And What They Do




Police officers are important people in our lives. They take care of people, their property and their community.

There are police officers who work with people who have broken the law. They try to teach them not to do that again.



Police officers work hard during the day.


Some police officers work all through the night.

the other one is there to help.



Color all the areas with circles in it blue. Color all the areas with squares in it brown. Who is exercising?




