Moved by Clerk Vorva and seconded by Trustee Heitman to approve the consent agenda for the Board of Trustees regular meeting of January 22, 2019. Ayes all.

Trustee Dempsey explained that Saturday is Statehood Day, the anniversary when Michigan became a state in 1837. On loan and on display is a document from that year signed by the first Governor, Stevens Thompson Mason. He encouraged everyone to look at the document and keep in mind the significance of Statehood Day.

Supervisor Heise noted the presence of three former state representatives, John Stewart, Jerry Vorva and himself. He introduced the current representative, Matt Koleszar, who gave an update on his appointments to the House Education and Health Policy Committees. He conveyed that he wants to be an asset and resource to the Board and to the community. Auto insurance reform and transparency in government are current considerations.

E. PUBLIC COMMENTS AND QUESTIONS (Limited to 3 minutes)

John Stewart, former trustee and state representative, reviewed past comments made by Trustee Doroshewitz regarding political ideals. He noted the April 6 combined community concert with the Michigan Philharmonic at PARC and spoke of the cancellation of PEP, the Plymouth Preschool Enrichment Program, because of frozen pipes.

Mary Weidel and Eileen Coleman spoke of their objections to portions of the proposed Criminal Code Supplementation Ordinance #1016, Amendment #22.

Attorney Patrick Arella, commented on the text amendment to the Zoning Ordinance No. 99, Article XXII, Single Family Cluster Housing option. He noted the filing of a notice of intent to petition objecting to 2019-01-22-01 and a notice of intent to petition objecting to the application that was submitted to the Planning Commission. He is acting on behalf of 15 members of the Plymouth Commons Homeowners Association.

Ron Rotole also commented on the Zoning Ordinance text amendment and gave a demonstration on density using a Monopoly board. He also answered questions from the Board about notices received by the adjacent property owners and in the newspapers.

Joseph Van Esley also commented on the density issue via the Zoning Ordinance text amendment.

Independence Village is being acquired by Great Lakes Senior Living Communities, LLC, a non-profit 501©(3) organization and tax exempt private activity bonds will be issued by the Arizona Industrial Development Authority. There is no obligation on the part of the Township.

Attorney Bennett noted three minor revisions that were agreed to by himself and ADM's attorney that will be included in the final copy of the agreement that will be signed.

Moved by Trustee Curmi and seconded by Clerk Vorva that the Board of Trustees will approve **Resolution #2019-01-22-06** authorizing the Supervisor and Clerk to sign the attached Contract with ADM Ventures, Inc., for the management of Hilltop Golf Course, subject to final approval by the Township Attorney. Ayes all on a roll call vote.

4. Text Amendment to Zoning Ordinance No. 99, Article XXII: Single Family Cluster Housing, **Resolution #2019-01-22-07**, *Planning Director Laura Haw*

The above item was removed from the agenda.

 Contract for "Cityworks" Data Management System, Resolution #2019-01-22-08, Director of Public Services Patrick Fellrath

Director of Public Services Fellrath explained that the first phase of Cityworks implementation was completed last November as part of a SAW Grant for sewer assets. This phase includes the software system acquisition and configuration for the water assets and system user training. Since Cityworks is a web GIS-centric system, the data and analysis tools will be fully integrated and easily accessible to both office and field users. GHD led the first phase implementation of Cityworks and costs will come from the Water and Sewer Fund account.

PROPOSED MINUTES

Moved by Clerk Vorva and seconded by Trustee Dempsey to approve **Resolution** #2019-01-22-08, authorizing GHD to perform the work in accordance with the attached proposal from GHD in an amount not to exceed \$50,000 for completing Cityworks implementation. Ayes all on a roll call vote.

6. Allocation of Wayne County Special Assessment District Funding for 2019, **Resolution #2019-01-22-09**, *Supervisor Kurt Heise*

Supervisor Heise reviewed his recommendation for allocating the Wayne County Local Road Improvement Funds to the Plymouth Notch (Litchfield Road) Special Assessment District Project because of the substantial costs of repair due to the road's poor condition which eventually will diminish property values and the extremely high cost per each of the 30 households to repair it. Board members discussed other options for distribution of the funds, possibly including the only other potential SAD for Rolling Oaks Subdivision with 162 homes.

A resident of Litchfield Road said that it is a very tight vote for the project and the high cost is a large deterrent to going forward. He also cited reduced real estate values.

Moved by Clerk Vorva and seconded by Trustee Heitman to approve **Resolution** #2019-01-22-09, authorizing the 2018-19 Wayne County Local Road Improvement Funds to the Plymouth Notch (Litchfield Road) Special Assessment District Project in the amount of \$388,888.00 and request that the Supervisor negotiate an Intergovernmental Agreement with the County for receipt of the funds.

C. NEW BUSINESS

- Board Discussion on Text Amendments to Chapter 99 of the Zoning Code Article 22 (Cluster Housing Options) – Planning Consultant Laura Haw & Attorney Kevin Bennett
 - Public Comment on Agenda Item (limited to 3 minutes per person)

Planner Laura Haw gave a brief background and layout examples of a typical subdivision and of cluster housing which can be used for the purpose of preserving quality natural assets on the site or aid in development of the site because of other factors such as configuration, circulation patterns, or suitable living environment. She also explained the proposed text amendments to Zoning Ordinance No. 99, Article XXII, and answered questions from the Board regarding those proposals.

PROPOSED MINUTES

Clerk Vorva noted that, although unable to be present, Trustee Dempsey presented a memorandum on the subject.

Attorney Bennett explained the difference in notification requirements for the two ways the Zoning Ordinance is amended. For text amendments, which affect the entire Township and are amendments to the language in the ordinance itself, the Zoning Enabling Act (State law) and the Zoning Ordinance (Township ordinance) both require notice by publication within 15 days of the public hearing to be held by the Planning Commission. Rezoning involves changing a district classification on the zoning map for a specific property, so a mailing to property owners within 300 feet is required, as well as notice by publication within 15 days. He also noted the Cluster Housing Option requires both the mailing notice and the notice by publication. The State Legislature would have to be petitioned regarding any proposed changes to the Zoning Enabling Act. He answered questions from the Board regarding the notification procedures.

Trustee Doroshewitz gave some history, as the Board's liaison to the Planning Commission, on the proposed changes considered, particularly Section 22.11 and the density ambiguity.

Supervisor Heise opened the floor to public discussion.

Residents Patrick Arella, Joe Van Esley, Sean Laycock, John Cullen, Lee Hachigian, Clinton Michael, and Ron Rotole expressed their concerns and opinions on the various changes proposed for the ordinance, many commenting on the density bonus proposed.

Supervisor Heise suggested the Planning Commission might want to consider a density limit based on some kind of formula to be determined. He also indicated the Cluster Housing application by the property owner, North Ridge Church, has been withdrawn as of this evening.

D. SUPERVISOR AND TRUSTEE COMMENTS

Trustee Heitman thanked everyone for coming and Mrs. Haw for her presentation, and he implored the residents to keep their eye on the Board.

Clerk Vorva noted a fund-raiser of the Plymouth Community Band to be held at the First United Methodist Church this Friday from 5-8 p.m., \$12 for Italian cuisine.

