VIRAL SAFETY MONTH

WHEREAS, It is of vital importance for all residents to protect their family, community and themselves by researching the positive effects of proper indoor humidity, Vitamin D exposure, and COVID-19 preventative measures; and

WHEREAS, Early treatment of COVID-19 has changed Rio grande City recommends the consultation of a medical professional to begin early treatment immediately as soon as symptoms display; and

WHEREAS, It is recommended for all persons to get tested to determine Vitamin D levels and to adopt a Vitamin D regimen specially designed by a medical provider to improve the immune system; and

United Way's VITA Program Offers Free Tax Preparation Services

United Way's VITA Program provides free tax preparation for families in Hidalgo and Starr Counties. Every year, Rio Grande City staff joins in on providing free tax services to the community. We are seeking volunteers to assist with the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program coming at the end of this coming January, 2022. In 2021, families saved an average of \$600,500 in tax preparations fees and received about \$5.2 million in federal tax refunds. This coming year, families who earn \$60,000 or less may be eligible to benefit from this service at no cost. Make sure to prepare ahead of time to potentially qualify for your tax refund.

Need Utility Bill Assistance?

Low income households throughout the U.S. have assistance to pay their water bills. The Rio Grande City Council meeting taking place on the 5th of January, 2022 will include an agreement between the South Texas Development Council with the City. Locally, applications will be received through their office located in precinct one.

According to Mrs. Beas, director of Rio Grande City Utilities, about 20% of RGC water accounts reside in a delinquent status. After 10 days of a missed payment, protocol requires that the city send out notices and shut off water supply for those in a delinquent status. However, patrons

may call to schedule a payment plan in the case of extenuating circumstances.

With this program, those on payment plans or in a delinquent status can be helped. It will help the city improve their delinquent status while also helping residents pay on their defaulted accounts.

Those federal funds available for residents through the agreement are available to any water supply company in the nation.

Rio Grande City Building Permit Awarded to Buffalo Wings Rings

Buffalo Wings and Rings received a building permit from Rio Grande City Planning Department at approximately 4 P.M on Friday afternoon, January 28th. The property is located in Rio Grande Village, on U.S. Highway Business 83 near FM 755. The official address will be 4521 E. U.S. Hwy 83, Rio Grande City TX.

Gilbert Millan, Rio Grande City Planning Director states that, "the first inquiry regarding the obtainment of the permit was in June of last year." Today, the permit was issued. The growing sports restaurant chain may break ground anytime within the next year, before the permit expires. The City is unaware of when that will be.

The sports oriented atmosphere will be the first of its kind in Rio Grande City, servicing a population of a growing 17,000+ residents. The valuation of the building is \$1.6 million, covering an area of 5,243 sf.

"An awesome dining experience beyond buffalo wings awaits families, sports fans, and connoisseurs of good food coming soon to beautiful Rio Grande City," remarks Rio Grande City Mayor, Joel Villarreal.

This Buffalo Wings & Rings permit represents the collaboration of Rio Grande City, Rio Grande City Economic Development Corporation, St. Ives Realty, Starr County, and Starr County Industrial Foundation working together for the prosperous expansion of the community.

Chick-Fil-A Coming Soon

Chick-Fil-A fans, here's some good news for 2022.

The Atlanta-based chain serving its famous original Chick-Fil-A sandwich is coming to Rio Grande City, according to plans submitted to the Rio Grande City Planning Office and filing with the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation.

Chick-Fil-A is scheduled to start construction this summer on an approximately \$12 million construction project on the southeast corner of US Highway 83 and FM 755 at Rio Grande Village in Rio Grande City. Completion is scheduled for early December.

Panda Express made a big splash over the Christmas holiday as it debuted its opening in Rio Grande City. The new fast casual restaurant is located at the Rio Grande Village subdivision on US Highway 83.

The Fire is Growing

Rio Grande City Fire Department received new inventory this January to keep up with the growing needs of the community. The two new vehicles include an E-3 and an E-4 commercial cab-pierce freightliner pumper truck that can hold approximately 1,000 gallons of water. The trucks are the general fire trucks needed to complete most calls the department receives on a daily basis. Last year, the Fire Department acquired two other large pieces of equipment- a brush truck and a tanker truck.

