

A look at how the Town of Wilton has changed demographically, fiscally, and socially - since the Master Plan was last updated in 1999.

The late author and biochemist Issac Asimov once noted that "It is change, continuing change, inevitable change, that is the dominant factor in society today. No sensible decision can be made any longer without taking into account not only the world as it is, but the world as it will be."

As Wilton begins the process of updating its Master Plan, it is important to review the changes which have occurred both in and outside the community over the last 14 years.

When Wilton last updated its Master Plan in 1999, President Bill Clinton was in office, the U.S. economy was powering through its longest peacetime expansion in history, and motor gasoline was selling for about \$.99 cents a gallon. The Town of Wilton has changed markedly since 1999, as have the regional and national landscapes. This document provides a basic overview of some of the changes that have occurred over that period.







Between 2000 and 2010, Wilton's population declined by 76 from 3,743 to 3,677 or by 2 percent.



An Aging Population

Wilton's population aged rapidly over the same period. The median age jumped from 37.4 to 42.1. The share of the population over age 44 jumped by 24 percent, while the population younger than 45 declined by 16 percent.
