DISTRIBUTION OF JANUARY THROUGH SEPTEMBER 2014 CASINO REVENUE TO VARIOUS REMAINING MUNICIPALITIES

WHEREAS, a Seneca Nation gambling casino governed by the Tribal-State Class III Gaming Compact and disbursing monies according to provisions of Subdivision 3-a of the Upstate New York Gaming and Economic Development Act continues to operate Class III gaming activities within the County of Niagara, and

WHEREAS, said casino is operated and owned by the Seneca Nation of Indians, a sovereign and foreign nation which is not subject to any taxation by the County of Niagara, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal-State Class III Gaming Compact and its authorizing legislation, provide for compensation for the "host municipalities" of the Seneca Niagara Casino and said Compact was submitted to and approved by the Secretary of the Interior of the United States as required, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Upstate New York Gaming and Economic Development Act, a special separate revenue account denominated "Tribal-State Compact Revenue Account" was established in the joint custody of the State Comptroller and the State Commissioner to receive the gaming revenues payable to the State and the host municipalities, and

WHEREAS, per the provisions of Subdivision 3 of the Upstate New York Gaming and Economic Development Act, 25% of revenues arising from the Seneca Niagara Casino are disbursed to the City of Niagara Falls, and

WHEREAS, per the provisions of the Update New York Gaming and Economic Development Act Subdivision 3-a, "Ten Percent of any of the funds actually received by the state pursuant to the tribal-state compacts and agreements described in [subdivision 2 of the Upstate New York Gaming and Economic Development Act] prior to the transfer of moneys to the general fund required by such subdivision, shall be distributed to counties in each respective exclusivity zone provided they do not otherwise receive a share of said revenues pursuant to [the Upstate New York Gaming and Economic Development Act]. Such distribution shall be made among such counties on a per capital basis, excluding the population of any municipality that receives a distribution pursuant to [Subdivision 3 of the Upstate New York Gaming and Economic Development Act]," and

WHEREAS, per the Upstate New York Gaming and Economic Development Act Subdivision 3-a, revenues arising from the Seneca Niagara Casino that are disbursed to the County of Niagara are to be apportioned by population for such purposes as shall benefit the residents of the Towns of Cambria, Hartland, Lewiston, Lockport, Newfane, Niagara, Pendleton, Porter, Royalton, Somerset, Wheatfield and Wilson, and the Cities of Lockport and North Tonawanda, and

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Treasurer's Office and the Niagara County Office of Management and Budget jointly established two interest-bearing revenue accounts, which shall be designated "Niagara County Community Development Fund 1" and "Niagara County Tax Relief Fund," with all revenues appropriated to

the county under Upstate New York Gaming and Economic Development Act Subdivision 3-a divided and deposited into said accounts, with 25% of said monies being deposited in Niagara County Community Development Fund 1 and 75% of said monies being deposited in Niagara County Tax Relief Fund, with these percentages of distribution remaining in force until December 31, 2015, and

WHEREAS, in December of 2014, this body did vote on a resolution creating both the Niagara County Community Development Fund and the Niagara County Tax Relief Fund, and

WHEREAS, Niagara County has received \$523,665.86 for the period of January 1, 2014 through September 30, 2014 towards the Niagara County Tax Relief Fund, and will distribute the funds to the respective municipalities per the aforementioned formula, and

WHEREAS, the Niagara County has previously distributed \$369,015.69 for the period of January 1, 2014 through September 30, 2014 as apportioned to the Towns of Lewiston, Lockport, Niagara, and Wheatfield and the Cities of Lockport and North Tonawanda, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Niagara County Legislature does hereby approve the disbursement of the remaining \$154,650.17 for the period of January 1, 2014 through September 30, 2014 to the following municipalities within the County of Niagara:

ACCEPTANCE OF GUN INVOLVED VIOLENCE ELIMINATION INITIATIVE GRANT & BUDGET MODIFICATION

WHEREAS, in 2014 the Division of Criminal Justice Services initiated a gun violence eradication initiative to target the rising incidents of gun involved violence across the State of New York and specifically the seventeen counties that account for the vast majority of crime outside of the City of New York which includes the County of Niagara, and

