
The Highway Commission hereby finds and determines and makes this decision that the public good and public travel will best be served by removing from the State Trunk Highway System the road described as

WHEREAS, in its decision the Court determined the above matter to be of a class action binding all County Clerks within the State of Wisconsin, and noted in connection with this determination that the "Attorney General of Wisconsin has taken an active part in this action, urging that the challenged statute be upheld"; and

WHEREAS, this Court ruling is one of statewide concern and has many broad ramifications substanially affecting the State Treasury;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Pierce County Board of Supervisors hereby deems that the a forementioned Federal Court decision and judgment deleteriously impedes the official marriage license functions of all County Clerks in the 71 counties of this state, and will seriously impair the fundamental right of children residing in Wisconsin, whose parents have been divorced, to adequate parental financial support and thus effectually deprive them of such support in numerous instances; and

COUNTY AID CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTEMANCE DURING THE CALENDAR YEAR 1977

TO THE HONGRABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS FOR PIERCE COUNTY, MISCONSIN:

GENTLEMEN:

<u>SECTION I</u>. The County Board of Supervisors of Pierce County, Wisconsin, regularly assembled, does hereby ordain that such funds as may be made available to the County for highway work in the year 1977 under the provisions of Section 20.395 and Chapter 83 of the Statutes, and the additional sums herein appropriated, shall be expended as hereinafter set forth:

SECTION II. COUNTY TRUNK HIGHWAY ALLOTMENT. WHEREAS the Division of Highways has notified the County Clerk that a sum of money estimated to be Two hundred ninety-three thousand six hundred and no/100 Dollars (\$293,600.00) will become available at the end of the fiscal year under the provisions of Sections 83.10 and 20.395 (1) (qa) & (qb) of the Statutes, for the county trunk highway system in the County, but the actual amount will not be known until the close of the fiscal year ending next June 30.

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Highway Committee is authorized and directed to expend the said sum to the extent required to match and supplement Federal Aid for construction, right of way, and other costs on any Federal projects located on the county trunk highway system of said County, which are not recovered from Federal funds, and to expend any balance for constructing, repairing, and maintaining such county trunk highway system and the bridges thereon, including snow and ice removal and control, as directed in Section 83.10(1) of the Statutes, and to reimburse the General Fund for any expenditures that may be made therefrom pursuant to Section 83.01(6) of the Statutes.

SECTION III. WHEREAS it appears that certain additional highway improvements in the County are necessary and warranted.

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Board does hereby appropriate the following sums for the purpose hereinafter set forth:

(1) For snow and ice removal on the County Trunk Highway System, the sum of One hundred thirty thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$130,000.00).

(2) For the Sign Department, the sum of Forty-nine thousand five hundred and no/100 Dollars (\$49,500.00).

(3) For county trunk highway maintenance (to provide dust settler on construction projects, etc.), the sum of Eleven thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$11,000.00).

(4) For administration, including salaries, per diem, officer and travel expense of the County Highway Committee, the County Highway Commissioner, his clerks and assistants not paid from construction or maintenance funds, the sum of Seventy-four thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$74,000.00).

(5) For the Engineering Fund, the sum of Twelve thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$12,000.00).

Total Authorized in this Section - \$276,500.00.

SECTION IV. WHEREAS appropriations are made herein, in addition to the amounts to be received from the State and available for work in the County under Section 20.395 of the Statutes,

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Board does hereby levy a tax on all of the property in the County to meet such appropriations as follows:

For the various purposes as set forth in Section III hereof the sum of Two hundred seventy-six thousand five hundred and no/100 Dollars (\$276,500.00).

<u>MARNING</u>: It is directed that provision for this levy shall be made in the County budget, but that this levy shall not be duplicated.

SECTION V. WHEREAS the various highway activities for which provision is made in this resolution are continuous from year to year, and the exact cost of any work cannot be known at the time of making the appropriation therefor, BE IT RESOLVED that this Board does hereby direct that any balance remaining in any appropriation for a specific highway improvement after the same shall have been completed may be used by the County Highway Committee to make up any deficit that may occur in any other improvement, which is part of the same item in the <u>County budget</u>, for which provision is herein made, and any balances remaining at the end of the year in any highway fund shall remain and be available for the same purpose in the ensuing year.

SECTION VI. WHEREAS the exact amount of the funds that will become available from the State for highway purposes in the County under Section 20.395 of the Statutes will not be known until on or after next June 30,

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to make payments for the purposes for which such funds are to be used, as hereinbefore authorized, from any funds in the County treasury that are not required for the purpose for which appropriated prior to next August 1, and to reimburse such funds in the County treasury from the sums received under Section 20.395 of the Statutes.

SECTION VII. WHEREAS the County Highway Committee and the County Highway Commissioner are charged with the duty and responsibility of carrying out the construction and maintenance of highways for which provision is made, and other related supervisory and administrative duties,

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Highway Commissioner shall have authority to employ, discharge, suspend, or reinstate such personnel as he deems necessary for such purposes, provided however that the County Highway Committee may by action recorded in its minutes determine the number of persons to be hired and may also at any time by action so recorded order the County Highway Commissioner to employ, discharge, suspend, or reinstate any such person. The term "personnel" or "person" shall include all patrolmen, laborers, foremen, clerks, stenographers, or other employees necessary to carry on such activities.

FURTHERMORE, that out-of-pocket costs to the county, such as wages and Social Security will be reimbursed to the County by the Soil and Water Conservation District no later than December 31, 1977.

LIBRARY PLANNING COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, Chapter 52 of the Laws of 1971 has revised Chapter 43 of the Wisconsin Statutes to promote improvement of library services generally, and library services can now be made more effective by participation in public library systems, and state grants are available for system planning,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Pierce County Board of Supervisors

hereby establish a Pierce County Library Planning Committee in conformance with Section 43.11 of the Wisconsin Statutes, and that said Committee consist of nine members. The members shall be appointed by the County Board Chairman and said appointments shall be subject to the approval of the Pierce County Board.

Only one member of this committee shall be a County Board member. The appointments shall be for terms of three years, unless the Committee's final report is accepted earlier. In that case, the Committee shall dissolve immediately upon acceptance of the report. The residence of the Committee members shall reflect the population distribution within Pierce County. The membership shall include representatives of existing public libraries in the County; that the Pierce County Board Chairman may fill vacancies in this Committee subject to the approval of the Pierce County Board; that the Pierce County Clerk shall immediately notify the State Division for Library Services of the appointment of the Committee under this resolution, also report the names and address of Committee members when appointed; that the Pierce County Treasurer is authorized to honor said checks.