ARTICLE XXII

SINGLE FAMILY CLUSTER HOUSING - DRAFT v.2

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Single Family Cluster Housing Option (CHO) is to permit optional methods of development and arrangement of single family structures on parcels less than forty (40) acres gross area in the R-1-E, R-1-H, R-1-S, R-1 and R-2 single family residential districts, which provide for design alternatives compatible with existing and future adjacent single family subdivisions, and which meet one or more of the following characteristics:

- 1. The parcel contains natural assets such as large stands of trees, rolling topography, swale areas, flood, plains or wetlands which would be in the best interest of the community to preserve and would otherwise be substantially destroyed if developed under traditional subdivision requirements.
- 2. Because of the parcel's peculiar configuration, it would be difficult to develop under traditional subdivision requirements.
- Because of the parcel's particular relationship to thoroughfare and/or collector roads and existing circulation patterns for abutting subdivisions, it would be difficult to develop under traditional subdivision requirements.
- 4. Because of the parcel's particular relationship to a limited access highway, development under the cluster option would result in a more suitable living environment than could be achieved under strict adherence to traditional subdivision requirements.

SEC. 22.1 STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES SINGLE FAMILY CLUSTER HOUSING ELIGIBILITY PRINCIPLES

Single Family Cluster Housing is an optional method of development which may be permitted only after a public hearing, review and recommendation by the Planning Commission, and approval by the Township Board of Trustees, and upon finding that the proposed cluster housing development reflects the following basic principles:

- 1. The proposal is in conformity with the spirit and intent of the Cluster Housing Option as established in the purpose Section of this Article.
- A recognizable and material benefit to the ultimate users of the project and to the community, where such benefit would otherwise be unfeasible or unlikely to be achieved without application of the CHO regulations.
- The vehicular circulation system planned for the proposed development will be in the best interest of the public health, safety and welfare in regards to the overall circulation of the community, egress/ingress to the site, vehicular turning movements related to street intersections and street gradient, site distance and potential hazards to the normal flow of traffic.

In reviewing the proposed interior circulation system for the proposed project, the Planning Commission shall determine the necessity for public roads and the potential future extension of such roads to adjacent properties.

All interior roads, both public and private, shall be constructed in compliance with existing construction standards as adopted by the Wayne County Department of Public Services for residential streets. The Planning Commission and/or Township Board may waive this requirement after review and recommendation by the Township Planner and Township Engineer, provided the proposed waiver will not materially impair the intent and purpose of this Ordinance or the public interest.

- 3.4. The proposed units, circulation, layout, parking facilities, <u>pedestrian connections / circulation</u> and any open space or recreation activity areas <u>/ amenities</u> are designed and located in a manner that ensures the stability of existing or future conventional single family residential properties in the area.
- Proposed landscape plantings, fences, walls and/or open space areas are appropriate and of sufficient size, height and quantity to insure that the proposed development will not be objectionable to nearby existing or future conventional single family residential properties by reason of noise, fumes or flash of lights from automobiles, or exterior lighting; nor will it interfere with an adequate supply of light and air, increase the danger of fire or otherwise endanger the public safety.
- The development shall be designed to create a cohesive community neighborhood through common open space areas for passive or active recreation and for resident interaction. All open space areas shall be equally available to all residents of the Cluster Housing community. The neighborhood shall be designed to create clusters of housing, synergy and promote interaction. Where applicable, the development should provide a range of housing opportunities through varied housing types, dwelling sizes and lot sizes within a single neighborhood.
- The development will permit the protection of environmentally sensitive areas and preserve on a permanent basis open space, natural features, including large stands of trees, rolling topography, significant views, swale areas, flood plains or wetlandst. This principle (Section 23.1.2) may not be applicable to potential redevelopment sites in the ARC or OS ARC Districts, in which ease Section 23.1.8 below shall apply. This determination shall be made by the Planning Commission and Township Board after review of a documented site analysis to be submitted by the applicant In the case of a proposed CHO to a site which is lacking said natural areas, this requirement can be satisfied by the creation of natural areas and amenities.
- 7.8. The Cluster Housing Option will provide long-term protection of historic structures or significant architecture worthy of historic preservation, if applicable.
- 8.9. The proposed development will not adversely impact the capability of public services and facilities in the area or the Township as a whole.

SEC. 22.2	APPL	ICATION
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Application for approval shall be made by the titleholder or titleholders of any parcel where use of the Cluster Housing Option is contemplated. The application shall be accompanied by a fee determined by Township Board resolution to cover the cost of evaluating the application.

SEC. 22.3 APPLICATION INFORMATION

Application for a Cluster Housing Option approval shall contain the following information:

1. Survey and Site Analysis

- (a) A metes and bounds survey and legal description of the acreage comprising the proposed Cluster Housing Development, including a disclosure of mineral rights ownership.
- (b) Topographic survey, including natural and manmade features at a scale of one inch equals fifty feet (1"=50"), with a contour interval not to exceed two (2) feet.
- (c) Site analysis, which identifies the character, structure and potential of the site as it relates to this Article, including areas adjacent to the subject property and sufficient information about the nearby properties, so that a determination can be made by the Planning Commission and Board as to the impact of the proposed Cluster Housing development on the general planning area in which it is located. The analysis shall include as a minimum the following:
 - Adjacent Land Uses: Indicate type and impact on adjoining lands, direction and distance to community facilities; show transportation routes related to site.
 - 2) Drainage: Natural watershed (direction), drainage swales and swamp areas.
 - 3) Soils: Depth of topsoil and type of soils.
 - 4) Vegetation: Locate and identify existing tree masses, locate and identify specimen plant material and indicate type of ground cover.
 - 5) Existing Conditions: Structures, utilities and circulation.
 - Special Features: Lakes, streams, ponds, floodplains and wetlands, dramatic views and significant natural, archeological, historical or cultural features.
- Documentation related to the Purpose and Eligibility Principles sections of this Article indicating
 why this parcel should be considered for development under the Cluster Housing Option, with a
 specific description of the proposed recognizable benefit to the ultimate users of the project and
 to the community.
- 3. General Development Plan: A plan of sufficient detail to define the proposed location of buildings, parking, interior circulation of vehicles and pedestrians (including sidewalks, trails and bike paths, etc.), landscape areas, open / recreation spaces, other special site amenities / features, and the method of handling storm water run-off, sanitary sewer and water facilities. (Scale 1"=50' minimum).

- Proposed method of ownership.
- General concept of the building types to be used, including typical architectural elevations of proposed residential dwellings.
- 6. A parallel plan conforming to all applicable requirements of a conventional residential development demonstrating the number of residential units or lots that could be developed following the requirements of the zoning district without the cluster option.
- Any other pertinent information deemed necessary by the Planning Commission or Township Board to make a determination concerning the desirability of applying the provisions of this Article.

22.4 PUBLIC HEARING REQUIREMENTS

At least one (1) public hearing shall be held by the Planning Commission on a proposed Cluster Housing Development Option in order to acquaint the public and adjoining property owners with the proposal prior to finishing furnishing of detailed plans and specifications by the Applicant. Notice of the hearing shall be published in a newspaper which circulates in the Township, not less than 15 days before the public hearing, and sent by mail or personal delivery to the owners of property for which approval is being considered, to all persons to whom real property is assessed, within three hundred (300) feet of the boundary of the property in question and to the occupants of all structures within three hundred (300) feet of the property regardless of whether the property or occupant is located in the zoning jurisdiction. The notice shall be given not less than 15 days before the date the application will be considered. If the name of the occupant is not known, the term "occupant" may be used in making notification. The notice shall be prepared in accordance with the Michigan Zoning Enabling Act, Act 110 of 2006, as amended, and shall:

- 1. Describe the nature of the Cluster Housing request.
- Indicate the property which is subject of the Cluster Housing request. The notice shall include a listing of all existing street addresses within the property. Street addresses do not need to be created and listed if no such addresses currently exist within the property. If there are no street addresses, other means of identification may be used.
- State when and where the Cluster Housing request will be considered.
- 4. Indicate when and where written comments will be received concerning the request.

