2. NEW BUSINESS

2a) Household Hazardous Waste Day-May 8

Household Hazardous Waste/Recycling Day will be held on Saturday May 8th. It will run from 8:00 AM until 11:00 AM at the recycling facility located at 370 Winter Street. No leaf or brush disposal will be collected. The Board is asking residents to please make sure they are not blocking driveways of the residents who live on Winter Street.

2b) Home Burial/Mausoleum- 8 Suffolk Drive

An application was presented to the Board from the office of Blatman, Bobrowski & Haverty, LLC for a home mausoleum at 8 Suffolk Drive. The Board is the first step in the approval process, followed by the Conservation Commission and Town Meeting. There is currently a mausoleum on site but approval is needed to have interments. There will be six vaults added to the current mausoleum. The mausoleum does meet the setbacks for zoning and the site will impact surface water supply.

There is a billboard on Nahatan Street and quotes will be involved in mobile advertisements.
