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FINANCE COMMISSION MEETING Monday, May 18, 2020 MINUTES OF MEETING - DRAFT

On Monday, May 18, 2020, a meeting of the Finance Commission was held at 4:00 pm digitally using GoToMeeting.

Attending the meeting were Anne Haley, Chair, Robert Donnelly, Vice Chair, members Judy Langone, Kellie Noumi and Alan Slater, supported by Tom McQuaid, Clerk to the Finance Commission, Molly Ahearn, Assistant Town Accountant, and Emily Chambers, Budget Management Analyst.

On a motion to accept from Vice Chair Donnelly, seconded by Mr. Slater, the minutes from May 14, 2020 were *approved unanimously* through a roll-call vote.

There were new concerns raised about going forward with the FY2021 budget as voted on May 14, 2020. On a motion by Mr. Slater, seconded by Mrs. Langone, using a roll-call, the Commission *voted 4-1 in favor* of rescinding the budget vote.

The Commission asked management to come up with possible revenue reduction scenarios and possible cuts to the budget by the end of this week.

The plan is to consider these scenarios, formulate a final budget, and vote at the next meeting which is scheduled for May 26, 2020, at 4:00 pm digitally using GoToMeeting

Karin Sheridan, Director of Finance and Operations presented an update on School Department Revolving Funds and COVID-19 expenditures. COVID-related expenses included extra costs for distance learning technology and payroll for Extended Day staff. Dr. David Thomson, Superintendent of Schools, confirmed that no refunds are due to parents as a result of cancelled spring athletics or activities. Ms. Sheridan will update the Commission when the Department of Education confirms the amount of Circuit Breaker funding for the 4th quarter.

Ms. Sheridan presented an update on School Department Grants. Federally funded Title Grants will be given an automatic extension due to COVID-19. The Commission inquired about the

impact of COVID-19 on available grant funds for Fiscal 2022 and beyond. Ms. Sheridan confirmed that enough notice is given to the School Department before grants are terminated.

The School Department Year-to-Date Budget was presented by Ms. Sheridan. Due to a mid-year transition of payroll to Munis, some history and categories may be confusing. Department Heads are being urged to close all open Purchase Orders to give a more realistic view of encumbered funds. Ms. Sheridan will have a more accurate figure in the coming weeks. The Commission discussed potential cost savings from reduced transportation or maintenance. Ms. Sheridan pointed out that although there may be a \$130,000 savings from the bus contract, there are approximately the same amount of extra transportation costs for special education. Commissioners asked about delaying new hires in FY2021 to provide cost reductions to offset anticipated revenue declines. Ms. Noumi pointed out that eliminating teachers and having more than thirty students per class may be unacceptable to the public immediately following an Override.

Tony Mazzucco, General Manager, reviewed increased costs in both the General Government and School Department as a result of COVID-19, and suggested using stabilization accounts and free cash to support the FY21 budget rather than making cuts. Mrs. Langone raised concerns that a deficit will be more difficult to address as time goes by and suggested a more proactive cost-cutting approach.

The Commission requested that Mr. Mazzucco provides modeling options for varying levels of revenue changes in advance of the next scheduled meeting in order to guide the Commission's decision on accepting a budget for FY2021.

On a motion from Mr. Slater, seconded by Ms. Noumi, the Commission *voted unanimously* through a roll-call vote to adjourn the meeting at 6:31 pm.

Dear Mr. Mazzucco,

The Police Department's fleet is using a Motorola APX6500 radio. We purchased these state of the art radios so that we would be prepared should any community go digital. What was lost in translation or not explained in any detail is that the radio though digital capable, it is not digital ready. This would mean that a device would have to be installed into the radio to transmit or receive digital transmissions. Unfortunately the Town of Walpole has gone digital leaving us and other area communities unable to communicate with an agency that we rely on, as they do us for mutual aid.

Over the last several years we have been able to issue most Officers with a digital ready portable radio. These have been updated to include the new Walpole Police frequency. Portable radios are usually turned down or off when the officer inside his cruiser. It would be extremely beneficial and important to have digital ready radios for all cruisers.

To have the fleet upgraded to become digital ready the cost would be at a cost of \$10,656.00. I have attached a quote from Motorola Solutions. This is quoted through Cyber Communications using the ITT57 MA STATE bid list.
