 - Request for Board Action Application 2178 The Enclave Cluster Housing Option

Mrs. Radtke reviewed the actions of the Planning Commission in recommending approval of the Cluster Housing Option on 4.75 acres located north of Ann Arbor Trail, west of Sheldon Road. Their approval was subject to restriction of decks, privacy screening or other above-ground building

projections as identified in Section 28.20 of Zoning Ordinance No. 99 for Units 6 and 7 because of a 35-ft. perimeter setback along the west property line. They also required a landscape buffer along the west property line, and some level of landscape screening along the east property line, as they would determine during Site Plan Review.

Board members discussed the proposed cluster plan for building eight detached single-family residential units. They also discussed a parallel plan which would allow for six homes to be built.

Michael and Kendall Gulbernat of 12560 Lighthouse Court and Rita Furdak of 12536 Lighthouse Court, both abutting Units 6 and 7, addressed the Board, stating their objections to the plan, including their concern about drainage issues.

Walt Menard of Menard Premier Homes and Uldus Vitins of Vitins Engineering addressed the Board and answered questions regarding the proposed luxury homes.

The Board felt that further study of the proposal with Mrs. Radtke and the Planning Commission would be beneficial to the developer, perhaps resulting in building sites that didn't require a reduced setback.

Moved by Mr. Curmi and seconded by Mr. Edwards to postpone a decision on Application 2178, Single Family Cluster Housing Option for The Enclave, Parcel R-78-036-99-0024-000. Ayes all.

• Request for Board Action - Versatrans Update

Mr. Fellrath presented photos of the blue, gluey type discharge found in the sewer line which dead ends at VersaTrans at 14777 Keel Street. He updated Board members on the actions undertaken over the past two years by WTUA, YCUA, the Michigan DEQ and the Township's DPW staff, to bring Versatrans into compliance and remediate damage to the sewer.

• Request for Board Action - Appointment to Planning Commission

This appointment replaces the opening on the Planning Commission created by the passing of former Trustee Kay Arnold, who served for over 20 years as ex-officio member.

Moved by Mr. Mann and seconded by Mr. Curmi to approve the Supervisor's appointment of Trustee Mike Kelly as the ex-officio member of the Planning Commission, effective immediately. Ayes all.

• Request for Board Action - Water and Sanitary Sewer Feasibility Study for Salem Township

Mr. Mann asked that he be allowed to abstain from voting on this matter to avoid any appearance of a conflict of interest because his firm is representing Salem Township in their investigation for obtaining water and sewer services.

Board members discussed the pros and cons of conducting a study regarding the feasibility of Plymouth Township providing water and sanitary sewer services to Salem Township's Urban Services District. The in-depth study is to be conducted by Wade-Trim Associates and paid for by Salem Springs LLC.

Moved by Mr. Edwards and supported by Ms. Conzelman to approve Resolution No. 2015-11-17-28 authorizing the Supervisor and Clerk to sign the Intergovernmental Agreement between Salem Township and Plymouth Township to study the feasibility of Plymouth Township providing water and sanitary services to Salem Township's proposed Urban Services District.

M. SUPERVISOR AND TRUSTEE COMMENTS

Mr. Mann thanked the Board for his appointment and hoped to see all work for the good of the Township. Mr. Curmi asked to see the information regarding easement gathering to fill sidewalk gaps and when the newsletter would be available for review. Mr. Doroshewitz asked to see a list of grants for which applications are being made, a detailed accounting for all projects in the park, and copies of the bills for legal services. He also asked why the Treasurer, rather than the Supervisor was meeting one-on-one with anyone who wanted to go over the budget since it's the Supervisor's budget. Mr. Edwards noted he has been assembling the budget for 15 years without any objections and that Mr. Price, just like prior Supervisors, had reviewed the line items and met individually with each department head in order to create the proposed budget. He also asked that questions be asked before the meeting, rather than at the meeting. Ms. Conzelman said that three elections are scheduled for next year: the presidential primary on March 8, the state primary in August and the November general election. She encouraged people leaving for Florida to notify the Clerk's office of the address where their absentee ballots should be sent if they won't be back in time for the

March election. Mr. Price reviewed his involvement in preparation of the budget with the department heads and Treasurer and willingness to meet with Trustees to review the budget. He also reminded Board members that Tuesday, November 24, 2015, is "Pucks for Pasadena," a game between the Red Wings Alumni and the USA Hockey team, to help send the Plymouth Canton Educational Park Marching Band to the Rose Bowl Parade. USA Hockey has donated the use of the arena, parking lot, etc., for the game. He also extended an invitation to attend the Township Christmas Tree Lighting at Township Park on December 1, 2015.

Ed Haggerty objected to the closed session being placed on the agenda near the beginning of the meeting;, Richard Beers had comments regarding developing utilities in Salem Township and Don Schnettler had questions on how members of the military can obtain absentee ballots and on the budget.

