Mr. Rice moved to continue to pay the clerk, \$250.00 a year to write deeds and Mr. Buck seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Chuck Buck will serve as Station 83 chairman and Jim Rice will serve as Service Garage chairman. Mr. Buck will also serve as press liaison for any inquiries regarding the Township.

It was moved by Mr. Rice and seconded by Mr. Workman to purchase the chain and equipment as requested. Motion carried.

WATER RESCUE SUITS - In January of 1998 we purchased 2 water /ice rescue suits and support equipment. Capt. Midgley would like to purchase 2 additional suits so we can have a backup team for the rescuers. This would also help us to meet the "2 in, 2 out" mandates. The price for a suit is \$350.00 each, for a total of \$700.00. These additional suits would greatly improve our water and ice rescue capability and safety for the rescuers and victims. Mr. Rice moved to purchase the additional suits and Mr. Workman seconded the motion. Motion carried.

OHIO PAVEMENT SYSTEMS - Mr. Joe Kindler from this company visited our meeting this evening. He does road work for Townships and wanted to make us aware of what his company does. They do a resurfacing of roads that he claims will save money in the future. The cost is around \$6300.00 per mile for the process he uses. His process will extend the life of asphalt which in turn will reduce the cost for repairs or replacements. His product should go over roads that have been resurfaced in the last 3-4 years. It is most efficient when applied over roads before they have had a chance to deteriorate.

CAPTAIN LIST - The current captain list will run out in July of 2002. We have 6 men who are eligible to take the captains test. The test will be given on May 7 and interviews will follow the testing.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS - Mr. Workman received a letter from Rep. Wolpert asking us to try and identify several possible capital projects that the state could possibly assist in funding. Projects that are co-funded by other government entities would likely have a higher priority. There is no guarantee that the State Capital Budget will afford assistance to local governments, but he wants to be prepared if the opportunity exists. Three projects came to mind:

- 1. Schirtzinger Road
- 2. Hilliard radio project
- 3. Fire House

RIGHT OF WAY (CEMETERY) - Columbia Gas is interested in a right of way at Wesley Chapel Cemetery. Mr. Bob Marburger (rep. for Columbia) has offered \$1000.00 for the right of way. We asked for a gas tap line for the cemetery also. We would like to find out how much laying the line would cost and then ask this much from the gas company for the right of way. We will try and find out a cost and meet with Mr. Marburger on Thursday Jan. 17 at 9:00am to sign papers with him. It was moved by Mr. Rice to ask for the gas company to pay for the line to the building and also the tap, and if they did not agree to this, to accept at least the \$1000.00 for the right of way. Mr. Workman seconded the motion. Motion carried.

# REGULAR MEETING OF THE NORWICH TOWNSHIP TRUSTEES

### **JANUARY 28, 2002**

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Workman, Chairman. A prayer was offered by Mr. Buck and the pledge of allegiance was repeated by all. The minutes were accepted as presented. A copy of the warrants for this pay period will follow these minutes.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

A new Officer from Franklin County, Andy Harper, was present and he will be our 2<sup>nd</sup> shift officer in the Township. He said that he will be here for a period of time, but this will not be a permanent assignment for him. We welcomed him and wished him luck.

MRS. STITH - Steve Montgomery has been in touch with Mrs. Stith and she is happy with the repairs made to her monument. The repairs were needed as our mowers had damaged the monument some. She would still like to have a bench and tree in the area of her lots, but this may not happen for a period of time. If a tree and bench are added to that area of the cemetery, they may not be positioned near her lots.

AIR HAMMER - Steve has gotten prices for a new hammer and they range in price from \$925.00 to \$1350.00. His recommendation is an Atlas Copco model TEX 40PE with ergonomic handles, 1 ¼ " tool shank and 1,110 blows per minute. This hammer costs \$1350.00. The hammer is available from Lorenz Equipment. It was moved by Mr. Buck to have Steve purchase the hammer from Lorenz Equipment and Mr. Rice seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**RIGHT OF WAY** - The Gas company cancelled our agreement for the right of way at the Cemetery. The men who own the Church property would not give permission for a right of way at their property. The Gas company will have to go a different direction. Mr. Rice asked Bob Marburger to return the signed papers that the Township gave the Gas company.

GAS LINE - Mr. Workman asked the other Trustees if we should pursue putting in the gas line to the service garage, since the Gas company will give us a free gas tap. All Trustees felt this is a good idea, as gas heating would be better than continuing to use propane to heat the service garage. Mr. Pontius is checking into prices for laying the line from Dublin Road to the service garage. It was moved by Mr. Buck to proceed with the laying of a gas line to the service garage. Mr. Rice seconded the motion and vote passed.

**DROPS** - Work has begun on the drops around the fire house. Legg & Davis is the contractor. They expect that the job will be completed in 3-4 days, weather permitting.

## **NEW BUSINESS:**

**BWC SEMINAR** - The BWC is offering a seminar on Feb. 5 in Columbus that if attended by our Township, we will realize a 25% reduction in our costs for the year for coverage. Mr. Workman and Captain Midgley will attend the seminar for Norwich.

TREE REPAIRS - There are at least 3 trees at Wesley chapel that need to be looked at to see if they can be saved or removed. Steve received a quote from Davy on pruning to remove deadwood and thin maples and install support poles. The total cost of repairs and removal of debris is approximately \$1375.00. Mr. Buck moved that we treat the trees and try to save as many as possible. Mr. Rice seconded the motion to do the repairs. Motion carried.

**SELLING VEHICLES** - Chief Mc Dowell is ready to proceed with the advertising of the two vehicles that we need to sell. We have a 1992 Ford Crown Victoria and a 1983 Chevrolet Pick-up. They will be sold by sealed bid and will stipulate a minimum bid on both vehicles. The bids will be opened up at a regular Trustees meeting. We hope to have this arranged so the bid can be opened up at the Feb. 25<sup>th</sup> meeting.

**DRIVEWAY RESURFACING** - Chief Mc Dowell has most of the information that he needs to advertise the bid for this job. We hope to advertise this as soon as possible and be on the agenda for early spring for the resurfacing job to be done at the firehouse.

TRAINING TOWER - Mike Keenan, Washington Township Trustee, has approached Norwich township about building a training structure to be shared by both Townships. An estimated cost of the project could be \$200,000.00 to \$300,000.00. He would like us to ask the fair board if there is a possibility that it could be built somewhere on their property. The Chief's have been asked to talk to Mr. Keenan and see exactly what he has in mind. This is something that may only be used once or twice a year, and as we now use a structure at Prairie Twp. It may be something we are not interested in doing. We will have a report on the Chief's findings at a later time.

COMPUTER - Mr. Workman would like all 3 trustees to meet at the Cemetery and discuss the data entry of cemetery items with Steve. UAN (Auditors computer program) has a cemetery program that we may look at for the data entry. Even though the work may not begin until the service garage project is completed, we could be ready to go when the work is done. Mr. Workman would also like Capt. Midgley to attend this meeting to lend his advise on this problem. The meeting is scheduled for Feb. 4 @ 11 am

**INVENTORY** - The inventory for Station 80 and Wesley Chapel Cemetery has been turned in for 2002. It was moved by Jim Rice to approve the inventories of equipment of both the fire house and cemetery as presented. The motion was seconded by Chuck Buck. Motion carried.

**CORE SAMPLES** - We have received word that the core samples of the site for Station 83 have passed all tests.

THANKS - Mr. Buck wanted to thank the Ladies Auxiliary for the angel fire fighter pin that was given to the Trustees and Clerk last fall. They do a great job and he wanted to publicly thank them for all they do.

#### **FEBRUARY 11, 2002**

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Workman, Chairman. A prayer was offered by Mr. Rice and the pledge of allegiance was repeated by all. The minutes were accepted as presented. A copy of the warrants for this pay period will follow these minutes.

# **BUSINESS:**

**SHERIFF** - Officer Harper reported that the home invasion at Polly & Dublin Road last week, someone has been apprehended. The homeowner identified the man from a line up.

YMCA - Representatives from the fund raising committee, Judge Charles Schneider, Tom Katzenmeyer & Donna Swenson attended our meeting this evening. They asked for additional funds in the way of a matching donation with the City of Hilliard. The committee is \$250,000.00 short of their goal of raising \$1.8 million needed to be the second location to be started in the building process. The second Y will be started in August of 2002. The committee will continue to try and raise monies, but whatever they are short, Norwich Township will pay 50/50 with the City. The most the Township would have to pay is \$125,000.00. Hilliard funds at this time is \$1,547,190.21.

The Trustees would like some time to think over this proposal. They would like the committee to be sure that the City of Hilliard will match our funds. At our next meeting, we will have an answer for Judge Schneider and committee.

CAR BIDS - The advertisement for bidding on the two vehicles to be sold at the Township will run in both local papers on Feb. 13 & 20<sup>th</sup>. The 1992 Crown Vic has 69,640 miles and a minimum bid of \$500.00. The 1983 Chevy Pick-up has 22,300 miles and a minimum bid of \$1,000.00. The bids will close on Feb. 22<sup>nd</sup> at 4:00pm, and the bids will be opened up at the Trustees meeting on Feb. 25<sup>th</sup> at 6:30pm.

**DRIVEWAY RESURFACE** - Chief Mc Dowell had a proposal from Richard Roberts for services for this project of asphalt renovation of our drive at the fairgrounds and the fire department. His proposal for project services is as follows:

- 1. Prepare estimate of cost & preliminary drawing.
- 2. Prepare specifications & drawings for the subject project.
- 3. Furnish full time inspection during construction.

He has estimated his time at 354 hours @ \$25.00/ hour for a total cost of \$8,850.00. He will keep track of h is actual time and if it is less, we will pay a lesser amount. He will not bill more than the 354 hours if it goes over. It was moved by Mr. Rice and seconded by Mr. Buck to hire Mr. Roberts as this project supervisor. Motion carried. We hope to advertise in the Columbus Dispatch 2 times on March 1 & 8 and open the bids on 3/25/02. The job needs to started as soon as possible to be finished before June 15, 2002.

**SERVICE GARAGE** - Construction progress is going well. Mr. Pontius listed 5 items for consideration.

- 1. Approval for Construction Materials Testing & inspection Services by HC Nutting Co. for an amount of \$2500.00.
- 2. Recommend approval of Countryside Construction proposal for the gas line at \$5500.00.
- 3. Recommend approval for Office Workstation by Functional Office Furnishings In the amount of \$1708.00.
- 4. Recommend approval for a flat file for integration into the workstation by Cannell Reprographics at a cost of \$561.00.
- 5. Breaking away from the existing gray color scheme and going with these colors as follows: building walls = beige/off-white = hunter green

gutters, downspouts & doors = white (existing)

Mr. Buck moved that we approve items 1-4 on this list and check about the colors before voting on the color change. Mr. Rice seconded the motion. Motion carried.

HB 410 - A letter was sent to Michael Cochran of the Ohio Township Association calling to his attention that we WERE NOT against this bill. Where he got his information we do not know. A copy of the letter was also sent to Rep. Wolpert.

INSURANCE - We have received a request from Scott Rider, local insurance agent, wishing to bid on our insurance package this year before renewal in July. We welcome his request and will get in touch with him so he can start the process of getting prices for us.

