WHEREAS, certain clerical errors, unlawful entries and errors in essential fact, as defined in the New York State Real Property Tax Law, are permitted to be corrected by a taxing jurisdiction based upon the recommendation of the Director of Real Property Tax Services, and WHEREAS, the taxing jurisdiction can delegate, by resolution, on an annual basis, to an official who is empowered to authorize payment of bills without prior audit, the authority to perform the duties of the tax levying body in regard to Real Property Tax Law, Sections 554 and 556, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Niagara County Treasurer is hereby delegated the authority to perform the duties of the tax levying body during 2020 when the Real Property Tax Director's recommended refund and/or correction is twenty five hundred dollars or less, and be it further

## NIAGARA COUNTY PUBLIC DEFENDER'S OFFICE BUDGET MODIFICATION CONTRACT FOR STATEWIDE EXPANSION OF HURRELL-HARRING REFORM OFFICE OF INDIGENT LEGAL SERVICES (OILS) GRANT CONTRACT NUMBER CSTWIDEHH30

WHEREAS, Niagara County Public Defender's Office has received an award from the New York State Office of Indigent Legal Services (OILS) in the amount of \$10,307,506.56 for a term from April 1, 2018 through March 31, 2023, and

WHEREAS, the 2020 budget will need to be modified to allow for the spending of this grant, and

WHEREAS, the Public Defender's Office will create one full-time 1<sup>st</sup> Assistant Public Defender at an annual salary of \$117,220 to be fully funded by this grant, and

WHEREAS, the Public Defender's Office will create two Court Assistant positions, grade 5, step 1 at an hourly rate of \$18.50/hour for each position, to be fully funded by this grant, and

WHEREAS, the Conflict Office will create one part-time Assistant Conflict Defender position without health insurance at an annual salary of \$59,333 to be fully funded by this grant, and

WHEREAS, the Public Defender's Office will abolish one part-time Assistant Public Defender and create one full-time 2<sup>nd</sup> Assistant Public Defender with a starting annual salary of \$115,566.72. The County will continue to fund its current commitment of \$61,820 from the part-time salary, and this contract will fund the remaining \$53,746.72 of the salary, and

WHEREAS, the Public Defender's Office will abolish two part-time Assistant Public Defender positions to create two full-time Special Assistant Public Defender positions with an annual salary of \$102,984.85 each. The County will continue to fund its current commitment of \$44,443 from each part-time salary, and this contract will fund the remaining \$58,541.85 of each salary, and

WHEREAS, the Public Defender's Office will assign an attorney to handle Veteran's Court for the 2020 calendar year at the cost of \$7,500, and

WHEREAS, seven part-time Conflict Attorney positions will receive an annual salary increase of \$5,000 effective January 22, 2020, to achieve parity between the offices of the Conflict Defender and Public Defender. The Public Defender's Office provides full health insurance benefits for their Assistant Public Defender positions. The increase in salary for the Conflict Attorneys will permit them to independently purchase health insurance, and

WHEREAS, the part-time Assigned Counsel/Conflict Administrator will receive an annual increase in salary of \$16,722. This increase in salary is for the additional responsibility of the roll of Data Officer. This position will work with ILS to operationalize data requirements on behalf of Niagara County. In addition, this position will also receive an annual salary increase of \$5,000 to achieve parity between the office of the Conflict Defender and Public Defender. This position is not provided with health insurance benefits. The additional \$5,000 increase in salary for this position will permit the Assigned Counsel/Conflict Administrator to independently purchase health insurance. The total annual salary for this position will be \$63,190. Both the increase for the new Data Officer role of \$16,722 and the parity increase of \$5,000 will be funded by this contract. The County will continue its current commitment to fund \$41,468 from the part-time position, and

WHEREAS, the existing full-time Confidential Secretary position will receive a merit-based salary increase of \$3,949. This position will receive an increase in salary to take on the additional responsibility of supporting a new staff Conflict Defender position. The new annual salary of the Confidential Secretary position will be \$55,081; the County will continue its current commitment of \$51,132 and health insurance, and this contract will fund \$3,949, and

WHEREAS, the contract will provide funding for Counsel at First Appearance (CAFA) stipends for attorneys from the Public Defender's Office to be on-call during non-business hours and for off-hour arraignments during non-business hours, and

WHEREAS, the contract will provide funding for Other Than Personal Services (OTPS) to include two Public Defense Case Management (PDCMS) licenses; employment exams/physicals for new positions as required by the County as well as office supplies and furniture; legal references materials/subscriptions/books; transcripts; two computer/laptops; phone, email and internet service, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, these changes will be effective January 22, 2020 and reflect no cost increase to the County and will be coterminous with the grant, and be it further

RESOLVED that following the County Attorney's review, the Chairman of the Legislature be and hereby is authorized to execute the agreement, and be it further

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Legislature passed Resolution #CSS-073-18 on 9/18/18 to enter into a job specific contract with Mission Critical Partners to review, examine and negotiate a Motorola proposal for necessary infrastructure and equipment to enhance the current Countywide Public Safety Radio Project, and

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Legislature passed Resolution #CSS-007-19 on 2/19/98 to enter into a job specific contract with Mission Critical Partners for Project Management and Implementation for necessary infrastructure and equipment to enhance the current Countywide Public Safety Radio Project, and

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Legislature passed Resolution #CSS-017-19 on 3/19/19 to accept a \$6 Million grant from the New York State Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Services to further enhance the interoperable communications network in Niagara County, including the addition of additional radio communication sites ("the Project"), and

