Rio Grande City Receives \$2.5M in Funding for New Public Safety Building, Emergency Shelter

he city of Rio Grande City, in collaboration with US Representative Henry Cuellar, held a press conference on Friday, August 19, at city hall in recognition of the \$2.5M grant check presented by Representative Cuellar for a brand new Public Safety Building and Emergency Shelter. "The reality is that the strength of a municipality is synonymous with public safety," expressed Rio Grande City Mayor Joel Villarreal as he addressed everyone in attendance. "This is going to be an amazing building," remarked Representative Cuellar, "Not only will it be a centralized location for all safety departments, but also for the shelter itself." This brand new facility will consolidate emergency functions into one building, and house fire, police, and other emergency first responders, as well as include an emergency shelter for the community in the event of extreme, hazardous weather.

The Rio Grande City Public Works Department is currently looking to upgrade the Water Meter System from a digital reading system to an antenna reading system, or Advanced Meter Infrastructure (AMI). An Advanced Meter Infrastructure (AMI) uses a powerful, long-range, radio system with more bandwidth to communicate with each meter, remotely. The RGC Public Utilities Department will continue to research this new project until further notice.










RGC PARKS AND REC. STAFF ATTENDS TRAINING