EMA - March 7<sup>th</sup> @ 9:00am there will be a meeting dealing with anti-terrorism activities over the last several years and how we can help local communities prepare. Chief Mc Dowell has agreed to be our representative to this meeting and will report on the meeting to the Trustees.

PATCHES & PUMPER - Our Patches & Pumper robot was put into service in 1995, and has had a lot use. P & P has been a regular fixture at Safety Town, the Franklin County Fair and he makes regular visits to Children's Hospital and many other community events. This usage and age is taking a toll and repairs & adjustments are

needed. An overhaul program is available at a cost of \$1,135.00 (new robot = \$8500.00). It was moved by Mr. Rice to repair P & P and Mr. Buck seconded the motion. The motion carried. Repair time will be 4-6 weeks.

FDIC - Captain Midgley would like to attend this Conference in Indianapolis again from April 9-12, 2002. He has attended this conference in the past and has found the information presented an excellent training opportunity. The cost to attend is approx. \$950.00 which includes hotel and meals. He would also like to have 8 additional members of the department to attend on the last day which will include vendors of fire apparatus, equipment, turnout gear & new innovations will be presented for display. Their admission would be \$55.00 each for a total of \$440.00. Mr. Buck moved that we send Capt. Midgley and the additional members on the final day to the conference. Mr. Rice seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**BANNER** - Firefighter Morales and Capt. Ritzenthaler would like to purchase 2 of the "THANK YOU" banners to be used at the firs, 4<sup>th</sup> of July, Old Hilliard Day and any other times when needed. The banners are \$99.95 each for a total of \$199.90. Mr. Rice moved to purchase the banners and Mr. Buck seconded the motion. Motion carried.

COPIER - Our current copier is over 10 years old. We have had several problems in the past few months resulting a lot of down time. Due to the age, the department would like to replace it. Chief Long has talked with Gordon Flesch Company (who now provides us with our service contract for the current copier) and they have quoted us a price of \$10,761.00 which includes a government discount. Our maintenance agreement which includes toner is \$.0012 per copy. Our plans are to keep the old copier and use it to make color copies that the new unit will not do. We would also keep the maintenance agreement but this cost would be way down due to the low number of copies made. **METAL DETECTOR** - During fire emergencies we sometimes need to shut off the gas and / or the water at the curb boxes in residents yards. Most times they are grown over with grass or are covered with snow in the winter. Capt. Kaufman has found a suitable unit at Radio Shack for \$99.00. The department would like to purchase one unit. Mr. Buck moved to buy the unit and Mr. Rice seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**SBC AMERITECH** - 10 digit dialing (area code = 7 digit number) will be required for all local calls placed from the 614 and 380 area codes as of Sept. 21, 2002. After this date if you forget to dial the area code, your call will not be completed and you will be prompted to include the area code. Existing numbers in the 614 area will not be changed. The 380 code will be assigned to customers after October 2002.

An executive session was called to order at 5:00pm to discuss personnel matters and also the land acquisition for Station 83. Executive session ended at 6:23pm.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

**PARKING LOT** - Four bids have been picked up for the parking lot project as of this date. Bids will be opened up at 12 noon on March 25 and a decision may be made on awarding the job at the evenings Trustees meeting. This change of time for opening up the bid was made due to error on bid sheets.

**COMPUTER PROGRAM** - Mr. Montgomery reported that he has 80% of Section D ready for computer input. The computer and computer program has arrived and will be installed down at the Cemetery when Steve is ready for them.

PATCHES & PUMPER - The repaired robot is on his way back from repairs.

**SATURN RD.** - Steve has been working on the standing water problem in this area, and there are definitely roots in the tiles. The County has agreed to boar out the lines and hopefully this will alleviate the standing water problem.

**BOARD OF HEALTH** - The annual meeting will be held on March 18 at 6:00pm at Berwick Party House. This meeting is required by ORC for the purpose of appointing a chairman and secretary to the District. A representative from each Township is required to attend. Mr. Buck thinks he will be able to attend as our representative.

## **NEW BUSINESS:**

**Station 83** - The Township attorney, Pam DeDent presented to the Trustees an Agreement for Purchase of Real Estate by and between Soma Co. and the Norwich Township Trustees. It was moved by Mr. Rice to accept the agreement to purchase .59 acres for a purchase price of \$103,250.00 to be paid to the Soma Co. Motion was seconded by Mr. Workman. On vote, Mr. Rice, "Aye", Mr. Workman, "Aye" and Mr. Buck, "Abstain". On other terms of this agreement, Soma will donate 2.5 acres of the entire 3.09 tract to Norwich Township of undeveloped land located in the City of Hilliard. Attached to these minutes is a draft of this agreement drafted 3/8/02. A final draft will be attached in the future.

**TERRIORISM WORKSHOP** - The Franklin County Emergency Management Agency is offering a training session on March 27 in Groveport, Ohio. Chief Mc Dowell will attend as Norwich Township's representative.

SERVICE GARAGE - During the development of the Construction Documents for this project, we remained cognizant of adding any unnecessary cost items to keep the costs to a minimum. Unfortunately, two items need to be added. New soffits for the existing garage at a cost of \$3795.00 and a replacement of the existing side door & frame at a cost of \$750.00. It was moved by Mr. Buck to make these additional repairs and Mr. Workman seconded the motion. Motion carried.

4330 SCHRITZINGER RD. - After the storm of March 9, a large tree came down in the Township right of way. Steve moved what he could, but the rest of the tree needs to come down as it is a safety concern as it stands. We asked Steve to have Davy Tree take down the remaining tree as it is too large for the Township to deal with.

DAMAGED FENCES - Steve reported that there are some areas in an around the Cemetery that has fences that need repaired or replaced. One area is between the Cemetery and the new home development on the SW. An estimated of \$1600.00 was received and Mr. Buck moved to have the repairs done and Mr. Workman seconded the motion. Motion carried. Mr. Buck also suggested to have some landscaping done when the repairs are completed.

STORAGE BUILDING - Steve would also like to recommend building a 24x24 storage building behind the dirt building. This would serve as a structure to lock up and store small equipment, and also keep things from view of the housing development. The structure would also have two 6' gates for easy access. He had one estimate of \$2400.00 and the Trustees would like to have another estimate before giving the ok. They thought this is a good idea, but wanted another estimate. MUSEUM - The Township is interested in participating with the Historical Society on a project involving a Town Hall and a Fire Museum. The Township feels this is a way to be a part of the Bicentennial for the State of Ohio. Hilliard will be celebrating 150 years of History. One of the first questions would be where to locate this structure. In the Historical Village, near the proposed City Hall or at the entrance of the fairgrounds near the marque? The Township is willing to help, but co-coordinating needs to be done with the Historical Society. Chief McDowell and Capt. Ritzenthaler will work with the society to see what can be done.

# REGULAR MEETING OF THE NORWICH TOWNSHIP TRUSTEES

## **MARCH 25, 2002**

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Workman, Chairman. A prayer was offered by Mr. Buck and the pledge of allegiance was repeated by all. The minutes were accepted as presented. A copy of the warrants for this pay period will follow these minutes.

# **OLD BUSINESS:**

**POLICE PROTECTION:** An article will be in the next Norwich Township Newsletter talking about the issue of police protection. Explanations will be given about the cost of the police protection for the unincorporated areas of Norwich Township and what will be done in the future about funding this expense. Meetings will be held on May 6 & Maya 20 at 7:00pm during our regular Township meeting.

Mr. Buck would like to have a representative from the Sheriff's department attend our next meeting to discuss response time in the Township. He was concerned about the response time last Sunday when we had a reported shooting in the Township.

**CONSTRUCTION MEETING:** Concerns about the gas line to the service garage are to be discussed. When does the gas company think they will have these lines available? The building is on schedule for completition around April 3.

The Trustees are considering additional insulation for the inside of the service garage and have had 2 proposals. The first option is \$7337.00 and includes white vinyl facing between the purlins at the roof deck on treated wood furring strips. The second option is \$8527.00 and is reinforced white vinyl faced fiberglass blanket insulation between purlins at the roof deck on fire treated wood furring strips which will be fastened to the purlins. It was moved by Mr. Buck to do option #2 for \$8527.00 at the service garage and to do the work as soon as possible. Mr. Workman seconded the motion. Motion passed.

# **BLACK TOP BIDS:** The bids were opened and announced at noon on March 25, 2002. Bids were as follows:

Mr. Roberts (project supervisor) and Chief Mc Dowell looked over the bids to make sure all were complete and upon their recommendation, Mr. Rice moved that we accept Strawser Paving as the contractor for the project. Mr. Buck seconded the motion. Motion carried. Completion date for the job is June 15, 2002.

**STUMPS:** The trees on Schritzinger Road have been trimmed and Mr. Montgomery has stated that there are 5 stumps that need removed from the Cemetery. He will get prices on the removal.

**CEMETERY RECORDS:** Section D is completed and Section E has been started on. Steve will continue to work on getting the records ready for entry into the new computer program. The computer is in and ready to be set up at the service garage when that job is completed.

**DEED**: Word from our attorney, Pam DeDent, said all parties involved are working on finalizing the deed preparation. When this is completed, we will pay for the additional land and then be ready to bid the project.

RADIO SYSTEM: A meeting was held with Chief Garnett, Chief Mc Dowell, Chief Long, Doug Broward and also Chuck Buck to discuss the radio system. The other parties are to get back to us, but no word from them as of yet.

HISTORICAL SOCIETY: Chief Mc Dowell asked the Township if they would be willing to donate money to the Bicentennial Committee for Hillard for the upcoming events in 2003. Mr. Buck moved that the Township give \$2500.00 for start up costs and for whatever is needed. Mr. Workman seconded the motion. Motion carried. We are permitted to give as the project is a 501.c3 organization.

MUSEUM PLAN: A letter is needed from the Township stating that the Trustees are in favor of the museum and will work in conjunction with the Historical Society on this project. This letter will go to the city of Hilliard and Parks & Recreation.

# **NEW BUSINESS:**

MOSQUITO FOREM: Steve will attend this meeting this year to be held on April 3 from 7:30-9:30am.

STATE WIDE EMERGENCY PLAN: Chief Long reported that this plan will be modeled like FEMA. We will be putting together resources to use in an emergency. Scramble response will be within 30 minutes and we would never commit more than 50% of our staff at a time. Mr. Workman recommended we adopt this plan and Mr. Buck seconded the recommendation. Motion carried.

AIR CASCADE: In order to improve the ability of the staff at Station 82 to keep their self contained breathing apparatus cylinders full, they need to add a cascade system at that station. Now, when a cylinder is low, that crew has to bring it into station 80 to top it off. This causes a delay in getting the cylinder filled and moves a truck out of it's district. Fire Fighter Hayes, has researched the equipment needs for this system and received three price quotes. The best price would be to purchase a 4 cylinder system from Valley Gas in Hilliard at a cost of \$1645.40. Mr. Buck moved to purchase the system and Mr. Workman seconded the motion. Motion carried.

MEDICAL EQUIPMENT: Lt. Papa has requested that we replace two pieced of medical equipment. The heart monitor we use is over 12 years old and no longer is being supported by the manufacturer. To purchase a new LifePak 12 will cost \$16,876.00. The new equipment will be placed on a front line medic and the older unit placed on a first response engine with the 12 year old unit being taken out of service. We also have a battery support system that is 19 years old and is also no longer supported by the manufacturer. The old battery support unit will be disposed of. The new unit will cost \$1,236.00. We can also pre-purchase a service agreement for these new units at a discount price of \$1,100.00. Total cost of this request is \$19,212.00. It was moved by Mr. Buck to purchase the medical equipment requested and Mr. Workman seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Workman, Chairman. A prayer was offered by Mr. Buck and the pledge of allegiance was repeated by all. The minutes were accepted as presented. A copy of the warrants for this pay period will follow these minutes.

# **OLD BUSINESS:**

**STUMPS**: No prices yet for the stump removal in the Township.

PATCHES & PUMPER: Has not been returned yet from second repair.

**CEMETERY RECORDS:** Steve will be ready for assistance in entering the data when he moves into the new office.

**SERVICE GARAGE**: Project should be completed by April 16, 2002.

**CEMETERY:** The road work in the cemetery was done about 4 years ago. The question is being asked if the roads need to be sealed? Will sealing preserve the roads for a few more years? Steve will get a recommendation about what we should do.

A sidewalk is needed around the new office building and also an apron is needed in front of the soil building. Steve will get quotes about these jobs.

**DEED**: Word from Pam DeDent is that some minor changes in the purchase agreement earlier received have been made. We will soon have a limited warranty deed for approval, and we are also going to purchase title insurance. She will be in touch when all is ready.

**RADIO SYSTEM:** Chief Garnett has not heard from Mayor Ward on any new progress on this project.

**PARKING LOT:** The project will be completed in two parts, starting on the front lot first and the back lot second. The project is expected to begin on April 15, and weather permitting, completed in 45 days.

MUSEUM: There will be a meeting between the Historical Society, City of Hilliard (Parks & Recreation) and Norwich Township about the future museum that we hope will get built. The meeting will be held on April 25 @ 7PM at City Hall. Chief Mc Dowell, Capt. Ritz. And Mr. Buck will attend this meeting.

MOSQUITO FOREM: Steve attended this meeting and said that problems will be handled the same way as in years past. Spraying will not be done as much and other preventative measures will be implemented. Timberbrook has standing water and he also feels that the trees are a source of the mosquito problem.

# **NEW BUSINESS:**

**LEAP ROAD CLOSING:** Leap road will be closed for 2 weeks beginning on April 15. It will be closed at the railroad tracks. Detour signs are up now.

GEOTECHNICAL STUDY: Steve Montgomery has expressed a concern that there is poor drainage conditions in the north end of the existing cemetery. The poor drainage is creating problems with excavation of gravesites in this area. He would like someone to conduct a test pit study of the area to evaluate site soil conditions and provide general recommendations to improve the drainage. H.C. Nutting Company has proposed to do a study of the area and problem for \$1940.00. It was moved by Mr. Buck and seconded by Mr. Rice to proceed with this study with H.C. Nutting Company. On vote, all "Aye".

**DUMP TRUCK:** Steve presented the Board with specs from the State Bid Program on a new dump truck. In the last two years he has had to spend over \$4500.00 on repairs of his main truck. His concern is that it will break down again during winter when he needs to do plowing of the Township streets, and this truck will be shut down for days for repairs. He cannot afford to have this happen. The truck is a 1996. He would like to purchase a 2002 dump truck with front plow and spreader. Factory price with options is \$70,468.00 and we will receive a discount of \$22,160.64. The final state price will be \$52,842.36. He thinks he will be able to get a trade in of \$35,000.00. It was moved by Mr. Buck to go ahead with the purchase of the new 2002 truck and Mr. Rice seconded the motion. On vote, "Aye".

FUTURE GOALS FOR CEMETERY: Mr. Buck would like to have some projects for Wesley Chapel Cemetery in 2003. He thinks new fencing around the Cemetery would improve the looks. The white, plastic fencing would be good as it would not need maintenance. The sign that is on Dublin Road needs to be placed where motorists can see it from driving both directions. And trees need to be added to parts of the Cemetery where there are no trees or bushes. It would give the Cemetery a warmer look for families visiting their loved ones.

**BRIDGE REPORT:** We received our annual bridge report for our only bridge in the Township, located on Stoney Bridge Lane. The report from Franklin County Engineers Department states that the bridge is in FAIR condition.

SCHRITZINGER ROAD: Residents on this road have reported that one home has 2 motor homes parked in the driveway and they are hooked up with water and electricity. The motor homes have been in the driveway for months. The County Zoning Department has sent the home owner a letter asking that the motor homes be removed from the property.

The work on the retaining wall on this road is scheduled to begin the beginning of June. The Trustees need to sign a paper for beginning of the work to start.

UNIFORM STANDARDS: Chief Long is working on developing new uniform standards for the department. He has designed a new shirt patch that will be added to any new shirts as they are replaced.

POLICE PROTECTION: A news item will appear in the April Township Newsletter talking about the Public Meetings to be held on May 6 & 20<sup>th</sup> about Township police protection. The meetings will be held at 7:00pm after the regular Trustees meetings. A news item will also run in the local papers to let people know what the meetings are about. The residents of the unincorporated areas of Norwich Township will be advised of the costs involved in keeping this service. As it stands now, the 2 levies do not pay for the additional police service.

A representative from Joe Testa's office will be present to tell homeowners how much the additional coverage will cost them if they want to continue the service. Washington Township is loosing their unincorporated areas and they may not want to continue with the additional police service, and then Norwich Township would be responsible for the cost of all the police protection, (not just ½ that we pay now, shared with Washington).

**GROUND BREAKING:** Mr. Buck thinks that we should be planning some kind of ground breaking ceremony for Station 83. We hope to have the deed soon, and will be letting the bid for the project soon after the deed is received.

# **APRIL 22, 2002**

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Workman, Chairman. A prayer was offered by Mr. Rice and the pledge of allegiance was repeated by all. The minutes were accepted as presented. A copy of the warrants for this pay period will follow these minutes.

Janell Thomas, from Washington Township, was present at our meeting this evening to present the Norwich Township Trustees with an award. Last year, the Township funded the handicapped play area in Homestead Park. It was dedicated in July and at that time, Janell registered this new play area with the Ohio Parks Association. The play area was awarded the Outstanding Park Area Development Award in the category of \$250,000.00 to \$500,000.00 from the Ohio Parks & Recreation Association.

STUMPS - No pricing on removal of stumps in the Township.

**CEMETERY-** The new office at the cemetery is completed and the furniture has been delivered and Steve will set up the computer this week. Korine Kitchen will be hired to help in the data entry of cemetery records.

The roof leaked last week with the hard rains we experienced. Countryside was called and a man was sent out to caulk the areas that leaked.

Steve has contacted Badurina Construction and Legg & Davis to come out and give an estimate on the sidewalks around the new service garage and the soil shed.

**PARKING LOT** - The specs that went out for the parking lot resurfacing were found to have an error. Instead of 6 inches of asphalt, the specs just listed 3 inches. The additional 3 inches of #301 asphalt will cost \$48,000.00. Mr. Buck expressed an opinion that this figure seems high, due to the fact that the whole job is \$124,000.00. Mr. Rice moved that we add the additional 1020 tons of #301 asphalt at an estimated cost of \$48,000.00 with the stipulation that the cost is refigured just to make sure the price is correct. Mr. Buck seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**GEOTECHNICAL TESTING -** H.C. Nutting has completed the physical testing and we are awaiting the results.

**DUMP TRUCK** - The new truck for the cemetery has been ordered and will probably take 3 months for delivery. Steve is going to check with Center City and see what price they will give us on trade for our truck. Another government had traded in a similar truck with 40,000+ miles and they received \$35,000.00 for trade. Our truck has only 19,000+ miles on it, so we hope to get a better trade in.

MOTOR HOMES - The motor homes that have been parked on Schirtzinger Road have been ordered to be moved by April 28<sup>th</sup>.



Held

1468 Birchwood Drive - Homeowner, Gary & Denise Brown were present and had a petition from their neighbors who stated they had no objections to the construction of the drive to the garage on the Brown's property. The neighbors who signed were as follows; G.E. Rogers, 5949 Timberbrook Lane; Rebecca Hutchins, 1438 Birchwood Dr.; Mr. & Mrs. Eugene Kent, 5743 Renner Road and James Cramer of 5950 Timberbrook. The one neighbor, Rebecca Hutchins was present at the meeting and she had no objections to the drive.

The concern from the trustees is that by putting in a drive, it may cause drainage problems, because of the ditch the drive will have to go over. Steve Montgomery has looked over the situation, and he feels if a 10" tile is used, it should improve the drainage in that area. If there is any problem, it would only effect the Brown's. It was moved by Mr. Rice to allow the Brown's to install a drive from the stub road to the garage on his property, using a 10" tile. Mr. Buck seconded the motion. Motion carried.

HURST TOOL - During testing, it was discovered that our current HURST tool gas powered pump was not performing to specifications. After sending it in for an estimate of repair cost, we were told it would cost \$2100.00 to repair and the unit is over 10 years old. A new pump from Finley Fire will cost \$5800.00 and Chief Long has recommended we purchase a new pump. A new pump will allow us to run two tools at a time rather than one. Mr. Buck moved that we purchase the new HURST tool from Finley Fire at a cost of \$5800.00. Mr. Rice seconded the motion and the motion passed.

CARS ALONG DUBLIN ROAD - The Trustees received a letter from Township resident, Gail Waldeck, expressing her concern with the amount of cars that seem to be for sale along Dublin Road. She wanted to know if the Township could do anything about this problem? The Township cannot do anything, as Dublin Road is a county road, and she would have to contact them. The clerk will write a letter to her and let her know what she needs to do since the cars are parked on county roads.

RULES SIGN - The Cemetery was in need of a new sign stating the rules for Wesley Chapel Cemetery to go on the renovated garage. Inspector Manske got in touch with National Sign Company, to have them manufacture a new rules sign. They visited the site and said they would manufacture a new sign and install it during the week of May 13, 2002. The cost estimate was approved by Inspector Manske in the amount of \$1.00.

We are very appreciative of the work that National Sign Company has done for us in the past. They are a good community neighbor and the clerk will write a thank you to them for this most recent work they are doing for us.

# **MAY 6, 2002**

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Workman, Chairman. A prayer was offered by Mr. Buck and the pledge of allegiance was repeated by all. The minutes were accepted as presented. A copy of the warrants for this pay period will follow these minutes.

# **OLD BUSINESS:**

STUMPS - Mr. Montgomery had an estimate from CENTRAL OHIO STUMP REMOVAL, and they would remove the stumps and grind them up for a price of \$75.00 each. We have 5 stumps that need to be removed. Mr. Buck entered a motion that we hire COSR for the removal of the 5 stumps in the township. Mr. Rice seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**ROOF** - After the repair of the new roof at the cemetery, it has not leaked in the past week. There have been some good hard rains, and there were no leaks.

