Dear Salem neighbors,

I hope all is well and that you and your family have enjoyed our beautiful fall season here in Michigan. The holidays are upon us and another year is coming to a close. I hope you have had a great 2017 and have a safe and Happy New year. The Salem Township Board and our employees have enjoyed serving you this year and are thankful for your support.

The Board of Trustees has been working on three projects and I would like to share the recent updates on these projects with you. They are the Chubb Road Project, the Hamlet Project and the Urban Service District project (USD).

Chubb Road Project

Engineers have been working on this project and should have it completed by the first of the year. Chubb Road between 5 Mile Rd and 6 Mile Rd and Five Mile Rd between Chubb and Napier will be impacted by this project. This is part of our Heavy Industrial area that needs to be paved. This will help to drastically cut down the dirt and dust problems coming out onto Six Mile Rd. This is part of Salem's infrastructure that needs to be fixed.

Hamlet Project

In August of this year, the Planning Commission recommended to the Board of Trustees, a plan to beautify the Salem Hamlet. Both the Planning Commission and the Board of Trustees have recommended steps to improve the physical characteristics of the Hamlet while maintaining and enhancing the Hamlet's focal points. These improvements include street lights, sidewalks and landscaping. Look for these updates coming in 2018.

Urban Service District (USD)

On October 23rd, the Township received an email from the Michigan Economic Development Corporation (MEDC) that Salem Township is eligible for a \$10 million grant for infrastructure for the USD. (Sewer & Water). At the time of writing this newsletter, we have not pursued this grant until the Board of Trustees has the opportunity to review it in our November meeting. Keep in mind, the total cost for the infrastructure will be in the vicinity of 25 million, therefore it's very important to understand where the rest of the money will

be coming from. The Township's position is that no development will be started until the developers can show how they are going to finance the project. Once again, to be very clear, this will not be paid for by the taxpayers of Salem Township.

November 7 Special Election Results - Salem Township

A "huge thank you" to all of our election workers for a job well-done! It is a lot of work, but it is a great learning experience. Thank you again for making Salem Township's election process run so smoothly.

The "Un-official" results of the election on November 7 were that only 645 residents voted out of a possible 5,197 total voting residents. The Washtenaw County Mental Health millage was defeated in Salem Township with 60% of the total votes cast. The Northville Public School millage increase was defeated overwhelmingly with 90% of the votes cast. However, the Washtenaw ISD School District millage won by a narrow margin with 53% of the votes cast.

Remember that 2018 will be another important voting season with both a Governor's & U.S. Senator's race, along with many other state & local issues. TREASURER'S UPDATE: FROM THE DESK OF DALE CONVERSE


I want to begin with wishing everyone a Merry Christmas and a Happy and Blessed New Year.

The Treasurer's office is in the process of issuing, collecting and distributing the annual winter taxes. This year will be no different than in the past. The taxes will be mailed and you should receive them by the first of December. The taxes are due by February 14, 2018. Those taxes that are delinquent after the February 14 due date will receive a yellow postcard stating that there are delinquent taxes due. All delinquent taxes that are not paid by February 28 will be turned over to Washtenaw County on March 1. All delinquent taxes that are turned over to the county will be assessed a 4% penalty and accumulate another 1% per month penalty until paid. The Township office will be open until 5:00 PM December 29 and February 28 to assist those that are not able to stop by the Township office during normal business hours. Residents who pay their taxes through an escrow service and need a paid receipt can request a stamped paid receipt and we would be happy to provide it.

The inspection of the Hamlet sewer system that I mentioned in past communications has been completed. We are awaiting the results to start planning on what needs to be accomplished to address future renovations if needed. This study will be beneficial in addressing the issue of excessive flow rates during and after a heavy rain. Much work still remains to fully understand the future needs for the system.

The Board approved an unusual large amount of road projects this past summer. I am pleased to report that the projects were funded without the need to use our investments. We did need to use our short-term savings account, but at this time those funds have been replaced.

