ORDINANCE NO. 87-

PIERCE COUNTY OBSTRUCTING ORDINANCE

The County Board of Supervisors of Pierce County, Wisconsin does ordain as follows:

Section 1.

Whoever knowingly obstructs an officer while such officer is doing any act in an official capacity and with lawful authority, is guilty of a violation of this ordinance and shall be penalized as provided in Section 3 of this ordinance.

Section 2. Definitions.

- (a) "Officer" means a peace officer or other public officer or public employe having the authority by virtue of his office or employment to take another into custody.
- (b) "Obstructs" includes without limitation knowingly giving false information to the officer with intent to mislead him in the performance of his duty including the service of any summons or civil process.

Section 3. Penalty.

Any person who violates this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be subject to a forfeiture of not more than \$500 together with costs of prosecution and penalty assessment; and in default of payment of such forfeiture and costs, shall be subject to imprisonment in the County Jail until such forfeiture and costs be paid, but not to exceed 30 days.

Section 4.

Any future amendments, revisions, or modifications of Wisconsin Statutes Section 946.41(1), incorporated herein, are intended to be made part of this ordinance as such amendments, revisions, or modifications are made to said Statutes.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its proper passage and publication pursuant to Wisconsin

PIERCE COUNTY BATTERY ORDINANCE

The County Board of Supervisors of Pierce County, Wisconsin does ordain as follows:

Section 1.

Whoever causes bodily harm to another by an act done with intent to cause bodily harm to that person or another without the consent of the person so harmed is guilty of a violation of this ordinance and shall be penalized as provided in Section 3 of this ordinance.

Section 2. Definitions.

- (a) "Bodily harm" means physical pain or injury, illness, or any impairment of physical condition.
- (b) "Intent" means the mental purpose to cause bodily harm to another human being, or a belief that the act, if successful, will cause harm to another even if the defendant does not desire that harm to occur.

Section 3. Penalty.

Any person who violates this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be subject to a forfeiture of not more than \$500 together with costs of prosecution and penalty assessment; and in default of payment of such forfeiture and costs, shall be subject to imprisonment in the County Jail until such forfeiture and costs be paid, but not to exceed 30 days.

Section 4.

Any future amendments, revisions, or modifications of <u>Wisconsin Statutes</u> Section 940.19(1), incorporated herein, are intended to be made part of this ordinance as such amendments, revisions, or modifications are made to said Statutes.

ORDINANCE NO. 87- 3

PIERCE COUNTY CONCEALED WEAPON ORDINANCE

The County Board of Supervisors of Pierce County, Wisconsin does ordain as follows:

Section 1.

Any person except a peace officer who goes armed with a concealed and dangerous weapon is guilty of a violation of this ordinance and shall be penalized as provided in Section 3 of this ordinance.

Section 2. Definitions.

- (a) "Goes armed" means that the weapon must have been either on the defendant's person or that the weapon must have been within the defendant's reach. In addition, the defendant must have been aware of the presence of the weapon.
- (b) "Dangerous weapon" means any device or instrumentality which, in the manner it is used or intended to be used, is calculated or likely to produce death or great bodily harm, including any loaded or unloaded firearm.
- (c) "Great bodily harm" means bodily injury which creates a high probability of death, or which causes a permanent or protracted loss or impairment of the function of any bodily member or organ or other serious injury.

Any person who violates this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be subject to a forfeiture of not more than \$500 together with costs of prosecution and penalty assessment; and in default of payment of such forfeiture and costs, shall be subject to imprisonment in the County Jail until such forfeiture and costs be paid, but not to exceed 30 days.

Section 4.

Any future amendments, revisions, or modifications of <u>Wisconsin Statutes</u> Section 941.23(1), incorporated herein, are intended to be made part of this ordinance as such amendments, revisions, or modifications are made to said Statutes.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its proper passage and publication pursuant to Wisconsin Law.

