> Southern Airways request to de-ice; park customer vehicles in main lot Southern Airways made a presentation to the Commission regarding year-round operations. The Nantucket New England operation was up over 50% compared to last year. Norwood to Nantucket was up over 70%. Southern Airways would like to pursue a year-round operation to Nantucket, and discussed their de-icing plan. Mr. Maguire discussed the storm water plan and how it would affect the operation.

Hangar Construction

The Airport Manager (AM) participated in weekly construction meetings organized by *Flight Level*, as the fixed-base operator moved forward in the construction of its new hangar south of the *Maj. Mark C. Welch Administration Building*.

COVID-19 Pandemic

Airport management continues to support the guidelines set forth by CDC, the Commonwealth and Town officials, while the airport operates without restrictions seven days a week. Airport management has kept normal business hours, providing full services that include inspections, NOTAM filings, general administration, project management, infrastructure and equipment maintenance, liaison work with FAA and MassDOT, capital planning and budgetary accounting. Airport management has also been available after hours, as needed.

Energy-Saving Initiative

On 9/23, airport management staff met with the Facilities Department to discuss procedures and services offered by the new department. Airport management shared a 22-page evaluation of the *Welch Administration Building*, which had been conducted by *Energy New England*. Facilities staff has since scheduled the *Welch Building* for an LED lighting conversion, and airport management has requested additional assistance with the LED conversion of monopole ramp lighting.

ADDENDUM 1 October 5, 2020

Runway and Taxiway De-Icing

Special Note: This addendum documents a <u>planned</u> industrial activity, with the expectation that this activity will again be identified, then employed and tracked, once the 2020 MSGP has been issued. At that time, airport management will implement the best management practices identified in the 2020 storm water pollution prevention plan to reduce storm water contamination from pavement de-icing.

At Norwood Memorial Airport, the application season for anti-icing/de-icing fluids typically runs from December through April, though, in rare cases based on weather, the application of fluids might be expected to occur outside of these months. The application itself would be effected during conditions of snow and freezing rain, especially when the airport experiences periods of prolonged freezing conditions on the runways. This would then necessitate the need to increase the pavement's friction coefficient through the application of anti-icing/de-icing fluids.

The liquid pavement anti-icing/de-icing fluid would be Cryotech E36 potassium acetate (LTL Class 65; NMFC#45650), applied in a diluted form with 50% water. The airport authority currently stores 265 gallons of Cryotech E36.

Airport management will maintain a record of the type(s) and quantities of anti-icing/de-icing chemicals used. Our records will also include Safety Data Sheets (SDSs)


Section VI Part A, Rented Space: At this time, Elite Aero Services does not plan to rent space on, or adjacent to, Norwood Memorial Airport. We currently dispatch fully equipped mobile teams from our base at Hanscom Field in Bedford, and we expect to coordinate our activities at Norwood through Flightlevel Aviation. We are available to the airport staff and potential customers 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year through our phone and email contact information. Therefore, we request an exemption from this requirement.

Section VI Part E, Commercial Tie-down: Elite Aero Services does not operate any aircraft that will require a tie-down at Norwood Memorial Airport. We also do not expect to store products or equipment at the airport. Therefore, request an exemption from this requirement.

Thank you again for your time and consideration of our application and our special request items. We look forward to working with you, the airport, your customers, and your tenants in the future.

SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

THIS SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT (the "Settlement Agreement" or "Agreement") is entered into as of this _____ day of September, 2020 between the Town of Norwood, Massachusetts, for itself and/or acting through its Norwood Airport Commission (collectively, the "Town" or "Norwood" or "Town of Norwood"), a Massachusetts municipal corporation with a business address located at 566 Washington Street, Norwood, MA 02062 and I.W. Harding Construction Co., Inc. ("I.W. Harding"), a Massachusetts corporation with a principal place of business located at 354 Pleasant Street, West Bridgewater, MA 02379.

WHEREAS, I.W. Harding entered into a contract with the Town dated as of August 17, 2018 (the "Contract") to act as general contractor for: (1) the realignment, construction, and lighting of Taxiway A at Norwood Memorial Airport; and (2) the relocation, construction, and lighting of Taxiway D at Norwood Memorial Airport (the "Project");

WHEREAS, DuBois & King, Inc. served as the Project engineer on behalf of the Town ("D&K");

WHEREAS, the Town issued a Notice to Proceed on September 13, 2018 stating that "[c]ompletion shall be obtained within 60 calendar days of the commencement," such that the Project was originally slated to be completed by Monday, November 12, 2018;

WHEREAS, I.W. Harding timely commenced its scope of work under the Contract, beginning with Taxiway A;

WHEREAS, various disputes arose between the Parties in connection with the Project and the Contract;

WHEREAS, the parties have successfully resolved their disputes on the terms and conditions set forth herein, without admission of liability by any party and to avoid the costs and uncertainties of litigation;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants contained herein, and for good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto intend to be legally bound and do hereby agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Denial of Liability/No Admission of Liability</u>: It is expressly understood and agreed by the parties that this is a settlement of disputes and that this Agreement is entered into solely for the purpose of resolving such disputes. Neither the Agreement nor any other communication concerning the Agreement is intended to be, nor shall be deemed, construed or treated in any respect, as an admission of liability or breach of duty on the part of any party. Furthermore, the entry into this Agreement, the performance of the work described herein, and any other representation or undertaking herein shall not constitute or be construed as an admission of liability, fault, breach of contract, or negligence by any party or an acknowledgment of the merit or lack of merit of any claim, defense, or position taken in relation thereto.
- 2. <u>Withdrawal of Notice of Default</u>: Effective immediately upon the parties' execution of this Agreement, the Town hereby formally withdraws and rescinds the October 18, 2019 D&K Notice of Default, which is null, void, and of no force effect. Simultaneously with the parties' execution of this Agreement, the Town shall provide I.W. Harding with a letter in the form attached as **Exhibit A** to this Agreement.
- 3. <u>I.W. Harding's Performance of Work Pursuant to this Agreement</u>: During the week of September 14, 2020, I.W. Harding shall perform the specific scope of work set forth

below and noted in the drawings attached as **Exhibit B** (collectively, the "Settlement Scope of Work"):

