WHEREAS, the County Legislature of the County of Niagara, enacted a Local Law No. by Resolution No. AD-0005-96 establishing a Code of Ethics for the County of Niagara, and

WHEREAS, the County Legislature of the County of Niagara, amended such 1996 Local Law by Resolution No. IL-0048-96, Resolution No AD-024-97, Resolution No IL-002-98, Resolution No AD-006-01, Resolution No IL-053-07 and Resolution No AD-009-19, and

WHEREAS, the County Legislature of the County of Niagara, does hereby amend such 1996 Local Law establishing a Code of Ethics for the County of Niagara, as amended by Resolution No. IL-0048-96, Resolution No AD-024-97, Resolution No IL-002-98, Resolution No AD-026-98, Resolution No AD-006-01, Resolution No IL-053-07 and Resolution No. AD-009-19 as follows:

SECTION 2. Disclosure of Interest; Legislative Abstention

1. Disclosure of interests regardless of conflict

The following individuals shall, by May 15th of every year or if newly elected or appointed within thirty (30) days after taking office file a statement with the Board of Ethics:

- A. Every County Legislator or any other county elected official;
- B. Members and Officers of the Industrial Development Agency (IDA);
- C. Every County Political Party Chairman;
- D. Candidates for County Elected Offices who file designating petitions for nominations at a primary election shall file such statement within seven (7) days after the last day allowed by law for the filing of designating petitions; and
- E. County Employees who hold policy-making positions as annually determined by the appointing authority and set forth in writing during January 31st of each year:

Such statement shall be adopted by the County and include the following:

- i. The name of any corporation for profit in which they, and/or their spouse, and/or minor children hold collectively 5% or more of the stock;
- ii. Real property situated in Niagara County which they, their spouse, or minor children hold for profit or from which they, their spouse, or minor children receive rents or income, excepting such real

property as is maintained for use as their residence or the residence of their spouse or minor children, as the case may be;

iii. Self-employment or employment by, or membership in or on the board of directors of, any corporation, partnership, association, person, or other entity from which the employee derives gross income in excess of \$500.00 per year.

Any such County officer or employee who does not have any such interests shall so file a statement to that effect. Such statements of disclosure shall be, indexed and maintained on file in an appropriate manner by the Board of Ethics.

It shall be the responsibility of the Director of Human Resources, prior to January 31 of each year, to review the list of those persons who, in the Director's judgement, are "policy making employees" and to forward any recommendations for additions and/or deletions to such list to the Chairman of the Niagara County Legislature who, subject to Legislative approval, may review and modify said list as deemed appropriate.

. . . .

SECTION 19. The local law shall take effect upon filing with the New York State Secretary of State, after which it shall become a law.

RESOLVED, that the Niagara County Legislature shall conduct a public hearing upon said proposed Local Law at the Legislative Chambers, Courthouse, Lockport, New York, on the 15th day of September, at 6:45 p.m., and be if further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Legislature, at least six (6) days in advance of such hearing, shall post a notice upon the bulletin boards in the Courthouse at Lockport and the Civic Building in Niagara Falls and shall publish such notice once in the Union Sun & Journal, and the Niagara Gazette; such notice shall contain the title of the Local Law and an abstract of the text to be prepared by the Clerk of the Legislature, with the assistance of the County Attorney's Office.

CONFIRMING THE AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES COORDINATOR FOR NIAGARA COUNTY; APPROVING THE NOTICE UNDER THE AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT AND APPROVING THE GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE UNDER THE AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Housing and Development (HUD) has designated the County as a recipient of Community Development Block Grant Funds, and

WHEREAS, in order to receive Community Development Block Grant funding, federal regulations require the County to designate an American's With Disabilities Act (ADA) Coordinator and establish a Grievance Procedure for the public to follow when issues arrive relative to ADA compliance, and

WHEREAS, the County supports and promotes accessibility to public areas and buildings for all County residents, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Niagara County Legislature confirms that the Commissioner of Public Works will act as the Americans with Disabilities Act Coordinator for Niagara County; and be it further

RESOLVED, that this Legislature approves the following Notice under the Americans with Disabilities Act:

NOTICE UNDER THE AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

In accordance with the requirements of Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA), the County of Niagara will not discriminate against qualified individuals with disabilities on the basis of disability in its services, programs, or activities.

Employment: The County of Niagara does not discriminate on the basis of disability in its hiring or employment practices and complies with all regulations promulgated by the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commissioner under Title I of the ADA.

Effective Communication: The County of Niagara will generally, upon request, provide appropriate aids and services leading effective communication for qualified persons with disabilities so they can participate equally in the County of Niagara programs, services, and activities, including qualified sign language interpreters, documents in Braille, and other ways of making information and communications accessible to people who have speech, hearing, or vision impairments.

