

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE PINCKNEYVILLE CITY COUNCIL

HELD MONDAY, JANUARY 24, 2022, AT 6:00 P.M.

IN THE COUNCIL CHAMBERS, CITY HALL

ROLL CALL

Mayor Spencer called the regular meeting of the Pinckneyville City Council to order at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers, City Hall. Members present: Commissioners Ricky J. Cicardi, Kevin B. Hicks, Sammy D. Peradotta, William B. Stotlar, and Mayor Robert L. Spencer. Mayor Spencer declared a quorum present. Mayor Spencer announced the agenda was set. Administrative staff present: City Clerk Melissa Kellerman, City Attorney Don Bigham, and Fire Chief Jim Gielow. Due to the COVID-19 Pandemic, the public was invited to attend by social distancing in the lobby area and the Council Chambers of City Hall. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Commissioner Cicardi.

PREVIOUS MINUTES

Commissioner Hicks made a motion to approve the minutes of the January 10, 2022, regular council meeting. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Peradotta. On roll call: Commissioners Cicardi, Hicks, Peradotta, Stotlar, and Mayor Spencer voted YEA. NAYS: None. Motion declared carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Commissioner Stotlar reviewed the treasurer's report and stated that the ending balance total was \$8,608,441.69 up from last year, and unrestricted balance total was \$1,664,177.34 slightly up from last year, for the period ending December 31, 2021. Commissioner Stotlar made a motion to approve the treasurer's report. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Cicardi. On roll call: Commissioners Cicardi, Hicks, Peradotta, Stotlar, and Mayor Spencer voted YEA. NAYS: None. Motion declared carried.

ACCOUNTS PAYABLE

Commissioner Stotlar made a motion to approve the accounts payable. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Hicks. On roll call: Commissioners Cicardi, Hicks, Peradotta, Stotlar, and Mayor Spencer voted YEA. NAYS: None. Motion declared carried.

Commissioner Hicks announced the Pinckneyville High School Basketball Shootout will be Saturday, January 29, 2022, starting at 1:00 p.m. He said there will be ten teams in town to play five games.

RESOLUTION NO. R-2022-05 TO ENTER INTO A MOWING CONTRACT WITH THOMAS E. GARNER, D/B/A GARNER MOWING SERVICE FOR BALL DIAMONDS

Commissioner Cicardi presented Resolution No. R-2022-05, a resolution placed on file at the January 10, 2022, regular council meeting, authorizing the City of Pinckneyville, Perry County, Illinois, to enter into a mowing contract with Thomas E. Commissioner Cicardi requested approval to issue a Notice of Bid for Operator – Water & Sewer Treatment Plant. He stated this is an additional operator position. Commissioner Cicardi made a motion to issue a Notice of Bid for Operator – Water & Sewer Treatment Plant. Commissioner Peradotta seconded the motion. On roll call: Commissioners Cicardi, Hicks, Peradotta, Stotlar, and Mayor Spencer voted YEA. NAYS: None. Motion declared carried.

ORDINANCE NO. O-2022-01 AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF A 2010 FORD CROWN VICTORIA

Commissioner Hicks presented Ordinance No. O-2022-01, authorizing the sale of a 2010 Ford Crown Victoria automobile by the City of Pinckneyville, Perry County, Illinois. City Attorney Don Bigham stated the minimum price of \$1,500.00 was based on the minimum bluebook price and stated the Council has the discretion to ask a higher price. Commissioner Hicks made a motion to approve Ordinance No. O-2022-01. Commissioner Stotlar seconded the motion. On roll call: Commissioners Cicardi, Hicks, Peradotta, Stotlar, and Mayor Spencer voted YEA. NAYS: None. Motion declared carried.

PURCHASE 2022 FORD POLICE INTERCEPTOR FROM VOGLER FORD

Commissioner Hicks requested approval to purchase a 2022 Ford Police Interceptor from Vogler Ford at a total cost of \$35,626.00 for the police department. Commissioner Hicks stated Vogler has the vehicle in stock and the purchase would come from the Police Fund. Commissioner Hicks made a motion to approve the purchase. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Peradotta. On roll call: Commissioners Cicardi, Hicks, Peradotta, Stotlar, and Mayor Spencer voted YEA. NAYS: None. Motion declared carried.

HIRE PART-TIME STREET WORKER

Commissioner Peradotta requested approval to hire Roger Holt as a part-time street worker to replace part-time street worker Paul Ritter. He stated Mr. Holt will work two to three days per week and has passed his physical, drug and background tests. Commissioner Peradotta made a motion to approve the request. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Stotlar. On roll call: Commissioners Cicardi, Hicks, Peradotta, Stotlar, and Mayor Spencer voted YEA. NAYS: None. Motion declared carried.

(ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COORDINATOR/ZONING ADMINISTRATOR)**

Mayor Spencer presented Resolution No. R-2022-04, a resolution placed on file at the January 10, 2022, regular council meeting, authorizing the City of Pinckneyville, Perry County, Illinois, to enter into an Employment Contract with Carrie Gilliam (Economic Development Coordinator/Zoning Administrator) to include changes to the wages in the contract. Commissioner Stotlar made a motion to approve Resolution No. R-2022-04. Commissioner Hicks seconded the motion. ACCEPT PROPOSAL TO REMOVE ASBESTOS

Mayor Spencer requested approval to accept a proposal for a Pre-Demolition Asbestos Survey from Farmer Environmental Services, LLC, at a cost not to exceed \$6,250.00. Mayor Spencer stated the EPA requires asbestos be removed prior to demolition. This covers all buildings on the property including the ones purchased from the Kelly's for the new Pinckneyville Wastewater Treatment Facility. Commissioner Hicks made a motion to approve the request. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Cicardi. On roll call: Commissioners Cicardi, Hicks, Peradotta, Stotlar, and Mayor Spencer voted YEA. NAYS: None. Motion declared carried.