SEC. 22.5 PLANNING COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION

The Planning Commission shall review the proposed Cluster Housing Option for conformance with the provisions of this Ordinance, the intent, spirit, and purpose of this Article, and the statement of Eligibility Principles listed in Section 22.1. and its compatibility with adjacent uses of land, the natural environment, and the capability of public services and facilities affected by the proposed Cluster.

SEC. 22.4 PUBLIC HEARING REQUIREMENTS
SEC. 22.5 PLANNING COMMISSION
RECOMMENDATION

Within a reasonable time following the public hearing and having a complete application, the Planning Commission shall recommend to the Township Board of Trustees approval, denial or approval with conditions of the Cluster Option. The decision and basis for the decision shall be recorded in the meeting minutes. The Commission's recommendations shall be forwarded to the Township Board of Trustees stating the Commission's findings, recommendations and any recommended conditions of approval.

SEC. 22.6 TOWNSHIP BOARD ACTION

Upon receipt of the recommendations of the <u>Planning</u> Commission, the Township Board shall review the application, recommendations, and may approve, approve with condition, or deny the application. <u>The decision and basis for the decision shall be recorded in the meeting minutes</u>.

SEC. 22.7 DISAPPROVAL BY TOWNSHIP BOARD

If the Township Board denies the request to apply the provisions of the Cluster Housing Option to the parcel of land as described in the survey submitted with the application, it shall record the decision and the basis for the decision in the meeting minutes. In the case of a denial, development of the subject property can be made only in accordance with the provisions of the Zoning Ordinance for the district where the property is located.

SEC. 22.8 APPROVAL BY TOWNSHIP BOARD

If the Township Board of Trustees approves the request to apply the provisions of the Cluster Housing Option to the parcel of land as described in the survey submitted with the application, it shall record the decision and the basis for the decision in the meeting minutes. Approval by the Board shall confer approval to develop the parcel of land described in the application under the conditions and requirements of the Cluster Housing Option. Such approval shall be further subject to the following:

- 1. Cluster Housing Option approval shall not constitute approval of a preliminary plat, final plat, final site plan or final site condominium plan.
- Approval Period: Said approval by the Township Board of Trustees shall grant the applicant a period of one (1) year and six (6) months from the date of Cluster Housing Option approval to submit and receive final site plan or final site condominium plan approval (dependent upon the method of ownership proposed), and to submit a CHO contract for approval to the Township Board.
- 3. Extensions of Cluster Housing Option approval may be granted by the Township Board upon written request of the applicant and upon showing of good faith and effort by the applicant. Failure to request such extension shall be deemed an abandonment of the proposed Cluster Housing Option.
- 4. Approval of the final site plan or final condominium site plan and approval of a Cluster Housing Option contract by the Township Board is a prerequisite for issuance of a building permit by the Department of Building and Code Enforcement.

SEC. 22.9 CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS

Prior to final site plan, final plat, or final condominium site plan approval, or in conjunction with the respective submissions, the applicant shall submit to the Planning Commission for recommendation and to the Township Board for approval, a proposed contract setting forth the conditions upon which approval of the Cluster Housing Development is based. The contract, after review by the Planning Commission and approval by the Township Board, shall be entered into between the Township and the developer. Said contract shall provide:

- 1. The manner of ownership of the land, including mineral rights.
- 2. The manner of the ownership and of the dedication of the common open land space, parks and/or amenities.
- 3. The restrictive covenants required for membership rights and privileges, maintenance and obligation to pay assessments for the common open land space, parks and/or other features. The dedicated open space shall be set aside by the developer through an irrevocable conveyance and protected by a Maintenance Agreement, in a form and manner acceptable to the Township. Such conveyance shall assure the open space will be protected and used as intended on the concept plan. Said documents shall bind all successors and future owners in fee title to commitments made as part of the proposal, but shall allow transfer of ownership and control to a subdivision or condominium association consisting of residents within the development, provided notice of such transfer is provided to the Township. Such conveyance shall indicate the allowable use(s) within the dedicated open space. Upon transfer to a successor of the developer, the open space shall be maintained by the property owners association or condominium association.
- 4. The stipulations pertaining to commencement and completion of the phases of the development, to construction, installation, repairs and maintenance of improvements, to obligations for payment of any costs, expenses or fees planned or reasonably foreseen, and to the manner of assuring payment of obligations.
- 5. Provisions for the Township to effect construction, installation, repairs and maintenance and use of public utilities, storm and sanitary sewers and drainageways, water, streets, sidewalks and lighting, and of the open land and improvements thereon, and any other conditions of the plan, and the manner for the assessment, and enforcement of assessments for the costs, expenses, or fees incidental thereto against the applicant, or the future owners or occupants of the Cluster Housing Development.
- 6. The Final Development Plan, final condominium site plan or final plat shall be incorporated by reference and as exhibits.
- 7. Provisions reasonably and necessarily intended to protect public health, safety, <u>morals</u> or general welfare of neighboring residents or the Township as a whole, to address any conditions of approval, or to further the purpose and intent of this Article.

SEC. 22.10 GENERAL CONDITIONS

The option allows for development of detached and attached one family dwelling clusters in the R-1-E, R-1-H, R-1-S, R-1, R-M and R-2 Residential Districts.

- 1. Clustering of the dwelling units shall be in a manner which preserves the basic amenities normally found in single family residential neighborhoods, while allowing for innovative site layout, and a potential increase of common open space, parks, natural areas, and/or amenities.
- 2. Open space shall be designed to achieve the following, as applicable on a site-by site basis:
 - (a) Organized around the site's most important natural features, a physical design element or to link existing and planned open spaces.
 - (b) Provide pedestrian pathways within the open spaces and link with adjacent open spaces, public parks, Township facilities or existing and planned non-motorized routes.
 - (c) <u>Provide areas for active public recreation, informal spontaneous recreation or passive recreation amenities for the benefit of residents or users of the development.</u>
 - (d) Preserve or create a buffer from adjacent land uses.
 - (e) Be highly visible within the development and/or from public view.
- 3. Each dwelling unit shall be provided with a private exterior entrance, with visual and physical separation from adjacent dwelling units.
- 4. The method by which dwelling units may be attached shall be limited to the following:
 - (a) A common party wall in the garage portion of the unit only.
 - (b) Obscuring walls, architectural screens fencing or similar elements designed to create a private outdoor area.
 - (c) A common party wall between individual dwelling units, which defines interior living or storage space, provided that the exterior design of the building is compatible with existing single family structures located in the general area in architectural style, size, overall floor area and height, and that the structure complies with acoustic control standards as established by the Chief Building Official for Cluster Housing.
- 5. Where the proposed cluster development abuts an existing conventional single family subdivision or land zoned for single family use, the Planning Commission shall ensure that an orderly transition occurs in one of the following manners:
 - (a) Detached single-family dwellings, subject to the standards of the Schedule of Regulations for the particular zoning district.
 - (b) Open or recreation space and associated amenities. Any accessory uses / structures that are a significant different scale or character than the surrounding residential districts (such as tennis courts, parking areas, etc.) shall not be located near the boundary of the development so as to negatively impact the residential use of adjacent lands.
 - (c) Sufficient change of topography.
 - (d) Buffer plantings of sufficient size, character, density and quantity to adequately provide for an orderly transition.
 - (e) Any other means the Planning Commission finds to be consistent with the spirit and intent of this Ordinance and the objectives of this Article.

