

he City of Rio Grande City Commission held their Regular Monthly Meeting on Wednesday, October 19, 2022, at City Hall. Rio Grande City Mayor, Joel Villarreal, along with all of our RGC Commissioners read and recognized proclamations for Fire Prevention Week, Domestic Violence Awareness Month, as well as, Down Syndrome Awareness Month. Community member, Jazlyn Barrera, spoke about the Down Syndrome Awareness event held on Saturday, October 15, at Basilio Villarreal Park, and Starr of Hope Representative, Belinda Trevino, spoke about the Starr of Hope organization that is designated to helping the victims of domestic violence and sexual assault by providing shelter services and advocacy. During this meeting, Fire Chief Manuel Muniz recognized a new member to the RGC Fire Department & Emergency Management, Edgar Alanis. The RGC Parks and Recreation Department received the T.A.A.F. Bronze Member City Award for outstanding registration support from teams,

Water and Sewer Services

Moving soon? Not sure about how to set up up your water or sewage? Follow the simple chart below to find the steps to help you navigate our system.

1. REQUEST FOR UTILITY SERVICE FORM FROM THE PLANNING DEPARTMENT.

2. DRIVERS LICENSE OR PICTURE ID

3. PROOF OF OWNERSHIP, LEASE OR RENTAL AGREEMENT

5. LASTLY, A WORK ORDER IS MADE FOR THE CREW TO PLACE ON THE SCHEDULE. PLEASE NOTE THAT THE CREW WILL NOT RESPOND IMMEDIATELY. CREWMEN PRIORITIZE WATER LEAKS AND SEWER BACK-UP PROBLEMS.

4. IF THERE IS AN EXISTING LINE, THEN THE FEE IS \$100 DEPOSIT TO OPEN AN ACCOUNT. IF THE EXISTING LINE IS NOT AVAILABLE, THEN THE FEE IS \$100 DEPOSIT TO OPEN THE ACCOUNT, \$450 TO ESTABLISH WATER SERVICE, AND \$375 TO ESTABLISH SEWER SERVICE.


These are but a few of the many new developments creating job growth and economic impact. Great things continue to happen in Rio Grande City.
