-Parks and Rec is still open and working during the pandemic. They are open Monday-Thursdays from 8-2. The parks in town are open, particularly Alcyon where the disc golf course has been consistently used. At this point, there have not been any issues that have occurred. We will continue to look out for any out-of-state license plates for safety purposes.

-The baseball fields in town are being kept and maintained. They are ready to go as normal, as if games were still scheduled to be played on them.

-Currently, the plan is to salvage the T-ball program. It is currently on hold. An email has been sent out informing everyone involved. A decision about its status will be done by the first week of June. Options were discussed, including possibly combining with Glassboro or doing a 3-day tournament to get as many games done as possible. If T-ball cannot run, Andy discussed the possibility of reimbursement and the idea of rolling over the money toward a future program in, say, the fall.

-Andy and Laurie briefly discussed the logistics of running Summer Playground this year. With not a lot of time to prepare and the usually large turnouts with current restrictions in place, it did not seem likely that it would run. However, a formal decision was not made at this time.

-Spring tennis is on hold, and the idea would be to combine it with the summer tennis program.

-By the first week of June, a decision will also be made about the Fourth of July Freedom 4 Miler. Shirts, bibs, and other necessities would need to be ordered in time to make the run a continued success.
