Annual Creek Week March 10 - 15

The Town of Mooresville will host its annual Creek Week March 10-15, 2025, with events for all ages. The Town's Stormwater Division is working with various town departments as well as local businesses, organizations, and agencies to offer a week full of fun, engaging events for children, teens, and adults.

Creek Week events include tours of the Water Treatment Plant and Wastewater Treatment Plant, guided hikes at Mooresville parks, and activities at the Main Library and West Branch. Residents can also get rid of unwanted household items and recycle electronics for FREE during the Community Clean Up. From 10 a.m.-2 p.m. on March 15, at Cornelius Road Park (247 Cornelius Road, Mooresville), Town Sanitation will be on site to collect the unwanted items. TVs, computers, filing cabinets, and similar items can be dropped off. Please note, hazardous chemicals, paints, and tires will not be accepted.

Along with the Community Clean Up, there is a full lineup of activities and events on Saturday at Cornelius Road Park including a Touch-A-Truck with Town vehicles and equipment, technical workshops, educational activity booths, and volunteer opportunities.

Town of Mooresville Releases 2024 Drinking Water Quality Report

The Town of Mooresville has released the 2024 Drinking Water Quality Report. The report shows there have been no significant detections of monitored contaminants set forth by regulatory agencies. The Town conducts regular in-house testing as well as third-party testing to ensure the water residents and visitors receive is a quality product they can rely on for drinking or use.

The Town's water supply comes from Lake Norman and is routinely monitored for more than 150 potential contaminants, including microbials (such as viruses and bacteria) and inorganics (such as salts and metals), before the water is distributed to residents, businesses, parks, and other establishments.

The 2024 Drinking Water Quality Report shows, among other things, that there was one detection of Coliform Bacteria, and no detections of E.Coli, nor any contaminants typically associated with pesticides or herbicides.

Mooresville participates in UCMR5 along with many other utilities across the nation to test for contaminants that are not yet regulated by the EPA or North Carolina. Testing began in 2024 and the focus of UCMR5 is on 29 separate Per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) compounds. All contaminates were not detected.
