his past year, New Lenox Township moved forward on a path to return to normalcy in our operations and services, after a challenging period for all of us. We are now, and have been for some time, operating without any such restrictions, offering our full array of services that the community has come to know. As Supervisor, with the support of the Board of Trustees, I am committed to continue with full, normal, and unrestricted operations and services. Our

staff has been outstanding through this all, and we continue to work cooperatively with the Road District to provide outstanding services, while continuing to be fiscally conservative and responsible.

We have also been overwhelmed with the generosity of our community. As use of our New Lenox Township Food Pantry surged during the lockdowns ordered by the Governor, donations to the New Lenox Township Family Services Foundation, which primarily funds the Food Pantry, soared to meet the demand. Again, we continue to be amazed at the generosity of our community, and willingness to help their neighbors.

The New Lenox Township Board and its employees serve our community not only with the Food Pantry, but also with our Guy Sell Senior Housing Facility, our traditional recycling program, our joint operation with Will County for electronics recycling, our transportation department for all New Lenox Township residents, as well as our continued operation of Maplewood and Marshall Cemeteries. Here is an update on the services and events that the board and staff have worked on this past year:

Guy Sell Housing Building: The building remains at 100% occupancy, with any vacancies being immediately filled from the waiting list. It continues to be a very popular facility. The building is again fully open, and the community room available for Park District classes, Meals on Wheels congregate luncheon meals, as well as use by community groups. The Township Board has now, for the eighth year in a row, abated all taxes levied under the bond issue for construction of the facility. We will continue to do so, keeping any such tax from appearing on your property tax bill. Any New Lenox Township resident age 62 or older may register and have their name placed on the waiting list. They must also be a New Lenox Township resident at the time they ultimately sign a lease and move in.

Township Cemeteries: We assisted 32 families with the burial of their loved ones in 2021.

Food Pantry: Usage continued to be high into and through 2021, as many of our Township residents continued to bear the brunt of the effects of the Governor's lockdown orders. Thankfully, those restrictions have been lifted.

Recycling: Our traditional recycling hours are Monday through Friday (excepting state holidays) from 1:00pm to 3:30pm, and the fourth Saturday of each month from 8:00am to Noon. Electrical components can be dropped off for recycling on the second and fourth Wednesday of each month from 5:00pm to 7:00pm. They accept used electronic items, with a limit of two televisions per vehicle. The items are immediately loaded on a truck, which departs at 7:00pm. We can NOT store any electronic recyclables onsite, as they must be received and loaded on the truck during such times, and the truck leaves at 7:00pm on such days. This program serves 50-75 vehicles per night, and collects about 6,000 pounds of electronics per event.

Transportation: Our drivers have been giving rides to an average of 400 rides per month, which is up from as little as 200 during the lockdowns, and continues to increase, but is still far away from the 800+/- during pre-Covid times. Rides can be scheduled Monday through Friday from 7:00am to 4:00pm.

In my first year as Supervisor, I am grateful for the excellent employees of the Township, as well as the support of the Board of Trustees, and especially the efforts of previous Supervisor Mike Hickey, who left the Township in excellent financial condition, which we will continue. We are fully open for business, and look forward to continuing to serve you.

Household Hazardous waste can be properly disposed of on **Sept. 10th from 8:00am-3:00pm** at the Spencer Campus located on Spencer Road just north of Laraway Road. This service is being provided by New Lenox Township, the Village of New Lenox, Will County Land Use, and Sharefest. This Sharefest organization provides several volunteers to provide help at this event. If you have household hazardous waste to dispose of, then this is the event you are looking for. Please go to **www.willcountygreen.com** for more information and to reserve a time slot prior to Sept. 10th. Will County Land Use has the resources and authorization to provide this kind of service. New Lenox Township does not.

Some of the items that are collected at this event are fluorescent light bulbs, used electronics, pool chemicals, oil based paints, smoke detectors, pesticides, household cleaning products, fire extinguishers, etc. These are just a few of the more common household hazardous waste items that are collected at this event. These type of events are very costly, and this service is being provided by your tax dollars through New Lenox Township, the Village of New Lenox, and Will County Land Use. Please take advantge of this annual event if you need to dispose of any of the above listed items as well as many other hazardous materials that are listed on the **www.willcountygreen.com** website.

New Lenox Township will no longer collect latex paint

New Lenox Township is not able to dispose of latex paint, but you the resident are allowed by law, to dispose of water based paint.

