U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Reviews Cleanup at Lipari Landfill Superfund Site

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is conducting its Fourth Five-Year Review of the Lipari Landfill Superfund Site located in Gloucester County, New Jersey. This review seeks to confirm that the cleanup conducted at the site, which included:

Installation of a 16-acre containment system around the former landfill and surrounding area; a batch flushing system to treat contaminated groundwater within the containment area; collection and on-site treatment of leachate; And, excavation, treatment and consolidation of off-site soils and sediments continues to be protective of human health and the environment.

A summary of these activities and evaluation of the long-term protectiveness of the remedy will be included in the upcoming Five-Year Review report.

What is an EPA Five-Year Review?

EPA inspects Superfund sites every five years to ensure that cleanups conducted remain fully protective of human health and the environment. These regular reviews, which are required by federal law when contaminants remain at a site, include:

- Inspection of the site and cleanup technologies;
- Review of monitoring data, operating data, and maintenance records, and
- Determination if any new regulatory requirements have been established since EPA's original cleanup decision was finalized.
