Mr. Ryan commented on landing fees that were reported for the month. Mr. Raymond was in the process of comparing Norwood's rates to other airports.

Mr. Sheehan pointed out correspondence received from a resident noting that the Plymouth Airport had higher fees than Norwood. Mr. Sheehan noted that the Plymouth Airport employed seven people, whereas Norwood had a larger airport with only two staff members.

Norwood Trails Advisory Committee- Airport Trail Proposal,

Joe Greeley presented on behalf of the Committee. They had originally submitted their request in October 2022, but had updated their request as of August 2023. They were not looking to build a trail on airport property, but to coincide. The Trails Committee had identified two potential trails near the airport. The goal was to connect Meadow Street with University Avenue.

Mr. Sheehan wondered if the FAA was against the original trail proposal from 2022. Mr. Ryan stated that the FAA did not support the proposal, but he had reached out to them again in hopes of making a trail on airport property work. Mr. Sheehan was concerned about the FAA pulling funding from the airport if the proposal were approved. Mr. Ryan clarified that the Commission could make sure that the proposal was pending FAA and MassDOT approval. Mr. Sheehan also expressed concern over safety during hunting season, as hunting on airport property was popular. Mr. Ryan noted that signage would need to be posted by the Trails Committee.

Mr. Corcoran was concerned about the trail going over MBTA or Amtrak tracks. He also questioned how the Trails Committee planned to maintain the potential trail. Mr. Greeley explained that the Trails Committee maintains all of the trails in Norwood themselves using volunteers, and sometimes petitions the DPW for assistance with heavy lifting.

# — Major Projects/Issues—

### **United States Army Helicopters**

During the months of November and December the airport hosted helicopters from the 10<sup>th</sup> Combat Aviation Brigade, 10<sup>th</sup> Mountain Division, Fort Drum, New York and the 160<sup>th</sup> Special Operations Aviation Regiment, Fort Campbell, Kentucky. The helicopters performed flyovers for football games at Gillette Stadium and engaged in multiple recruiting events in the local area.

### **Monthly Revenues**

For the months of November and December two deposits were posted to the Treasurer's office. This totaled \$78,376.14 in payments.

## **Landing Fees – Fourth Quarter 2023**

For the months of October, November, and December the airport collected \$1,170.00 in landing fees from *Boston Executive Helicopters*.

## **Monthly Fuel Flowage**

For the months of November and December, *Flight Level's* bills of lading for fuel totaled 94,390 gallons. At \$.07/gallon, the Town received \$6,607.30 in flowage fees.

For the month of October, *Boston Executive Helicopter's* bills of lading for fuel totaled 50,288 gallons. At \$.07/gallon, the Town received \$3,520.16 in flowage fees.
