Committee Reports

Councilman Austin

Councilman Austin reported that the next meeting of the Board of Trustees of the McCowan Memorial Library will take place on October 25.

Councilman Austin attended the Combined Planning and Zoning Board meeting on October 16. Three Historic District applications were submitted and approved by the Commission. The new bakery also applied for a sign permit; the business will be called the Broadway Bakery, and we look forward to its' success. Members from the Planning and Zoning Board would like to be placed on the next Work Session Agenda to discuss possible C-1 Historic District changes.

On October 15, Councilman Austin assisted the Friends of the Grove during their clean up, and thanked all who came out and helped the members.

Councilman Austin and Councilman Razze helped place the new birdhouse in the garden on First Avenue on October 15. Mr. Tim Dey created the birdhouse, which is a replica of the Grove Auditorium. The attention to detail that Mr. Dey incorporated is truly amazing. Thank you Mr. Dey.

Councilman Blass

Councilman Blass reported that the Historic Commission met on October 13, where they reviewed five applications. All were approved, with minor changes.

The Borough Engineer met with a roofing contractor today at the Grove Auditorium to inspect the roof. We are waiting for his report to determine how to proceed with the repairs or possible replacement needed.

Councilman Razze

Councilman Razze remarked on the birdhouse that was placed in the garden on First Avenue. He said that the entire birdhouse was made by hand, using scrap pieces of wood, and that it is quite impressive.

The Recreation Commission met last week, and will resume their monthly meetings at Borough Hall.

Registration for in-house basketball, and travel basketball, was last week. Anyone who did not get a chance to register should please stop by Borough Hall and see Andy Fox.

Councilman Razze said that earlier today he attended the monthly Joint Insurance Fund meeting, and reminded Mayor and Council that the Elected Officials have a training session coming up. The first one is in December at Merighi's in Vineland, and the second one is January 31, at Nicolosi's in Woodbury. The Borough receives a \$250.00 credit for each attendee to our assessment from the JIF.

Also, in everyone's mailbox, Councilman Razze said that there is a brochure advertising the MEL's thirtieth anniversary. The MEL is the Municipal Excess Liability Joint Insurance Fund. It provides a layer of coverage over and above our Gloucester, Cumberland, and Salem JIF, and insures many of the JIFs across the state.

Councilwoman Higbee

Councilwoman Higbee reported that the Gloucester County Road Department's paving projects will begin again on October 31. This project includes Broadway in Pitman, from Glassboro to Mantua Township, excluding Uptown Pitman. The milling and paving should begin on or around December 10.

The county has requested from the state, sixty million dollars to continue the light rail program through Gloucester County. In April or May of 2017, site work is expected to begin on the Inspira Hospital project on Route 322 in Harrison Township.

Rowan University has announced that they will begin development of the property they own, which is located

along Lambs Road.

In preparation for the 2017 year, Pitman is advertising for towing contract vendors, and we are sending out requests for professional contracts. We are also advertising an opening for a part time employee in our Water and Sewer Department.

Councilwoman Rudley

Councilwoman Rudley reported that the Police Department will be hosting the First Annual Food Truck Event and K-9 Fundraiser, "Chow down Uptown" is on Saturday, November 5th from 4:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m. We hope to see everyone there.

Ptlm. Chris Leach recently attended annual Recertification Training at the Gloucester County Police Academy.

The entire Police Department completed an active shooter drill, and the bi-annual firearms qualifications during the month of October. Sgt. Zander is the Police Department's Certified Range Instructor. This also includes use of force, and cap stun spray training.

Recently, there was a donation made in Ptlm. Chris Leach's name for \$1,100.00 to the Hero's Scholarship fund. This donation was made by the Hack Brigade, which is a golf group that raised this money during a golf tournament at the Salina Cup Match Play outing. The Hack Brigade donated this money in honor of Pltm. Leach's professionalism, service, and sacrifice to others.

Councilwoman Rudley said that the Fire Department and the Board of Fire Engineers hosted a wonderful Fire Prevention Night. Councilwoman Rudley thanked all of the people who were involved, and announced that there will be a fundraiser for the Highland Chemical Engine Company on the night before Thanksgiving.

Councilman Razze reminded everyone that registration for the Borough's Santa Parade is now open, and will continue until Friday, November 11.