FARMLAND PRESERVATION AGREEMENTS

WHEREAS, The Pierce County Planning & Zoning and Pierce County Agriculture Extension & Educational committees have been designated by the County Board of Supervisors to review and make recommendations on Farmland Preservation Agreement applications, and

WHEREAS, applications of the below listed applicants have been referred to the required agencies for a 30 day review period, and comments from said agencies have been considered, and

WHEREAS, the lands of said applicants meet the eligibility requirements of the law, namely;

- 1. The land is 35 acres or more.
- 2. The land produced gross farm profits (as determined in accordance with Federal Schedule F) of \$6,000. or more in the previous year, or \$18,000. or more in the previous 3 years.
- The land was in agricultural use for at least 12 consecutive months during the preceding 36 months.
- 4. The land was used for one or more of the following: Beekeeping; dairying, egg production; floriculture; fish or fur farming; forest and game management; grazing; livestock raising; orchards; plant greenhouses and nurseries; poultry raising raising of grain, grass, mint and seed crops; raising of fruits, nuts and berries; sod farming; vegetable raising and commercial feedlots.
- 5. The land is owned by a resident of the state. An "Owner" includes an individual, legal guardian, corporation, incorporated in Wisconsin, business trust, estate, trust, partnership or association of 2 or more persons having a joint or common interest in the land. Where land is subject to a land contract, "owner" means the seller in agreement with the buyer.
- 6. A Soil and water conservation district conservation plan is in effect or has been applied for, and
- 7. Landowner must include all existing tillable cropland according to Resolution No. 77-71.

WHEREAS, the land of said applicants meet the County's approved standards for approval, based on criteria specified in Sec. 91.13(4) relating to agricultural productivity, agricultural use, extent of contiguous ownership entered, consistency with existing Ag Preservation plans, or other criteria established by County Board of Supervisors.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That the following named applicants for Farmland Preservation Agreements under Ch. 91 of Wis. Stat. be approved by the Pierce County Board of Supervisors for participation in the Farmland Preservation Program. (See attached list)

- Site Selection Data for the Pierce County Sanitary Landfill (1986);
- 7. Initial Site Report for the Pierce County Sanitary

whereas, current and future studies will utilize these reports as well as additional information and data in the development and implementation of a comprehensive solid waste management program,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Pierce County develop and implement a solid waste management program to include:

- 1. A cooperative arrangement with nearby counties and other units of government or businesses when feasible and favorable to Pierce County for the managing of solid wastes including recycling, incineration, resource recovery¹ and landfilling of demolition and construction materials and inert² wastes only.
- The development of a sanitary landfill suitable to meet the requirements of the comprehensive solid waste management program to be developed according to this resolution.
- 3. A coordinated approach for the proper handling and disposal of industrial, institutional, agricultural and household hazardous wastes as defined in state and federal regulations, using those standards as minimum criteria.
- 4. A cooperative arrangement between the county and the municipalities whereby all will share the responsibility for determining an acceptable solid waste management solution.
- 5. An educational component to assist the municipalities in implementing solid waste management practices designed to reduce waste generation, reutilize waste resources, and properly dispose of inert waste materials.
- 6. Interactions with federal, state and local agencies and private business to develop alternatives to solve the waste tire and other special waste problems, and

Urge the Wisconsin Legislature To Reinstate The State Of Wisconsin Reimbursement To Counties For Excess Trial Expenses.

