Key Diversity Statistics and Impact

- 9.1% of Pitman residents live at or below the poverty line
- Approximately 2/3rds of Pitman residents do not have a college degree
- Less than 5% of Pitman residents are Black/African-American
- Less than 3% of Pitman residents are Hispanic or Latino
- Less than 1% of Pitman residents are Native American, Native Hawai'ian, or Asian
- Around 55% of Pitman residents are female
- Approximately 7% of Pitman residents have a disability

From the available Census data, Pitman's DEI Committee works to advocate for these groups/persons by way of promoting access to resources, equity, and inclusion in full representation.