- 6. Attached dwelling units shall be subject to the following:
 - (a) The maximum number of units which may be attached shall be four (4) six (6) units.
 - (b) The exterior design of the structures shall be compatible with existing single family structures located in the general area of the project in regards to architectural style, size, overall floor area and height.
 - (c) Variety in the design of individual units shall be provided by the use of design details which do not appear to be continuous or repetitious. A building pattern which is repetitious throughout the project shall not be permitted.
- 7. All buildings shall be set back a minimum of forty (40) feet from the street setback line for a major thoroughfare [projected right-of-way one hundred twenty (120) feet] or collector road [projected right-of-way eighty-six (86) feet]. The Planning Commission may reduce this requirement to allow development consistent with existing or future single family developments along the major thoroughfare or collector road.
- 7. All buildings shall be set back a minimum of forty-two (42) feet from the edge of any internal private street providing general circulation through the site. A minimum setback of twenty-five (25) feet shall be provided on drives whose primary purpose is to serve as access for only a few units. may be permitted, provided the project offers exemplary design and neighborhood best practices, such as additional recreational amenities, pedestrian connections, and streetscape enhancements with additional landscaping and street lighting. The Planning Commission on the basis of the Site Plan shall determine which streets provide general circulation and those which serve only a few units.

8. Yard and Building Separation Standards

The requirements of Article 20, Schedule of Regulations applicable for minimum lot size and yard requirements shall not apply under the Cluster Housing Option. The arrangement of buildings, distances between buildings and intended use of yard areas shall be reviewed by the Planning Commission. Yard requirements and minimum separation distances between buildings shall be provided as follows:

- (a) Separation between Detached Dwelling Units. A minimum of ten (10) feet shall be provided between each detached unit except that the distance between garages or between a garage and living area may be reduced to six (6) feet with Planning Commission approval. The applicant shall clearly indicate the intended use of outdoor and indoor areas and proposed elevations facing each other. Where the space between units is intended for use as outdoor living space, the separation shall be a minimum of twenty (20) feet.
- (b) Separation between Dwelling Clusters. Minimum spacing between clusters shall be determined by the number of living units that are arranged in any cluster group, as shown in the following table:

4. Unit Cluster and a 4. Unit Cluster	40.0

- (c) Planning Commission Modifications. After review of the proposed plan and the proposed-use of yard areas and arrangement of buildings, the Planning Commission may require additional setbacks or separation distances between buildings or clusters of buildings to ensure that the intent of this Ordinance is carried out and the public health, safety and welfare of the community is adequately served and may reduce separation distances between buildings or clusters of building where sufficient justification is presented and where the public health and safety is not compromised.
 - (d) The minimum building setback in a Single Family Cluster shall be 50 feet from any perimeter property line or street setback line of the development parcel. However, based on factors such as lack of impacts on adjacent sites or the particular relationship of the building(s) to the side and/or rear property line, the Planning Commission may reduce the required building setbacks from any side or rear property line. In no case shall be building setback be less than 35 feet.
 - (e) Where a building in a Single Family Cluster sides to the right-of-way of a road, the minimum building setback from the street setback line shall be equal to the front yard setback for the abutting zoning district, if one of the abutting districts fronting the same road is zoned single family residential. In no case shall the building setback be less than 25 feet.
- 9. Where the proposed cluster development abuts a designated thoroughfare and/or collector road, the Planning Commission shall ensure that the treatment along said roads is compatible with existing or future single family developments in the area, and that an orderly transition occurs in one of the following manners:
 - (a) Detached single family dwellings, subject to the standards of the Schedule of Regulations for the particular zoning district.
 - (b) Open or recreation space and associated amenities.
 - (c) Sufficient change of topography.

- (d) Buffer plantings of sufficient size, character, density and quantity to adequately provide for an orderly transition.
- (e) Mounding or berming of sufficient size, height and slope to insure proper maintenance of the area and to adequately provide for an orderly transition.
- (f) Any other proposed means the Planning Commission finds to be consistent with the spirit and intent of this Ordinance and the objectives of this Article.

10. Architectural Standards

The following minimum architectural design and exterior wall finish materials standards are intended to encourage greater design variety, encourage greater variety and interest in the design of individual buildings, minimize repetition of design elements between neighboring structures, avoid design monotony within neighborhoods and prohibit the use of materials that are less permanent or are not consistent with a residential appearance.

Residential structures in a Cluster Housing development shall be subject to the following, unless otherwise determined by the Planning Commission:

- (a) Facade Materials. A minimum of forty (40) sixty (60) percent of the exterior vertical surface of the principal building façades shall be finished with brick, stone or similar decorative masonry materials approved by the Planning Commission. Variations in color shall be kept to a minimum and shall be in harmony with the surrounding area.
- (b) Other Elements. Other architectural elements intended to increase architectural variety, interest and reduce monotony in building design may be required by the Planning Commission. Such elements may include variation of the location and design of building entries, garage door orientation, porches, window openings, roof design and pitch, building materials, etc.
- (c) Variety in the design of individual units on each block shall be provided by the use of design details which do not appear to be continuous or repetitious. A building pattern which is repetitious throughout the project shall not be permitted.
- (d) A minimum of 50% of residential units shall have side entry, rear entry or detached garages. Attached front facing garages shall incorporate design elements that diminish the appearance of the garage. Attached front facing garages shall be recessed a minimum of five-feet behind the front building line.
- (e) Planning Commission Modifications. The Commission shall have the authority to vary the specific requirements of this subsection upon determination that alternative designs, materials or other architectural elements would be in accordance with the Purpose and Eligibility Principles sections of this Article.
- 11. Covenants and Restrictions or Master Deed: Architectural standards required as conditions of Cluster Housing development approval shall be included in the covenants and restrictions and/or master deed of the development.

12. Open spaces shall include all-weather pedestrian paths to permit convenient access for residents. Access easements connecting local streets within the cluster development to open spaces shall have a minimum width of ten (10) feet.

SEC. 22.11 PERMITTED DENSITIES

The area used in computing overall density shall be the gross site area including any dedicatable interior right-of-way less than eighty-six (86) feet in width and twenty-five percent (25%) of the water area of water located wholly within the boundaries of the parcel. Permitted dwelling unit density shall be further subject to the following:

1. Planning Commission Modifications

The Planning Commission may vary the percentage of water area to be used in the density calculation overall gross density of up to 25 percent when a developer conveys land for open space, recreation, or other purposes that is accessible to the public, upon determination that such an increase would be within the spirit and intent of the Cluster Option as established in the Purpose Section and the overall projection project would be in harmony with the existing and proposed land patterns of adjacent properties and the general planning area.

The following gross densities may be permitted, subject to modification:

Exemplary Projects. An additional density bonus, greater than 25 percent, may be considered by the Planning Commission for exemplary projects. To qualify, the proposed development must provide a recognizable and substantial benefit to the residents of the community and overall quality of life in the Township through site design in excess of the requirements of this Ordinance, such as extensive landscaping, unique site features, preservation of woodlands / natural features, creation of recreation amenities, and buffering. Not less than 25 percent of the site shall be conveyed as common open space, exclusive of, right-of-way, lots and streets.

Density Impact. The proposed type and density of use shall not result in an unreasonable increase in the need for or impact to public services, facilities, roads, and utilities in relation to the use or uses otherwise permitted by this Ordinance, and shall not place an unreasonable impact to the subject and/or surrounding land and/or property owners and occupants and/or the natural environment. The Planning Commission may require that the applicant prepare an Impact Statement documenting the significance of any environmental, traffic or socio-economic impact resulting from the proposed open space community. An unreasonable impact shall be considered an unacceptable significant adverse effect on the quality of the surrounding community and the natural environment in comparison to the impacts associated with conventional development. Should impacts be identified, a mitigation plan is required.