ARTICLE XXXI

ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS

SEC. 31.1 MEMBERSHIP, TERMS, REMOVALS

There shall be a Charter Township of Plymouth Zoning Board of Appeals which shall have five (5) members appointed by the Township Board, subject to the following:

1. Membership

One (1) member of the Zoning Board of Appeals shall also be a member of the Charter Township of Plymouth Planning Commission. One (1) member may also be a member of the Township Board. The remaining members shall be selected from among electors residing in the Charter Township of Plymouth. An elected officer of the Township shall not serve as Chair of the Zoning Board of Appeals. An employee or contractor of the Township Board shall not serve as a member or an employee of the Zoning Board of Appeals.

2. Removal

Members of the Zoning Board of Appeals may be removed by the Township Board for nonperformance of duty or misconduct in office after written charges have been filed with the Township Clerk, and after public hearing has been held on the charges by the Township Board. Failure of a member to disqualify himself/herself from deliberations and action on any questions, interpretations, appeals or other requests for action in which he/she has a conflict of interest shall constitute misconduct in office.

3. Term

The term of each member shall be for three (3) years, except that of the members first appointed, two (2) shall serve for two (2) years and the remaining members for three (3) years. A successor shall be appointed not more than one (1) month after the term of the preceding member has expired. All vacancies for un-expired terms shall be filled for the remainder of the term.

4. Alternates (as amended 9/30/07)

Up to (2) alternate members may be appointed to serve on the Zoning Board of Appeals in the same manner as appointments of regular members. An alternate may be called on a rotating basis to serve as a member of the Zoning Board of Appeals, with the same voting rights as a regular member, in the absence of a regular member if the regular member will be unable to attend one (1) or more meetings, or for the purpose of reaching a decision on a case in which the regular member has abstained for reasons of conflict of interest. Whenever an alternate serves as a member of the Zoning Board of Appeals on a case, the alternate member shall continue to serve in the case until a final decision is made.

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

The required limits of liability for insurance coverages shall not be less than specified herein unless specified otherwise on any "Special Conditions."

Commercial General Liability (CGL)

Insurance Services Office Form CG 00 01 covering CGL on an "occurrence" basis, including products and completed operations, property damage, bodily injury and personal and advertising injury with limits no less than \$5,000,000 per occurrence. If a general aggregate limit applies, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to this Contract or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit.

Umbrella or Excess Liability

Policy in an amount not less than \$3,000,000. Umbrella or Excess policy wording shall be at least as broad as the primary or underlying policy(ies) and shall apply both to the Contractor's general liability and to its automobile liability insurance and shall be written on an occurrence basis. The County, officials, employees and others as may be specified in any "Special Conditions" shall be named as an additional insured under this policy.

Automobile Liability

Insurance Services Office Form Number CA 0001 covering, Code 1 (any auto), or if Contractor has no owned autos, Code 8 (hired) and 9 (non-owned), with limits no less than \$1,000,000 per accident for bodily injury and property damage.

Workers' Compensation

Insurance as required by the State of Michigan, with Statutory Limits, and Employer's Liability Insurance with limits of no less than \$1,000,000 per accident for bodily injury or disease.

Professional Liability (if Design/Build)

Insurance appropriate to the Contractor's profession, with limits no less than \$3,000,000 per occurrence or claim, \$3,000,000 aggregate.

Builder's Risk (Course of Construction)

Insurance utilizing "All Risk" (Special Perils) coverage form, with limits equal to the completed value of the project and no coinsurance penalty provisions.

Contractors' Pollution Legal Liability and/or Asbestos Legal Liability and/or Errors and Omissions (if project involves environmental hazards)

Insurance with limits no less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence or claim, and \$2,000,000 policy aggregate.

▶ If the Contractor maintains higher limits than the minimum insurance coverage required as stated above in this Attachment, the Contractor shall maintain the coverage for the higher insurance limits for the duration of this Agreement.

Additional Insured Status

The County, its officers, officials, employees, volunteers, and others as may be specified in any "Special Conditions" shall be additional insureds on the CGL policy with respect to liability arising out of work or operations performed by or on behalf of the Contractor including materials, parts, or equipment furnished in connection with such work or operations. General liability coverage can be provided in the form of an endorsement to the Contractor's insurance (at least as broad as ISO Form CG 20 10 11 85 or both CG 20 10 and CG 20 37 forms if later revisions used).

Primary Coverage

For any claims related to this Agreement, the Contractor's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects the County, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the County, its officers, officials, employees, or volunteers shall be excess of the Contractor's insurance and shall not contribute with it.

Notice of Cancellation

Each insurance policy shall state that coverage shall not be canceled, except with notice to the County.

Waiver of Subrogation

Contractor grants to the County a waiver of any right to subrogation which any insurer of the Contractor may acquire against the County by virtue of the payment of any loss under such insurance. Contractor agrees to obtain any endorsement that may be necessary to affect this waiver of subrogation, but this provision applies regardless of whether or not the County has received a waiver of subrogation endorsement from the insurer.

Deductibles and Self-Insured Retentions

Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by the County. The County may require the Contractor to provide proof of ability to pay losses and related investigations, claim administration, and defense expenses within the retention.

All insurance must be effected under valid and enforceable policies, issued by recognized, responsible insurers qualified to conduct business in Michigan which are well-rated by national rating organizations. All companies providing the coverage required shall be licensed or approved by the Insurance Bureau of the State of Michigan and shall have a policyholder's service rating no lower than A:VII as listed in A.M. Best's Key Rating guide, current edition or interim report.