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS FOR PIERCE COUNTY, WISCONSIN

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN:

WHEREAS, 1973 Wisconsin Chapter 90 (Section 757.65, Wisconsin Statutes) was repealed by 1983 Act 27, Section 1749 M effective July 2, 1983; and,

WHEREAS, prior to the repeal of 1973 Wisconsin Chapter 90 the State was liable for certain enumerated trial costs in all trials involving indigent defendants where the costs exceeded the lesser of \$10,000 or 50 cents multiplied by the county's population; and,

WHEREAS, after the repeal of 1973 Wisconsin Chapter 90 the state no longer reimburses counties for excessive court costs for trials involving indigent defendants; and,

WHEREAS, the repeal of 1973 Wisconsin Chapter 90 overburdens counties with the trial expenses of indigent defendants and depletes the counties available resources for addressing local concerns including effective county administration and the health and safety of its residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Pierce County Board of Supervisors urges the state legislature to re-enact 1973 Wisconsin Chapter 90,

SO, NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Pierce County Clerk be authorized and directed to send a copy of this Resolution to area Wisconsin legislators and to the Wisconsin Counties Association.

Re-Classification of Roads

TO THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS FOR PIERCE COUNTY, WISCONSIN

Ladies and Gentlemen:

WHEREAS, the comprehensive study by the Functional/Jurisdictional Committee analyzed all highway segments in Pierce County in detail to determine their function, and

WHEREAS, three classifications (functions) were identified. Arterials, which provide interstate and interregional travel mobility connecting larger population centers and significant traffic generators are the highest classification. Collectors, which provide intra-county travel mobility and land access within localized areas, are in the middle classification and; locals, which provide direct land access and comprise all remaining public roads not classified as arterials or collectors, are the lowest classification, and

WHEREAS, the Functional/Jurisdictional relationships generally are that the Arterials are maintained by the State; the Collectors by the County; and the Locals by the Townships, and

WHEREAS, when analyzing the county highways the route segments meeting the criteria elements to be classified as Collectors were first identified as the High Group. (See the attached map.) Those county segments that were not classified as collectors were analyzed in more detail and divided into two sub-groups. The Middle Group consisted of those routes that the consensus of the committee felt had some stature even though they could not be totally justified as collectors by the criteria. The Low Group on the other hand were not performing a county function and were clearly local function roads.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, it is the policy of the County that all general maintenance on the County Trunk Highway System will be done on a priority basis. The High Group on the attached map will have first priority, the Middle Group second, and the Low Group last, and

FURTHERMORE, recognizing that improvements to County Highways are limited to available resources it is the intent of the County that proposed improvements be rated on the same priority basis. The High Group would be brought to current County Trunk Highway Collector Standards. The Middle Group will be maintained and, on a case by case basis, individual deficiencies will be corrected as the budget permits. The Low Group would be maintained unless the jurisdicational transfer of the responsibility for maintaining the highway is being transfered in which case the county would negotiate an improvement. It is also the specific policy of the County that current county maintained roads which adjoin another county's roads will not be transferred to a township unless the road in the adjacent county is also being transferred.

FURTHER, in recognition of this policy the County does hereby formally adopt the attached chart illustrating the guidelines that will be used to assess the county's responsibility towards the improvement needs of a particular highway. (Also attached is a map and a list identifying the status of the current County Trunk Highway System.)



GENTLEMEN:

SECTION I. The County Board of Supervisors of Pierce County, Wisconsin, regularly assembled, does hereby ordain that such funds as may be made available to the County for highway work in the year 1988 under the provision of Section 20.395 and Chapter 83 of the Statutes, and the additional sums herein appropriated, shall be expended as hereinafter set forth:

SECTION II. COUNTY TRUNK HIGHWAY ALLOTMENT: WHEREAS the Division of Highways has notified the County Clerk that a sum of money estimated to be Seven hundred eighty three thousand six hundred fourteen and 23/100 (\$783,614.23) will become available at the end of the fiscal year under the provisions of Sections 83.10 and 20.395 (1) (qa) & (qb) of the Statutes, for the county trunk highway system in the County, but the actual amount will not be known until the close of the fiscal year ending next June 30th.

