# Board of Education

At the March 18<sup>th</sup> meeting, the Board of Education presented their tentative budget. Currently the total budget is \$25,211,109.00. It will result in a 1.96% increase in the tax levy, for the average assessed home of \$167,000. That amount will create an approximate \$95.00 increase over last year for the owner of an average home. The public hearing for the school budget will be held on April 29<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m. in the Pitman High School Media Center.