Claims-made Policies

If any of the required policies provide coverage on a claims-made basis:

- 1. The Retroactive Date must be shown and must be before the date of this Agreement or the date the Contractor starts to perform the services.
- 2. Insurance must be maintained and evidence of insurance must be provided for at least five (5) years after completion of this Agreement.
- 3. If coverage is canceled or non-renewed, and not replaced with another claims-made policy form with a Retroactive Date prior to this Agreement's effective date, the Contractor must purchase "extended reporting" coverage for a minimum of five (5) years after completion of Agreement work.

Verification of Coverage

Contractor shall furnish the County with original certificates and amendatory endorsements or copies of the applicable policy language effecting coverage required by this Article. The County shall receive and approve all certificates and endorsements before the Contractor begins providing services. Failure to obtain the required documents prior to commencement of services shall not waive the Contractor's obligation to provide them. The County reserves the right to require complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies, including endorsements required by the Article, at any time.

Subcontractors

Contractor shall require and verify that all subcontractors maintain insurance satisfying all the stated requirements, and Contractor shall ensure that the County is an additional insured on insurance required from subcontractors.

Special Risks or Circumstances

The County reserves the right to modify these requirements, including limits, based on the

nature of the risk, prior experience, insurer, coverage, or other special circumstances.

The Contractor must submit certificates evidencing the insurance to the Risk Management Division at the time the Contractor executes an agreement with the Township, and at least fifteen (15) days prior to the expiration dates of expiring policies.

Surety Bonds

The Contractor shall provide the following Surety Bonds: 1) Bid bond; 2) Performance bond; 3) Payment bond; 4) Maintenance bond. The payment bond and the performance bond shall be in a sum equal to the contract price. If the performance bond provides for a one year warranty a separate Maintenance Bond is not necessary. If the warranty period specified in the contract is for longer than one year a Maintenance Bond equal to 10% of the contract price is required. Bonds shall be duly executed by a responsible corporate surety, authorized to issue such bonds in the State of Michigan and secured through an authorized agent with an office in Michigan.

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THIS AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is between the County of Wayne, Michigan, a public body corporate and Home Rule Charter County, acting through its Department of Public Services, Parks Division (hereinafter the "County") and the Charter Township of Plymouth, a Michigan municipal corporation (hereinafter "Township").

1. PURPOSE

1.01 The County and Township have an interest in entering into cooperative parks and recreation projects that are mutually beneficial to the residents of Wayne County.

2. <u>SCOPE OF THE PROJECT</u>

2.01 The County will cooperatively fund the construction of improvements (the "Project") at the Plymouth Township Park, located in the Township (individually, "Site" or collectively, "Sites"), for the citizens of Wayne County, at the locations described in **Exhibit A** attached hereto and made a part hereof. The County will finance any improvements agreed upon by the Chief Executive Officer for the County or his/her designee and the Supervisor of the Township or his/her designee, in creation of the Project under the limitations indicated in Sections 4 and 5.

3. TERM OF CONTRACT

3.01 The effective date of this Agreement is upon approval of the Wayne County Commission and execution by the Wayne County Chief Executive Officer, and shall terminate on October 15, 2017 at 11:59 p.m.

<u>3.02</u> If Township fails to complete the Project by the termination date as stated in Section 3.01, the parties agree that the County shall be under no further obligation to provide any remaining funds committed hereunder.

4. <u>COUNTY'S COVENANTS</u>

4.01 The County will assist in funding construction of the recreational Project described in Exhibit B attached hereto and made a part hereof. The FY 2014-15 funding provided by the County for the recreational Project shall not exceed Sixty-One Thousand One Hundred Fifty Eight (\$61,158.00) Dollars.

5. TOWNSHIP'S COVENANTS

<u>5.01</u> Prior to construction of any portion of the Project, Township shall provide the County with documents evidencing title to each Site, including, but not limited to, deeds, assignments, leases, land contracts, and mortgage instruments. The documents must specify all covenants, restrictions, easements, or other encumbrances on each Site.

5.02 Township warrants that it is the legal owner with good, valid, and clear title to each Site described in Exhibit A. To the extent allowable by law the Township shall hold harmless and defend the County against any claims, demands, penalties, fines, liabilities, settlements, damages, costs or expenses, including but not limited to, court costs and litigation expenses, known or unknown, contingent or otherwise, arising out of or in any way related to an action by a third party to quiet title in any Site described in Exhibit A.

5.03 Township shall keep accurate records and account of the Project costs that shall be accessible for inspection and audit by a representative of the County.

<u>5.04</u> Township shall submit to the County no more frequently than once every 30 days, a certified application for reimbursement of acceptable Project costs together with all contractor and subcontractor certified invoices and any required supporting documentation for reimbursement, which shall be made upon receipt and approval of the application for

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reimbursement. The County is under no obligation to reimburse Township for any unapproved costs or costs outside the scope of this Agreement.

<u>5.05</u> Township shall be responsible for financing the Project beyond the financial commitment the County has made as indicated in Section 4.01.

<u>5.06</u> Township shall operate and maintain improvements for public recreation, and that it shall allow each park to be open to the public on equal and reasonable terms and that no individual shall be denied ingress or egress thereto or the use thereof on the basis of sex, race, color, religion, national origin, residence, age or handicap.

<u>5.07</u> Township agrees that in consideration of the financial commitment that the County is providing for the Project, Township shall operate each Site as a recreational facility for no less than 10 years after the Project is completed.

5.08 Township will develop signage at its own expense, which recognizes the County as a donor at each Site. The signage shall comply with the specifications described in Exhibit C attached hereto and made a part hereof. The County shall have the right to approve the signage. Such approval will not be unreasonably withheld or delayed. Township shall install the signage prior to the Project's completion.

<u>5.09</u> Township agrees to provide the County with an opportunity to participate in planning any press conference, ribbon cutting ceremony, opening ceremony, or other public/media announcement related to the Project ("media event"). Township further agrees to provide the County with no less than thirty (30) days' prior written notice of a proposed media event.

5.10 Breach of any of the provisions contained in this Article may be regarded as a material breach of this Agreement.

6. **TERMINATION**

<u>6.01</u> This Agreement can be terminated by either party with or without cause upon 30 days' written notice, prior to commencing construction. If terminated prior to commencing construction of the Project, each party is solely responsible for its own costs, fees, and obligations incurred prior to the termination.

<u>6.02</u> After the Project's construction is commenced, the County may terminate this Agreement with or without cause and shall be responsible for expenses previously approved by the County and incurred by Township, not to exceed the amount stated in Section 4.01.

<u>6.03</u> Township may terminate this Agreement, with or without cause, after construction is commenced and shall return to the County any funding provided by the same under this Agreement.

6.04 This Agreement shall terminate if any Site is not operational and regularly open to the public.

7. DATA TO BE FURNISHED

<u>7.01</u> Township must maintain copies of all information, books, data, reports, records, etc., related to the Project. Such information and records shall be maintained for a period of three (3) years from the date Township receives its final reimbursement payment under this Agreement.

<u>7.02</u> Upon the request of the County or its authorized representative, including its Legislative Auditor General, Township must furnish, without charge, copies of all information,

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books, records, data, reports, etc., of Township, or any contractors, subcontractors, consultants or agents rendering or furnishing services under this Agreement, whether direct or indirect, that will permit adequate evaluation or audit of the services provided by Township or any of its contractors, subcontractors, consultants or agents. Township must include a similar covenant allowing for County audit in any agreement it has with a contractor, subcontractor, consultant or agent related to this Agreement. The County may delay reimbursement payments to Township pending the results of any such audit without penalty or interest.

<u>7.03</u> The County may schedule conferences at mutually convenient times with Township administrative personnel to gather the information. If, as a result of any audit conducted by or for the County relating to Township's performance under this Agreement, a discrepancy should arise as to the amount of compensation due Township, Township shall pay to the County on demand the amount of compensation in question. If Township fails or refuses to make payment, in addition to other legal remedies available to the County, the County may retain said amount from any funds allocated to Township but not yet disbursed under this Agreement or may offset such a deficiency against the compensation to be paid Township in any concurrent, successive or future agreements between the parties.

<u>7.04</u> Township further acknowledges the right of the Wayne County Commission as a third-party beneficiary of this Agreement to sue for specific performance to enforce the audit rights provided herein for the Legislative Auditor General.

8. <u>ADMINISTRATION</u>

<u>8.01</u> Township must inform the County as soon as the following types of conditions become known:

- 1. Probable delays or adverse conditions which do or may materially prevent meeting the objectives of this Agreement, including changes, transfer, or assignment of any real property interest related to any Site;
- 2. Favorable developments or events that enable meeting time schedules or goals sooner than anticipated; or
- 3. Any changes or modifications in appropriations and funding for the Project.

9. <u>RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES</u>

<u>9.01</u> The parties are independent entities. No liability or benefits, such as Workers' Compensation, pension rights, or insurance rights, arising out of, or related to a contract for hire or employer/employee relationship, accrues to either party or either party's agents, contractors, subcontractors, or employees as a result of this Agreement. No relationship, other than that of independent contractor will be implied between the parties, or either party's agents, employees, contractors, or subcontractors.

10. INSURANCE

<u>10.1</u> The Township will require that all contractors undertaking work on the Project provide insurance coverage in said amounts as set forth in **Attachment D**.

10.2 All insurance and bonds shall name the County of Wayne and the Township as insured or beneficiary.

11. HOLD HARMLESS

<u>11.01</u> Township agrees to remain responsible for its own negligence, or tortious acts, errors, or omissions, and the acts, errors, or omissions of any of its employees, contractors, subcontractors, consultants, or agents. It is agreed that the County is merely acting as a funding source for the Project and that any negligence, or tortious acts, errors, or omissions on the part of

the County shall only arise out of providing these funds or processing reimbursement requests made by Township as submitted pursuant to Section 5.03.

<u>11.02</u> This hold harmless provision must not be construed as a waiver of any governmental immunity by the County or Township or any of their agencies, or employees, as provided by statute or modified by court decisions.

12. LIABILITY

<u>12.01</u> The County does not assume and is not responsible for, payment of any debt service, lien, or encumbrance, including, but not limited to, mortgage, promissory note, land contract, or other obligation, incurred prior to the signing or during the term of this Agreement.