2. Exclusions

The following shall be excluded from the area used in computing overall density:

- (a) Dedicated or dedicatable interior and exterior right-of-way equal to eighty-six (86) feet in width or greater. This shall be determined by the established street setback lines, in the case of existing streets.
- (b) Water area which is not wholly within the boundaries of the parcel to be developed.

SEC. 22.12 AMENDMENT, TERMINATION AND REVOCATION

Approval of the Final Development Plan, final plat, or final condominium site plan by the Planning Commission, and subsequent final approval by the Township Board of the Cluster Housing Option Contract, signifies the completion of the Cluster Housing development application process. The applicant shall comply with all conditions and requirements of the approved Cluster Housing Option contract and final site plan or final condominium site plan, which shall remain unchanged except upon the mutual consent of the Township and the landowner.

1. Compliance Required

Once an area has been included within the Final Development Plan, final plat, or final condominium site plan approved for a Cluster Housing Development, no development may take place in such area nor may any use thereof be made except in accordance with said plan, or in accordance with a Board approved amendment thereto, unless the plan is terminated as provided herein.

2. Amendment

An approved Cluster Housing contract and Final Development Plan, final plat, or final condominium site plan may be amended in the same manner provided in this Article for approval of the original Final Development Plan and Contract, excluding scope of work which is permitted by Section 29.4: Administrative Review.

3. Termination

An approved CHO Contract and Final Development Plan, final plat, or final condominium site plan for a Cluster Development may be terminated by the applicant prior to any development within the Cluster Housing Development involved by filing with the Township Clerk and recording in the Wayne County Records an affidavit so stating. The approval of the CHO Contract and Final Development Plan, final plat, or final condominium site plan for the Cluster Housing Development shall terminate upon said recording. No approved CHO Contract and Final Development Plan, final plat, or final condominium site plan shall be terminated after any development commences, except with the approval of the Township Board and of all parties of interest in the land, except as outlined below.

4. Revocation

A Cluster Housing Option approval may be revoked by the Township Board in any case where the conditions of such approval have not been or are not being complied with. If it is determined that the conditions of the approval are not being met, the Chief Building Official shall issue an immediate stop work order and communicate in writing his actions to the applicant and to the

Township Board with reason therefore. The Township Board shall give the applicant notice of its intention to revoke such approval at least ten (10) days prior to review of said approval by the Board. After conclusion of such review the Township Board may revoke such approval if it finds that a violation in fact exists and has not been remedied prior to such hearing.

BACKGROUND:

Enclosed, please find a copy of the proposed text amendment to the C-1, Neighborhood Shopping district to permit restaurants, the sale of alcohol as a permitted, accessory use, subject to use requirements, and outdoor seating. Track changes are shown for ease of review in the enclosed draft Ordinance.

Currently, the sale of alcohol is not permitted in the C-1 district and sit-down restaurants are only permitted as a special land use. <u>Please note, drive-in or drive-through restaurants are not permitted in the C-1 district and no change to this standard is proposed.</u>

A public hearing was held at the November 2018 Planning Commission on this amendment and subsequently discussed by the Commission at regular and work session meetings.

Additionally, at the November 2018 Planning Commission meeting, an analysis of Plymouth Township's outdoor dining ordinance requirements, surrounding municipalities' outdoor dining ordinances, and best practice standards as recommended by the American Planning Association (APA) were presented and discussed. Outdoor dining is currently not permitted in the C-1 district and it was recommended that such provisions be included, with additional use provisions, greater than those currently provided today (see below).

Plymouth Township's existing regulations are located in *Article XIII: C-2, General Commercial District, section 13.2 Special Land Uses*, and requires, as follows:

Outdoor cafes and eating areas accessory to a permitted restaurant use, subject to the following:

- (a) Pedestrian circulation and access to building entrances shall not be impaired. A minimum of six (6) feet of sidewalk leading to the entrance to the establishment shall be maintained free of tables and other encumbrances. Planters, posts with ropes or other enclosures shall be used to define the area occupied by the outdoor café.
- (b) The outdoor café shall be kept clean, litter-free, and with a well-kept appearance within and immediately adjacent to the area of the tables and chairs. Additional outdoor waste receptacles may be required. Written procedures for cleaning and waste containment and removal responsibilities shall be included with all applications and approved by the Planning Commission. Preparation of food and beverages is prohibited in the outdoor café area.

(c) Tables, chairs, planters, waste receptacles, and other elements of street furniture shall be compatible with the architectural character of the adjacent buildings, subject to Planning Commission approval.

A second public hearing was held at the January 16, 2019 regular meeting of the Planning Commission, no public comment was made.

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ARTICLE XII

C-1 NEIGHBORHOOD SHOPPING DISTRICT

PURPOSE

To provide for neighborhood shopping facilities in close proximity to residential areas which satisfies the need for non-durable convenience goods and/or personal services and to encourage the planned concentration of such activities in locations where analysis of the residential population within a one mile radius demonstrates the need for such facilities.

SEC. 12.1 PRINCIPAL PERMITTED USES

No building or land shall be used and no building shall be erected except for one or more of the following specified uses, unless otherwise provided in this Ordinance:

- 1. Any use permitted in an OS Office Service District, as a principal permitted or special land use, provided such use does not meet the definition of "large scale institutional uses", unless otherwise indicated in this Article.
- 2. Retail establishments, whose principal activity is the sale of food and/or drugs in an enclosed building without drive-in or drive-through facilities, such as and limited to:
 - (a) Bakeries, limited to retail, on the premises only.
 - (b) Candy, confectionery and ice cream stores.
 - (c) Delicatessens.
 - (d) Drug stores and pharmacies, without drive-in or drive-through facilities.
 - (e) Dairy stores, without drive-in or drive-through facilities.
 - (f) Food market, grocery stores and meat markets.
 - (g) Party stores.
 - (h) Tobacco stores.
 - (i) Other retail establishments as determined by the Planning Commission to be consistent with the purpose and standards of the C-1 District.
- 3. Establishments which provide personal services in an enclosed building excluding drivein or drive-through businesses and not exceeding 10,000 square feet of gross floor area, such as and limited to:

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- (a) Barber shop or beauty parlor.
- (b) Dry cleaning or laundry pick-up shops.
- (c) Laundromat.
- (d) Rental business with no outside storage or outside display of goods.
- (e) Shoe and hat repair.
- (f) Tailor shops.
- (g) Television, computer, and radio repair shops.
- (h) Watch repair shops.
- 4. Restaurants, but not including drive-in or drive-through restaurants.
- 5. Restaurants, as permitted in 12.1(4), serving food and/or alcoholic beverages, subject to the following requirements:
 - (a) The service of alcohol is considered an accessory use to the principle use of the building and may not occupy greater than 30% of the total gross floor area.
 - (b) The service of alcohol is limited to the hours of 9:00 AM 10:00 PM.
- 46. Public schools offering courses in general education provided that such facilities do not meet the definition of "large scale institutional use" subject to the following requirements:
 - (a) All vehicular access to the site shall be from a paved primary or collector road, as classified in the Township Master Plan. The Planning Commission may allow secondary access from local streets.
 - (b) All schools shall be licensed by the State of Michigan. Documentation shall be provided by the proprietor relative to such facility's ability to obtain a license.
- 57. Outdoor cafes and dining areas, accessory to a permitted restaurant use, subject to annual administrative site plan approval and the following requirements:
 - (a) Pedestrian circulation and access to building entrances shall not be impaired. A minimum of six-feet of sidewalk width leading to the entrance to the primary establishment and the outdoor café shall be maintained free of encumbrances.
 - (b) The outdoor café shall be kept clean, litter-free and with a well-kept appearance within and immediately adjacent to it. Written procedures for cleaning and waste containment and removal responsibility shall be included with all application.
 - (c) Tables, chairs, planters, waste receptacles and other street furniture elements shall

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be compatible with the architectural character of the on-site building and adjacent buildings.

- (d) Outdoor café space must be delineated by decorative planters, landscaping, four-foot or less in height fencing, or other decorative enclosures to define the space.
- (e) Hours of operation of the outdoor café space must be consistent with the hours of operation of the primary establishment, provided that outdoor hours of operation may be no later than 11:00 pm. In the C-1 district, outdoor hours of operation may be no later than 9:00 pm.
- (f) Tables, chairs and must be locked or taken inside when the facility is closed.
- (g) All furniture must be removed from December 1 February 28.
- (h) No amplified music shall be permitted if residential lot or dwellings are within 300 feet of the outer boundary of the outdoor café area. Details regarding any music be provided, including: hours, type of entrainment, music speaks or similar devices.
- 48. Accessory structures and uses customarily incidental to the above permitted uses, subject to the standards of this Article, including restrictions on accessory warehousing and storage as specified in Section 12.3, Development Requirements.

SEC. 12.2 SPECIAL LAND USES

The following uses shall be considered special land uses in this district and shall be permitted only after review and approval by the Planning Commission in accordance with the procedure and standards as found in Section 2.7 of this Ordinance and further subject to the requirements listed below:

- 1. Any of the principal permitted uses and related accessory uses listed in Section 12.1 with hours of operation within the time period 12 Midnight to 6:00 A.M.
- 2_. Restaurants, but not including drive in or drive through restaurants, or those which provide entertainment or dancing or which sell alcoholic beverages.
- 32. Public and quasi-public uses intended to serve the neighborhood and immediate vicinity including park and ride facilities, provided that they do not meet the definition of "large scale institutional uses."
- 43. Municipal facilities, including libraries and community buildings, provided that they do not meet the definition of "large scale institutional uses".
- 54. Commercial child care centers and adult care facilities, as licensed by the State of Michigan, subject to the standards of Section 28.64.

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- 65. Charter and private schools, including parochial, elementary, intermediate and/or secondary schools, provided that they do not meet the definition of "large scale institutional uses" offering courses in general education subject to the following conditions:
 - (a) All vehicular access to the site shall be from a paved primary or collector road, as classified in the Township Master Plan. The Planning Commission may allow secondary access from local streets.
 - (b) All schools shall be licensed by the State of Michigan. Documentation shall be provided by the proprietor relative to such facility's ability to obtain a license.
- Public utility transformer stations, substations and gas regulator stations without service or storage yards shall comply with the requirements of Section 26.12, Areas Requiring Screening and/or Buffering, and shall provide a front yard setback of not less than fifty (50) feet, and two (2) side yards and a rear yard of not be less than twenty five (25) feet each.
- Outdoor cafes and dining areas accessory to a permitted restaurant use, which do not comply with the standards of section 12.1.7.

SEC. 12.3 DEVELOPMENT REQUIREMENTS

All principal uses and special land uses in the C-1 Neighborhood Shopping District shall comply with all applicable requirements of this Ordinance, including, but not limited to the following:

- 1. Site plan and development approval for all uses as specified in Article 29 of this Ordinance.
- 2. Off-street parking for all uses as specified in Article 24 of this Ordinance.
- 3. Off-street loading for all uses as specified in Article 24 of this Ordinance.
- 4. Landscaping, screening and land use buffers for all uses as specified in Article 26 of this Ordinance.
- 5. Height, area, lot coverage and yard regulations as specified in Article 20 of this Ordinance.
- 6. Signs for all uses as specified in Article 25 of this Ordinance.
- 7. Special Provisions, as specified in Article 28 of this Ordinance.
- 8. The following specific requirements shall apply within a C-1 Neighborhood Shopping District:

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- (a) The above specified stores, shops or businesses shall be retail or service establishments dealing directly with consumers and offering personal services and/or new merchandise only.
- (b) Such stores, shops or businesses shall be conducted entirely within a building.
- (c) All goods produced on the premises shall be sold only at retail on the premises. Manufacturing of products for distribution or sale at off-premises locations shall be prohibited in the C-1 District.
- (d) All warehousing and storage of goods associated with permitted uses in the C-1 district shall be limited to that which is normally associated with the permitted use and/or shall be restricted to that amount necessary to support on-site operations of the principal use. There shall be no outside storage of goods, inventory, or equipment.
- (e) All exterior walls of every building hereafter erected or extended or whose exterior is structurally altered which faces a street or which is adjacent to property classified as residential shall be designed, treated and finished in a uniform manner consistent with the exterior of the front of the building. All such buildings shall comply with Section 28.14, Building Design Standards.
- (f) Underground utilities shall be provided as required under Section 28.10.
- (g) Compliance with Section 28.5, Environmental Performance Requirements, is required for all uses.
- (h) Yard Grading and Drainage. All yard and open space areas in a C-1 Neighborhood Shopping District shall be graded as specified in Section 28.15 of this Ordinance.
- (i) All buildings shall be readily accessible by fire and emergency vehicles, and shall comply with the Township Fire Prevention Ordinance.
- (j) Sidewalks shall be provided as specified in Section 28.16 of this Ordinance.
- (k) Lighting shall comply with the standards as specified in Section 28.8, Exterior Lighting.
- (1) The method of trash pick up shall be presented to the Planning Commission for approval. Dumpsters and similar waste receptacles shall be subject to the requirements of Section 28.9, Waste Receptacles.
- (m) Street trees shall be provided between the street or road pavement and sidewalk of all public right of ways.

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- (n) Fences. In all Neighborhood Shopping Districts it shall be unlawful for any person to build, repair or relocate a fence without first having secured a Zoning Compliance and/or Building permit from the Department of Building and Code Enforcement. All fencing and/or screening walls required and approved by the Planning Commission as part of a special land use and/or site plan approval shall be, subject to the following:
 - Protective or Security Fencing: Protective or security fencing shall be considered a structure enclosing a piece of land or separating contiguous land either in whole or part, serving the purpose of preventing intrusion onto or across a lot of record or any parcel or tract of unplatted land from without or straying from within. The following shall govern the height, location and placement of protective or security fencing:
 - a) Maximum Height: The maximum height of a protective or security fence shall be four (4) feet.
 - b) Material: Fences shall not be constructed of old or used material unless such material shall be reasonably sound in the judgment of the Department of Building and Code Enforcement. Fences shall not be made of or contain barbed wire, electric current or charges of electricity or sharp or pointed projections of any kind; provided if such fence is constructed of pickets, the pickets shall be made of not less than one (1) inch by three (3) inch material and shall have an angle at the top of dot less than ninety (90) degrees. The fence shall comply with the requirements of the applicable requirements of the State Construction Code enforced by the Township. Cyclone fencing or cyclone fencing with plastic or other types of strips intertwined or otherwise attached to the fence shall be prohibited.
 - c) Placement: No fence shall be built closer to the street than the front setback line applicable to the premises pursuant to the Article 20, Schedule of Regulations, provided no fence shall be built closer to the street than the established front building line along said street or in front of the principal building on the lot that is closest to the street setback.
 - d) The Planning Commission may, at its discretion, permit alternative fence placements, heights or materials in keeping with the spirit and intent of this Ordinance and deemed necessary to provide adequate protection for the abutting properties.

