

INFORMATIONAL MEETING OVERVIEW OF FY 18/19 ACCOMPLISHMENTS PLANS FOR FY 19/20

Purpose

As defined by Act 57 of 2018 "When the governing body of a municipality determines that it is necessary for the best interests of the public to halt property value deterioration and increase property tax valuation where possible in its business district, to eliminate the causes of that deterioration, and to promote economic growth, the governing body may, by resolution, declare its intention to create and provide for the operation of an authority."



Funding

Funds for projects are collected in two ways:


Tax Increment Finance (TIF) District - established in 2011, this funding mechanism allows the DDA to collect the incremental increase in taxes collected as properties increase in value from 2011 to now. Total we collect approximately \$15,000 annually.

- This fund can be used for public improvements in the district, such as streetscape improvements, parking, underground utilities and marketing efforts.
- The lifespan of the Saginaw DDA TIF is from 2011 2030.

2 Mill Levy - adopted in 2017 and collects \$1 for every \$1,000 of property value in the DDA District. Total we collect approximately \$130,000 annually.

• This tax levy was voted on by the public.


Funds for administration come from a City of Saginaw CDBG Grant.

Administrative costs are funded by a City of Saginaw CDBG Grant of \$31,200.

The Tax Increment Financing District collected \$14,459 which was kept in the same fund as the 2 Mill Levy collections for projects.



Safety

Police Patrols

- \$15,000
- The DDA pays the overtime for two police officers to patrol the riverfront afterhours in the warmer months.



Security Cameras

- \$36,381
- The DDA is working with Police Chief Ruth and the City of Saginaw to increase the number of security cameras in the riverfront.
- This last year the DDA purchased a server to store data collected by the cameras and approved funding the monthly consumers bill to run the cameras.



Attractiveness

Streetscape Improvement

- \$10,000
- A committee was formed to determine the streetscape project each year. The committee is made up of four DDA members who own property or businesses in the riverfront.
- This past year the committee decided to purchase flower pots which were placed in the beginning of June.
- This project was a partnership with the City of Saginaw, Tri-Cap and Abele's Greenhouse, saving the DDA approximately \$6,000.

Infrastructure Improvement

 Spicer Group was hired to develop an infrastructure plan for the primary corridors of the riverfront.





Business Assistance

Façade Grant Program

- \$50,100
- 50/50 matching grant for façade improvements.
- This past year the DDA awarded 11 grants.



Marketing Plan

- \$10,000
- This past year the DDA has working with the City of Saginaw and a hired marking firm to manage the development of a marketing strategy.
- Conducted research including stakeholder interviews, an online survey, which collected more than 1,000 responses, and reviewed all existing marketing efforts.
- Phase two included audience profile development, goals and objectives, messaging and drafting the marketing communications
- The marketing campaign is launching at the Redevelopment Ready Community Celebration this Friday, June 28, 2019.



Special Projects

Temporary Wayfinding Signs

- \$1,100
- This was funded by a grant from EMCOG.
- The temporary signs show walking or biking distances to cultural, recreational and entertainment amenities in the riverfront.



Redevelopment Ready Certification

 The DDA assisted the City of Saginaw in meeting the requirements to become a Redevelopment Ready Certified Community


