


ENVIRONMENTAL ENFORCEMENT



The mission of Environmental Enforcement, a department within the Pickens County Community & Tourism Development Division, is to work in partnership with Pickens County residents and stakeholders to promote and maintain a safe and desirable living and working environment.



CODE ENFORCEMENT & LITTER REPORTING TOOL



Citizens can now easily report litter and code enforcement issues online through the Code Enforcement and Litter Reporting Tool. When using a cell phone or other mobile device, citizens can even allow the site to detect your current location so users aren't required to key in an address.

Once in the system, Code Enforcement and Environmental Enforcement work the issue or complaint and log the process and results in EnerGov.





ADOPT A HIGHWAY PROGRAM



Partner organizations are invaluable to keeping our county clean and helping us toward our goal of being a litter-free community.

PRE-TRIAL INTERVENTION PROGRAM (PTI)

The Pre-Trial Intervention (PTI) program is a diversionary imprisonment if they meet a number of requirements such as paying restitution and performing community service. The program's focus is on rehabilitation – not discipline.

Solid Waste staff will work closely with the Community Engagement Specialist for PRT and the Environmental Enforcement officials to develop additional, cohesive educational materials for the public.






RESOURCE LIBRARY

A Resource Library is available on the county website, and includes:


