Below are a few of our latest updates.

### Chubb Road and 5 Mile RD Paving Project

By now, I am sure many of you have noticed the completion of the 5 Mile Rd paving from Chubb to Napier. It appears that weather and temperatures will start to have an impact on the contractor's operations. As of right now, it looks like Chubb Road will not be completed until the Spring of 2020. Although the project will not be fully completed until Spring, the contractor has indicated that they will open both north and southbound lanes to traffic. There will be a list of things that need to be completed in the spring including restoration and pavement markings. I would like to thank you all for your patience during this important paving project.

### MEDC Grant and the USD (Urban Services District) Update

Once again, as I mentioned in our last newsletter, the MEDC Grant of \$20 million dollars has been secured. There has not been much change from our last newsletter concerning utilities for the USD. An application has been submitted to Superior Township for the sewer line to come through the road right of way through their community. Most of the other required permits have already been acquired at this time. I will continue to keep you posted as more information becomes available.

Once again, it has been a pleasure for our board members and staff at the Township to serve you this year. ### **CLERK'S COMMENTARY:** FROM THE DESK OF DEL WENSLEY

### **Reminder: Presidential Primary – Tuesday, March 10, 2020**

The 2020 Presidential Primary is designated a "closed primary," just as it was in 2012 and 2016. Michigan Election Law, requires voters wishing to participate in the March 10 election to choose a Democratic, Republican, or no-Presidential Primary ballot when voting absentee or at the polls on Election Day (local issues only, when applicable). While a voter must select a specific party ballot, there is no political party registration in Michigan's voter registration system.

### Who is Eligible for an Absent Voter Ballot?

Due to the passage of the statewide ballot proposal 18-3, all eligible and registered voters in Michigan may now request an absent voter ballot without providing a reason.

### Join the Permanent Absent Voter List

Salem Township offers this great service that allows you to receive an Absent Voter Ballot Application automatically prior to every election in your precinct. You will still have to sign & return the application to us before each election so we can send you a ballot. It is a more convenient way to vote in the privacy of your own home rather than waiting in lines on election day.




### **TREASURER'S UPDATE:** FROM THE DESK OF DALE CONVERSE

The paving of Five Mile Road has been completed. If you have not driven over it yet, I'm sure that you will be as impressed as I was. The portion of Chubb Road between the Rail Road tracks and Six Mile has the first and second of three asphalt lifts completed. The section between the Rail Road tracks and Five Mile Road was halted when a major issue was discovered that delayed the final paving by 2 to 3 weeks. That delay pushed laying the of asphalt well out of the season when paving can be accomplished due to weather conditions. We have been informed that construction will resume most probably in April 2020 and paving approximately 4 weeks later. In the meantime, Dans Excavating will be prepping the road for normal public use and for snow maintenance.

The SAW grant is now completed. The SAW grant was basically an asset management program sponsored by the MDEQ where the condition of all components of the sewer system were evaluated against their life expectancy. After 22 years of service to the Hamlet and sewer expansion, several areas were identified that needed to be addressed. We were aware of several issues identified during the investigation and have already implemented corrective action. A work plan is being developed with input from our engineers and Highland Treatment to address several other issues as we go forward.

The Treasurer's office is now preparing to mail, collect and distribute the 2019 winter taxes. The office will be open until 5:00 PM on December 31 and March 2. Delinquent taxes paid after February 14 have until March 2 to be paid, after which those delinquent taxes will be turned over to the Washtenaw County. Delinquent taxes that are turned over to the county for collection will be assessed a 5% penalty. We once again caution everyone that mailing their taxes after Feb 1 runs the risk of not being received prior to the deadline. In the past, several individuals had their taxes returned due to a USPS error. Typically, it takes over 30 days for letters to be returned to the sender when the issues arise like "address unknown" is encountered. In those cases, a 5% penalty was imposed which we were unable to waive. If you choose to send your payment by mail, I would check with your bank to make sure it clears by the due date or feel free to call the office and see if your payment has been posted.



# **NEWS FROM THE ASSESSOR'S DESK**

I just received the inflation multiplier from the State Tax Commission. They have calculated a **1.9**% increase in your Taxable Value for 2020. You can take last year's value and multiply it by 1.019 to get an estimate of the amount you will pay taxes on for 2020. This is assuming that you didn't make any changes on your property during 2019. I will be sending out your assessment notices by the end of February. Please watch for it and if you don't agree with my value, please call and make an appointment to visit the Board of Review. Appointments will be available in March. I will be driving throughout the Township during December, January, and February to look at new construction, so if you see a black Ford Escape driving around in your neighborhood, please feel free to come out and ask me any questions you might have.

