SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER (SRO)

In September, officer Justin Hyland was assigned to the ConVal High School as a School Resource Officer. The SRO serves as a police officer performing responsible law enforcement duties, including policing the campus and a variety of other duties designed to preserve peace and order and to protect life and campus property. The officer serves as a resource teacher, reality counselor, and the law enforcement officer on campus. The SRO is not a school disciplinarian, but when a violation of school rules is also a violation of state law, the school administration and the SRO work together to bring all necessary resources under their control to help serve the school and solve the problem.

Officer Hyland works out of his office at the school Monday through Friday throughout the school year and is reassigned to the police department patrol schedule during the summer months.

ALICE Training (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter and Evacuate)

This year the Peterborough Police Department hosted a training for the ALICE program in conjunction with the Conval school district. School Resource Officer Hyland and 20 other law enforcement and school personnel participated in the training. ALICE is a civilian-based response to a critical incident event. This training was a train-the-trainer event made up of law enforcement and school officials from all over the state and even two from as far away as Toronto, Canada. Once certified, the participants can go back to their organizations and teach their people how to prepare and respond to a critical incident if the need should arise. Patrolman John Giffin was instrumental in getting this national level training brought to the Town of Peterborough.

PERSONNEL CHANGES

POLICE K-9

In 2022, K-9 Queso was called into service 71 times for a variety of tasks: Narcotic searches, crime scene tracking, tracking wanted individuals, searching for lost/missing persons (who Queso successfully located each time), building searches, and more.