WHEREAS, the Project will soon move to the next phase, which will necessitate that the County obtain further professional services to assist in negotiating a contract(s) with Motorola, technical review, project management, and implementation, and

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Services has approved the use of Mission Critical Partners as a Single Source professional service for the Project, and

WHEREAS, under Niagara County's Purchasing Guidelines, the Niagara County Legislature and the requisite committee(s) have the discretion to waive Requests for Proposal for a professional service contract, and

WHEREAS, Mission Critical Partners has assisted the County with the ongoing phases of the a Project and has the unique expertise and Project knowledge needed for technical review, procurement, project management, contract negotiations, and implementation of this highly technical Project, and

WHEREAS, Mission Critical Partners has submitted a Radio System Six Site Procurement and Implementation Proposal which provides for the above mentioned professional services for a fixed fee of \$497,192 which will be paid through the current FY18 State Interoperable Communications Targeted Grant, and

WHEREAS, the Mission Critical Partners proposal will have a cost breakdown for specific tasks to be performed by Mission Critical Partners in phases, and the ability for the County discontinue the services of Mission Critical Partners for any task or phase at the County's discretion, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the County finds that the services to be provided by Mission Critical Partners consist of "professional services" and further waives the RFP requirement and/or requirement that additional cost proposals be sought or obtained, and be it further

RESOLVED that following the County Attorney's review and approval of the contract, that Niagara County enter into a contract with Mission Critical Partners for the professional services outlined above at a cost of \$497,192, and be it further

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Legislature believes the safety of its workforce of paramount concern and a primary mission of county government, and

WHEREAS, the Me Too movement has highlighted the prevalence of inappropriate sexual conduct in various industries, including government, and demonstrated a need to protect workers, and

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Legislature supports zero tolerance of rape, sexual abuse, and forcible touching committed against its employees by other employees or members of the public, and

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Legislature opposes sexual discrimination and sexual harassment, and has zero tolerance for either, as both create a hostile or unsafe work environment, and

WHEREAS, in addition to our desire to protect our employees from hostile work environments and quid pro quo sexual harassment situations, this Legislature is also desirous of protecting the taxpayers from expensive payouts to settle sexual harassment claims, now, therefore, be it RESOLVED, the Niagara County Legislature directs the Department of Human Resources to, within 60 days, establish a policy barring from employment by Niagara County any individual convicted of a sexual offense including rape, sexual abuse, forcible touching, possession of child pornography, engaging in lewd contact or communication with a minor, and various other conduct which would require an individual to register as a sex offender, and be it further

RESOLVED, the Niagara County Legislature directs the Department of Human Resources to, within 60 days, establish a policy barring from employment by Niagara County any individual whose egregious conduct resulted in a successful lawsuit against a public entity, such as a municipal government, the state or federal government, or an authority, or in which a monetary settlement was reached with a party alleging impropriety on their part, with said payment being paid using taxpayer dollars, and be it further

# RESOLUTION URGING AMENDMENT AND ENACTMENT OF A.8837, A BILL RESTRICTING INDIVIDUALS FROM OWNING A COMPANION ANIMAL AFTER BEING CONVICTED OF CERTAIN CRIMES INVOLVING ANIMALS

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Legislature did enact a Local Law establishing an animal abuser registry in resolution IL-103-15, and this registry has been extremely successful to date, with more than 50 individuals identified as ineligible to own domesticated animals due to their convictions for violating animal abuse statutes, and

WHEREAS, Assemblywoman Linda Rosenthal, D-District 67, has submitted a bill, A.8837, which "restricts individuals from owning a companion animal after being convicted of certain crimes involving animals," and

WHEREAS. Assemblywoman Rosenthal's bill amends the state Agriculture and Markets Law restricting those convicted of animal fighting; overdriving, torturing and injuring animals; failure to provide proper sustenance or aggravated cruelty to animals from owning a companion animal for five years, with provisions allowing a judge to lengthen the ban on pet ownership in certain circumstances, and

WHEREAS, this bill is a welcome change in state policy and fully endorsed by the Niagara County Legislature, and

WHEREAS, the bill does not provide for creation of an animal abuser registry, which would enable interdiction at the point of sale by pet store owners, animal shelters, and others engaging in animal sales and adoption, which this Legislature considers a flaw in an otherwise strong piece of legislation, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, the Niagara County Legislature applauds Assemblywoman Rosenthal and the New York State Assembly for their leadership on this issue, and be it further

RESOLVED, the Niagara County Legislature urges Assemblywoman Rosenthal to amend her bill to provide directives and funding establishing an online registry that can be accessed by pet store owners, animal shelters, and others engaging in animal sales and adoption, and to provide information/education to these individuals on accessing that registry, and be it further

RESOLVED, the Niagara County Legislature considers our Local Law Establishing the Niagara County Animal Abuser Registry a model that all municipalities and the state should look to when authoring their own laws, and directs the Clerk of the Legislature to forward a copy of this resolution and IL-103-15 to Assemblywoman Rosenthal with our compliments, and be it further

RESOLVED, the Niagara County Legislature hereby directs the County Attorney to provide any materials related to the creation and enactment of the Local Law Establishing the Niagara County Animal Abuser Registry to Assemblywoman Rosenthal to assist in this effort, and be it further

RESOLVED, the Niagara County Legislature hereby urges the New York State Assembly to take up and enact a duly amended A.8837, and be it further

RESOLVED, the Niagara County Legislature hereby urges the New York State Senate to take up and pass a companion bill to A.8837, and be it further

RESOLVED, the Niagara County Legislature hereby urges Gov. Andrew M. Cuomo to sign A.8837 into law so our companion animals can receive the protection that they need and deserve.