**1468 BIRCHWOOD DRIVE** - Mr. Brown has installed the 10 " tile on his property. The driveway should be installed soon.

FIRE MUSEUM - The fire department museum proposal has been presented to the Franklin County Historical Society, the Franklin County Fair Board, Hilliard Parks & Recreation and the Old Hilliard Commission. All have approved the basic idea/concept. We have been informed that our next step is to present the detailed architectural plans for approval to the Old Hilliard Commission. The project seems to have progressed to the point that we need an architect and a budget. Should we use the architect that the Historical Society is using? Mr. Buck feels we need to contact Pete Beagle from the city and make sure he will give us the OK to precede with the project. Chief Mc Dowell and Capt. Ritzenthaler will be in touch with him as soon as possible.

GEOTECHNICAL TESTING - Mr. Montgomery has not received any reports from H. C. Nutting as of yet. They were out last week and took a few more soil samples. They have reported to Steve that the problem may be surface water and if that is the case, it could be easily fixed by putting a tile in the NE corner of the cemetery and have it drain to a drop area. We will await their official report.

# **NEW BUSINESS:**

MEMORIAL DAY - The Township gives on a yearly basis a donation the American Legion a donation of \$100.00 for Memorial Day expenses. It was moved by Mr. Buck to donate the \$100.00 to the American Legion and Mr. Rice seconded the motion. Motion carried.

CONCRETE WORK - Mr. Montgomery had two estimates for the concrete work to be done at the cemetery. The work to be done is a 30x40 pad at the soil shed; a 12x14 apron and 77° of sidewalk around the new addition to the service garage. An estimate from Legg & Davis was \$12,855.00, with a completition date of 60 days. Badurina Construction gave a price of \$12,850.00 with work to be started immediately. It was moved by Mr. Buck and seconded by Mr. Rice to award the work to Badurina Construction for the price of \$12,850.00. We hope the work is completed before Memorial Day.

**CONTRACT SWEEPERS** - It is time again to have the streets swept in the Township and the price this year will be \$1330.00. Mr. Rice moved to have Contract Sweepers do the job and Mr. Buck seconded the motion. Motion carried. Mr. Montgomery will be in touch with them to do the job.

**FENCE** - Mr. Montgomery had received prices on a fence along the line between the cemetery and the housing development that joins the cemetery. Treudeau Fencing gave an estimate of \$2495.00 and Mr. Rice moved that we have the fence installed and Mr. Buck seconded the motion. Motion carried. The fence they are to put up is a better grade than originally promised, as the original is not available for 6 weeks, and we want installation immediately. They will start the project the week of May 20.

MONUMENT APPROVAL - Mr. Montgomery has had a request for a monument in Section R, that is over the recommended size. The monument is 6x1x6". The trustees did not have a problem with the larger monument as the drawing is very pleasant. Mr. Rice moved and Mr. Buck seconded the motion to approve the large monument.

POLICE LEVY MEETING - A public meeting to discuss the police levy in Norwich Township began at 7:00PM, with 3 residents of the unincorporated area of Norwich Township present. Also attending the meeting were 3 Officers from Franklin County Sheriff's department and 2 representatives from the Auditors Office. Mr. Rice gave a brief description of when and how the levies were placed in Norwich Township. There were no questions from the audience, but the representatives from the Auditors office, Stan Dixon & Laurie Ludlum gave examples of what coverage would cost the homeowner if the coverage were to be continued.

Another public meeting will be held on May 20 @ 7:00PM. Mr. Buck asked that the two local newspapers be contacted and see if they will print an article on the meeting coming up.

# **NEW BUSINESS:**

**SOIL & WATER CONSERVATION** - Jennifer Fish visited our meeting this evening to update us on what will be happening on May 22. At 10 a.m. there will be a signing agreement where Townships agree to participate in the future and continuing study of the area. It may be another  $1\frac{1}{2}-2$  years before the actual recommendations are made. When the study is finished, all Townships will have the opportunity to accept their final decision or not. The Hellbranch Watershed Forum was created out of a need to address storm water runoff, which contributes to flooding in the Hellbranch Watershed and to the decline of water quality in the Hellbranch Run and Big Darby Creek.

CHAIN SAW - The fire department needs to replace one of their saws. The Homelite saw carried on engine 80 has failed. This saw is approx. 20 years old and is no longer repairable. A replacement of a Husqvarna saw for \$439.95 from Advance Power Equipment is recommended. Mr. Rice moved and Mr. Buck seconded to purchase the saw. Motion carried.

REPLACEMENT MEDIC - Chief Long is working with Horton's to develop a set of specifications for a new medic vehicle. He has completed this task and has a set of specs that meet our needs. It is estimated that the new medic will run in the area of \$100,000 to \$150,000. The new medic will replace the 1996 unit that is now in service, which has over 88,000 miles on it. Chief Long recommends that we bid the replacement with and without a trade in. We may want to keep this vehicle for the future need to a third unit in service.

INJURY - Larry Cordial was injured in a training exercise, but he will be back to work soon.

KNOX BOX - After concerns from residents about having to have the knox box, and having to pay for one and have it installed; the Township consulted our attorney to get an opinion. There is a waiver that the department has set up, for a resident to sign. The fire department is opposed to having businesses being able to sign the waiver. The Trustees have tabled this item and will discuss it at a later time.

3685 SCHIRTZINGER RD. - Resident, Mary Panzone, was present at our meeting this evening with a drainage problem. She wanted the Trustees to give her an opinion on her problem, but the Trustees had not received her letter. She had sent it to the post office box #, and that address does not exist. The resident says that the tile has a township number and tag on it, but the Trustees are not confident that it is our tile. The township cannot put a tile on private property. Mr. Montgomery stated that he had been told by the Board of Health, not to work on any tile on private property. The resident wanted permission to stop up the tile, but if they do, they would be responsible for damage done to other property owners. The trustees will table this item.

**POLICE LEVY** - Around 35-50 residents attended our meeting this evening for the discussions about the police levy. An explanation was given to the residents about how much the sheriff contract costs us, and how much money is collected from the levy. By a show of hands, it looked like the residents were split in their feelings about continuing the levy or not.

Another public meeting will be held on June at 7:00p.m. to further discuss this matter.

800 RADIO UPGRADE - Upgrade costs were received and the portion for Norwich Township would run around \$499,990.00 It was moved by Mr. Buck to approach the city of Hilliard with this proposal: 9 years of dispatching in exchange for our participation in this project, with the upfront money. Mr. Rice seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**NFiPA**- The 2002 NFiPA codes are now available and the 12 volume set will cost the department \$1008.00, as a member. It was moved by Mr. Buck & seconded by Mr. Rice to purchase the code books. Motion carried.

Adjourn for executive session at 8:00p.m. for personell matters. Out of executive at 8:55 p.m.

# REGULAR MEETING OF THE NORWICH TOWNSHIP TRUSTEES

### **JUNE 3, 2002**

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Workman, Chairman. A prayer was offered by Mr. Buck and the pledge of allegiance was repeated by all. The minutes were accepted as presented. A copy of the warrants for this pay period will follow these minutes.

# **OLD BUSINESS:**

**800 RADIO UPGRADE** - Mr. Buck has been in meetings with Chief Garnett of the Hilliard Police Department, and the city of Hilliard will offer Norwich Township 8 years of dispatching and also cover all the maintenance costs for the radios in exchange for the Township fronting the money for the radios. We will also get a reduction in price on the radios of around \$60,000.00 + if we act now. It was moved and seconded to go ahead with the radio upgrade.

KNOX BOX WAIVER - This item was tabled at out last meeting and Chief Mc Dowell expressed the same concerns with this issue. Himself along with Captain Ritzenthaler are against offering waivers to residents and businesses. A resolution was passed in 1991 that required homeowners and businesses to have a knox box if the alarm was tied in to the fire department and alarm company. Upon discussion, it was decided that the Township will CONTINUE WITH OUR CURRENT POLICY. You must have a knox box if your alarm system is tied to the fire department.

**MEDIC** - Chief Long has looked over the specs for a new medic and he is satisfied with what he has seen. He will proceed with the bid process for a new medic and put in the specs the option for a second medic at the same price if we decide we need another. The estimated cost of the new medic will be \$150,000.00 + -.

COUNTRYSIDE CONSTRUCTION - The project at the cemetery is complete except one job. That job is to put a gas line from the road to the new service garage. Columbia Gas has not got gas in the area as of yet. Countryside will honor the price given to us if and when the gas company gets the gas line in. They would like to close out the job, but in order to do this we need to cancel out the change order for the gas line. It was moved by Mr. Buck and seconded by Mr. Rice to cancel the change order for the gas line at this time. Motion carried.

# **NEW BUSINESS:**

**TOWNSHIP PICNIC** - Our yearly picnic will be held on August 3 and the Township will again provide the hamburgers, hot dogs and table service. We hope everyone will be able to attend, it is always a good time for all.

4<sup>TH</sup> OF JULY - The 4<sup>th</sup> of July celebration is close at hand. We have been asked to make a donation to the Boosters Assoc. again this year to help defray costs. Mr. Buck moved that the Township donate \$200.00 to the association. Mr. Rice seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**TENT** - A tent was loaned to the Township by Roger Massie and after last Friday's storm the poles to the tent were damaged. Chief Mc Dowell will find out how much it will cost to replace the poles and get back to the Trustees with this information.

4030 POSTE LANE - Resident, Stephen Shirk, wrote a letter talking about his drainage problems. He has been in contact with Steve Montgomery who have come up with a solution. This solution also involves his neighbor, Mark Emerson. His driveway will have to be excavated and crossed to install the drain line to the Township ditch. Mr. Shirk and Mr. Emerson will install their own tile and catch basin and tie into the existing system to handle the water. They are confident this will help the drainage. The Trustees have given permission to these individuals to do this work under the supervision of Steve Montgomery.

YMCA - Judge Charles Schneider was present this evening to update the Township on the status of the YMCA. In April he met with Don Schonhardt and Tim Ward to confirm the cities pledge. The city has pledged \$600,000.00 and will pay this in 3 yearly payments. Other large pledges have come in from Brown Township for an additional \$10,000.00; Hilliard Methodist Church for \$3000.00; an individual for \$1000.00 and \$8104.00 from the sale of bricks.

The Patch family has given the YMCA a 99 year lease on the ground.

The amount of money needed to complete the drive is \$433,705.00. Norwich Township is being asked for an additional \$50,000.00 in addition to our previous pledge of \$250,000.00. We would be able to pay off the pledge in 4 years.

The Trustees will discuss this matter and get back with Judge Schneider.

**POLICE LEVY-** 4 residents were present for the presentation about the expected levy. Mr. Workman gave the residents the information about the cost and what is being collected from the current levy. He told the residents that at least 3-5 mills would have to be put on the ballot for consideration. As it stands, a levy will be put on the ballot, but as to how much, it has not been determined as of yet.

#### REGULAR MEETING OF THE NORWICH TOWNSHIP TRUSTEES

#### **JUNE 17, 2002**

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Workman, Chairman. A prayer was offered by Mr. Rice and the pledge of allegiance was repeated by all. The minutes were accepted as presented. A copy of the warrants for this pay period will follow these minutes.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

MUSEUM - The museum project is put on hold for the time being.

