Whereas, in case of fire, immediate access to the affected premises is necessary to protect property and lives, and

Whereas, many buildings in Norwich Township are equipped with automatic fire alarms, that initiate fire calls from locations remote from the locations in which the alarms are situated, and where no individuals are present, and

Whereas, the Norwich Township Fire Department must respond to all alarms, valid or false and

Whereas in each response, it is necessary to gain entry int the premises to determine whether or not a fire exists. If there is no key available, or a person present to open the premises entry must be forced inot the premises which forced entry may present a security risk for the building subsequent to the fire department's entry, and

Whereas, the presence of a key on the premises would eliminate the necessity of forced entry in response to an automatic alarm.

Now Therefore Be It Resolved:

That the following section be added to the Norwich Township Fire Code:

Section 3 Definitions:

- B) Key Lock Box shall refer to the Knox-Box system, a high security key box system, designed to give emergency services immediate access.
- C) Automatic Fire alarm, as defined in NFPA 71 Sec. 1-3
- D) Central Station, as defined in NFPA 71 Sec. 1-3
- E) Central Station Services, as defined in NFPA 71 Sec. 1-3

- A) Owners or occupants of all structures, commercial, and otherwise, that are equipped with an Automatic Fire Alarm shall install a Key Lock Box on the premises.
- B) The key Lock Box shall be installed and maintained in such a manner as to provide access to the premises by the Norwich Township Fire Department in the event of the Norwich Township Fire Department's receiving a fire alarm from the premises.
- C) The master key to the Key Lock Box shall be maintained in the custody of the Norwich Township Fire Department, who shall have sole responsibility for giving access to any premises by use of the Key Lock Box as defined by department policy.
- D) The Key Lock Box shall be supervised by any security system present on the property.
- E) The Norwich Township Fire Department shall make a complete report of the circumstances surrounding the use of the Key Lock Box,

A motion was made by Mr. Rice and seconded by Mr. Workman to purchase the mower from Columbs Lawn and Garden at \$5300.00. On vote, all 'Aye'.

Steve requested seasonal help to get the cemetery ready for Memorial day and for the rest of the summer. Terry Weaston is available again this year. A motion was made by Mr. Rice and seconded by Mr. Workman to hire Terry at \$6.00 per hour. On vote, Mr. Rice 'Aye', Mr. Workman, 'Aye', Mr. Junk 'Nay' as he feels extra help should be used for mowing only.

Steve reported that the EPA has refused their request for a buring permit at the cemetery and gave the excuse that htey had several complaints. However they issued a permit to the Franklin County Fair Board which is in the middle of Hilliard. Mr. Junk and Mr. Rice will try to call Mr. Cobeen of the EPA to see if anything can be done.

The annual road survey was done last week and the Clerk has already received the results from the County Engineer's office as follows; they recomend that all of Timberbrook South be overlayed; crack seal only for Smiley Road, Polley Road, Stoney Bridge Lane and Rockford Drive; berms, primed and sealed for Hayden Blvd., Hayden Falls Drive, Anderson Drive and Bellann Drive. The Clerk was instructed to write to the County Engineer and request specifications for this work in preparation for bidding. The total for this work is estimated at \$135,000.00. Our current road mileage is 14.14 as reported by Engineer.

The property at 4085 Schirtzinger needs some berm work done. The men will do only our portion.

Mr. White of Ridgewood had requested yard tiling several months ago and is just now doing the work. Mr. Montgomery did an inspection and reported that it was a very nice job.

A driveway cut was requested on Old Post Lane. After some investigation the Board has no objections as the two parties involved have an agreement on the common portion of the drive.

Mr. and Mrs. Suttman, Mr. and Mrs. Still and Mrs. Stoner were present to discuss the ditch between Schirtzinger Road and Scioto Run Development. The drainage in this ditch has not been adequate since the Scioto Run Development was put in and puts more water into the ditch than it can handle. As a result the yards of these residents is eroding and they feel some one should be responsible for doing something about it. In the early stages of the Scioto Run Development the City of Hilliard said their engineers stated that this would not be a problem. The Board suggested that the Clerk could write to Mayor Reynolds and the Service Director to see what can be done, or that maybe they could meet with these residents and discuss the problem. The Clerk will send a copy of the letter to Mr. Suttman.

Mr. Junk-Chief Ellwanger; The department needs 6 SCBA and 10 bottles for the self contained breathing apparatus at cost of \$12,520.00 this is in the budget. A motion was made by Mr. Workman and seconded by Mr. Rice to purchase these items, on vote, all 'Aye'.

Lt. Long was present to report on the Haz-Mat physicals required for men on the department. Estimates are as follows;