NEWS FROM THE ASSESSOR'S DESK

I just received the inflation multiplier from the State Tax Commission. They have calculated a 2.1% increase in your Taxable Value for 2018. You can take last year's value and multiply it by 1.021 to get an estimate of the amount you will pay taxes on for 2018. This is assuming that you didn't make any changes on your property during 2017. I will be sending out your assessment notices by the end of February. Please watch for it and if you don't agree with my value, please call and make an appointment to visit the Board of Review. In 2018 they will be in session on March 14, 15, & 16. I will be driving throughout the Township during December, January, and February to look at new construction, so if you see a black Ford Escape driving around in your neighborhood please come out and ask any question you might have.

To anyone in the Township that is operating a business, if you have less than \$80,000 in personal business property, please don't forget to file the "Affidavit to Claim Small Business Tax Exemption" with my office by February 10, 2018. You must file this form every year. If you are no longer in business as of December 31. 2017 let me know by returning the form with "No longer in Business" written on it and I'll take you off the Tax Roll. If you didn't receive your form by February, either come and get one at the office, or on line at michigan.gov, the State Treasury Department.

Washtenaw County will be completing their studies that determine the increase or decrease in assessed values for 2018. They will be looking at property sales in Salem Township during the last two years and comparing the sale prices with my 2017 assessments. The ratio of sale prices to assessed values must be at 50% by State Law. This is done by adding all the sale prices and dividing it into the total of the assessments of all those properties that sold. So, if you purchased your house recently, the 2018 assessed value may not be exactly half of the sale price. I hope you will all have a joyful holiday season.

SALEM TOWNSHIP FIRE DEPARTMENT

PLEASE HELP THE FIRE DEPARTMENT HELP YOU!

For some of our fire and rescue responses within the township we have a hard time reading the house address. You can help us by installing a "Green Address" sign. Small address numbers or missing numbers delay our responses. Remember, some of our roads have speed limits over 50 mph which make small address especially difficult to read at night or under poor weather conditions such as rain and fog. The address sign can be purchased at the Township Hall for a nominal cost.

Another issue we encounter is driveways that do not have the trees and/or bushes trimmed back away from the road. Driveways that offer easy access to a car may not allow ambulances or fire apparatus to enter. We suggest a minimum of 15 feet across the driveway and 15 above the driveway be cleared of all obstructions to allow us to quickly get to your house.

Hearty White Bean Chicken Chili Recipe

Ingredients

- 4 cups shredded chicken (I use a Costco rotisserie chicken)
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1 onion, chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 (15.5) ounce cans Great North Beans, rinse & drained
- 1 (14.5) ounce can chicken broth
- 2 (4 ounce) cans chopped green chilies
- 1 teaspoon salt

- 1 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1 teaspoon dried oregano
- ½ teaspoon ground black pepper

Directions

- 1. Heat olive oil in sauce pan over medium heat. Add onion and garlic and sauté for about 10 minutes. Add chicken to mixture.
- 2. Mix Great Northern Beans, chicken broth, green chilies, salt, cumin, oregano, black pepper and cayenne pepper into chicken mixture. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer for 30 minutes.
- 3. Remove from heat. Stir in sour cream, whipping cream and cheese. Enjoy!

MEMENTO MORI

June 6, 1917 was an extreme weather day spawning many weather-related events that wreaked havoc and devastation on Southern Michigan. This storm began out in Lake Michigan. Several tornadoes were spawned by the storm, but one in particular traveled from Climax, Kalamazoo County, to Cass Lake, in Oakland County. This twister passed through Salem Township. First it hit the village of Worden near Five Mile Road and Pontiac Trail, where it destroyed the Worden Church and damaged many other buildings. Continuing on an easterly path it touched down again near the intersection of Angle and Six Mile Roads. The Walker schoolhouse, and numerous barns were destroyed in this area. Also, the cyclone took on a particularly devastating feature for the community here. The Rentchler family, upon hearing the unmistakable sound of the approaching tornado, fled for their lives to the storm cellar. Unfortunately, the cellar did not provide the protection needed by the Rentchlers. Mrs. Thelma Rentchler used her body to shield her little 7-month-old son, Warren. The tornado tore the home to pieces. Mrs. Rentchler was struck by the debris which broke her back and took the life of her son. Thelma would linger on for nearly 2 months before she succumbed to her tornado inflicted injuries. Both Warren and Thelma are interred at the Salem-Walker Cemetery.