Modifications to Policies and Procedures: The County of Niagara will make all reasonable modifications to policies and programs to ensure that people with disabilities have an equal opportunity to enjoy all of its programs, services, and activities. For example, individuals with service animals are welcomed in the County of Niagara offices, even where pets are generally prohibited.

Anyone who requires an auxiliary aid or service for effective communication, or a modification of policies or procedures to participate in a program, service, or activity of the County of Niagara, should contact the Office of the Public Works/ADA Coordinator, Garret Meal, Philo J. Brooks Office Building, 59 Park Avenue, Lockport, NY 14094 at (716) 439-7242 or email Garret.Meal@niagaracounty.com as soon as possible but no later than 48 hours before the schedule event.

The ADA does not require the County of Niagara to take any action that would fundamentally alter the nature of its programs or services, or impose an undue financial or administrative burden.

Complaints that a program, service, or activity of the County of Niagara is not accessible to persons with disabilities should be directed to Garret Meal, Commissioner of Public Works/ADA Coordinator at Philo J. Brooks Office Building, 59 Park Avenue, Lockport, NY 14094; (716) 439-7242 or at Garret.Meal@niagaracounty.com.

The County of Niagara will not place a surcharge on a particular individual with a disability or any group of individuals with disabilities to cover the cost of providing auxiliary aids/services or reasonable modifications of policy, such as retrieving items from locations that are open to the public but are not accessible to persons who use wheelchairs, and be it further

RESOLVED, that this Legislature approves the following Grievance Procedure under the Americans with Disabilities Act:

GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE UNDER THE AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

This Grievance Procedure is established to meet the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA). It may be used by anyone who wishes to file a complaint alleging discrimination on the basis of disability in the provision of services, activities, programs, or benefits by the County of Niagara. Employment related complaints of disability discrimination are covered elsewhere, in policies available from the Human Resources Department of the County of Niagara.

The Complaint should be in writing and contain information about the alleged discrimination such as name, address, phone number of complainant and location, date and description of the problem. No particular format of the complaint is required. Alternative means of filing complaints, such as personal interviews or a tape recording of the complaint will be made available for persons with disabilities upon request.

The complaint should be submitted in writing by the grievant and/or his/her designee as soon as possible but not later than 60 calendar days after the alleged violation to:

Within 15 calendar days after receipt of the complaint, the ADA Coordinator or his/her designee will meet with the complainant to discuss the complainant and the possible resolutions. Within 15 calendar days of the meeting, the ADA Coordinator or his/her designee will respond in writing, and where appropriate, in a format accessible to the complainant, such as large print, Braille, or audio tape. The response will explain the position of the County of Niagara and offer options for substantive resolution of the complaint.

If the response by the ADA Coordinator or his/her designee does not satisfactorily resolve the issue, the complainant and or his/her designee may appeal the decision within 15 calendar days after receipt of the response to the agency head or his/her designee.

Within 15 calendar days after receipt of the appeal, the agency head or his/her designee will respond in writing, and, where appropriate, in a format accessible to the complainant, with the agency's final resolution of the complainant, or indicating that the matter has been returned to the ADA Coordinator for further action. If further response is indicated, the complainant will be contacted within 15 calendar days.

All written complaints received by the ADA Coordinator or his/her designee, appeals to the agency head or his/her designee, and responses from these two offices will be retained by the County of Niagara for at least three (3) years.

WHEREAS, lakeshore towns in Niagara County have been faced with unprecedented damage due to Lake Ontario flooding in 2017 and 2019, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Wilson is working with all levels of government to find ways to mitigate damage from future flooding allowing for economic recovery, growth, and development, including tourism, and

WHEREAS, New York State created the Resiliency and Economic Development Initiative (REDI) to fund projects that increase the resilience of shoreline communities and bolster economic development, and

WHEREAS, three important projects in the Town of Wilson which have been approved through the New York State Resiliency and Economic Development Initiative, Town of Wilson Water Tower (\$1,000,000), Sunset Island West Barrier Bar (\$210,000), and Roosevelt Beach Bridge Waterline (\$500,000), with the costs for these projects totaling \$1,710,000, and

WHEREAS, lakeshore towns in Niagara County have been faced with unprecedented damage due to Lake Ontario flooding in 2017 and 2019, and

WHEREAS, the Village of Wilson is working with all levels of government to find ways to mitigate damage from future flooding allowing for economic recovery, growth, and development, including tourism, and

WHEREAS, New York State created the Resiliency and Economic Development Initiative (REDI) to fund projects that increase the resilience of shoreline communities and bolster economic development, and

WHEREAS, two important projects in the Village of Wilson which have been approved through the New York State Resiliency and Economic Development Initiative, Village of Wilson Wastewater Treatment Plant (\$4,461,000) and Village of Wilson Townline Pier (\$1,587,000), with the costs for these projects totaling \$6,048,000, and

SUPPORT FOR WHEATFIELD VETERANS MEMORIAL PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Niagara Power Coalition ("NPC") and the New York Power Authority(NYPA) agreed to a licensing settlement for the next 50 years for the Niagara Power Project, and

