Mark Raymond: Sunday October 8, 2023 was another recent Sunday with over 100 overflights over the Winfield/Rock Streets neighborhood, starting in the morning and going into dusk. This follows Sunday September 17: 120 overflights; Tuesday September 19: 60 overflights; and Tuesday October 3: 110 overflights. What is especially disturbing is that you emailed a memo and supporting material on October 4 to airport pilots and student pilots that reiterated departure guidelines on runway 10/28 and asked for courtesy to the neighborhoods. Yet that was ignored to the extent that the overflights on Sunday October 8 seemed to be so low and loud as to buzz the Winfield/Rock neighborhood to the point of harassment. See for yourself by looking at the attached document a neighbor sent. Flightracker24.com shows one plane--P28A--representing the flight track on the yellow line going around in circles, over and over Winfield/Rock Streets multiple times at an altitude of about 1250 feet at 4:30pm. That's a lot of yellow lines for a lot of overflights. We would appreciate a response (please hit reply all) to clarify why this happened--many Winfield/Rock Street neighbors cannot attend the Norwood Airport Commission meetings as they are held at 4pm and they are working either at home (where they can hear the overflights) or in the workplace.
