Women became pregnant after receiving the Moderna vaccine during clinical trials.

**4**

Women became pregnant after receiving the J&J vaccine during clinical trials.

*\*There have been no reports of anyone that has received the COVID vaccines having difficulty getting pregnant as a result of the vaccination.*