12.02 This Agreement is not intended to create beneficial rights in any third party other than the Wayne County Commission. This Agreement is entered into for the sole benefit of the parties to this Agreement.

13. ENVIRONMENTAL MATTERS

<u>13.01</u> Township warrants to the County that Township will not use Hazardous Materials (as defined in Section 13.06) at any Site in violation of any governmental regulation pertaining to the use, storage, treatment, transportation, manufacture, refinement, handling, production or disposal of Hazardous Materials.

<u>13.02</u> Township warrants that it is not in violation of governmental regulations pertaining to the use, storage, treatment, transportation, manufacture, refinement, handling, production or disposal of Hazardous Materials at any Site, and, to the best of Township's knowledge, there have been no actions commenced or threatened by any party for noncompliance which affects a Site.

13.03 Township will keep each Site free of Hazardous Materials except to the extent that the Hazardous Materials are stored or used in compliance with applicable local, state and federal regulations. Township must not cause or permit any Site to be used to generate, manufacture, refine, transport, treat, store, handle, dispose of, transfer, produce, or process Hazardous Materials, except in compliance with governmental regulations. Township shall not cause or permit, as a result of any intentional or unintentional act or omission on the part of Township, any tenant, subtenant or occupant, the release, spill, leak or emission of Hazardous Materials at any Site or onto any other contiguous property.

13.04 Prior to commencing the Project, Township must conduct and complete or cause to be conducted and completed an investigation, including a comprehensive environmental audit, studies, sampling, and testing, as the County deems necessary. A copy of any environmental audit, study, sampling or testing shall be provided to the County within ten (10) working days of Township's receipt of such audit, study, sampling or testing. If the audit reveals the existence of any Hazardous Material at any Site, Township shall immediately disclose the findings to the County. If the County decides to proceed with the Project, Township shall do or cause to be done all remedial, removal and other actions necessary to clean up and remove all Hazardous Materials on, under, from or affecting the Site as required by all applicable governmental regulations, to the satisfaction of the County, and according to all federal, state and local governmental authorities. Any audit conducted by the County is solely for the benefit, protection, and interest of the County. Township or any third party cannot rely upon the audit conducted by the County for any purpose.

13.05 It is agreed that the County is merely acting as a funding source for the Project and that the County shall only be responsible for providing these funds and processing reimbursement requests made by Township as submitted pursuant to Section 5.03. Therefore, the County shall not be responsible for any claims, demands, penalties, fines, liabilities, settlements, damages, costs or expenses, including attorney and consultant fees, investigation and laboratory fees, court costs and litigation expenses, known or unknown, contingent or otherwise, arising out of or in any way related to:

- 1. The presence, disposal, release or threatened release of any Hazardous Materials on, over, under, from or affecting the Site or the soil, water, vegetation, buildings, personal property, persons or animals;
- Any personal injury (including wrongful death) or property damage (real or personal) arising out of or related to Hazardous Materials at a Site;
- Any lawsuit brought or threatened, settlement reached or government order relating to the Hazardous Materials with respect to a Site;
- 4. Any violation of laws, orders, regulations, requirements or demands of government authorities, or any policies or requirements of any mortgage, which are based on or related to the Hazardous Materials used at a Site;
- 5. This section applies to the presence, disposal, release, leakage, or threatened release of any Hazardous Materials prior to the effective date of this Agreement.
- 13.06 Hazardous Material means any material or substance:
- Which is or becomes defined as a hazardous substance, pollutant, or contaminant pursuant to the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act (42 U.S.C. 9601 et. seq.) and any amendments thereto and regulations pursuant thereto;
- 2. Containing gasoline, oil, diesel, fuel, or other petroleum products;
- 3. Which is or becomes defined as hazardous waste pursuant to the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (42 U.S.C. 6901 et. seq.) and any amendments thereto and regulations pursuant thereto;
- 4. Containing polychlorinated biphenyl;

- 5. Containing asbestos;
- 6. Which is radioactive;
- 7. The presence of which requires investigation or remediation under any governmental regulation; or
- 8. Which is or becomes defined as a hazardous waste, hazardous substance, pollutant, contaminant, or biologically hazardous material under any governmental regulation.

14. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

<u>**14.01</u>** Each party must comply with and must require its employees to comply with all applicable laws and regulations.</u>

<u>14.02</u> Township must construct and develop the Project or cause the Project to be constructed and developed according to applicable local, state and federal laws.

15. <u>AMENDMENTS</u>

No amendment to this Agreement is effective unless it references this Agreement, is written, is signed and acknowledged by duly authorized representatives of both parties and approved by resolutions adopted by the Plymouth Township Board of Trustees and the Wayne County Commission.

16. NONDISCRIMINATION PRACTICES

<u>16.01</u> Township shall require that all contractors, subcontractors, consultants and agents retained to perform work related to this Agreement comply with:

- A. Titles VI and VII of the Civil Rights Act (42 U.S.C. §§ 2000d et. seq.) and the United States Department of Justice Regulations (28 C.F.R. Part 42) issued pursuant to these Titles.
- B. The Age Discrimination Act of 1985 (42 U.S.C. §6101-07).
- C. Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. §794).