As part of this agreement, the Club shall perform all maintenance and preparation on Field #4 and undertake four "Community Improvement" projects totaling roughly \$17,000 in 2019, involving the refurbishment and nighttime lighting of the existing flag & flagpole at the field, enclosing Field #4 with fencing down the lines to protect players and fans, and installation of a grass infield on Field #4 including proper preparation (base layers), irrigation, and sodding. This document has been reviewed by Attorney Bennett.



LETTER OF AGREEMENT Between CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH & PLYMOUTH CANTON LITTLE LEAGUE (BASEBALL)

This Agreement is entered into thisday of	, 2019, by and between the
Charter Township of Plymouth, whose address is 9955 N. Haggerty Road	, Plymouth, Michigan 48170,
(the "Township") and Plymouth-Canton Little League, whose address	is PCLL, P.O. Box 87057,
Canton, Michigan 48187 (the "Club"). This agreement will be in effect thro	ough December 31, 2020 and
may be renewed by mutual agreement of the parties.	

Whereas the Club provides high quality youth baseball and programs and the Township is desirous of partnering with the Club to provide youth baseball and softball programs to area residents as well as ongoing enhancements to Township Park.

The purpose of this Agreement is to establish the rights and obligations of the Township and the Club with respect to the use and maintenance of Field #4, Plymouth Township Park (PTP, aka "McClumpha Park"), located in Plymouth Township.

IT IS HEREBY AGREED TO BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES:

1. Program

- a. The Club shall operate and make available a developmental and competitive baseball and softball program at PTP, including Field #4.
- b. The Club shall make the program available to residents and non-residents, under terms and conditions it prescribes for such participation.

2. Facility Use

- a. The Club shall have priority use of Field #4 at PTP / McClumpha Park.
- b. All use of the park by the Club shall be in strict compliance with the Township's Rules and Regulations and this Agreement. In case of conflict between the Rules and Regulations and this Agreement, the terms of this Agreement shall be controlling.
 - The Club will utilize the fields for games from end April through mid-July.
 Specific game schedules will be provided to the Township Supervisor's Office by April 1st for spring season. Such schedules are incorporated by reference into this agreement.
 - ii. Whereas The Club initially limits its intent to Spring and Summer baseball, the Club may wish to extend usage to an additional Fall Season, at future time and upon mutual agreement.

- c. For any dates not covered by the Club's schedule, the Township shall control field use for non-Club groups on a first-come, first-served basis. The Township agrees to consult with the Club prior to granting authorization for any additional Club or league usage of the fields to ensure that both parties mutually agree that requested usage will not have a deleterious effect on the condition of the baseball diamond(s). The Township agrees, to the best of its abilities, to avoid authorization of activities which will degrade field conditions. Notwithstanding any other provision herein, the Township shall retain final say in the use of all park activities.
- d. The Township will maintain its right to control use of the PTP / McClumpha Pavilion per Township Park Rules and Regulations.

3. Field Preparation

- a. At its sole cost and expense, the Club shall perform all maintenance and preparation on the baseball Field #4 as follows:
 - i. The field(s) will be dragged, lined and prepped for game-play as needed to maintain a quality playing surface (PCLL Saturday game play on Fields 1-4, and #4 throughout the week, leveraging existing relationships, eg, Alan Krunk, LocheLemonde).
 - ii. The Club shall make specific improvements to Field #4 as jointly agreed with the Township, as follows:
 - Community Improvement Project #1: Investigate Permanent Solution
 to Public Lighting of the Flag & Flagpole The Club shall jointly, with the
 Township, develop the bid, source the work, and fund at The Club's sole
 expense lighting of the Flag & Flagpole; targeting immediately to Spring
 2019, work shall be completed not later than year end 2019 (projected
 expenditure <= ~\$5,000)
 - 2. Community Improvement Project #2: Enclose Field #4 with fencing down the lines; close off access to the field for fans and spectators for safety and better playability; The Club shall jointly, with the Township, develop the bid, source the work, and fund at The Club's sole expense installation of additional fencing for #4; targeting immediately to Spring 2019, work shall be completed not later than year end 2019 (projected expenditure <= ~\$5,000)</p>
 - 3. Community Improvement Project #3: Install and implement a grass infield on Field #4; includes proper preparation (base layers), irrigation, and sodding; The Club shall jointly, with the Township, develop the bid, source the work, and fund at The Club's sole expense installation of grass infield on Field #4; targeting Fall 2019, work shall be completed not later than year end 2019 (projected expenditure ~\$5,000 \$8,000)

- iii. Priority of field #4 for turf maintehance (especially after installation of the grass infield) shall be mutually agreed upon between the Township and Club, as well as "resting" or closing of fields.
- iv. The Township may approve any other desired field maintenance activities that the Club may want performed at the Club's expense.
- b. The Township agrees to provide irrigation throughout the growing season. The Township agrees to coordinate with the Club to ensure appropriate timing and quantities of irrigation are applied to maintain the desired field quality.

4. Administrative Provisions

- a. The Township shall be provided with a copy of the Club's articles of incorporation, bylaws, and proof of 501(c)(3) status upon request.
- b. The Club shall not discriminate against any participant based on race, color, creed, religion, sex, age, national origin, residency, or sexual orientation.
- c. A current certificate of liability insurance shall be provided to the Township at time of contract execution, and shall be renewed and provided to the Township annually. The certificate shall comply with Township Parks Insurance Requirements (see attachment). The Township agrees to wave the Auto liability provision of the requirements.
- d. The Club shall agree to defend, pay on behalf of, release, indemnify, and hold harmless the Township, its elected and appointed officials, employees and volunteers, and others working on behalf of the Township against any and all claims, demands, suits, or loss, including all costs connected therewith, and for any damages which may be asserted, claimed, or recovered against or from the Township by reason of personal injury, including bodily injury or death, and/or property damage, including loss of use thereof, which arises out of or is in any way connected or associated with this agreement.
- e. The Club shall immediately notify Township of any incidents involving damage or injury to persons or property at events occurring on Township property.
- f. This Agreement represents the entire understanding and agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, and superseded all other negotiations, understandings, and representations (if any) made by and between such parties.
- g. In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement shall for any reason be held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, this invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect the enforceability of any other provision of the Agreement. This Agreement shall be construed as if the invalid, illegal or enforceable provision had never been contained in it. The remainder of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
- h. No waiver, alteration, amendment, or modification of any provisions of this Agreement shall be binding unless in writing and signed by the parties hereto. The fact that one of the parties to this Agreement may be deemed to have drafted or structured any

- provision of this Agreement shall not be considered in construing or interpreting any particular provision of this Agreement, either in favor of or against such party.
- i. The headings in this Agreement are for purpose of reference only and shall not be considered in construing this Agreement.
- j. This Agreement shall be binding upon the parties hereto and their respective heirs, successors, legal representatives and permitted assigns. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement and understanding between the parties with respect to the subject matter hereof, superseding any prior oral or written agreements or understandings. The parties acknowledge that they have not been induced to enter into this Agreement by any representation or statements, oral or written, not expressly contained herein or expressly incorporated by reference herein.

BACKGROUND: Plymouth Township must replace the fire apparatus at Fire Station #3. This vehicle was purchased in 1992 and is 27 years old. It is costly to maintain and is not currently in service. Engine #3 has not been working for the past 30 days as we await parts that must be custom made. Parts must be custom made, each time there is maintenance. This is not cost effective. Additionally the township has not had a ladder truck since January of 2012. We have a heavy concentration of Commercial and industrial buildings in Station #3's service area. We should use the opportunity to purchase a dual role Fire Engine and Ladder truck to respond to all fires in station #3's service area as well as backing up the rest of the Township. We have reviewed the capabilities of this vehicle and find it will sufficiently provide fire and rescue protection for our community. We will also see a benefit to the Insurance Service Office rating for our community by purchasing this vehicle which will reduce insurance rates throughout Plymouth Township.