WHEREAS, the GIVE (Gun Involved Violence Elimination) Initiative is a statewide comprehensive strategy which was built on the successes of Operation IMPACT but now focuses exclusively on reducing shootings and homicides by promoting integrated, evidence based strategies, and

WHEREAS, the Niagara County District Attorney's Office, the Niagara County Sheriff's Office and the Niagara County Probation Department, in conjunction with the Niagara Falls Police Department, applied for funding under the 2015-2016 GIVE Initiative, and

WHEREAS, The Niagara County District Attorney's Office, the Niagara County Sheriff's Office and the Niagara County Probation Department have received notification that funding has been awarded in the amounts of \$189,280, \$101,065 and \$56,907 respectively, for the period of July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016, with no required match from Niagara County, and

WHEREAS, the Sheriff's Office has a Correction Officer position #10442 which is currently funded under this program and will remain coterminous with grant funding, and

WHEREAS, the District Attorney's Office has an Assistant District Attorney position #4771 which is currently funded under this program and will remain coterminous with grant funding, and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to modify revenue and appropriations in the District Attorney's Office, the Sheriff's Office and Probation Department's budgets for fiscal year 2015, now, therefore, be it

RESOLUTION SUPPORTING PRODUCT STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM FOR PAINT

WHEREAS, it is estimated that roughly 3.1 million gallons of leftover paint are generated in New York each year, and

WHEREAS, management of leftover paint in New York results in a cost that typically represents 50% of municipal household hazardous waste budgets, and

WHEREAS, a statewide paint stewardship program would mean that the paint industry would be responsible for collecting and managing leftover paint in New York, and

WHEREAS, the American Coatings Association, a trade association representing paint manufacturers from across the United States has created PaintCare, a non-profit program to manage the reuse, recycling and disposal of leftover paint, and

WHEREAS, eight other states, including Rhode Island, Connecticut, Minnesota, California, Vermont, Maine, Colorado and Oregon have passed legislation implementing paint recovery programs managed by PaintCare, saving local municipalities tens of thousands of dollars to manage the paint as part of household hazardous waste collection programs, and

WHEREAS, in addition to reducing government costs, a paint stewardship program would create green sector jobs, reduce waste and encourage the public to purchase the right amount of paint for a job, and

WHEREAS, the Niagara County Legislature therefore wishes to express its support for an industry-sponsored statewide paint collection system, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Niagara County Legislature hereby urges the New York State Legislature to enact paint recycling legislation which would require the paint industry to be responsible for collecting and managing leftover paint in New York funded by a consumer fee of no more than \$0.75/gallon, and be it further

RESOLUTION DIRECTING THE RENAMING OF THE NIAGARA COUNTY SOCIAL SERVICES BUILDING, LOCATED AT 20-40 EAST AVENUE IN THE CITY OF LOCKPORT, AS "THE WILLIAM L. ROSS COUNTY OFFICE BUILDING"

WHEREAS, the Honorable William L. Ross, of Wheatfield, is the longest-serving Chairman of the Niagara County Legislature, having been elected to preside over this august body a record 11 annual sessions, and

WHEREAS, the Honorable William L. Ross will have served the people of this County, and the Towns of Niagara, Wheatfield and Lewiston, in various elected offices and capacities for 30 years at the conclusion of the 2015 session of this Legislature, and

WHEREAS, Legislator Ross has publicly declared his retirement from elected office at the conclusion of his current term on December 31, 2015, and

WHEREAS, Legislator Ross's chairmanship of This Legislature has led to many important accomplishments for the People of the County of Niagara through a commitment to fiscally-conservative budgeting priorities, and principally among those accomplishments were:

- a 12 percent reduction in the County tax rate since 2004,
- an increase in the County's bond rating from a poor Baal with negative outlook to a current rating of Aa3,
- the reduction of the size of the County workforce by several hundred without the loss of services for residents,
- the reduction of the Niagara County Legislature from 19 to 15 members,
- a decrease in locally-directed spending at a time that state-mandated spending continually increased, and

