APPROVAL OF VOTING MACHINE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF NIAGARA AND
THE NIAGARA WHEATFIELD CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Niagara Wheatfield Central School Districts will be conducting an election on November 15, 2016 and requires the use of the Niagara County Board of Elections voting equipment in connection with this election, and

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Attorney's Office has prepared a formal agreement for use between the County of Niagara and the Niagara Wheatfield Central School District, which has been fully approved by the District, a copy of which has been filed with the Clerk of the Legislature, and

WHEREAS, time is of the essence in connection with the approvals by the Niagara County Legislature, and

WHEREAS, under the terms of the agreement the County will provide, and be reimbursed for transportation of the voting machine preparation, programming, and packaging of the voting machine and all necessary Niagara County personnel: the District, among other things, shall furnish at its expense, election custodians and inspectors and also insurance in form, content and amounts as approved by the Niagara County Attorney, and

WHEREAS, the final written agreement between the parties is subject to the review and approval by the parties' respective legal counsel, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that pursuant to the provisions of §3-224 of New York State Election Law, the Chairman of the Niagara County Legislature and the Niagara County Election Commissioners are authorized and directed to execute and deliver an agreement, in substantially the form of agreement now filed with the Clerk of the Legislature between and among the County of Niagara, the Niagara County Election Commissioners and the Niagara Wheatfield Central School Districts for the provision, by the County of Niagara, of sufficient voting equipment, including the programming thereof, to the Niagara Wheatfield Central School Districts in connection with an election scheduled to be held the 15<sup>th</sup> day of November 2016, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the execution and delivery of this equipment, is subject to the approval of the Board of the Niagara Wheatfield Central School District and the review and approval of the Niagara County Attorney's Office and counsel to the Niagara Wheatfield Central School Districts, and be it further

MH - 2016 BUDGET MODIFICATION – ACCEPT SAMHSA PRIMARY AND BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CARE INTEGRATION (PBHCI) GRANT

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Department of Mental Health provides services to adults with mental illness and substance use disorders who are living in Niagara County, and

WHEREAS, Niagara County Department of Mental Health has been awarded grant funding from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, Center for Mental Health Services, to participate in the Primary and Behavioral Health Care Integration (PBHCI) program, and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this program is to establish projects for the provision of coordinated and integrated services through the co-location of primary and specialty care medical services in community-based behavioral health settings; the goal is to improve the physical health status of adults with serious mental illnesses (SMI) and those with co-occurring substance use disorders who have or are at risk for co-morbid primary care conditions and chronic diseases. The program's objective is to support the triple aim of improving the health of individuals with SMI; enhancing the consumer experience of care (including quality, access, and reliability); and reducing/controlling the per capita cost of care, and

WHEREAS, SAMHSA launched the PBHCI program in FY 2009 with the knowledge that adults with serious mental illness experience heightened morbidity and mortality, dying an average of 25 years earlier than the general population due to obesity, diabetes, hypertension, and heart disease. This increased morbidity and mortality can be attributed to a number of issues, including inadequate physical activity and poor nutrition; smoking; side effects from atypical antipsychotic medications; and lack of access to health care services. Many of these health conditions are preventable through routine health promotion activities, primary care screening, monitoring, treatment and care management /coordination strategies and/or other outreach programs; much of the national effort towards achieving the triple aim of improved health, enhanced care, and reduced costs are associated with developing person-centered systems of care that address an individual's holistic health and wellness, and

WHEREAS, this funding will allow Niagara County Department of Mental Health to fully integrate and coordinate behavioral health, physical health, and wellness services for Seriously Mentally Ill adults, including those with co-occurring substance use disorders, in Niagara County, NY through the expansion of our primary care services, the development of health and wellness classes, and the expansion of our partnership with community agencies, such as Northpointe Council and the Mental Health Association of Niagara County, and

WHEREAS, the SAMHSA Primary and Behavioral Health Care Integration (PBHCI) grant funding requirements give specific staffing criteria to provide direct care services, supervision, and assistance to Niagara County Department of Mental Health administration to ensure the success of the integrated care services, and to be consistent with the rules and regulations of the New York State Office of Mental Health and New York State Office of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Services, and

WHEREAS, the SAMHSA Primary and Behavioral Health Care Integration (PBHCI) grant totals \$1,512,803.00 spread over a period of 4 years and Niagara County Department of Mental Health intends to convert the positions created for this program to be fully revenue supported; in the event that this does not occur and the positions cannot support themselves through generated revenue at the end of the 4 year grant period, these positions will be coterminous with the grant funding, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the following three (3) positions: one (1) Supervising Community Mental Health Nurse position, Grade 13, Step 1, at an hourly rate of \$29.52, one (1) Community Mental Health Aide position, Grade 8, Step 1, at an hourly rate of \$19.76, and one (1) Account Clerical I position, Grade 4, Step 1, at an hourly rate of \$16.41, be created within the Niagara County Department of Mental Health, and filled effective December 1, 2016, to carry out the required roles and responsibilities to integrate and coordinate behavioral health, physical health, and wellness services for Seriously Mentally III adults, including those with cooccurring substance use disorders under the guidelines and requirements of the SAMHSA Primary and Behavioral Health Care Integration (PBHCI) grant, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the department is given authorization to accept the full PBHCI grant with the increase in the 2016 budget and the effectuation of the following 2016 budget modification:

#### ACCEPT 2017 EMPLOYMENT FOCUSED SERVICES GRANT

WHEREAS, the 200% of Poverty Grant, which provided funding in the amount of \$126,997 to provide support for the salary and fringe benefits of a probation officer (coterminous with the grant) and an employment counselor (coterminous with the grant), will be terminated effective December 31, 2016, and

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Probation Department in collaboration with the Niagara County Employment and Training Department applied for Employment Focused Services grant funding from the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS)/Office of Probation and Correctional Alternatives (OPCA) in the amount \$187,864 for the period of January 1, 2017 through December 31, 2017, with up to four (4) one (1) year options to renew in 2018, 2019, 2020, and 2021, and

WHEREAS, the initiative is part of a state-wide comprehensive strategy developed to reduce recidivism in local jurisdictions and increase public safety through effective community-based interventions for high risk offenders through the use of evidence based practices, and

WHEREAS, DCJS/DPCA, under this initiative, awarded this grant on a competitive basis to those local agencies that proposed using evidence-based interventions which target criminal thinking, job readiness, obtainment of employment, and employment retention, and

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Probation Department has received notification from the DCJS/OPCA of a financial award for Year 2017 in the amount of \$187,864, with four one year renewal options, to provide support in the form of salary, benefits, and training for a probation officer (coterminous with the grant) and an employment counselor (coterminous with the grant), as well as for other costs associated with the program, and

WHEREAS, the Employment Focused Services Grant is replacing the 200% of Poverty Grant and the two positions formerly funded by 200% of Poverty funds will now be funded by Employment Focused Services funds, and

WHEREAS, no new positions are being created, and