**800 RADIO** - The purchase agreement is coming to the township soon. Pam DeDent and the city are working on the agreement and all looks good.

**CEMETERY COMPUTER** - Mr. Rice had his neighbor, Rick Cavaleria, meet with Steve Montgomery last week and he is going to be giving advise on the program and software and entering the data into the system. Steve was pleased with his knowledge and willingness to help.

**MEDIC** - The advertising for the medic is appearing in the Dispatch and the bids will be opened up at the Trustees meeting on July 15 @ 7:00PM.

SHERIFF CONTRACT - The current contract expires on 12/31/2002. If the township is going to put a levy on the November ballot, it has to be filed with the Board of Elections by August 22 @ 4:00PM. Mr. Buck feels we need a meeting with Washington Township to see what they are going to do about the contract with the sheriff's department. He also feels we need some cost projections from the sheriff's department for the next 5 years. The clerk will write a letter to Sheriff Karnes to this effect and also contact Washington Twp.

**INSURANCE** - Our current health insurance is up for renewal on July 1, 2002. The Township has been getting quotes from other carriers and Mr. Rice moved to change insurance carriers to The Rider Financial Group (Scott Rider) who will use Central Benefits for the carrier. It was seconded by Mr. Workman. On vote, Mr. Rice, "Aye", Mr. Workman, "Aye" and Mr. Buck, "Abstain".

**NEW FIRE CODE** - A copy of the new fire code was given to the trustees last week by Capt. Ritzenthaler and he wanted them to look over the codes that will keep the department in concert with the Ohio Building Code which changes in July. It was moved by Mr. Rice and seconded by Mr. Buck to adopt the new codes. Motion carried.

This resolution adopts a township fire code prescribing regulations consistent with nationally recognized good practice for the safeguarding, to a reasonable degree, of life and property from the hazards of fire and explosion, arising from the storage, handling, and use of hazardous substances, materials, and from hazardous conditions in the use of, or occupancy of buildings or premises.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

FRANKLIN COUNTY FAIR - Phyllis Ernst was present and asked the Trustees for a contribution of \$1000.00 to help with expenses for the fair. The Franklin County Fair is a 501.3c organization. The trustees are supporters of the fair, but felt at this time, it was not the best time to give a contribution. They have had many unexpected expenses recently, and would like to be asked at a later time for a donation.

**CAPTAINS LIST** - The current captains list will expire on July 1, 2002. Tests; interviews with the Officers of the department and also with the Trustees were conducted in the past few weeks. The ranking is as follows: John King; Vince Papa; Greg Collier; Steve Russell; Mike Hull & Reggie Brown.

**COMPUTER UPGRADE** - Capt. Midgley outlined the need to upgrade our computer system. This upgrade is to replace the current server which is 6 years old. We would replace 6 of the oldest work stations; and also upgrade some software to improve operations. The total cost of this upgrade including installation will be \$31,222.72. This upgrade could be done in parts and not all at once. If the servers CRASHES, we are out of luck.

Mr. Buck moved to table this item for a month and then revisit the request. Mr. Rice seconded the motion. Motion carried.

ROAD GRADES - Steve Montgomery talked about the problem in the area of Astral Drive/Saturn Road & Schritzinger Rd. He had previously gotten an estimate from the County Engineers of under \$1000.00 to grade these areas so run off would be better and help in the drainage. The township would provide the truck for this work, with county employees doing the work. Around 200' are involved in the road grading. The neighbors involved have agreed to this work, to help in their drainage problems. Mr. Rice moved to have the county do the work and Mr. Buck seconded the motion. Motion carried.

OHIO FIRE CHIEF CONFERENCE - Chief Mc Dowell would like to attend this conference in July. The conference is being held in the Easton area. The cost of the conference is \$250.00. Mr. Buck moved to send the Chief to the conference and Mr. Rice seconded the conference. Motion carried.

**ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANT-** After the ad for the position ran in the two Hilliard papers, Chief Mc Dowell received 53 applications. Chief Mc Dowell, Chief Long, Capt. Ritz. & Linda Gill narrowed the list down to 7 to interview. These interviews will be held on June 20. After these interviews they will choose 2-3 people to be interviewed by the Trustees on June 27<sup>th</sup>. The pay for the position will be \$11.00/hour.

STATION 83 - After the bid opening on June 13, all the bids were above the 10% of \$2.7 allowed by law. After much discussion as to what to do, it was moved by Mr. Buck to raise the budget to \$3.2 and re-bid the project with alternates. Alternates include a temporary driveway; reduction of landscaping; deletion of courtyard pavers for concrete pavers; delete painted walls & ceilings in basement storage; delete solid surface countertops for plastic laminate; delete custom wood cabinets for pre-manufactured stock cabinets; change all 15 dormers to non-functional dormers; delete remaining 25 exterior in-ground uplights & reduce lighting fixtures in basement storage. Also we want to re-bid the sanitary sewer extension. Motion was seconded by Mr. Rice. Motion carried. Project will appear in paper June 21& 28<sup>th</sup> and bid to open on July 23<sup>rd</sup> again.

#### REGULAR MEETING OF THE NORWICH TOWNSHIP TRUSTEES

#### July 15, 2002

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Workman, Chairman. A prayer was offered by Mr. Rice and the pledge of allegiance was repeated by all. The minutes were accepted as presented. A copy of the warrants for this pay period will follow these minutes.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

YMCA - Judge Schneider was present and gave an update on the giving to the YMCA. A \$25,000.00 donation from the estate of Mary Miller was received just recently. A company from Grove City is donating shredded tires for the flooring of all the Y's, and this will be a savings of \$60,000.00 for Hilliard. All Trustees would like to give additional funds to the Y, but feel the Township is not able to do so at this time. The Township has already tabled other requests for funds at this time and will have to do the same for the Y. Judge Schneider advised us that the Y committee will go before P & Z in September. Ground may be broken this fall or most likely in the Spring. He will be back!

GEOLOGICAL TESTING - The study is back with a solution to the problems with elevated groundwater levels in section "D" at the north end of the cemetery. The groundwater table encountered here is encountered at elevations above the bottom of gravesite excavations and has created problems with burials. Historically, excess soils from grave excavations have been deposited in the ravine north of section "D". Mr. Montgomery has theorized that this soils fill had created a "dam" blocking natural drainage of groundwater in the adjacent ravine.

Recommendations of two actions to lower the water table in the area of section "D" were given. The first is to create a surface drainage pathway from the surface area of section "D" that contains tapped water due to the driveway. This area could be drained towards the ravine. The second recommendation is to place a system of drainage trenches within and around section "D". The drainage outlet should be day-lighted within the ravine. Based on the need to lower the local groundwater level to a depth of about 5 ft. below the existing ground surface, they anticipate that the depth of the trench should be at least seven (7) feet below the existing ground surface. They recommend that the trench drains be located as close as possible to the locations to be excavated and along opposite sides of the excavation locations if possible.

Steve said that his crew could possibly do the work, but Mr. Buck recommended that he get prices on having the work done by another company. Steve will get prices.

**OLD CEMETERY DUMP TRUCK** - The City of Clayton was supposed to send an offer, but we have not received it as of yet. Steve will check into this.

**COMPUTER** - Rick Cavaleria is ready to set up the program at the cemetery. All we need to do is hire a person who can type and do the data entry. He will show the person what to do and how to enter the information.

**BICENTENNIAL MEETINGS** - Chief Mc Dowell presented items that have been discussed at the meetings, and Hilliard will be 150 years old in 2003. Many events will be based on this fact. The committee is still trying to get the county bell for Franklin County cast at the Franklin County Fair next year.

800 MHZ RADIO - It was moved by Mr. Buck and seconded by Mr. Rice to authorize an Agreement for the Purchase of an 800 MHZ Communication System for Use by the Fire & Emergency Medical Services Department to Coordinate Communications with the City of Hilliard Division of Police & County-wide Fire Departments and Waiving the Competitive Bid Requirement in Connection with the Purchase.

Whereas, the Fire & Emergency Medical Services Department has requested approval of the purchase of an 800 MHZ radio system to coordinate communications among it's personnel, the police personnel of the city of Hilliard and other county-wide division of fire personnel, pursuant to the establishment of a county-wide communication system; and

Whereas, the City of Hilliard has been providing dispatching services for the Township, and will continue to provide services with the upgraded equipment; and

Whereas, the Township has determined that the communications system manufactured by Motorola, Inc. is the most suitable system for the communications program and the only system compatible with the equipment purchased by the other county departments in the county-wide system, making Motorola a sole source of supply for the equipment; and

Whereas, the cost of the equipment exceeds the statutory amount requiring that the equipment be competitively bid, but there would be no advantage afforded the Township to competitively bid such equipment because the only compatible equipment is manufactured and supplied by Motorola.

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Board of Trustees of Norwich Township, Franklin County, Ohio:

Section 1. That, upon the passage and effectiveness of an ordinance by the Hilliard City Council approving an agreement with the Township for dispatching services, the Township is authorized to proceed with the purchase of the 800 MHZ communications equipment from Motorola, Inc. in the amount of \$791,627.00, and the Chairman of the Board of Trustees, or his designee, is authorized to enter into the agreement with Motorola, substantially in the form presented to the Board.

Section 2. That in the interest of preserving time and expense in preparing bids for the equipment when there exists a sole source of supply, the competitive bid requirements for the purchase of such equipment are hereby waived.

Motion carried by majority vote by all.

It was also moved by Mr. Rice to sign the agreement with Motorola after the city of Hilliard approves the agreement with Norwich Township at their July 22<sup>nd</sup> meeting. Mr. Buck seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The bill permit's a township to appropriate general fund moneys to certain municipal corporations for specific public purposes. Rep. Wolpert made us aware that the Ohio Township Association has not supported this bill, and he is asking us to write a letter to the association to ask them to support the bill. The clerk will write the appropriate letter.

THEFT AT CEMETERY - Over the weekend, the cemetery office was broken into. Stolen items included: computer, monitor, printer; 3 string trimmers; and tool box including all hand tools. Steve was told to replace anything he needed to get back into business as soon as possible. He is going to contact an alarm company to set up a security system. Mr. Workman is going to contact the sheriff's department to ask them to patrol inside the cemetery during the night hours, as it is common for thieves to come back a second time.

**COMPUTER UPGRADE** - Tabled until further notice.

EMS BILLING - Chief mc Dowell has been in contact with Columbus Departments about this billing issue on mutual aid. NORWICH TOWNSHIP WILL NOT BILL. Norwich will send a letter to Mayor Coleman explaining our feelings on this issue. We want it on record, that we are not going to bill.

#### REGULAR MEETING OF THE NORWICH TOWNSHIP TRUSTEES

#### July 29, 2002

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Workman, Chairman. A prayer was offered by Mr. Buck and the pledge of allegiance was repeated by all. The minutes were accepted as presented. A copy of the warrants for this pay period will follow these minutes.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

**GEOLOGICAL TESTING** - Mr. Montgomery has not been in touch with a company to do the work in the cemetery to repair the drainage problem. He has been tied up with problems resulting from the robbery.