- D. The Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. §12101 et. seq.) and its associated regulations.
- E. The Michigan Civil Rights Act (P.A. 1976 No. 453) and the Persons With Disabilities Civil Rights Act (P.A. 1976 No. 220).
- F. The anti-discrimination provisions as required by Section 120-192 of the Wayne County Code of Ordinances.

<u>16.02</u> All contractors, subcontractors, consultants and agents retained by Township to perform work related to this Agreement shall not:

- A. Refuse to recruit, hire, employ, promote or to bar or discharge from employment an individual, or discriminate against an individual in compensation, terms, conditions or privileges of employment because of race, color, creed, national origin, age, marital status, handicap, sex, religion, familial status, height or weight.
- B. Limit, segregate, or classify an employee or applicant for employment in a way which deprives or tends to deprive any individual of employment opportunities or otherwise adversely affects the employment status of an employee because of race, color, creed, national origin, age, marital status, handicap, sex, familial status, height or weight.
- C. Print or publish or cause to be printed or published a notice, application, or advertisement relating to employment indicating a preference, limitation, specification, or discrimination based upon race, color, creed, national origin, age, marital status, handicap, sex, religion, familial status, height or weight.

- D. Except as permitted by rules and regulations promulgated pursuant to Section 120-192 of the Wayne County Code of Ordinances, or applicable state or federal law, make or use a written or oral inquiry or form of application that elicits or attempts to solicit information concerning the race, color, creed, national origin, age, marital status, handicap, sex, religion, familial status, height or weight, of prospective employees. Township also shall not make or keep a record of that information or disclose such information.
- E. Make or use a written or oral inquiry or form of application that expresses a preference, limitation or specification based on religion, race, color, creed, national origin, age, height, weight, marital status, handicap, or sex.

<u>16.03</u> Township agrees that it will notify all of its contractors, subcontractors, consultants, or agents of their obligations relative to non-discrimination under this Agreement when soliciting the contractor, subcontractor, consultant, or agent. Township will include the provisions of this Article in any contract, as well as provide the County with a copy of any agreement with a contractor, subcontractor, consultant, or agent completing work related to this Agreement.

<u>16.04</u> All contractors, subcontractors, consultants and agents retained by Township to perform work related to this Agreement shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment, training, education, or apprenticeship connected directly or indirectly with the performance of this Agreement, with respect to hire, promotion, job assignment, tenure, terms, conditions or privileges of employment because of race, color, creed, national origin, age, marital

status, handicap, sex, religion, familial status, height or weight. This Section does not apply if it is determined by the Division of Human Relations that the requirements are bona fide occupational qualifications reasonably necessary to perform the duties required for employment. The burden of proof that the occupational qualifications are bona fide is upon Township.

<u>16.05</u> Breach of any of the covenants in this Article may be regarded as a material breach of this Agreement.

<u>16.06</u> Township acknowledges the right of the Director of Human Relations to sue to enforce the provisions in this Article.

<u>16.07</u> If Township or any of its contractors, subcontractors, consultants, or agents does not comply with the non-discrimination provisions of this Agreement, the County may impose sanctions, as it determines to be appropriate, including but not limited to the cancellation, termination or suspension of this Agreement, in whole or in part.

16.08 In the event that Township is or becomes subject to federal or state law which conflicts with the requirements of Section 120-192 of the Wayne County Code of Ordinances, the provisions of federal or state law shall apply and this Agreement shall be interpreted and enforced accordingly. In accordance with 1976 P.A. 453, Township covenants not to discriminate against an employee or applicant for employment with respect to hire, tenure, terms, conditions, or privileges of employment because of race, color, religion, national origin, age, sex, weight, height, or marital status, and to require a similar covenant on the part of any contractor, subcontractor, consultant, or agent employed in the performance of this Agreement.

17. ETHICS IN CONTRACTING

17.01 Township and all of its contractors must comply with Article 12 of Chapter 120 of

the Wayne County Code of Ordinances governing "Ethics in Public Contracting" or any similarly existing Township ordinances.

18. NOTICES

<u>**18.01</u>** All notices, consents, approvals, requests and other communications ("Notices") required or permitted under this Agreement must be given in writing and mailed by first-class mail and addressed as follows:</u>

18.02 All notices are deemed given on the day of mailing. Either party to this Agreement may change its address for the receipt of notices at any time by giving notice to the other as provided. Any notice given by a party must be signed by an authorized representative of such party.

18.03 Termination notices, change of address notices, and other notices of a legal nature, are an exception and must be sent by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested.

19. WAIVER OF ANY BREACH

No failure by a party to insist upon the strict performance of any term of this Agreement or to exercise any term after a breach constitutes a waiver of any breach of term. No waiver of any breach affects or alters this Agreement, but every term of this Agreement remains effective with respect to any other then existing or subsequent breach.

20. SEVERABILITY OF PROVISIONS

If any provision of this Agreement or the application to any person or circumstance is, to any extent, judicially determined to be invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this Agreement, or the application of the provision to persons or circumstances other than those as to which it is invalid or unenforceable, is not affected and is enforceable.