The latex paint that we have been accepting over the past few years has been collected and processed by volunteer groups. The paint was then used in the community for various projects. The pandemic, as well as fewer and fewer volunteers has forced us to stop collecting paint.

The processing of the paint is labor intensive and very time consuming.

Our volunteers were forced to dispose of much of the paint as it was unusable for projects.

We can no longer continue to dispose of the unusable paint as the intent of this program was to collect good paint that could be used on paint projects. While much of the paint we collected was usable, the amount of paint that had to be disposed of continued to increase. Many of the volunteer groups that used this paint, simply do not have the volunteers that they once had. If you have excess latex paint, you the resident, can dispose of water based paint by following a few simple guidelines.

Open the container and allow it to dry naturally. You can help the drying process by adding rags, oil dry, kitty litter, even newspaper until the paint becomes a paste like consistency and then dispose of it as normal trash. Todays water based paints do not contain enough toxic ingredients to be considered hazardous waste. Mosquito Abatement

New Lenox Township, in partnership with the Village of New Lenox, provides mosquito abatement during the warm months of the year. The Village and the Township have provided this service for many years. We cover all residential areas of New Lenox Township including all of the Village of New Lenox as well as the unincorporated residential areas. The mosquito spraying is based on data provided to us by the Will County Health Department. The spraying normally takes place during the week in the evening hours. We continue to provide the spraying for as long as the counts taken by the Will County Health Department warrant additional treatment. Normally, in the spring, we will apply larvacide to the retention and detention areas throughout the Township. Then as the "brood counts" exceed a pre-determined level, we will begin the spraying. It normally requires a weeks time to cover the entire Township with a spraying.

West Nile Virus is a flu like illness that is transmitted by mosquitos. Our efforts with the mosquito abatement program are intended to reduce the number of mosquitos in our neighborhoods and hopefully reduce the likelihood of the spread of this virus. It is a time-consuming process and your cooperation is greatly appreciated.

Senior Housing

The Guy Sell Housing Building, located at 1090 S. Cedar Road consists of 6 two-bedroom and 18 one-bedroom apartments. Applicants must be at least 62 years of age, a New Lenox

Township resident at the time of application, and when a vacancy becomes available. You must also be able to live independently. The 2800 sq ft Community Room provides additional space for civic gatherings. Thanks to New Lenox Lions Club, a kitchen was added several years ago. Through a cooperative agreement with our Park District, the Community Room serves as a satellite facility recreation. for senior exercise. and social



enrichment programs. To inquire about using our Community Room, please call the Township.

Medical Exchange Program

New Lenox Township provides a free Medical Supplies Exchange Program for residents of New Lenox Township. Medical supplies that are offered for use include but are not limited to: wheelchairs, walkers, canes, crutches, bedside commodes, raised toilet seats, and shower chairs. We encourage you to donate your medical supplies/equipment for others in need.

Senior Nutrition Program

The New Lenox Township "Meals on Wheels" program is sponsored by New Lenox Township and the Community Nutrition Network.

New Lenox Township was officially established in 1850. The powers expressly granted to New Lenox Township by State Statute include providing General Assistance to Needy Families, the Fair and Equal Assessment of all real estate within our jurisdiction and Road, Bridge and Storm Water System Maintenance outside the municipality. ew Lenox Township has worked in cooperation with the District 210 Transition Program for many years. I felt that this program was something our township could partner with and provide for these students. New Lenox Township is a "training site" which means that as students graduate from the program, we then provide the same training site for younger students who come into the program each new school year. This program helps these special needs students, who with the assistance of his or her job coach and our Township staff, work and learn job skills at our Township facilities. This partnership has been working well for everyone involved. Our Township receives part time help that provides maintenance of the community room, senior meals kitchen, and our food pantry. It is truly a win-win situation for the Township and the students in the transition program. Our food pantry workers help stock shelves and assist in receiving food each morning, as well as filling orders for our residents. Our kitchen workers keep our kitchen clean, neat, and up to health department standards.

The Township is able to provide an atmosphere that can help

these students learn a job skill and build self confidence, while at the same time the Township receives the help we need to complete a variety of tasks. These students not only learn job skills, but they also learn how to work in a "team" environment as well as learning the value of earning a paycheck and how to manage their earnings. Many of these students have since graduated from the program and are now working independently in the work world, thanks to the skills that they have learned at New Lenox Township. These are the kind of programs that we strive to provide to our township residents.