To anyone in the Township that is operating a business, if you have less than \$80,000 in personal business property, please don't forget to file the **"Affidavit to Claim Small Business Tax Exemption"** with my office by February 10, 2020, unless you filed the form last year. If you are no longer in business as of December 31. 2019, let me know by returning the form with **"No longer in Business"** written on it and I'll take you off the Tax Roll. If you didn't receive your form by February, either stop by and get one at the office, or on line at <u>michigan.gov</u>, the State Treasury Department.

# Chocolate Yule Log Cake

#### Ingredients

- CAKE
- $1/2 \operatorname{cup} \operatorname{flour}$
- 1/4 cup unsweetened cocoa (plus, a little extra to sprinkle)
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 4 large eggs, at room temperature
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1/4 cup cooled melted butter

#### Directions

1. Heat oven to 375°F. Line bottom of 15x10x1-inch baking pan with parchment paper.

2. Arrange clean, thin cotton napkin or towel onto counter (don't use terry cloth). sprinkle generously with unsweetened cocoa.

3. Mix flour, 1/4 cup cocoa, baking powder and salt in bowl.

4. Mix eggs and vanilla in another bowl and beat at high speed 5 minutes or until it is fluffy, thick and a pale-yellow color. Stir melted butter into egg mixture. Gently stir flour mixture into egg mixture until just combined. Spread into prepared pan. Bake 10-12 minutes or until center springs back when touched. Run knife around edges to loosen sides.

5. Flip hot cake out onto prepared towel and remove parchment paper. Lightly dust with powdered sugar and trim away crisp edges. Starting with one of the short sides of the cake, immediately roll the cake up in the cloth and cool on rack for at least 30 minutes.


6. Beat 1/2 cup chilled whipping cream and 1/4 cup powdered sugar in chilled bowl. Beat at medium-high speed, scraping bowl often, until stiff peaks form.

7. Place chocolate hazelnut spread and cream cheese in another bowl; beat at medium speed until well mixed. Gently stir whipped cream mixture into chocolate mixture until just combined. Cover and refrigerate for at least one hour.

 Combine 1/3 cup butter and melted chocolate in bowl and beat at medium speed until well mixed. Add 2 cups powdered sugar and beat on low until well mixed. Add 3 tablespoons whipping cream and beat at medium-high speed until smooth and creamy.
Unroll cake and spread with chilled filling. Reroll and refrigerate for 30 minutes. Spread cake with frosting and reroll.

10. Draw lines in frosting with a fork for bark appearance. Dust with powdered sugar. You can garnish with holly leaves and red M&M's for berries, just place the letter side down.

11. Cover and refrigerate until serving. Enjoy!

#### FROSTING

- 1/3 cups softened butter
- 2 (1 oz) squares melted unsweetened chocolate
- 2 cups powdered sugar
- 3 tablespoons heavy whipping cream

### **SALEM MEMORIES**



Jarvis (Salem) Stone School - Erected 1857

We have visited the early settlements of Salem including Brookville (Lapham's Corners), Worden (Pebble's Corners), Rider's (Walker) and Summit.

One additional location was pivotal in Salem's early history – that being Bullock's Corners. Bullock's Corners was situated at the intersection of North Territorial and Curtis Road.

In 1829 a schoolhouse was erected at this key intersection. The building would stand in as an early meeting place in the township's history. The outcome of two meetings held at this building 4 years prior to Michigan's statehood continue to impact the township to this day.

The first meeting took place on 17 January 1833 when a group of settlers gathered and voted to form a Baptist Society. The result was the formation of a congregation named The First Baptist Church of Salem. Around 1852 the society erected its first edifice on property north of the present Salem Hills Golf Course. When the railroad came through the township, the church was offered a parcel of land in the newly formed village of Salem. The church relocated its existing building to this parcel. In 1887 they built a new building; this is the current sanctuary of Salem Bible Church. The congregation continues with the mission as proposed by those early settlers 186 years ago.

Secondly, in March of 1833 the Michigan Territorial legislature voted to split Panama Township of Washtenaw County into two new townships: Salem and Superior. On 1 April 1833 the citizens of the newly formed township of Salem gathered at the Bullock's Corners schoolhouse and appointed the first Salem township officials. We as township residents continue to provide members to this group which serves our community at the citizenry's behest.