21. MERGER CLAUSE

<u>21.01</u> This Agreement, including the Exhibits contains the entire agreement between the parties and all prior negotiations and agreements are merged in this document. Neither party has made any representations except those expressly set forth in this Agreement. No rights or remedies are, or will be acquired by either party by implication or otherwise unless set forth herein.

<u>21.02</u> This Agreement may be executed in counterparts, each of which will be deemed an original but all of which together will constitute one agreement.

22. JURISDICTION AND LAW

This Agreement, and all actions arising from it, must be governed by, subject to, and construed according to the laws of the State of Michigan. Each party consents to the personal jurisdiction of any competent court in Wayne County, Michigan, for any action arising out of

this Agreement. Each party will not commence any action against the other because of any matter arising out of this Agreement, in any courts other than those in the County of Wayne, State of Michigan unless original jurisdiction is in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Michigan, Southern Division, the Court of Claims, the Michigan Supreme Court or the Michigan Court of Appeals.

23. COMPLIANCE WITH CONSENT AGREEMENT

23.01 The parties acknowledge that this Contract is subject to Public Act 436 of 2012, MCL 141.1541 to 141.1575 ("Act") and the Consent Agreement between the County and the State Treasurer N.A. Khouri effective August 21, 2015 ("Consent Agreement"). A copy of the Consent Agreement is available at www.waynecounty.com/mb/consent-agreement.htm.

<u>23.02</u> Upon written request of the County, the Township shall promptly and fully provide all necessary and requested assistance and information under the Consent Agreement and under the Act.

23.03 The Township shall promptly provide notice to the County Executive if the Township receives a request for assistance by an officer, employee, agency or contractor of the State Department of Treasury.

23.04 The Township shall promptly provide notice to the County Executive of knowledge or information of any action or omission that could be considered, or that could lead to, a failure to comply with or breach of the Consent Agreement or of a violation of state or federal law with respect to a matter relating to the Consent Agreement, including the Open Meetings Act, 1976 PA 267, the Uniform Budget and Accounting Act, 1968 PA 2, or the Emergency Municipal Loan Act, 1980 PA 243, by the County, the County Commission, the

County Executive, or another officer of the County.

<u>23.05</u> The Township shall immediately provide notice to the County Executive of any possible violations of the Consent Agreement by sending an email to <u>consentagreement@waynecounty.com</u> or by completing the submission form found at <u>www.waynecounty.com/mb/consent-agreement.htm</u>.

23.06 If this Contract is considered "Debt" under the terms of the Consent Agreement, it may not be executed or submitted to the County Executive or County Commission for approval until it has been submitted to the County Chief Financial Officer for approval and verification that the required State Treasurer's approval has been received.

24. <u>MISCELLANEOUS</u>

24.01 It is mutually understood and agreed that neither of the parties hereto shall be held responsible for damages occasioned by delay or failure to perform where due to fire, strike, flood, acts of God, unavailability of labor, material, legal acts of public authorities, or delays caused by public carriers or third person (including contractors or subcontractors) which cannot reasonably be foreseen or provided against.

24.02 The parties agree that upon termination of this Agreement, the following sections shall survive termination and shall remain in full force and effect: 5.02; 11; 12; 13; 14 and 22.

<u>24.03</u> The term "County" includes the Charter County of Wayne and all other associated, affiliated, or subsidiary departments or divisions now existing or to be created, their agents, and employees.

24.04 This Agreement must not be construed as a waiver of any governmental immunity the County or Township, or any of their agencies, or employees, has as provided by statute or

modified by court decisions.

24.05 The headings of the articles in this Agreement are for convenience only and must not be used to construe or interpret the scope or intent of this Agreement or in any way affect this Agreement.

25. AUTHORIZATION AND CAPABILITY

25.01 This Agreement has been approved and executed by the Charter County of Wayne and the Charter Township of Plymouth, as evidenced by the attached Resolutions adopted by the Township Board of Trustees and the Wayne County Commission. Copies of such resolutions shall be attached to this Agreement.

25.02 Each party warrants that the person signing this Agreement is authorized to sign on behalf of its principal and is empowered to bind its principal to this Agreement.

25.03 This Agreement is effective only upon review and approval by the Wayne County Commission, the Wayne County Chief Executive Officer, the Supervisor of the Township and the Township Board of Trustees, whichever occurs last.

ATTACHMENT D INSURANCE COVERAGE'S

TOWNSHIP, at its expense, or any contractors, subcontractors, consultants or agents retained by TOWNSHIP, at their own expense, shall procure and maintain for the duration of this Agreement, insurance against claims for injuries to persons or damages to property which may arise from or in connection with the performance of the services by the Contractor, its agents, representatives or employees. Contractor shall maintain at least the following minimum coverage:

Commercial General Liability (CGL)

Insurance Services Office Form CG 00 01 covering CGL on an "occurrence" basis, including products and completed operations, property damage, bodily injury and personal and advertising injury with limits no less than \$5,000,000 per occurrence. If a general aggregate limit applies, either the general aggregate limit shall apply separately to this Contract or the general aggregate limit shall be twice the required occurrence limit.

Umbrella or Excess Liability

Policy in an amount not less than \$3,000,000. Umbrella or Excess policy wording shall be at least as broad as the primary or underlying policy(ies) and shall apply both to the Contractor's general liability and to its automobile liability insurance and shall be written on an occurrence basis. The County, officials, employees and others as may be specified in any "Special Conditions" shall be named as an additional insured under this policy.