**DUMP TRUCK** - Steve received a letter from the City of Clayton expressing their interest in purchasing our truck. We will send them a letter giving them first choice on the purchase of the truck at a price of \$38,500.00. We will also let them know that we cannot sell them the truck until our new truck arrives, which may be late summer or early fall. They are interested in a truck for this winter.

**COMPUTER** - Steve will be in touch with Capt. Midgley to have him order a new computer, printer and monitor which were all stolen in the robbery on July 15, 2002.

SCHRITZINGER RD. - The ditch repairs on this road are scheduled for this fall.

**JOHN DEERE GATOR** - Mr. Workman asked Steve if the equipment Steve asked for could be used this fall? He responded that the mower could wait, but they could be using the gator now. It was moved by Mr. Buck to purchase the John Deere gator at a cost of \$6735.77 now. Mr. Rice seconded the motion. Motion carried.

ALARM SYSTEM- The alarm system is hooked up at the cemetery and is in operation. The system included motion detectors also. If and when the alarm is set off, the first call goes to Franklin County Sheriff's and the second call will go to Steve Montgomery. It was suggested that Steve and the other men at the cemetery, share the phone calls from the Security Company (Sterling), do it for three months and then pass it on to another. This way not the same person gets the calls all the time. Hopefully there won't be many calls.

**ROAD STRIPES** - Steve has called Griffin Striping and he gave us a price for doing the work on the township roads of \$1500.00 is we use traffic paint (lasts for 3 years) and also told us about a method using thermal paint (lasts 10 years). He did not have a price for the thermal paint. It was suggested to use the color of paint that the county recommends (yellow or lime green).

MEDIC BID - Chief Long has looked over all the specs from Horton Emergency and he recommends they build our next medic. He also recommends that we keep the old medic for our future use. The Chief's have met with Washington Township and talked about EMS runs and mutual aid. Both townships are going to do as little with Columbus because of the billing issue and do more with each other. It was learned that Prairie Township will begin billing on Sept. 1, 2002.

**STATION 83** - We have not heard from Rich Pontius as of yet to his recommendations for the new station. We are going to have a special meeting on August 2 @ noon to award the bid.

ADMINISTRATIVE ASST. - Lisa Carter will start on Thurs. Aug. 1, 2002.

TOWNSHIP PICNIC - August 3rd at 11:00 am will be the 3rd annual picnic.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

**PROMOTIONS** - Two promotions are needed as a result of Capt. Mike Massie's retirement. It was moved by Mr. Rice to promote Lt. John King to the position of Captain. Mr. Buck seconded the motion. Motion carried.

It was moved by Mr. Rice to promote firefighter Joe Russell to the position of Lieutenant. Mr. Buck seconded this motion. Motion carried.

Both men will assume their new positions on August 2, 2002.

#### CONGRATULATIONS TO BOTH MEN.

**SOIL & WATER** - Brought to our attention by this committee, all townships are going to be effected by federal regulations. Regulations require that our township implement a minimum of (6) six "control measures" dealing with storm water management and pollution controls. Norwich Township will be allowed to partner with the Franklin County Work Group and underwrite our activities as a "co-permittee". It was moved by Mr. Rice to join the Franklin County group and Mr. Buck seconded the motion. Motion carried. Meeting for this group will be the 1<sup>st</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> Friday of the month. Jim and Chuck will try to attend these meetings, but cannot commit to attend all.

Trustee Rice moved for the adoption of the following resolution and Trustee Workman seconded the motion.

#### RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE NECESSITY OF LEVYING AN ADDITIONAL TAX FOR THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING ADDITIONAL POLICE PROTECTION, BY CONTRACTING WITH THE FRANKLIN COUNTY SHERIFFS DEPARTMENT, TO THE UNINCORPORATED AREA OF NORWICH TOWNSHP, WHICH ALSO EXCLUDES THE RESIDENTS OF THE CITY OF HILLIARD AND REQUESTING THE FRANKLIN COUNTY AUDITOR TO CERTIFY THE TOTAL CURRENT TAX VALUATION OF THE TOWNSHIP AND THE DOLLAR AMOUNT OF REVENUE THAT WOULD GENERATED BY THE ADDITIONAL LEVY.

WHEREAS, the Board finds that the amount of taxes which may be raised within the tenmill limitation by levies on the current tax duplicate will be insufficient to provide an adequate amount for the necessary requirements of the Township and that it is necessary to levy a tax in excess of that limitation for the purpose of providing additional police protection for the incorporated area of Norwich Township; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Division (B) of Section 5705.03 of the Revised Code, in order to submit the question of a tax levy pursuant to Section 5705.19 of the Revised Code this Board must request the Franklin County Auditor to certify (i) the total current tax valuation of the Township and (ii) the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the proposed levy; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Division (B) of Section 5703.03 of the Revised Code, upon receipt of a certified copy of a resolution of this Board declaring the necessity of the tax, stating its purpose, whether it is an additional levy or a renewal or a replacement of an existing tax, and the Section of the Revised Code authorizing its submission to the electors, and requesting such certification, the County Auditor is to certify the total current tax valuation of the Township and the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the proposed levy;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of Norwich Township, Franklin County Ohio that:

Section 1. This Board declares that it is necessary to levy for a continuing period of time an additional 2.8 mills ad valorem police district levy outside the ten-mill limitation. Such additional levy shall be placed upon the tax list and duplicate for the current tax year, if a majority of the electors voting thereon, vote in favor thereof, for the purpose of providing additional police protection, and that it intends to submit the question of that additional levy to the electors at an election on November 5, 2002 as authorized by Section 5705.19 of the Revised Code.

Section 2. This Board requests the Franklin County Auditor to certify to it both (a) the total current tax valuation of the Township and (b) the dollar amount of revenue that would be generated by the 2.8 mill levy specified in Section 1.

Section 3. The Township Clerk is authorized and directed to deliver promptly to the Franklin County auditor a certified copy of the Resolution.

Section 4. This Board finds and determines that all formal actions of the Board concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Board and that all deliberations of this Board and of any committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.

#### REGULAR MEETING OF THE NORWICH TOWNSHIP TRUSTEES

#### **AUGUST 26, 2002**

The meeting was called to order by Mr. Workman, Chairman. A prayer was offered by Mr. Rice and the pledge of allegiance was repeated by all. The minutes were accepted as presented. A copy of the warrants for this pay period will follow these minutes.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

WATER DRAINAGE - Steve does not have price yet for the repair of the drainage problem in the cemetery.

**COMPUTER** - The cemetery has received their new computer and Mr. Rice will get in touch with the man who is going to help Steve with the entering of data. Steve did report that Ramaker Company did not charge for another program since it was stolen with the computer.

**ASTRAL DITCH** - Steve has not heard from the County when they are going to clean out this ditch. He thought it should be soon, as that is what they initially indicated.

**MOSQUITOES** - The City of Hilliard has agreed to spray for the Township in the unincorporated areas. They will charge us for the materials only. They started the spraying on last Thursday (Aug. 22) and will finish on August 27<sup>th</sup>. In some of the ditch and low lying areas, they will put corn cobs that have been soaked with microbes that will attract mosquitoes and then die.

**DOORS AT CEMETERY** - The doors still have not been keyed. We are holding their check for \$1700.00 as they have not completed the job. They started the repairs a month ago and Steve says he was told it would be done Thursday, Aug. 29<sup>th</sup>.

SOIL & WATER CONSERVATION - Mr. Rice attended this mandatory meeting and discussions were concerned with septic tank run offs. Many people have old systems that are not draining properly. Estimates of \$12,000 to \$20,000 have been given for putting in new systems that would drain properly. Many people who attended the meeting were asking what could be done to help these people. The Soil & Water group did not have any answers to these questions. This could be very costly to the homeowners and maybe the Township. Tom Spring, Washington Township Administrator, was asking Jim if Norwich would be interested in partnering with Washington on these meetings. We would, and Jim will ask him if he would also represent us at the future meeting if we cannot make all the meetings in the future. The next two meetings are to be on Sept. 6<sup>th</sup> & 20<sup>th</sup> at the Franklin County Engineers Office. Mr. Buck will try to attend these two meetings.

**SCHIRTZINGER ROAD** - Township residents, Mary Panzone and Duke & Patty Hatcher were in attendance and wanted some additional input on their drainage and tile problems.

The Franklin County Engineers office had sent a letter on August 7th to the Township giving their assessment of the drainage issues involving 3685 & 3705 Schirtzinger Road. Culvert NOR-156-0.34 is a 23 inch diameter concrete pipe which drains to the south across Schirtzinger Rd. and connects into an 18" tile. This tile, a combination of clay and concrete tiles, flows in a southeast direction across 3707 toward the east property line adjacent to 3685. This section of the tile is broken and obstructed in several locations. Additionally, the driveway appears to have been damaged due to a crushed tile or a blowout from the tile. As the tile approaches the property line it branches with the main tile continuing southeast across 3685 & 3665 until it outlets into Holcomb Ditch. This southerly branch seems to be functioning normally. The outlet for the main branch could not be found, but appears to flow into a gabion wall along Holcomb Ditch, which is entirely within the City of Hilliard. The gabion wall was put in as part of the Hilliard Subdivision.

The Franklin County maintenance crews attempted to run a camera through the entire system. It was unable to do so due to numerous sections of broken tile in the front yard section of 3705 and in the main tile section leading across 3685 & 3665. Waster was flushed through the system and outletted through the tile running south. Any water that does flow down the main section of tile is further prevented from outletting into Holcomb Ditch due to the gabion walls.

Research of their records does not show any easement along this tile. Original subdivision plans do now show this ditch being tiled in during the construction of this area in 1957. This subdivision was platted as Scioto Downs #2. The properties in question were lot numbers 4 (3705), 5 (3685), and 6 (3665). A five-foot easement of unknown designation, bordering Holcomb Ditch is shown across the south portion of the properties. No petition easement is shown across the properties. Not petition records were found for this tile as well. THIS PLACES THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR DRAINAGE MAINTENANCE ON THE PROPERTY OWNERS, as per Ohio Drainage Law. Hilliard also has a responsibility to open the outlet that was blocked by their gabion wall.

This report is from Dean Ringle, Franklin County Engineer.

After getting this letter, the residents are going to try and get the County to accept responsibility for the problems and see if they will pay for the repairs. Mr. Buck told of an incident similar to this that happened in Brown Township he wanted to let the residents know that it is a long and drawn out process. After 3-4 years it was settled and residents were assessed a fee for the work to be done. Mr. Buck's suggestion would be for the residents to do the repairs ( which they say could be done for around \$500.00 ) and not involve the County.

The residents know that the Township does not have any responsibility for this problem, but they are asking that the Township support the residents if they decide to go after the County with this problem. The Trustees did not have a problem with supporting them if that is the way they wish to proceed.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

ADMINISTRATIVE ASST. - It was moved by Mr. Buck and seconded by Mr. Rice to hire Ellen Joseph as our full time Administrative Assistant. Motion carried by majority vote.

**COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT GRANT -** Every 3 years the U.S. Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) notifies Franklin County that it must re-qualify as an "urban county" to receive Community grant funds. We must now re-qualify for the years 2003, 2004 and 2005.

