

Thursday, February 24th, the community was invited to join live on the City's Facebook page (City of Rio Grande City, Texas) at approximately 6 p.m to hear about legislative projects and policy direction embalming the theme: "Our River, Our City, Our Future!"

Notable community members invited include all elected officials within Starr County, Starr County Memorial Hospital, Rio Grande City Grulla ISD, Mayors of border towns and prominent Rio Grande Valley cities as well as the President of South Texas College and representatives for the University of Texas Rio Grande Valley and more.

Mayor Joel Villarreal and City Commissioners Rey Ramirez (Mayor Pro-tempore), Flor Flores, Alberto Escobedo, and Rogerio Olivarez presented an overview of the City's current state and future plans for growth. Economic development, infrastructure, public safety and quality of life encompassed the majority of fundamental details that spelled out Rio Grande City's fruitful year. Furthermore, Mayor Villarreal expanded on special projects which include the Rio Grande Village, an Animal Kennel expansion, the SCMH-DHR medical expansion, a new public safety building along with an emphasis on clinical and trade binational

efforts. He even coined a name to illuminate the newly established partnership between all municipalities of the county–"Starr Alliance".

While Villarreal provided a snapshot of the past, he also tipped the audience in on a real treat before closing out with the announcement of plans that have commenced for a municipal boys and girls club and even moreso, possibly a golf course.

In conclusion, this year's State of the City Address made waves that resonated further than the Starr County county limits and our river. According to recent internal conversations, the City Administration aspires to continuously amplify that positive spirit that lends itself to the success and betterment of our great border City.

## CHILDREN OF ADDICTION AWARENESS WEEK

The City of Rio Grande informed the committee about Children of Addiction Awareness. To Support this cause the City of Rio Grande had an awareness week from February 13 through February 19th, 2022. One in four children live in a family with a parent addicted to drugs or alcohol. That translates into 18.25 million children who need help eliminating the adverse impact of parental addiction.

Children of addiction are more likely than others to have emotional, psychological, or physical problems related to their childhood. As such, they need the support of caring adults to bring awareness, hope, and ultimately healing.

Here are six ways you can make a difference:

- 1. Be caring and consistent (and do not pry).
- 2. Remember: children love their parents (even if they have said or done terrible things).
- 3. Remind them (repeatedly) it is not their fault.
- 4. Look beyond a child's behavior (instead ask why).
- 5. Help kids learn to deal with their emotions (in a healthy way).
- 6. Let kids be kids. (encourage silliness!)

# Fire Dept.



The Fire Department began fire hydrant maintenance. It is important to maintain fire hydrants annually to ensure that they are functioning properly. Maintenance on fire hydrants improves the Insurance Services Office(ISO) rating.

Firefighters are continuing their education hours that are mandated by the Texas Commission on Fire Protection, in turn, education hours improve the ISO annual rating.

The Fire Department continues to assist at the Port of Entry Vaccination Clinics. This effort aids the border crossing individuals to be vaccinated and their well being.

The Fire Department stesses to residents to be cautious when turning on BBQ pits, especially when windy days are upon us.

The Fire Department personnel will attend the annual All Hazards Conference in McAllen. As the Texas Division of Emergency Management assists local first responders to educate about emergency preparedness, this effort enhances knowledge about sheltering, hurricane evacuation, declaration decisions, school district preparedness, disaster preparedness, school bullying, and public safety.

## **New Leash Law 2022**

Is it illegal to chain your dog outside in the state of Texas? Unlawful restraint of a dog which includes them being chained and without shelter or water is now a criminal offense in Texas.

The law is called "Safe Outdoor Dogs Act" which bans chaining up dogs that are outside. This new law was passed mid January

of this year. Chains are an unsafe tethering option for outdoor dogs. It's required that outdoor dogs have access to drinking water and a good shelter that will protect them from any weather conditions. The act was passed by the Texas legislature last year with broad bipartisan support.



The city-wide collection center serves as the City's initiative to promote a clean and prosperous community. Usually, days the drop-off facility is open falls on either the second or fourth week of the month. The second week will consist of a Friday-Saturday accessibility while the fourth week will be available to Rio Grande City residents Monday through Saturday. Public works crewmen will be available during those designated days from 8 A.M. to 6 P.M. to receive residents and their bulky items for disposal. Requirements for utilization of bulky item -drop-off service includes the following: Bring your ID and a recent utility bill. Bring only acceptable items: Example: Bulky items include tires, beds, appliances, furniture, brush etc. Items NOT accepted include construction materials such as plywood, concrete, drywall, insulation, etc. Residents can find the facility located on 632 W Eisenhower Rd, Rio Grande City, Texas. Great things are coming to Rio Grande City! Our Planning Department has received a permit request for a new Wendys set to come into Rio Grande City. The building is valued to be about 800,000.00 with a square footage of 2,608 square feet. The location of the new Wendys will be located at 4559 E Hwy 83. Once the application is complete, the permit should be ready within ten business days.

The Planning Department also processed four new occupancy permits for new businesses that include a law firm, a beauty salon, a fruit business and a yogurt house. "We have

also processed permits of improvements with a total value of 1,214,083.00 with a square footage of 60,992 square feet," says Planning Director Gilbert Millan.

Lastly, for the homey side of incoming permits, the department welcomed 5 new residential homes with a total valuation of 865,000.00 encompassing a total of 11,500 square feet of improvements. Each week, there are new projects getting started. It's great to see that the City of Rio Grande is growing!





#### TEMPORARY SIGNAGE ORDINANCE

A person may not place a handbill, poster, placard or other temporary sign in the historic sign district except inside a window or on a bulletin board and with the consent of the owner or the tenant.

If a person files an application for a signed permit in the historic sign district and the application complies with all applicable regulations of this chapter and other building codes adopted by the City of Rio Grande City then the planning Director will review the application and determine whether it complies with the resort sign district guidelines.

### **Notice of Ordinance**

Rio Grande City Code Enforcement would like to remind citizens of the common areas that fall within prohibited temporary signage zones, as stated in Rio Grande City's Ordinance No. 2018-2. These areas include Britton Ave (South of the Courthouse), the downtown Main Street area on business 83 as well as all other historical district areas within Rio Grande City city limits. On that note, make sure to cast your votes!