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Highway Committee is authorized and directed to expend the said sum to the extent required to match and supplement Federal Aid for construction, right of way, and other costs on any Federal projects located on the county trunk highway system of said County, which are not recovered from Federal funds, and to expend any balance for constructing, repairing, and maintaining such county trunk highway system and the bridges thereon, including snow and ice removal and control, as directed in Section 83.10(1) of the Statutes, and to reimburse the General Fund for any expenditures that may be made therefrom pursuant to Section 83.01(6) of the Statutes.

SECTION III. WHEREAS it appears that certain additional highway improvements in the County are necessary and warranted:

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Board does hereby appropriate the following sums for the purpose hereinafter set forth:

- (1) For snow and ice removal on the County Trunk Highway System, the sums of Two hundred thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$200,000.00).
- (2) For the Sign Department, the sume of Forty five thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$45,000.00).
- (3) For county trunk highway maintenance (to provide dust settler on construction projects, etc.), the sum of Eight thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$8,000.00).
- (4) For administration, including salaries, per diem, officer and travel expense of the County Highway Committee, the County Highway Commissioner, his clerks and assistants not paid from construction, or maintenance funds, the sum of One hundred sixty thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$160,000.00).
- (5) For the Engineering Fund and for the purchase of right of way on county trunk highways, the sum of Eighty thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$80,000.00).

Total Authorized in this Section - \$493,000.00

SECTION IV. WHEREAS appropriations are made herein, in addition to the amounts to be received from the State and available for work in the County under Section 20.395 of the Statutes,

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Board does hereby levy a tax on all of the property in the County to meet such appropriations as follows:

For the various pruposes as set forth in Section III hereof the sum of Four hundred ninety three thousand and no/100 Dollars (493,000.00).

WARNING: It is directed that provision for this levy shall be made in the County budget, but that this levy shall not be duplicated.

 $\underline{\text{SECTION V.}}$ WHEREAS the various highway activities for which provision is made in this resolution are continuous from year to year, and the exact cost of any work cannot be known at the time of making the appropriation therefor,

BE IT RESOLVED that this Board does hereby direct that any balance remaining in any appropriation for a specific highway improvement after the same shall have been completed may be used by the County Highway Committee to make up any deficit that may occur in any other improvement, which is part of the same item in the County budget, for which provision is herein made, and any balances remaining at the end of the year in any highway fund shall remain and be available for the same purpose in the ensuing year.

SECTION VI. WHEREAS the exact amount of the funds will become available from the State for highway purposes in the County under Section 20.395 of the Statutes will not be known until on or after next June 30th.

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to make payments for the purposes for which such funds are to be used, as hereinbefore authorized, from any funds in the County treasury that are not required for the purpose for which appropriated prior to next August 1st, and to reimburse such funds in the County treasury from the sums received under Section 20.395 of the Statutes.

SECTION VII. WHEREAS the County Highway Committee and the County Highway Commissioner are charged with the duty and responsibility of carrying out the construction and maintenance of highways for which provision is made, and other related supervisory and administrative duties,

BE IT RESOLVED that the County Highway Commissioner shall have authority to employ, discharge, suspend, or reinstate such personnel as he deems necessary for such purposes, provided however that the County Highway Committee may by action recorded in its minutes determine the number of persons to be hired and may also at any time by action so recorded order the County Highway Commissioner to employ, discharge, suspend, or reinstate any such person. The term "personnel" or "person" shall include all patrolmen, laborers, foremen, clerks, stenographers, or other employees necessary to carry on such activities.

AMENDING THE PIERCE COUNTY PERSONNEL CODE

To The Honorable Board of Supervisors For Pierce County, Wisconsin

Ladies and Gentlemen:

. .