WHEREAS, Legislator Ross has played a critical role in aligning local, state, and federal leaders around efforts to save the Niagara Falls Air Station, most notably overturning 2005 Base Realignment and Closure Commission recommendations to cease operation of the same, and

WHEREAS, Legislator Ross has served as a driving force in the efforts to expand commercial air traffic at the Niagara Falls International Airport, and

WHEREAS, as a Trustee of the Niagara County Community College, the Honorable William L. Ross has been a vigorous supporter of the expansion of that public academic institution, leading efforts by County government to support construction of the Niagara County Community College Culinary Institute and site it in downtown Niagara Falls, and

WHEREAS, the Honorable William L. Ross, despite leaving elected office, remains a beloved fixture in his home community of Wheatfield and throughout the County of Niagara, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that this Legislature does direct that the Vice Chairman shall issue a proclamation upon the last day of this session declaring the week of January 3rd to 9th 2016 "William L. Ross Week" in Niagara County, and be it further

RESOLVED, that this Legislature does direct that the county-owned property at 20-40 East Avenue in the City of Lockport, which is currently operating as the Social Services Department, shall be renamed "The William L. Ross County Office Building," effective the 1st Day of January, 2016, and be it further

RESOLVED, that this Legislature does direct the County Manager to appropriate funds as shall be necessary to property signify the same on the front and back accesses to said building, denoting it "The William L. Ross County Office Building," in letters which shall be visible not less than 150 feet from said entrances, and direct the Department of Public Works to take all necessary steps to ensure such markings have been put in place no later than the 4th Day of January, 2016, and be it further

RESOLVED, that this Legislature does direct that, effective the 1st Day of January, 2016, all correspondence from this Government, all letterheads pertinent to the facility located at 20-40 East Avenue, and all official utterances relative to said facility shall utilize the name The William L. Ross County Office Building, and be it further

RESOLVED, that this Legislature does direct the Clerk of the Legislature to emplace such legal notices as shall be necessary to identify the newly-named facility in the official newspaper(s) of this body no later than the 31st day of December, 2015, and be it further

RESOLVED, that this Legislature does further direct the Clerk of the Legislature to place upon this august body's schedule a formal dedication of The William L. Ross County Office Building on Monday, January 4th, 2016.

RESOLUTION BY THE NIAGARA COUNTY LEGISLATURE COMMITTING FUNDS TO AID IN THE COMPLETION OF THE NIAGARA COUNTY COMMUNITY COLLEGE "LEARNING COMMONS" PROJECT

WHEREAS, Niagara County Community College is an outstanding institution that offers individuals an excellent yet affordable education, and

WHEREAS, for decades, the Niagara County Legislature has repeatedly shown its commitment to investing county resources in the college to make it a premier higher education destination for students from across the region, state, country, and globe, and

WHEREAS, in April of this year, New York State Senator Robert G. Ortt and NCCC President James P. Klyczek announced that state funding had been secured for the college's proposed "Learning Commons" project, with the funds included in the state's 2015-2016 budget, and

WHEREAS, the Learning Commons initiative is a transformational project that will propel the college to the forefront of technology and includes the renovation of and upgrading of the college's library, a child development center, and a faculty resource center, and

WHEREAS, in announcing the project, Dr. Klyczek stated, "The Learning Commons will become the nucleus of the campus; a place for faculty to collaborate and help students develop critical thinking skills while incorporating state-of-the-art technology, multiple student support services, and a home for both students and staff. This will support NCCC's overarching goals to improve student success and graduation rates", and

WHEREAS, with an estimated cost of \$25 million, and \$12.5 million already allocated for the project in the state's 2015-2016 budget, Niagara County is required to provide a matching grant, and

WHEREAS, Niagara County Community College has received commitments totaling approximately \$2.5 million from sources other than the state and the county, leaving Niagara County with a commitment of approximately \$10 million for the Learning Commons project, and

WHEREAS, the County is fully prepared to see this project that will enhance the educational experience for students and faculty at Niagara County College come to fruition, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Niagara County Legislature does formally commit \$10 million to the Learning Commons initiative at Niagara County Community College, and be it further