WHEREAS, that settlement allows Niagara County to receive, through NPC Host Community Standing Committee ("HCSC"), up to \$390,000 annually to fund projects which are found to be consistent with the Niagara Greenway projects along the Greenway Trail, and

WHEREAS, the Wheatfield Veterans Memorial Inc., a 501-(c)(3) organization, whose mission is to create a memorial to honor the sacrifices veterans have made to defend our country, has made application to the Niagara County's Ad Hoc Committee on Parks, Recreation and Tourism for Greenway funds for the Wheatfield Veterans Memorial Project, and

WHEREAS, the Wheatfield Veterans Memorial Project will include the construction of a 7,800 square foot paved walkway and display area for the Town of Wheatfield's recently restored Huey helicopter, tank and Veterans Memorial monument to honor all branches of the United States armed forces, and

SUPPORT FOR PENDLETON PARK COMMUNITY CENTER PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Niagara Power Coalition ("NPC") and the New York Power Authority ("NYPA") agreed to a licensing settlement for the next 50 years for the Niagara Power Project, and

WHEREAS, that settlement allows Niagara County to receive, through NPC Host Community Standing Committee ("HCSC"), up to \$390,000 annually to fund projects which are found to be consistent with the Niagara Greenway projects along the Greenway Trail, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Pendleton, has made application to the Niagara County's Ad Hoc Committee on Parks, Recreation and Tourism for Greenway for its Pendleton Park Community Center Project, and

WHEREAS, the Pendleton Park Community Center will be constructed at the Pendleton Town Park, which is a 23-acre park centrally located in the Town that surrounds Pendleton's municipal facilities and Historical Society Museum, and is used primarily for recreation and Town events, including Fourth of July celebrations, and farmers' markets, and

WHEREAS, On June 12, 2020 Governor Cuomo issued Executive Order 203, the New York State Police Reform and Reinvention Collaborative, and

WHEREAS, each local government that maintains a police agency must perform a comprehensive review of current police force deployments, strategies, policies, procedures, and practices, and develop a plan to improve such deployments, strategies, policies, procedures, and practices, for the purposes of addressing the particular needs of the communities served by such police agency and promote community engagement to foster trust, fairness, and legitimacy, and to address any racial bias and disproportionate policing of communities of color, and

WHEREAS, each chief executive of such local government shall convene the head of the local police agency, and stakeholders in the community to develop such plan, which shall consider evidence-based policing strategies, including but not limited to, use of force policies, procedural justice; any studies addressing systemic racial bias or racial justice in policing; implicit bias awareness training; de-escalation training and practices; law enforcement assisted diversion programs; restorative justice practices; community-based outreach and conflict resolution; problem-oriented policing; hot spots policing; focused deterrence; crime prevention through environmental design; violence prevention and reduction interventions; model policies and guidelines promulgated by the New York State Municipal Police Training Council; and standards promulgated by the New York State Law Enforcement Accreditation Program, and

WHEREAS, the political subdivision, in coordination with its police agency, must consult with stakeholders, including but not limited to membership and leadership of the local police force; members of the community, with emphasis in areas with high numbers of police and community interactions; interested non-profit and faith-based community groups; the local office of the district attorney; the local public defender; and local elected officials, and create a plan to adopt and implement the recommendations resulting from its review and consultation, including any modifications, modernizations, and innovations to its policing deployments, strategies, policies, procedures, and practices, tailored to the specific needs of the community and general promotion of improved police agency and community relationships based on trust, fairness, accountability, and transparency, and which seek to reduce any racial disparities in policing, and

WHEREAS, such plan shall be offered for public comment to all citizens in the locality, and after consideration of such comments, shall be presented to the local legislative body in such political subdivision, which shall ratify or adopt such plan by local law or resolution, as appropriate, no later than April 1, 2021, and

WHEREAS, Niagara County maintains a police agency that is covered by this Executive Order in the Niagara County Sheriff's Office, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, the Niagara County Legislature hereby creates the Niagara County Task Force on Police Reform, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Chairman of the Niagara County Legislature will chair this task force and all members of the Niagara County Legislature are appointed as ex officio members, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Niagara County Sheriff, the Niagara County District Attorney, the Niagara County Public Defender and the Niagara County Emergency Services Director are appointed to this task force, and be it further

RESOLVED, that a resident from each of Niagara County's three cities and 12 towns shall be appointed to the task force by the chief executive of each municipality, and be it further

RESOLVED, that up to 5 additional members from the community can be appointed to this task force by the Chairman of the Legislature based on recommendations made by either the Majority Leader or the Minority Leader, and be it further

RESOLVED, that this task force is directed to solicit comment from the public to allow all interested stakeholders to have input into the plan, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Legislature expects the task force to complete all of its work and submit a plan to the Legislature for consideration before the end of 2020.