WHEREAS, the Pierce County Personnel Code was adopted by the Pierce County Board of Supervisors on November 16, 1982; and

WHEREAS, the Pierce County Personnel Code has been effective and in operation since the time of its adoption; and

WHEREAS, the Personnel Committee has recommended that the Pierce County Personnel Code be changed in the following manner,

SO, NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that Section XI be recreated to read as follows:

XI. Conditions of Employment

H. Work Rules

Second paragraph - amend to read as follows:

Grounds for disciplinary action shall be inclusive of, but not limited to, the following:

J. Discipline

1.b. Amend to read as follows:

Whenever an employee commits an offense warranting disciplinary action, the Department Head, or designee, the Supervising Committee or the Personnel Committee takes action in accord with the following procedures, depending upon the seriousness of the offense committed. Should any conflict arise between a supervising committee and the Personnel Committee over the proper discipline of an employee, the Personnel Committee's action shall take precedence and control.

1.b.4. Amend first sentence to read as follows:

The Department Head or designee and/or Supervising Committee and/or Personnel Committee may terminate an employee for any reason so long as the decision is not arbitrary or capricious.

Insert before last sentence the following:

The Department Head, the Supervising Committee or the Personnel Committee contemplating discharge of an employee may suspend the employee with pay pending an investigation and hearing before the Personnel Committee except where the procedure is set forth by the Wisconsin Statutes in which case the Statutory procedure shall be used.

Amend last sentence to read a follows:

If non-arbitrary and non-capricious reasons for termination exist, the suspended employee is discharged.

K. Probation

"to

All non-represented employees serve a probationary period of twelve (12) months. Employees may be discharged during the probationary period on a non-arbitrary basis without recourse through the County's grievance and appeal procedure.

It is the responsibility of the Department Head to monitor the performance of each new employee during the probationary period. The progress of a new Department Head is monitored by the Supervising Committee. Before one-half of the probationary period is served, the Department Head evaluates the performance of the employee and reviews his/her findings with the employee. Copies of the Probationary Evaluation Form are available from the County Clerk's Office. A signed copy of this evaluation is forwarded to the County Clerk's Office for inclusion in the employees permanent personnel file.

After ten and one-half months of employment the new employee is evaluated by the Department Head and confirmed by the supervising committee. Successful completion of the probationary period grants permanent status to the employee. Again, the evaluation form is forwarded to the County Clerk and the appropriate payroll changes are made. Department Heads are reviewed by their Supervising Committee and approved by the Personnel Committee. Personnel Committee may extend probation beyond twelve (12) months.

A probationary employee is not entitled to vacation, but upon completion of the probationary period, vacation credits accrue from the start date of employment. Probationary employees are entitled to paid holidays, provided they meet the eligibility requirements for holiday pay. Probationary employees are entitled to use sick leave as accrued.

Section V (B) (4)

Cooperative Extension Agents are to be annually evaluated by the Extension Committee and by the Cooperative Extension Service District Director. These evaluations are to be submitted to the County Personnel Committee for determination of annual salary adjustments and merit increases. Determination of merit should follow the same format and criteria as for other non-union county employees, but should apply only to the county portion of agents salaries.

The competent rating would include Income Maintenance Supervisor, Deputy Director of Human Services, Supervisor of Long Term Care, Director of Child Support, Administrative Assistant for Human Services, Law Enforcement Lieutenant, Register in Probate, Assistant Highway Commissioner, and Soil Conservation Technician with \$250.00 added to their salaries effective January 1, 1988.

REQUEST STATE OF WISCONSIN TO PROVIDE IMMUNIZATION SERVICES FUNDING

WHEREAS, the Division of Health will not receive enough federal grant funds to supply local public health agencies with adequate amounts of vaccine to meet the needs; and

WHEREAS, in Pierce County there are many families who will not have their children immunized if a charge is made at the immunization clinic. They will not come to clinics just as many do not now seek routine preventive health care for their children because of costs; and

WHEREAS, the Pierce County Health Committee has recommended the following:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that General Purpose Revenue funds be allocated for the purchase of vaccine, thereby enabling county health departments to continue to provide immunizations at no cost to those in need;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be forwarded to Governor Thompson, to all legislators representing Pierce County, and to the Wisconsin Counties Association.