We do not have to take any action in order to continue to be eligible for the funds.

It was moved by Mr. Buck to stay in the program and Mr. Rice seconded the motion. Motion carried to stay in the program.

WEST NILE VIRUS - Cases of the West Nile Virus (WNV) have been found in mosquito pools and now in humans in Ohio this summer. According to the Ohio Department of Health, in Franklin County alone a total of 42 birds, 35 mosquito pools and 1 human have tested positive for the WNV.

As part of the comprehensive mosquito management plan their department has been preparing for the WNV for several years and had a plan in place by the time it arrived in birds and mosquitoes last summer. Their plan includes: trapping, surveillance, barricading, fogging and public education.

The Franklin County Board of Health is currently aggressively trapping mosquitoes all around the county. The Board of Health is advising people to use personal prevention and protection measures & to eliminate mosquito breeding sites.

**BRAIDWOOD DRIVE** - Steve received a letter from several residents on Braidwood Drive pertaining to storm drain problems. The residents of 3688; 3672; 3673; 3657; and 3627 Braidwood would like to install storm drainage pipes to eliminate some of these problems. They would install the drains to meet the standards of Norwich Township and Steve Montgomery will supervise their work. They will use 12"ADS plastic pipe. They will do the work on all the properties at the same time providing a clean and efficient project. It was moved by Mr. Rice and seconded by Mr. Buck to let the residents do the project along with the supervision of Steve. Motion carried.

**HOMESTEAD PARK** - On Sept. 10, Chuck will meet with Pam Sayre from Brown Twp and one of the Trustees from Washington Twp to discuss what might happen to Homestead Park if Dublin decides to take over the Township. Where does it go? Who runs it? And who would own it? These are all questions that need to be addressed.

HILLIARD SCHOOL BOARD - All Trustees met with Supt. Dale McVey at his request. He was asking if the Township would oppose the annexation of land from Norwich to the City of Hilliard for the new proposed high school. The Trustees would not oppose the annexation, but both Mr. Rice & Mr. Buck were questioning why the school did not support the Township when the City tried to take over the fire department. Mr. McVey did not comment on this.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

**ANNEXATION** - On August 26, 2002, the Trustees received a notice to annex 121+- acres in Norwich Township to the City of Hilliard. The annexation hearing will be held on November 6<sup>th</sup> at 10:00am at the Franklin County Board of Commissioners. The property in question is the land owned by Kermit & Dorothy Grener and also Norma Grener. The land is being considered for purchase by the Hilliard City Schools for a proposed 3<sup>rd</sup> high school. It was moved by Mr. Rice to not oppose the annexation to the City of Hilliard, but the Trustees do have major concerns about the roads in the area and the additional traffic that another school will bring. #### **OLD BUSINESS:**

WATER REPAIRS AT CEMETERY - Mr. Montgomery has not gotten a company to do the repairs yet. He is waiting to get a local company to do the work.

**SCHIRTZINGER ROAD** - The repairs on the road have been made and the retention wall is completed also. The job looks good.

**COMPUTER WORK** - Rick Calaleria has not been in contact with Steve. Mr. Rice will try and call Rick and have him call Steve as soon as possible, so they can get started.

Steve is going to attend a seminar on Oct. 11 that will be covering "Windows".

**BRAIDWOOD RESIDENTS** - The tile work that the residents have done are ready to be inspected by Steve. The tile work is at grade and waiting final inspection.

WATER & SOIL - Jim Rice wanted to check to make sure we had sent a letter of intent to go along with the County and their plans for the county. We have sent the letter.

**DUMP TRUCK** - The City of Clinton will be calling us to make arrangements for the purchase of the cemetery dump truck. The sale price is \$38,500.00. Our new truck has arrived and we are ready to sell the old truck to them.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

**PANCAKE BREAKFAST** - The Ladies Auxiliary will hold a breakfast on Sept. 28<sup>th</sup> from 8-11AM. Everyone is invited to attend.

**AWARD BANQUET** - Washington Township has invited the Trustees and Clerk to their annual Employee Recognition Banquet to be held on Sept. 24<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 PM. We are to receive the Trustees Award. This award was recommended by the Trustees for all the work and support that Norwich Township has done over the years with Homestead Park. The award is for action or actions which was beyond normal expectations. The Norwich Township staff and spouses are all planning to attend.

REPLACEMENT ENGINE - of November. Chief Long has been drafting specs for a new engine for the department. The new engine will replace Engine 83 which is a 1984 Sutphen truck. This truck has 47,934 miles on it with 4,779 engine hours on it. The new engine will be similar to Engine 81. He is also asking for an additional Thermal Imaging Camera to be added to the truck. Bidding the engine now will guarantee delivery by late 2003. General build time is 12 months. The estimated cost of a new engine is in the range of \$320,000 to \$350,000. **POLICE LEVY** - The Township has received from the Board of Elections, the Notice of Election and the sample of ballot language as approved by the Secretary of State. Publication of notice of election in the Columbus Dispatch has been ordered for:

Oct. 7th; 14th; 21th; and 28th 2002.

Mr. Rice expressed concern that the Sheriff's department has not been showing up at our regular township meetings. The last time they attended was in April 2002.

TRAFFIC IN TOWNSHIP - Mr. Buck is concerned about the heavy traffic on township roads, he feels it is only going to get worse. He is going to set up a meeting with County Engineer, Dean Ringle, to see if there is anything the Township can do to help traffic problems in our area. Bad intersections in the township are: Alton Darby & Renner; Alton Darby & Scioto Darby and Cosgray & Scioto Darby. Mr. Buck feels that Township monies spent for traffic signals could help in stopping accidents. We would have to see if Township funds could be spent in this manner.

FIRE MUSEUM - Chief Mc Dowell wanted to ask the Trustees if they were still interested in the fire museum? The Trustees all agreed they were still interested and the Chief & Capt. Ritzenthaler should pursue the issue. A suggestion would be to put in a water softener, it may do the same job at a lower cost. Nothing was decided.

using the GPS tracking system. It shows where all trucks are located, if they are plowing or stopped, by satellite.

The next meeting will be held at Brown Township on Nov. 14th at 7:00PM. Jeniffer Fish will attend and report on the soil & water concerns.

ANNEXATION - We have received a new petition on the annexation of 121.384 + /- acres of the Grener property. Property lines have changed and a new map was sent to the township.

EMS REPORTING SYSTEM - Chief Long and Lt. Papa have been working with Washington Twp. And Clayton IDS to develop a better system to do our EMS reports. This new system will allow our medics to fill out a report on the computer in the medic during the run. Once the report is completed they can leave a copy of the report at the hospital from a printer in the medic. When they return to the station, they simply down load the report to our computer network in a matter of seconds. Based on 10-15 runs per shift, we could be saving between 5-12 man hours per day.

Chief Long would like to purchase 4 hand held units, 4 printers, 5 vehicle docking stations, 2 desk docking stations and mounting hardware. The total cost of this system including installation for all equipment and software with a 3 year warranty is \$26,036.00.

It was moved by Mr. Buck to purchase the program and units and Mr. Workman seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**COMPUTERS** - Mr. Buck feels all our trustees need to have computers to be able to keep up with the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. There are many e-mails that come to our office and it is so much easier to respond to an e-mail rather that phone conversations. This could cut down on all the paper involved in day to day operations.

This is an area we are going to explore for the near future.

**SALT** - We need to notify the County Engineers office of our intention to purchase salt from them for 2002-2003. Steve needs to let the Clerk know how much salt we will be needing, and the cost this year of the salt. She will send the letter to Mr. Ringle.

HEATING PROBLEM — Steve reported that he has not heard if the gas line has been run from Dublin Road. They are using propage to heat now, but the tank belongs to Countryside and they may want the tank back, and the tank is also about empty. Mr. Workman asked Steve to contact Greg, at Countryside, and see about the gas line tap. The weather will be getting colder and we need to have this problem solved.

CEMETERY EQUIPMENT — Mr. Buck asked about the equipment being used at the cemetery and Steve reported the pick-up is a 2000 model with about 20,000 miles and they have a 1998 International Dump Truck in good shape.

Mr. Buck would like Steve and his staff to look at the ZTR mowers for next spring. These models cut down on mowing time and they are very easy to operate.

He would also like Steve to check into using "growth regulators" around the monuments. This would cut down on string trimmer use. Steve says it now takes one person about 40 hours a week to do the trimming.

A slice seeder may be something we need to look into for a purchase. With the draught of this summer, much of our ground will need help in coming back with good grass growth.

The houses along the west end of the cemetery are right along the property lines. We need some kind of a buffer between the houses and cemetery. If a funeral is going on, we do not want people in their back yards having a party or cookout and disturbing the family experiencing the burial of a loved one.

**RECOGNITION** — Mr. Rice would like to recognize the girls and boys Cross Country teams of Davidson High School for their State Championship wins this fall. He moved we get a plaque for them and have them attend a Trustees meeting to present it to them and the school. Mr. Buck seconded the motion. We will get a plaque and then get in touch with them to present it.

BROWN TOWNSHIP CONTRACT — The fire contract expires on 12/31/02. Mr. Buck would like to set up a meeting with their board to discuss the future contract. We need to check about their millage and its effective rate and how much is collected. Questions abut cost of staffing the firehouse and cost of equipment also need to be discussed.

A meeting will be set up between the two Townships as soon as possible.

#### REGULAR MEETING OF THE NORWICH TOWNSHIP TRUSTEES

#### **NOVEMBER 18, 2002**

Mr. Workman, Chairman, called the meeting to order. Mr. Buck offered a prayer and the pledge of allegiance was repeated by all. The minutes were accepted as presented. A copy of the warrants for this pay period will follow these minutes.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

**SHERIFF REORT** — Officer Raven reported that the Township had been quiet the last two weeks. He is still interested in obtaining a fire walkie-talkie for Township runs. He feels it would speed up his response time to an accident or fire emergency. Chief Mc Dowell told him to check into prices. This could be used with Washington Twp. also.

**WATER PROBLEM** — Mr. Montgomery is still waiting for a price from the County to do the drainage work. The County received our letter about the retaining wall on Schirtzinger Rd. and they will work up a price for that also. Steve would like them to do the drainage work first.

**ASTRAL DITCH** — The County has been out and their feelings are that the property owner only cuts the weeds in the ditch about 2 times a year and then this causes the water to stand. Doing drainage work may help, but it will not solve the problem.

**COMPUTER ENTRY** – Jeff Warren has been down to the cemetery and has been helping Steve with the data entry problem. There have been some problems, but Steve should be able to do the data entry now. Mr. Buck would like Ellen to become familiar with the software, so she could help with data entry also, if needed.

**AMERICAN LEGION** – Mr. Buck has been in contact with the Legion and one question that keeps coming up is, "did the Legion buy the lots, or were they just given to the Legion"? "Is there deeds for these lots"? Steve is going to talk to the previous clerk (his Mother) and see if she knows, or knows the approximate date this may have happened, and we can look it up in the minutes to check this out.

**NEW PUMPER** — Chief Long has gone over all the specs for the new pumper and it is his recommendation that the Township accept the bid from Sutphens. It was moved by Mr. Rice and seconded by Mr. Buck to accept the bid of \$354,324.00/trade from Sutphens. Motion carried. A 25% deposit will be due for work to begin on the equipment.