New Lenox Township Highway Commissioner

This past year brought many changes to the way everday business is conducted throughout the world. Supply chain challenges and the persistent pandemic affected everyone in one way or another. Despite these obstacles the Highway Department was able to catch up with many of the projects which have been postponed over the previous seasons. This coming season should be very productive given no unforeseen crises.

Drainage Improvements: Last fall we were lucky to experience very moderate weather well into December. This allowed us to complete some asphalt patching and drainage projects which would have been delayed into this season. This extended "construction season" should give us a good head start on this year's activites.

Signage Improvements: Over the past few weeks, we have focused our attention on replacing many of our worn or outdated signage throughout the community. Many street name signs have been replaced along with regulatory signs when warranted. These activites will continue until all of our signs meet current standards. At present our staff are working on a subdivision-by-subdivision basis unless conditions require immediate action. Missing or damaged signs can be reported by contacting my office at 815-485-6484, or online through the New Lenox Township website.

Road Repairs and Improvements: As always, we will continue to perform pavement repairs and improvements on Township maintained roadways throughout the community. Our program to reinforce road edges and repair damaged curbs will combine with some full roadway resurfacing as needed. Although we strive to keep our roadways in good condition, heavy traffic and winter weather can take a toll on asphalt. Potholes and crumbling road surface can also be reported as noted above.

Ditches: I would like to remind everyone that the primary function of roadside ditches is to drain water away from the roadways and shoulders. Please contact our office before placing any pipes or fill in ditches or waterways.

Senior Citizens and General Homestead Exemption Information

nyone born in **1957** is eligible to apply for the Senior Citizen Homestead Exemption. You do not have to wait until your birthday to apply. **Your driver's license must match the property address in order to sign up for the senior exemption. NO EXCEPTIONS.** The Senior Citizen Homestead Exemption is \$5,000 off of your assessed valuation.

If the household income is **\$65,000** or less you may qualify for the Senior Citizen Assessment Freeze. **Applications will be available in our office no sooner than May 1st.** You must bring in your Federal 1040 Income Tax return to apply. If you do not file a 1040, then all 1099 forms and interest statements must be brought in for proof of income.

Anyone born in **1956 or before** and have not already signed up for the senior exemption, please call to make arrangements to come into our office as soon as possible and we will process the necessary paper work to get the exemption added to your tax bill. Do not delay as we have a limited time to make corrections on the 2021 tax bills.

The General Homestead Exemption is \$6,000 off your assessed valuation. The exemptions and requirements are as follows:

General Homestead Exemption \$6,000 off the assessed value

- The property must be your primary residence
- The property must be owner occupied

Senior Citizen Homestead Exemption \$5,000 off the assessed value

- The property must be your primary residence
- The property must be owner occupied
- At least one owner will be 65 during the tax year

The Will County Treasurer's Office mails tax bills usually by the first of May. The 2021 Tax Bills will be divided into 2 equal installments due June and September.

The tax bill is the only place where you actually see the exemptions being applied to your property. Please read them carefully, as we only have a limited time frame to make corrections for any missed exemptions. If you think there is an error, please call the office as soon as possible so we can look into the matter.

Our office hours are 8:00 am to 3:30 pm Monday through Thursday and 8:00 am to 3:00 pm Fridays. The telephone number is **815-485-9419.** Please call the office prior to coming in to be sure you have the correct documentation. Thank you very much for your cooperation.

he New Lenox Township Board helps our residents with transportation needs by providing door to door service at reasonable rates, between 7:00 am and 4:00 pm Monday through Friday.

Primarily provided within the boundaries of New Lenox Township and Village; transportation can also be provided to the Mokena, Frankfort, and Joliet areas for medical and physical therapy purposes, or the employment purposes of developmentally disabled New Lenox Township residents who are age 22 years and older. Our Transportation Service cannot travel beyond the borders of an immediate adjacent township or west of the Des Plaines River in Joliet.

The Covid-19 restrictions have been rolled back. Service to our wheelchair patrons has resumed. The previously installed Protective Plexiglass Shields between driver and passenger have been removed. All vehicles are still supplied with hand sanitizer, wipes, disposable vinyl gloves, and optional extra masks if needed. Our drivers continue to sanitize the vehicles on a regular basis. Masks are optional.

All services are scheduled through our Transportation Service Manager, Debbie Cunningham, who may be reached at 815-485-6431. You can also email Debbie at dcunningham@newlenox.org, or leave a voicemail 24 hours a day.
