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FINANCE COMMISSION MEETING Monday, June 29, 2020 MINUTES OF MEETING- DRAFT

A meeting of the Finance Commission was held at 5:30 pm digitally using GoToMeeting.

Attending the meeting were Anne Haley, Chair, members Judith Langone, Kellie Noumi and Alan Slater, supported by Tom McQuaid, Clerk to the Finance Commission, Molly Ahearn, Assistant Town Accountant, and Emily Chambers, Budget Management Analyst. Vice Chair Robert Donnelly was absent.

Chair Haley requested a minor change to the minutes from the June 22, 2020 meeting. On a motion from Mr. Slater, seconded by Mrs. Langone, the amended minutes were *approved unanimously* through a roll-call vote.

Police Chief William G. Brooks presented the Police Department's Municipal Relief Request for an internal funds transfer of \$60,000 from Police-Paid Holiday into five operations accounts:

- \$35,800 into Police-Medical
- \$6,500 into Police-Transportation
- \$2,700 into Police-Telephone
- \$5,000 into Police-Miscellaneous
- \$10,000 into Police-Training/School
- Total: \$60,000

Chief Brooks explained that Transportation and Telephone costs in fiscal year 2020 were higher than projected. Also, the Medical costs in fiscal 2020 were higher due to an officer's surgery. The Police Department is requesting funds be transferred from the Paid Holiday account in which there is a balance because many officers choose to take time off instead of holiday pay.

Mrs. Haley asked whether the line items above were underfunded compared to previous years. Chief Brooks explained that fuel is level-funded from year to year, and often comes up short. Medical expenses are a moving target, as it is impossible to predict how many officers will be injured.

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On a motion from Ms. Noumi, seconded by Mrs. Langone, the Police Department internal funds transfer of \$60,000 was *approved unanimously* through a roll-call vote.

Commissioners expressed their gratitude to Chief Brooks and the rest of the Norwood Police Department for their hard work during these challenging times.

Mrs. Haley requested the Clerk of the Finance Commission to sign the Municipal Relief Request due to the fact that Commissioners were meeting virtually.

Mrs. Haley confirmed the next meeting date of July 15, at either 12:00 pm or 5:30 pm. Mrs. Haley will contact Representative John Rogers about attending a Finance Commission meeting to discuss state funding for FY21.

There being no other business, on a motion by Mr. Slater, seconded by Ms. Noumi, the Commission *voted unanimously* to adjourn at 5:45 pm.

Questions for Representative John Rogers

When do you anticipate the state will be able to put forward a complete FY21 budget?

Is the House considering adjustments in any revenue sources to close the budget gap?

What is the balance of the state's rainy day fund? Are there any proposals on the table to use some of this fund to reduce the budget gap?

What is the status of state funding, particularly school SOA funding? Please include time frames and amounts.

We need to make decisions at a September/October Town Meeting. When will we have the information available to us on state funding to make those decisions?

What can we expect for SPED circuit breaker?

Thoughts on the future: what can we expect for funding in future fiscal years? We would like to talk about any impact to the budget for 2022 and beyond. What is the State expecting for revenue reductions?

We have a State of Emergency for Norwood after the floods; what can we expect for assistance?

We realize that some if not most of the information we are asking for is fluid and no one has a crystal ball. Please give us your understanding at the present time.

Is there anything that you can share about Chapter 70 or SOA? Is there discussion to reduce funding from the early budget?

What are you doing to make sure DESE is putting out good guidelines in a timely manner?

Will some "out of the box" ideas be considered?

Is it possible that there could be flexibility regarding the number and length of school days?

How will things be managed to make sure the funding is appropriate for the COVID precautions that will be required of schools? It's not just PPE and cleaning supplies - it might be additional buses, additional lunch supervisors if students can't be grouped in the cafeteria, additional costs to separate cohorts of students, etc.

What are your ideas on handling the other unfunded mandates that schools face?

RE: Budget Funds Transfer

Dear Mr. Mazzucco,

The Police Department is requesting an additional \$30,000.00 to be transferred from POLICE-SALARIES to POLICE-EXPENSES. The Department had requested a funds transfer of \$60,000 in late spring, however, that request had unfortunately not sufficiently projected additional spring costs associated with spring firearm training and of course the current pandemic.

The Department also had to outfit several members of the department with ballistic body armor as the expiration date for the armor was approaching. These vests cost nearly \$1,000 each and have a 5 year life expectancy.

We currently have three recruits in the academy, and the pandemic caused the academy to cease operations. However, the graduation of the recruits has been moved up to the first two weeks of the new fiscal year, requiring that final equipment purchases be made before July 1.

Based on the current fiscal situation, we are requesting an internal department transfer of \$30,000.00 from 012101 519700 POLICE- PAID HOLIDAY into 012102-579600 POLICE-TRAINING.

Dear Mr. Plasko and Ms. Haley,

MUNICIPAL RELIEF REQUESTS

We are writing to request that your Boards take a vote to invoke the Municipal Relief Act to make fund the following accounts which are in deficit. The source of funding in each case will be Debt Service Interest Expense for Fiscal 2020.

General Manager Salaries \$7,000 – This deficit was caused by a long-term illness in the office and the related necessity to cover the position with temporary help.

Town Counsel \$106,000 – This deficit was primarily caused by the expense incurred settling a lawsuit. We have been waiting several weeks for all the final invoices to come in. While we have the option of deferring this amount to the Tax Recap for Fiscal 2021, we have the funds to dispose of this item now,

Building Commissioner Salaries \$3000 – Although we made a projection for year end and thought this account would be covered, the storm of June 28th put additional pressure on this budget.

Public Works Salaries \$1,000 - This account was also adversely affected by the storm of June 28th.

Medicare Expense \$47,000 – The Schools are on a bi-weekly payroll schedule. Lump sum payments for teacher summer salaries were paid on July 2, 2020 forcing the cost to go into Fiscal 2020. Our original budget anticipated this amount would not be disbursed until Fiscal 2021.

These items total \$164,000 and will be funded by interest expense savings in the debt service budget.