**STATION 83** – Chief Mc Dowell reported that they are pouring concrete and that job is about ¾ completed.

**HEATING SYSTEM** – Mr. Montgomery has found out that there is a gas line from Dublin Road to the cemetery service garage. There has been a request for the tap, by Countryside, but noting has been done yet. Steve has had a call in to Dan (Countryside) but he has not returned his call. Countryside did re-fill the propane tank, so they are at least getting heat.

**SLICE SEEDER** — We will wait till spring to get prices on this piece of equipment, and use it then to replace the bad areas of grass in the cemetery.



HELDNUTES – Mr. Buck, Chief Long and Capt. Ritzenthaler are receiving the monthly minutes by e-mail and they all agree it is a good way to communicate. We will continue the computer discussion at a later meeting.

**STREET SIGNS-** Steve and his men will begin to replace the signs and posts in the township next week. They are trying to finish up the leaves in the cemetery for the fall clean up.

**PLAQUE FOR CROSS COUNTRY** – The company that Dave was going to use, has gone out of business and he will check with another company to get the plaque made. Mr. Rice would like to have the coaches and team members present at one of our future meetings to present the plaque for their achievements in cross-country.

**BROWN TOWNSHIP** — The trustees have met with Brown Township about their contract for fire protection for 2003-04. It was moved by Mr. Rice and seconded by Mr. Buck to continue through 2004 with the contract as it is now written. Motion carried. Both townships will have to re-visit this issue and Brown will have to pay more in the future. Brown Twp. should be paying the same rate as Norwich Twp. residents pay.

**POLICE PROTECTION** — The fire levy passed in Norwich Township, and the trustees now have to decide who they will have doing the additional police protection for the unincorporated areas of the Township. The contract with Franklin County expires on 12-31-02. Washington Township will also be deciding what they are going to do. The additional monies received from the 2.8 mills will be \$276,610.57.

MOSQUITO PROTECTION – The Franklin County Board of Health has offered to the township protection for the 2003 mosquito season. It was moved by Mr. Buck to accept the maximum service level for a cost of \$5000.00. It was seconded by Mr. Rice. Motion carried. This plan will provide these activities: pre-planning meetings with our community to design a mosquito management program during March 2003; FCBH will work in our community for 3-4 days per week meeting with citizens on their property and meeting with Department heads on mosquito issues; provide door-to-door breeding site identification and consultation; provide education specific to our community; provide adult mosquito surveillance on public & private property, using traps; training community volunteers & our staff on the use of all types of mosquito traps; providing all the necessary traps & supplies; consultation on the identification of trapping locations; picking up trapped mosquitoes; consultations with our staff on obtaining pest control certification; adulticiding based upon trap data; edidemiological investigations of human cases; recording & investigation all mosquito related complaints; larviciding based upon breeding site identification and providing GIS mapping of all mosquito related data collected during the season.

WORKERS COMP. — We will be receiving another bonus refund from the bureau and we would like to use the money to help with safety programs, that would include the whole township; fire & cemetery. We will look for avenues to explore.

MAINTENANCE PROGRAM — Chief Mc Dowell is looking for prices for maintenance for our new carpets that have been installed in the firehouse. He will have prices at the next meeting.

Meeting adjourned at 7:12PM, and the next scheduled meeting of the Norwich Township Trustees will be held on December 2 @ 6:30PM.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

SHERIFF REPORT - Nothing to report from Officer Raven.

GAS LINE - Country wide has started to connect the lines, but the job is not completed as of yet. They did deliver another tank of propane for heating in the interim,

**VETERANS SECTION** – Mr. Buck is still waiting to hear from Bob Domer.

**FIRE MUSEUM** — Bob Apel brought plans for us to look at. We need a lease on the land from the Fair Board. Until we have a lease, we cannot even think of going ahead with the project.

**3599 RIDGEWOOD DRIVE** — Mrs. McNalley has not closed in the ditch where the tile was laid. There are piles of dirt around the tile and it needs to be filled in. The job is not completed and the dirt is frozen now. The clerk will send a letter to the resident.

**ASTRAL DITCH** — We have received a letter from the County and their estimation on a price to do this job is around \$900.00. The resident was looking for an easier way to mow the ditch area, and it is not the responsibility of the Township to do this work for the resident, especially at this cost. Steve will contact the resident.

**SLICE SEEDER** – The cost of a new machine will cost around \$3200.00. Mr. Buck recommended that we wait till spring to purchase the seeder, and begin to use it in March of 2003.

TWP. SIGN POSTS - Steve and his crew are ready to begin replacing the signs.

**SUMMER HELP** – Everyone is now laid off for the winter months.

**CROSS COUNTRY CHAMPS** — At out next meeting on December 16, we will invite both the boys & the girls cross country teams to present them with a plaque from the Township for their State Championship wins.

**EMS REPORTING** — The system is due to arrive at our firehouse any day. The company wants to do a video presentation using our department for promotion of the product.

**RADIO EQUIPMENT** – The 800 MHz equipment is being installed at City Hall now. It is a very big job and is taking time to install it correctly. We hope to be using the system by the end of January 2003.

**BUREAU OF WORKERS COMP.** – The Township received a check for \$24,997.29 for a reduction in costs of our premium. The reduction was accomplished

ANNEXATION - The Township received new annexation papers and they will oppose this annexation of the Grener property, as some of the property will be annexed into the City of Columbus. The township always opposes annexation into Columbus.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

WASHINGTON TWP. - As of Jan. 1, 2003, Washington Township will no longer have mutual aid with Columbus because of the billing issue. They will help with fire runs only and not medic runs.

Norwich Township has not come to any conclusions yet as to what we are going to do. There is a thought that Norwich will move Columbus down on the mutual aid request list. We will possibly restructure our run cards with Columbus. We don't want to alienate Columbus with Norwich Township completely, as they are a help to us. All of these problems are being brought to the surface because of the billing that Columbus is going to start in the near future. Norwich Township wants no part of billing to our residents.

**SHERIFF CONTRACT** – The Township received some estimates of what police service will cost the Township in 2003, and it looks to be taking an 18% increase over last years costs. The Township is working on solutions to the police protection and what avenue they are going to take.

**DOORS** – Chief Long presented a plan for new doors to be installed at the back of the building (leading to the meeting rooms) and also at the side of the building near the clerks office. These will be glass doors (like at the front office) and Paul Mc Knight will do the work at a cost of \$2925.00. It was moved by Mr. Buck to have the doors installed and Mr. Rice seconded the motion. Motion carried. The doors will be better marked for the public to use, so there is not so much confusion as to where people should enter the building.

YEAR END MEETING - Our last meeting of the year will be held on the regular meeting day of December 30, 2002, but will be held at 10:00am.

Meeting adjourned at 7:12PM, and the next scheduled meeting of the Norwich Township Trustees will be held on December 16@ 6:30PM.

Officer Raven reports that most of the speeders he has warned in the Ridgewood area, have been Ridgewood residents themselves. The warnings are about to end, tickets will be given soon.

GAS LINE- The gas line should be completed today. It was 80% completed, before the gas company ran into a lot of rock to be dug through.

**FIRE MUSEUM** – The Trustees must agree on some points of the project. They need to get a lease on the land from the fair board first. Then they can continue to work on the building project. It is estimated that the building project will be around \$180,000 to \$250,000.00.

**3599 RIDGEWOOD DRIVE** — Dirt has been brought to the ditch area and the resident has been trying to finish the project. Weather has been a deterrent in finishing the job.

**ASTRAL DITCH** – Mr. Montgomery has not heard from the resident about the \$900.00 charge to do the work on the ditch and drainage problem.

**FOUNDATIONS** – The final pour of concrete is being done at the cemetery on foundations for monuments.

**COMPUTER** - The program is ready and data is ready to be entered. Ellen Joseph will enter the data from the firehouse at her computer, and it will then be transferred to the cemetery computer upon completion. Jeff Warren will show Ellen the program and how to enter the data. Steve will bring the data from cards to be put on the computer. This project will be started the week of Jan. 6, 2003.

EMS REPORTING — Our equipment is to be shipped on Dec. 20<sup>th</sup>. We hope to be using the system the first of the year. All units have been trained on the new program.

GLASAS DOORS – Mc Knight is waiting on some warm weather to install the doors at the back and end of the building.

EMS BILLING — Mr. Rice wishes that Mr. Higgenbotham (Columbus firefighter) would come to our meeting to express his feelings about the billing issue. He feels he has mis-information about the whole situation. Run cards have been changed with Columbus, and they are last on our mutual aid response call. Chief Long has been told by Columbus, that they will notify us when they transport a Norwich Township resident. Dave will then write a letter to the resident to explain why they will get a bill for transportation from Columbus. The Norwich Township resident will not be penalized for not paying the bill. Columbus will not pursue the insurance companies if the resident refuses to pay the bill.



Held **POLICE PROTECTION** – Chief Garnett is working on a proposal to present to the Mayor and City Council for patrolling Norwich Township (unincorporated area).

Washington Township has not heard from the Sheriff's Department on the current contract. They are willing to go on a month to month contract. They understand our pursuing other forms of protection for the residents.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

**CROSS COUNTRY** — Coach Schlecht and athletes from both the boys and girls team attended our meeting this evening. Mr. Rice made a presentation of a plaque to the Boys and Girls cross country teams for their duel State Titles. The coach praised the student athletes on both their athletic skills along with the academic skills.

### CONGRATULATIONS TO ALL

YMCA — It was moved by Mr. Rice to make the first installment of \$50,000 to the Y in January of 2003. Mr. Buck seconded the Motion.

**ADDITIONAL PERSONNEL** – Chief Mc Dowell would like to hire 3 additional firefighters (1 per unit) to help with manpower and reduce overtime costs. He would like to have these people on board by Feb. 1, 2003. It was moved by Mr. Rice to hire the additional men and Mr. Buck seconded the motion. Motion carried. Interviews will be set up for the Trustees the week of Jan. 6-10.

We will possibly hire 9 additional firefighters in August of 2003 for the opening of Station 83.

**BETH MERENDO** – Beth is a student of Hilliard Darby High School and is asking the Township to donate money to her to attend a National Leadership Forum on Defense, Intelligence and Diplomacy in Washington D.C. The Township would like to help her, but according to the ORC we can not do this. A letter will be sent to her telling why the donation would not be possible.

**ELLEN JOSEPH** – Chief McDowell would like to propose to give Ellen a raise of \$1.00 and hour starting Jan. 1, 2003. It was moved by Mr. Rice and seconded by Mr. Buck to give the raise. Motion carried. In August of 2003, she will be evaluated again at her anniversary date of employment.

**HILLIARD SESQUICENTENNIAL** – Chief Mc Dowell presented to the board an opportunity to advertise in the souvenir program for Hilliard's Sesquicentennial. It was moved by Mr. Buck to buy a full page add for \$300.00. Mr. Rice seconded the motion.

Meeting adjourned at 7:23 PM, and the next scheduled meeting of the Norwich Township Trustees will be held on December 30 th at 10:A.M.
