Boo-Tification Awards - Rules & Criteria

- Decorations can include anything—lights, inflatables, art, you name it! Each house will be judged on its unique presentation.
- 2) Decorations must be PG-13. Nothing too inappropriate for neighbors and children, please.
- 3) Decorations must comply with all City of Oak Park laws and housing codes.
- 4) Judging will take place from 7-9 p.m. the week of October 14. Decorations must be displayed during that time period to be judged!
- 5) Winning homes will be determined by a majority vote of the Committee.
- 6) There will be 3 winners chosen from each section of the City (use leaf collection schedule to determine your section), and 3 businesses from throughout the entire City.
- Judging criteria: nighttime display, daytime display, use of lights, scariest display, most creative use of color, use of inflatables/props, theme execution, use of special effects, and interaction with children.
