Hi Christian,

SCE gives the city the Civil Phase final set of drawings for the installation of vaults and conduits and street restoration. What SCE doesn't give the city are the Electrical Phase final set of drawings. Because SCE will be doing the Electrical Phase and not a city bid/contractor. Further, the cost of the project from SCE is the Electrical Phase which also includes inspection for the Civil Phase.

The Civil Engineer does not need to create a complete set of engineered drawings just take our drawings and include them with your project specifications for the trenching bid.

The trenching bid will consist of the following items:

- SCE Final Drawings
- Other Utilities Final Drawings
- SCE/Other Utilities Specifications (ours are on the first sheet of the plans)
- Special Provisions Section of the Specifications (permit/traffic control/working hours requirements, other requirements, Pre-Bid Meeting place/date/time, et al)
- Schedule of Bid Items or Bid Sheet (where bidders fill in their bid dollar amounts, total bid amount, and sign the bid)

City accomplishes the Civil Phase and the utilities accomplish the Electrical (SCE) and Cabling (Comm Utilities) Phase.

To advertise, bid/award, and manage construction, et al. And at an acceptable fee!