Description and Function of new capital item

This vehicle will be assigned to Fire Station #3 at 13600 Beck Rd. This vehicle will play a dual role as both a Fire Engine and a vehicle mounted 100' ladder with an elevated hose stream. This vehicle will be designated Ladder 3 and will provide primary Fire Suppression on the west side of Plymouth Township. It will be primary fire response to Metro West and the industrial areas of Plymouth Township. It also will be first due on all structures of 35 feet or higher in Plymouth Township providing roof access to buildings we cannot achieve today. (See attached list)

Explain new or improved service that will result from new item

Engine #2 will be retired from service with the arrival of this vehicle. Engine #2 was purchased in 1989 and is 30 years old. It does not meet current NFPA standards. This vehicle will have a larger pumping capacity than Engine #2 and will meet all NFPA requirements that Engine #2 does not meet, including interior seating for all occupants, Engine #2 still has firefighter seating outside. We will also see a significant decrease in maintenance cost and vehicle down time. We lost the ability to gain access to roofs at the dissolution of the fire merger. This vehicle will provide much improved services to our Industrial and Commercial industries which we do not currently provide adequate coverage. We will also increase our ISO rating as a result of this improvement.

Why is this new item needed? Why does the Township need to provide this service?

Plymouth Township purchased a ladder truck in 1972. This vehicle operated in our community until we sold it during the merger with the City of Plymouth. Plymouth Township has provided no ladder vehicle since the dissolution of the City Fire Merger in 2012. This has greatly reduced our ability to provide rescue and fire suppression in almost all commercial and industrial manufacturing facilities. Plymouth Township has numerous buildings greater in height than 2 stories including several five story structures. The Township has already approved the concept of 2 additional 4 story buildings on Plymouth Rd. There is another building on Beck road which is also over 35 feet that is in planning. Plymouth Township has several manufacturing parks throughout the community and we do not have a ladder to reach the roofs of these structures. Most new structures are built at the 35' limit which is taller than the largest fire department ground ladder. See attached list of structures over 35' in size.

Furthermore we have attempted to write a grant using the Assistance to Fire Fighters Grant Program and we have been denied. We also joined with Northville Township and the City of Novi to write a regional grant and were also denied.

How will any current services be affected or changed if approved? What will happen if this item is not approved?


If approved we will be able to provide appropriate equipment to the heavy concentration of industrial buildings in our industrial parks including Metro West, Plymouth Corporate Park and Plymouth Oaks Business Park. Plymouth Township residents will also benefit from the improvement to the Insurance Services office calculation which has determined that a community our size and density needs to provide a ladder company at the Beck Rd station. In 1999 the ISO gave Plymouth Township credit for two ladder companies. We did not receive credit for any ladder companies in 2015,.

How do you anticipate providing this service?

This vehicle will be placed in service at Fire Station #3 at Beck and Territorial. It will provide the benefit of an engine company or a ladder company; This is a dual role vehicle which will improve services across the community. If this expenditure is approved, the vehicle will be delivered in 10-11 months. We will have to make our first payment 1 year after signing the purchase agreement. The vehicle will be put into service after fire department training is provided by the manufacturer. Those costs are included in the price of the vehicle and include vehicle operation training as well as ladder training.

What will be the operating budget impact? (personnel, supplies, other charges)

The purchase price was estimated prior to the recent millage proposal. We had originally estimated a purchase price of 884,790.60 for 2020 however the tariff increases were not anticipated. The 2019 budget would not be affected. The 2020 budget would need to be adjusted to include the lease rate.



<u>BACKGROUND</u> : It is time once again to ask our representatives in Lansing and Wayne County to take action on the McClumpha/Ann Arbor Road Intersection.
As your former State Representative, I worked with the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) and Wayne County in the Fall of 2015 to get a traffic study done that proved the need for four-way, red/yellow/green traffic signals at the intersection. In February of 2017 this Board passed a Resolution that implored our Lansing officials to take action on the intersection, which is under MDOT control.
In 2017, State Representative Jeff Noble was able to secure funding from the state to begin work on the intersection. Unfortunately, this only resulted in a widening of the intersection and a promise that four-way traffic signals would be installed at the intersection. Apparently yet another traffic study would need to be done.
We cannot afford to wait any longer, and with the new Governor and Legislature in place, it is time for us to reiterate our need for a fully-functional traffic signal at this dangerous intersection.
PROPOSED MOTION: I move that the Board of Trustees approve Resolution 2019-02-12-15 urging the State of Michigan to expedite the funding and installation of all necessary 4-way signals and other improvements necessary for the McClumpha Road/Ann Arbor Road traffic safety improvements.

RESOLUTION TO URGE THE STATE OF MICHIGAN TO EXPEDITE THE INSTALLATION OF TRAFFIC SIGNALS AND RELATED SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS TO THE INTERSECTION OF ANN ARBOR ROAD AND MCCLUMPHA ROAD IN THE TOWNSHIP OF PLYMOUTH

At a regular meeting of the Board of Trustees for the Charter Township of Plymouth (the 'Board'), held at Township Hall, 9955 N. Haggerty Road, Plymouth, MI on February 12, 2019 the following resolution was offered:

WHEREAS, the intersection of McClumpha and Ann Arbor Road in Plymouth Township (the 'intersection') is currently one of the busiest in the township, handling vehicles travelling east and westbound on Ann Arbor Road travelling at speeds in excess of 50 mph; and,

WHEREAS, the intersection also services major residential neighborhoods to the north and south of the intersection; including to the south, the nearby Plymouth-Canton Educational Park, the largest high school campus in Michigan with more than 6,100 students; and,

WHEREAS, the intersection also services a church and charter school at its northeastern quadrant, and a large funeral home at its southwest quadrant; and,

WHEREAS, since January 1, 2010, 60 vehicle crashes have been reported at the intersection – 23 of those listed as 'injury accidents:'

WHEREAS, the State of Michigan, through its Department of Transportation (MDOT) is responsible for the intersection's design, construction, traffic flow, and safety as Ann Arbor Road is a state trunkline (the 'old M-14 highway); and,

WHEREAS, after numerous citizen complaints in 2015, MDOT commissioned the County of Wayne to undertake a traffic study to determine whether additional traffic signals and other improvements were needed at the intersection; and,

WHEREAS, the study showed the need to make such improvements, including but not limited to, new traffic signal(s), improved deceleration lanes, center turn lanes, and a widened intersection in accordance with modern traffic safety guidelines; and,

WHEREAS, MDOT as of this date has only made limited intersection improvements and has not installed four-way, red/yellow/green traffic signals – an unsatisfactory outcome that has done little to protect public safety;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Plymouth Township Board of Trustees urges the State of Michigan to expedite the funding and installation of all necessary 4-way traffic signals and other improvements necessary to promote enhanced public safety and traffic flow at the intersection of Ann Arbor Road at McClumpha Road, Charter Township of Plymouth, Michigan.

FURTHERMORE, that copies of this Resolution be sent to Governor Gretchen Whitmer, MDOT Director Paul Ajegba, State Senator Dayna Polehanki, State Representatives Matthew Kolezar and Kristy Pagan, House Appropriations Chair Rep. Shane Hernandez, County Commissioner Melissa Daub, and the Plymouth-Canton School Board.
