Council Reports

Councilwoman Rudley

Councilwoman Rudley thanked the Pitman Fire Department for their professionalism and incredible work with respect to the fire at 206 N. Broadway. Also thanked was the Pitman Police Department and everyone who participated in the Fishing Tournament on May 4. The weather was perfect and everyone had a great time.

The Economic Development Committee is finalizing its plan for flower planters along Broadway this spring, as well as working closely with the purchasers and investors uptown.

The Senior Outreach Committee has planned a Senior Bus Trip to Ocean Grove, New Jersey. The price is \$32.00 per person, and includes a walking tour, lunch and transportation. There were twelve spaces left as of this morning – so sign up quickly if you are interested.

Retired Police Chief, Jack McEnery who served the Pitman Police Department for over 25 years, passed away Sunday evening. The Pitman Police Department would like to send their condolences, thoughts and prayers to Chief McEnery's family and friends. Chief McEnery was one of the department's staunchest supporters and

never missed a chance to be present at the events held and sponsored by the PPD. Chief McEnery will be missed.

The Pitman Police Department would like to thank everyone who participated and/or supported our Annual K-9 Fishing Tournament. Once again it was a huge success as approximately 150 people were on hand to fish and enjoy the morning. Over 200 fish were caught including, one big, angry crayfish.

The PPD will begin periodically adding a K-9 activity account to its Council Report. This evening, the PPD is welcoming Ranger back to work after a couple of weeks off due to a minor shoulder injury which he sustained during a training exercise.

As a reminder, the Pitman Police Department will be holding its Second Annual Youth Academy during the second week of July. The Youth Academy is open to kids in the sixth and seventh grades. Applications for the Youth Academy are available at the Pitman Police Department and through the Pitman Police Department's Facebook Page.

Councilman Weng

Councilman Weng reported that in the month of March the Construction Office issued forty-three permits, which included forty-one for alterations and two for demolitions. Forty-two of the permits issued were for privately owned buildings and one was for a publicly owned building. The Construction Office collected \$77.01 in building permit fees, the Planning and Zoning Board collected \$200.00 in fees, and \$490.00 was collected for zoning permits.

On-street leaf collection will conclude on Friday, May 18. Going forward, please put leaves in containers at the curb after Friday, May 18.

- Seventeen loads of recycling for a total of 71 tons
- Sixty-six yards of leaves were collected
- Nine loads of bulk trash

Councilman Razze read the following report:

Thank you to our Recreation Director Andy Fox and to the members of the Recreation Commission who assisted with making our Youth Week activities a great experience for all the kids who participated.

At the May meeting of the Recreation Commission a policy was approved for the consideration of naming our recreation facilities around the Borough. The policy mirrors the Board of Education's policy with some minor adjustments. This clearly defines for interested parties the policy to follow for the Commission to possibly make a recommendation to Council for naming or renaming a facility.

Registration for summer band, summer field hockey, and summer tennis is currently open. Micro-mini soccer registration will be held at the end of this month. All forms and information can be found outside our Recreation

Office in Borough Hall or on the Borough website under the Parks and Recreation tab. Emails are also sent home through the schools and our information is posted on the Borough Facebook page.

Registration for the 4th of July Parade will remain open for about another month, closing on June 15 to allow us the time needed to notify all participants of their line up position.

The Miss Pitman Pageant Committee will hold its information session with the contestants on Sunday May 20 here in Borough Hall at 6:30 p.m. All girls were sent the information through the mail and through the email address that they provided.

Sponsors are reminded that they must provide a chaperone for all contestants. Parents are not permitted to transport the girls to and from the meetings.

The Environmental Commission's Earth Day celebration will be held this Saturday in Ballard Park during our Spring Craft Show, all are welcome to attend. Thank you to the Environmental Commission for all of their efforts in this and their other endeavors.

I would also like to offer my condolences and prayers to the McEnergy family on the passing of Chief Jack McEnergy. Chief McEnergy was an iconic member of our hometown, who never stopped serving even after he retired from his police work.

Chief McEnergy will not simply be missed by his family who had been so optimistic for his recovery in the past four weeks, and the impact of this loss will also be felt across the Borough and beyond.

Jason James, 91 Circle Avenue – Mr. James stated that one of the things he loves about Pitman is when the community comes together to offer support for each other. He said that he noticed this in particular last weekend when the Pitman Middle School had their Spring Fling Dance and he saw the Pitman Police Department and Mayor Johnson out making sure everyone was safely crossing the streets to get to where they were going. Mr.

James said that again the following morning, at the SPARC Race, he saw Mayor Johnson along with the Pitman Police Department, Councilwoman Rudley and Councilman Razze all helping out.

Vanessa James, 91 Circle Avenue, President of the Greater Pitman Chamber of Commerce - Ms. James thanked Council and the Chief of Police for working with her on the Beer Garden Application and Social Affairs Permit. She said that this was the first time the Chamber has held this type of event so it took a little bit of extra legwork. Ms. James said that she appreciated everybody's feedback, involvement and assistance, and she will make sure that its noted at the Chamber's meeting tomorrow night.

Jim Fortney, 502 Carew Avenue, President of the Pitman Garden Club - Mr. Fortney showed an advertisement from Glassboro highlighting their upcoming events and businesses. He gave it to Councilman Pierpont and asked him to share it with Pitman's Chamber of Commerce.

Mr. Fortney thanked the Borough's Water Department employees for helping to get the water running for the First Avenue sprinkler system.

Mr. Fortney announced that the Garden Club began planting in March, beginning with the flower gardens at the Cedar Avenue triangle, Shertel Park, First Avenue, the Rose Garden at the Library, and the Ed Campbell Memorial. They are just about finished up and will be moving on to preparing the hanging baskets for along Broadway.

The Garden Tour for this year will be held on June 23, from Noon until 4:00 p.m. At this time, they have about seven or eight houses, and would to have a few more if anyone is interested in participating. The Garden Club members will begin selling tickets soon.

Mr. Fortney asked if it would be alright for the Garden Club to plant flowers in the brick planter around the electronic sign at the corner of Broadway and Holly Avenue.

Councilwoman Rudley said that the planter is damaged and that John Fitzpatrick had someone take a look at it, and is waiting to see if they will be able to find bricks that match. They are also looking for someone to donate their time and labor to doing the repair. Mr. Fortney replied that they can put a planter in the bed until the brickwork is completed.

Mr. Fortney concluded by saying that at the last Council meeting the Police Chief was put on the spot, and that it was wrong to do so. He said that he feels that the Chief explained himself very well as to why he would not sign off on the Beer Garden. Mr. Fortney said that in the future, if the Event Permit Applications are not complete, they should not be placed on the agenda.

Kara Knauss, 222 Embury Avenue – Ms. Knauss thanked the Environmental Commission for all the work that they do and said that she is looking forward to the nature walk Saturday, June 9. She said that she is very much in agreement with their efforts to preserve Alcyon Woods and that she hopes that as a community we can think of a creative solution to support their efforts while addressing some of the economic concerns that we have in town.
