

Shattuck Park

Just south of Highland Cemetery and adjacent to Winter, Bond, and Nichols Streets, is Shattuck Park.

This park serves as a green oasis for the surrounding neighborhood.

In December, 1924, Ms. Emma Morrill Shattuck offered these undeveloped wooded lots to the Town of Norwood. To date, the area remains open space with trails criss-crossing mixed woods.

At this location several types of trees and undergrowth can be seen, including red maple, white pine and blueberry. Occasionally, turkey and hawks can be seen, as well.

Trail Information

Location: Winter St & Nichols St, Norwood, MA.

Parking: Off-Street, Bellevue Ave.

Trails: 7.53 Acres, stonedust and natural walking trails.



Trail Rules and Etiquette

No motorized vehicles allowed on trails.

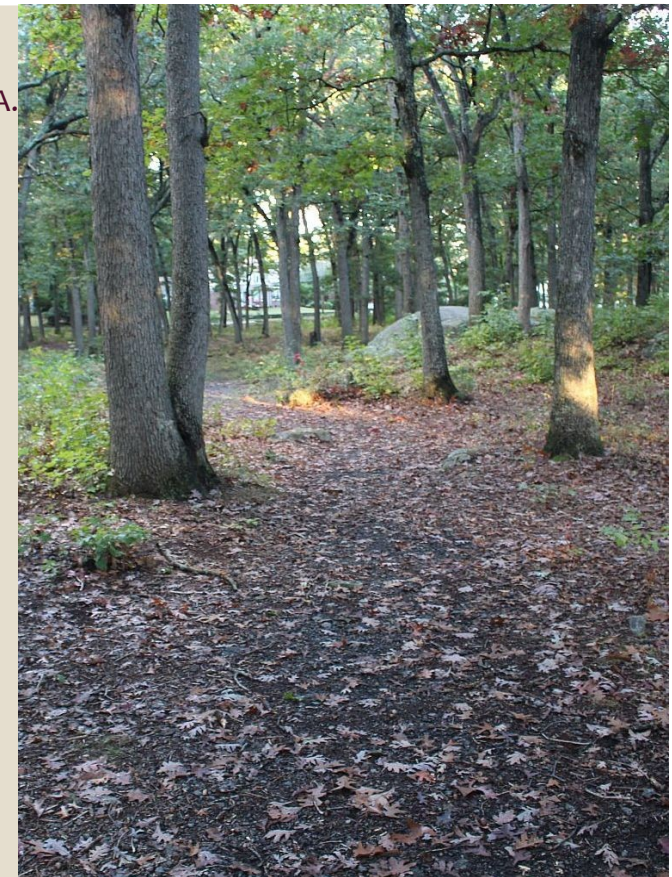
Dog owners must immediately pick up bag and properly dispose of all pet waste.

Shattuck Park Trail Map

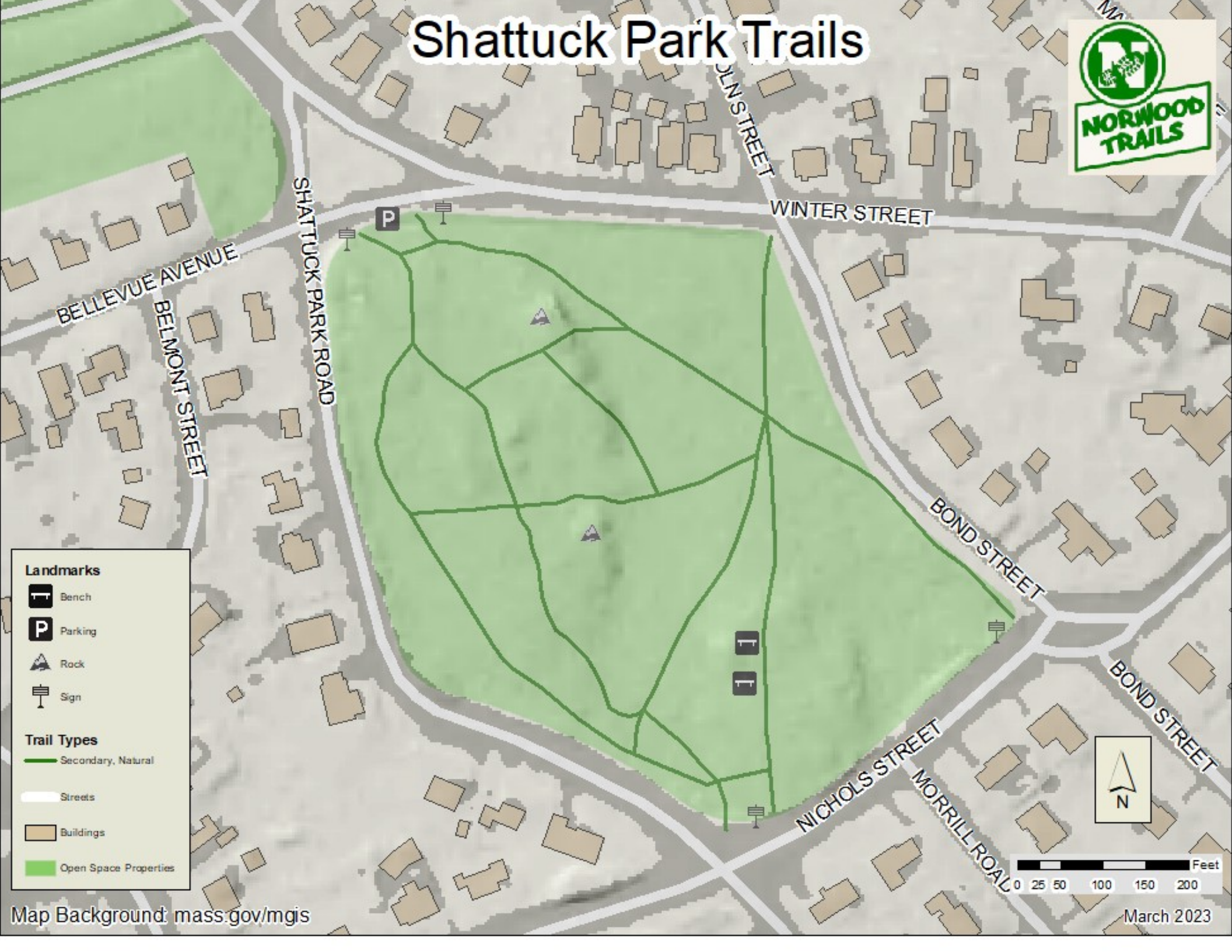