Taxiway D - Plan Sheet C3.2

1. Clean up and fill silt fence trench area.

Taxiway A - Plan Sheet C3.1

- 1. Drop DSCB #7 by one course of brick to facilitate positive drainage.
- 2. Add loam at DSCB #6 as necessary to facilitate positive drainage.
- 3. Fill depressions in area 15' by 75' in the area of station +4.
- 4. Fill several small ruts in an area 15' by 15' at the corner / end of the runway.

The Town shall provide I.W. Harding full and unfettered access to perform the Settlement Scope of Work during the week of September 14, 2020. I.W. Harding shall perform the Settlement Scope of Work at no charge to the Town. However, to the extent that the Town incurs any costs in connection with I.W. Harding's Settlement Scope of Work, the Town shall be responsible for such costs and shall not charge, recover, or attempt to recover such costs from I.W. Harding. Immediately upon completion of the Settlement Scope of Work, I.W. Harding's performance obligations under this Agreement shall be satisfied.

4. <u>Mutual Termination of the Contract for Convenience</u>: Immediately upon I.W. Harding's completion of the Settlement Scope of Work, the Town shall issue a letter in the form attached as <u>Exhibit C</u> stating that: (a) I.W. Harding has fully and satisfactorily completed all work performed on the Project; (b) I.W. Harding has been fully paid for all work performed at the Project; and (c) terminating the Contract for the mutual convenience of the parties pursuant to the mutual agreement of the parties.

- 5. Release by the Town: Effective upon execution of this Agreement, the Town, on its own behalf and on behalf of its agents, officers, directors, officials, representatives, employees, affiliates, attorneys, successors, and assigns, including without limitation, the Norwood Airport Commission, hereby releases and remises and forever discharges I.W. Harding, and its officers, directors, officials, principals, employees, parents, subsidiaries, affiliates, successors, assigns, agents, and representatives, insurers, and sureties, including without limitation, Fidelity and Deposit Company of Maryland and all of its officers, directors, officials, principals, employees, parents, subsidiaries, affiliates, successors, assigns, agents, and representatives, including without limitation, Zurich North America, from any and all claims, causes of action, demands, losses or damages, whether known or unknown, asserted or unasserted, arising out of or relating to the Contract and/or the Project, except only for material latent defects with respect to work performed at the Project prior to 2020. The Town states that, other than with respect to the disputes resolved in this Agreement, it is not currently aware of any material latent defects relating to work performed at the Project prior to 2020.
- 6. Release by I.W. Harding: Effective upon the parties' execution of this Agreement, I.W. Harding, on its own behalf and on behalf of its officers, directors, officials, principals, employees, parents, subsidiaries, affiliates, successors, assigns, agents, and representatives hereby releases and remises and forever discharges the Town of Norwood and its officers, officials, representatives, public bodies, employees, agents, attorneys, affiliates, successors, and assigns from any and all claims, causes of action, demands, losses or damages, whether known or unknown, asserted or unasserted arising out of or relating to the Contract and/or the Project, except for those obligations arising out of this Agreement.

- 7. <u>Signatures</u>: The undersigned signatories, by their respective signatures, represent they are duly authorized to execute this Agreement on behalf of their respective parties.
- 8. <u>Entire Agreement</u>: The terms of this Agreement are contractual, and not merely recitals. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement and understanding of the parties, superseding any prior agreements, understandings, representations, or negotiations concerning the subject matter hereof. No provision hereof may be changed, waived, or modified, except in a writing subscribed by all parties.
- 9. <u>Invalid Provisions/Severability</u>: Should any provisions of this Agreement be declared invalid or be determined by any court to be illegal or invalid, the validity of the remaining parts, terms, or provisions shall not be affected thereby, and the illegal or invalid parts, terms, or provisions shall be deemed not to be a part to this Agreement, but only to the extent of the invalidity or illegality thereof.
- 10. <u>Controlling Law</u>: Regardless of where this Agreement is executed, it shall be construed and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. In no event, however, will resort be had to any presumption or other rule of law requiring construction against any party who may have drafted or caused this Agreement to be drafted.
- 11. <u>Counterparts</u>: This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, such that the counterparts when read together shall constitute one and the same Agreement. This Agreement shall be effective upon execution by all of the parties. Duplicate and facsimile copies of this Agreement are deemed by the parties to be as effective as the original of this Agreement.
- 12. <u>Voluntariness</u>: The parties hereto expressly represent and warrant that they have entered into this Agreement freely and voluntarily, with proper authority and without any reservation. Each party acknowledges that it has had adequate time to review, reflect upon,

consider, and consult with legal counsel concerning the terms of this Agreement, and agree that neither this Agreement nor the settlement set forth herein is the result of fraud, duress, coercion, or undue influence on the part of any party or their counsel.

- 13. <u>Headings</u>: The descriptive headings used in this Agreement shall not be interpreted to supersede the provisions of this Agreement.
- 14. <u>Binding Effect</u>: This Agreement shall be binding upon, and inure to the benefit of, the parties hereto, as well as their successors and assigns.