Assistant Fire Chief, Martin Galvan states that, "Now the Fire Department is able to carry-out equipment for several jobs at a time." In previous cases, the City has been able to help neighboring cities outside of its normal operating areas between Alvarez rd and U.S. highway 83 to La Puerta near the Dollar General on Hospital rd.

In other Fire Department related news, in a recent Facebook Live public service announcement, Mayor Joel Villarreal along with Chief noe Castillo and Fire Chief Manuel Muniz discuss the future of the Rio Grande City Fire Department.

Aside from housing one station in the recently announced Public Safety Building, another station has taken roots right next door to the Municipal Airport located on the northeast side of the City. Renovations are expected to come in the near future as the city continues to expand its public safety services to the residents of Rio Grande City.

In a recent public announcement found on Rio Grande City's Facebook Page, Assistant Chief Solis notified the public that starting January 28th, RGC Police Department will begin using new uniforms. In 1985, the original color resembled a light blue color. Through the years, various uniforms had been implemented. The new color will be an LA blue, according to the Assistant Police Chief.

Various reasons went into this new look for the Rio Grande City Police Department. Solis goes on to mention that one reason is due to the extreme summer temperatures. This is especially true for officers wearing thick, long-sleeved uniforms with bulletproof vests on top of it all. "There are two companies that make a different kind of 'French Blue'", says Solis. This makes it difficult to coordinate continued colors in uniform for the squad.

Rio Grande City urges citizens not to be alarmed by the change in uniforms. Our Police Department is more prepared now than ever to continue protection and community defense services.

Operation Blue Santa 2021



During the 2021 Rio Grande City Toy Drive, our local police force funneled toys into the hands of hundreds of children based in the Starr County area for the holiday. Aside from providing Christmas cheer to the children, the Police Department continued an initiative that tends to draw quite the social media crown along. Notice from the Rio Grande City I.T. Dept

Previously, the Rio Grande City sourced Spectrum as its primary internet service provider, or isp, for all municipal buildings. Eduardo Lopez, the City's Information and Technology personnel, sheds a little light on how functionality and efficiency have improved fivefold in the past year.

One reason for change was the route for internet funneling to each City department structure. In comparison to the original connection, with 200 megabits per second (Mbps), the city amped up to 1 gigabyte per second (GBps) with its move to Smartcom. Lopez stresses, "It saves us a lot of money—with approximately \$16,000 per year." Lopez goes on to speculate that the weakened connection under the former plan could have been caused by an extra circuit not being utilized. Investigation is still underway.

So now let's break down how City departments are wired. The main site is located in the Tijerina Courtyard area while the other sites are fed off the centralized Main Distribution Facility, or MDF. The main internet, which has become about five times faster, is linked to other circuits at nearby sites. These nearby sites have doubled in speed. Connected to the main circuit are eight subcircuits. Sites that were 50 megabits are now 100 megabits with the adjustment.

The great news is that this growth is not in its completion stages yet. Currently, the city is undergoing an addition to these circuits with facility renovations underway.



Rio Grande City Police Dept. Applies for Grants

Rio Grande City Police Department has been very busy the month of December, and that's aside from their North Pole duties. Assistant Chief of Police, Jose Solis, mentioned during his monthly report that, "This upcoming month we are applying for 5 different grants to help better serve the community." Here's a breakdown of what Rio Grande City could see after the start of the new year:

1. Crime Victim Liaison Grant - A Crime Victim Liaison will act as a liaison between victims, family members of victims, victim advocates, various service providers and law enforcement in accordance with the grant. This position is subject to grant funding and could be eliminated without grant funding.
2. Violence Against Women Detective Project - The goal of the grant program is to develop and strengthen law enforcement entities, invigorate prosecution and court strategies to combat violent crimes against women and to develop and strengthen victim services, including community-based and culturally specific services.
3. Drug and Human Trafficking Interdiction Grant - The Office for Victims of Crime (OVC) is one of six components within the Office of Justice Program (OJP). OJP receives funding under 22 U.S.C. § 7105(b)(2) for the purposes of developing, expanding, or strengthening victim service programs for victims of trafficking. The table below outlines information about OJP human trafficking funding from Fiscal Year 2011-present.
4. Body Worn Camera Grant - Law enforcement agencies across the United States and throughout the world are using body-worn cameras (BWCs) as a promising tool to improve evidentiary outcomes, and enhance the safety of, and improve interactions between, officers and the public. BWCs also are proving to be an important tool to assist broader law enforcement, problem-solving, and community engagement strategies within jurisdictions.
5. BJA's Body-Worn Camera Team developed the Body-Worn Camera Toolkit to serve as a comprehensive clearinghouse for criminal justice practitioners interested in planning and implementing a body-worn camera program in an effort to improve officer and community safety.
6. Rifle Vest Grant - Back in January, Texas Gov. Greg Abbott announced grant funding that will provide rifle-resistant vests for nearly 33,000 Texas police officers. Abbott announced the \$23 million grant at the Dallas Police Association, though the vests will be handed out statewide.



The city-wide collection center serves as the City's initiative to promote a clean and prosperous community. Usually, days the drop-off facility is open falls on either the second or fourth week of the month. The second week will consist of a Friday-Saturday accessibility while the fourth week will be available to Rio Grande City residents Monday through Saturday. Public works crewmen will be available during those designated days from 8 A.M. to 6 P.M. to receive residents and their bulky items for disposal. Requirements for utilization of bulky item -drop-off service includes the following: Bring your ID and a recent utility bill. Bring only acceptable items: Example: Bulky items include tires, beds, appliances, furniture, brush etc. Items NOT accepted include construction materials such as plywood, concrete, drywall, insulation, etc. Residents can find the facility located on 632 W Eisenhower Rd, Rio Grande City, Texas. Rio Grande City Permit Application Submitted by Incoming Chick-fil-A Chain



Chick-fil-A applied for a building permit with Rio Grande Planning Department Friday morning, January 21st, to initiate the construction of the nation-wide fast-food restaurant chain. The proposed property is located in Rio Grande Village, on the corner of U.S. Highway Business 83 and FM 755. The official address will be 4505 E. U.S. Hwy 83, Rio Grande City TX.

Gilbert Millan, Rio Grande City Planning Director states that, "discussion had developed throughout the past three months. This permit application means that they are ready to pay for a building permit and start construction." However, the permit usually takes a couple of weeks to finalize before construction can begin.

Rio Grande City Code Enforcement completes about a hundred health inspections for restaurants and other food preparation businesses a year, with now another on the way. This Chick-fil-A permit application represents the harmonious effort of Rio Grande City, Rio Grande City Economic Development Corporation, St. Ives Realty, Starr County, and Starr County Industrial Foundation working together for the prosperous expansion of the community.

Permitted Growth

During the last month of 2021, the Planning Department processed permits with a valuation of \$1,689,242 worth of building improvements and 30,555 square footage. This includes the permit for our one and only "Marshalls" worth 1.2 million dollars worth of improvements!

January brought about a hefty amount of activity as well. The Planning Department processed permits with a valuation of \$740,100.00 and 21,793 square feet of improvements. Residential growth is seeing a steady incline with the average of 4 homes per week. New residential builds were permitted with a valuation average of \$177,000.00 each.

Rio Grande City Announces New Public Safety Building Concept



On Monday afternoon, Rio Grande City placed official signage north of the St. Ives Realty development, alongside FM 755, where the City's new Public Safety building will erect. The City has budgeted \$6.1 million for the contemporary two-story project. The blueprints for the approximate 29,000 sq ft of construction include plans for housing the Rio Grande City Police Department, Fire Department, along with a few other additions.

Furthermore, the price per square foot is set at \$265.00, according to the office of the Warren Group Architects, Inc. Laura Warren, lead architect with TWG Architects, Inc stated that the new development may "have updated revisions in the design process."

With the population skyrocketing in the previous years and more commercial development underway, some may argue that this expansion to vital public safety resources is long overdue. Mayor Joel Villarreal articulates that "Public Safety is the cornerstone of prosperous, successful and progressive municipalities."

The new public safety building is set to break soil sometime in the next few months.