Automobile Liability

Insurance Services Office Form Number CA 0001 covering, Code 1 (any auto), or if Contractor has no owned autos, Code 8 (hired) and 9 (non-owned), with limits no less than \$1,000,000 per accident for bodily injury and property damage.

Workers' Compensation

Insurance as required by the State of Michigan, with Statutory Limits, and Employer's Liability Insurance with limits of no less than \$1,000,000 per accident for bodily injury or disease.

Professional Liability (if Design/Build)

Insurance appropriate to the Contractor's profession, with limits no less than \$3,000,000 per occurrence or claim, \$3,000,000 aggregate.

Builder's Risk (Course of Construction)

Insurance utilizing "All Risk" (Special Perils) coverage form, with limits equal to the completed value of the project and no coinsurance penalty provisions.

<u>Contractors' Pollution Legal Liability and/or Asbestos Legal Liability and/or</u> <u>Errors and Omissions (if project involves environmental hazards)</u>

Insurance with limits no less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence or claim, and \$2,000,000 policy aggregate.

▶ If the Contractor maintains higher limits than the minimum insurance coverage required as stated above in this Attachment, the Contractor shall maintain the coverage for the higher insurance limits for the duration of this Agreement.

Additional Insured Status

The County, its officers, officials, employees, volunteers, and others as may be specified in any "Special Conditions" shall be additional insureds on the CGL policy with respect to liability arising out of work or operations performed by or on behalf of the Contractor including materials, parts, or equipment furnished in connection with such work or operations. General liability coverage can be provided in the form of an endorsement to the Contractor's insurance (at least as broad as ISO Form CG 20 10 11 85 or both CG 20 10 and CG 20 37 forms if later revisions used).

Primary Coverage

For any claims related to this Agreement, the Contractor's insurance coverage shall be primary insurance as respects the County, its officers, officials, employees, and volunteers. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the County, its officers, officials, employees, or volunteers shall be excess of the Contractor's insurance and shall not contribute with it.

Notice of Cancellation

Each insurance policy shall state that coverage shall not be canceled, except with notice to the County.

Waiver of Subrogation

Contractor grants to the County a waiver of any right to subrogation which any insurer of the Contractor may acquire against the County by virtue of the payment of any loss under such insurance. Contractor agrees to obtain any endorsement that may be necessary to affect this waiver of subrogation, but this provision applies regardless of whether or not the County has received a waiver of subrogation endorsement from the insurer.

Deductibles and Self-Insured Retentions

Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be declared to and approved by the County. The County may require the Contractor to provide proof of ability to pay losses and related investigations, claim administration, and defense expenses within the retention.

All insurance must be effected under valid and enforceable policies, issued by recognized, responsible insurers qualified to conduct business in Michigan which are well-rated by national rating organizations. All companies providing the coverage required shall be licensed or approved by the Insurance Bureau of the State of Michigan and shall have a

policyholder's service rating no lower than A:VII as listed in A.M. Best's Key Rating guide,

current edition or interim report.

Claims-made Policies

If any of the required policies provide coverage on a claims-made basis:

- 1. The Retroactive Date must be shown and must be before the date of this Agreement or the date the Contractor starts to perform the services.
- 2. Insurance must be maintained and evidence of insurance must be provided for at least five (5) years after completion of this Agreement.
- 3. If coverage is canceled or non-renewed, and not replaced with another claimsmade policy form with a Retroactive Date prior to this Agreement's effective date, the Contractor must purchase "extended reporting" coverage for a minimum of five (5) years after completion of Agreement work.

Verification of Coverage

Contractor shall furnish the County with original certificates and amendatory endorsements or copies of the applicable policy language effecting coverage required by this Article. The County shall receive and approve all certificates and endorsements before the Contractor begins providing services. Failure to obtain the required documents prior to commencement of services shall not waive the Contractor's obligation to provide them. The County reserves the right to require complete, certified copies of all required insurance policies, including endorsements required by the Article, at any time.

Subcontractors

Contractor shall require and verify that all subcontractors maintain insurance satisfying all the stated requirements, and Contractor shall ensure that the County is an additional insured on insurance required from subcontractors.

Special Risks or Circumstances

The County reserves the right to modify these requirements, including limits, based on the nature of the risk, prior experience, insurer, coverage, or other special circumstances.

> The Contractor must submit certificates evidencing the insurance to the Risk

Management Division at the time the Contractor executes an agreement with the Township, and at least fifteen (15) days prior to the expiration dates of expiring policies.

Surety Bonds

The Contractor shall provide the following Surety Bonds: 1) Bid bond; 2) Performance bond; 3) Payment bond; 4) Maintenance bond. The payment bond and the performance bond shall be in a sum equal to the contract price. If the performance bond provides for a one year warranty a separate Maintenance Bond is not necessary. If the warranty period specified in the contract is for longer than one year a Maintenance Bond equal to 10% of the contract price is required. Bonds shall be duly executed by a responsible corporate surety, authorized to issue such bonds in the State of Michigan and secured through an authorized agent with an office in Michigan.
