GLF Environmental Inc acquired Arbor Hills from Advanced Disposal on October 30th and we look forward to working with them. The new management team have been asking for ID when using the resident drop off, so please have your landfill pass and ID with you for your convenience.

Wastewater System Design (pump station and ten miles of force main)

- Joy Road Pump Station. Bidding TBD
- Force Main-Regulatory Permitting. In progress Next design steps include but are not limited to:
 - Pump Station Bidding and Contract Award TBD
 - Force Main Bidding and Contract Award TBD

Water System Design and construction (Meter Pit, Booster Station, and Transmission Main):

- Water system.
 - Construction started July 8, 2020.
 - All water main related to phase 1 has been installed and pressure tested (except for the connection to GLWA)
 - Connection to GLWA postponed to the spring due to valve procurement delay
 - Booster Station construction initiated and is ongoing

 - Booster station construction-In progress
 - GLWA Meter vault
 - GLWA connection and related piping

 - Bid the gravity sewer system and M14 pump station when the Township is ready


As always, I would like to let you know that all fees paid toward this project have been 100% paid for by the MEDC grant Salem Township was awarded.

CLERK'S COMMENTARY: FROM THE DESK OF DEL WENSLEY

Legislative Agenda from the State Capitol for 2021: Secretary of State - Jocelyn Benson

As you may have read from other news outlets, our MI Secretary of State and the Democratic party support this new agenda – Advancing the Vote. Please call your state legislators to let them know what you think of the details.

Voting Access

- Require absentee ballot applications are mailed to registered voters every federal election cycle
- Require counting of ballots postmarked by election day and received shortly after
- Establish early in-person voting at clerk offices and satellite offices prior to Election Day
- Make Election Day a state holiday
- Allow overseas service members and their spouses to return their ballots electronically
- Require translated election materials where a significant non-English-speaking community lives
- Provide funds to ensure voting locations are ADA compliant and establish curbside voting
- Allow transportation assistance to the polls

Election Infrastructure

- Allow processing of absentee ballots two weeks prior to Election Day
- Provide an additional week for the county canvass
- Allow recounts of precincts with clerical errors
- Consolidate May and August elections into one June election
- Provide dependable funding for local election officials
- Update language on absentee ballots and applications

Elections Details

- Prohibit open carry of firearms within 100 feet of a voting location
- Provide election officials additional tools to maintain the registration list
- Require election challenger and election worker training
- Update security requirements for election vendors
- Require a statewide risk-limiting audit prior to state election certification

Join the New Permanent Absent Voter List

Salem Township will be starting up a new Permanent AV List for 2021. The new list allows you to receive an Absent Voter Ballot Application automatically prior to every election in your precinct. You will still have to sign & return the application to us before each election so we can send you a ballot. 
TREASURER'S UPDATE: FROM THE DESK OF DALE CONVERSE

This issue of the Messenger is the first since our reelection this past November. I would like to express my gratitude for the confidence the residents granted me to serve another term as the Township Treasurer. It has been my pleasure to not only to perform the duties of the Treasurer's office, but to get involved and lead in other Township business. As in the past, I welcome questions, concerns and comments on anything relating to the Treasurer's Office and other responsibilities that I have or will be involved with in the future.

The preparation for the winter tax season was challenging as this was the first time the township would be billing those residents that are a part of the Chubb/Five Mile SAD. Legal issues were discovered when the SAD was being loaded into the BS&A software. It took a considerable amount of time and effort to resolve those issues, and we are happy to report that everything is now in agreement and going smoothly. We have accomplished some long overdue updates the Township Office and Hall to better serve the public and staff. We have new front doors, remodeled bathrooms, a wall mounted audio, visual monitor in the Town Hall, new tile in the foyer, new lighting in the office and parking lot, and a computer/break room completely gutted and remodeled. The final issue I am addressing is our security camera system. I looked into a new camera system years ago, but was prevented from acquiring a new system as all new systems required Windows 10 and the Township at that time only had Windows 7. We now have Windows 10 available, so we are requesting bids for an updated and more enhanced camera system.

Progress is moving forward in developing the USD. So far, the Treasurer's Office has been involved by submitting quarterly reports to the state and managing the funding from the MEDC grants. In the future, the Treasurer's Office will be responsible to make financial arrangements with developer to make sure the Township is not at risk for any construction costs.

NEWS FROM THE ASSESSOR'S DESK

I received the inflation multiplier from the State Tax Commission. They have calculated a 1.4% increase in your Taxable Value for 2021. You can take last year's taxes and multiply it by 1.014 to get an estimate of the amount you will pay taxes on for 2021. This is assuming that you didn't make any changes on your property during 2020. You can get more information on how the State calculations are made on line at this link:

You should have received your property assessment notices. To minimize your epidemic exposure, letter appeals are highly recommended. If you intend to appeal in person, please call and make an appointment for the Board of Review. Appointments will be available Wednesday March 10th, Thursday, March 11th and Friday, March 12th. Please call the office for appointment times available.

A letter of authorization is required for a personal representative to go before the Board of Review and it must be signed by the property owner. You can also appeal by letter, but please be sure it will be in our office by Friday, the 12th of March.

IRS Phone Scams

Washtenaw County Sheriff's Office would like to remind you to be aware of potential IRS Phone Scams and to be prepared. As tax season approaches many will soon be awaiting a refund or paying off a tax bill. Beware that IRS impostors may attempt to take advantage. Criminals are looking for ways to steal your money or your identity. Don't fall victim to an IRS scam.

Your first contact with the IRS will not be an unexpected call from an IRS agent but through official correspondence sent through the mail. A red flag for an IRS scam is threatening, angry calls from people who say they are from the IRS or your local police agency and they demand immediate payment. Please know that the Sheriff's Office does not make calls on behalf of the IRS and that these calls are scams. Even if the caller ID shows as the Washtenaw County Sheriff's Office, remember we do not call on behalf of the IRS.

THE IRS WILL NOT:

- Call you to demand immediate payment.
- Call you if you owe taxes without first sending you a bill in the mail.
- Demand that you pay taxes and not allow you to question or appeal the amount you owe.
- Require that you pay your taxes a certain way. For instance, require that you pay with a prepaid debit card.
- Ask for your credit or debit card numbers over the phone.
- Threaten to bring in police or other agencies to arrest you for not paying.

Also beware of scammers calling under the guise of verifying your tax return information over the phone. Scam artists call saying they have your tax return, and they just need to verify a few details to process your return. The scam tries to get you to give up personal information such as a Social Security number or personal financial information.

If you receive a phone call or voicemail from someone claiming to be from the IRS, here is what you should do:

- If you think you do owe taxes, call the IRS at 1-800-829-1040. They can help you with a payment issue if there is one.
- If you don't believe you owe any taxes, then call and report the incident to the Treasury Inspector General for Tax administration at 1-800-366-4484.

There are numerous variations of scams out there. Remember to beware if someone calls asking for personal financial information or payment over the phone.

Ingredients

- 4 cups all-purpose flour plus more for dusting the work surface
- 1/4 cup granulated sugar
- 🖁 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 11/4 cups raisins

- 1/4 cup butter cold, cut into small pieces
- 13/4 cups buttermilk
- 1 egg
- cooking spray

Instructions:

Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F. Coat a 9-inch round pan with cooking spray.

- 1. Put the flour, sugar, baking soda and salt in a bowl. Stir to combine.
- 2. Add the butter to the bowl.
- 3. Use a pastry two forks to cut the butter into the flour mixture until coarse crumbs form.
- 4. Stir the raisins into the flour mixture.
- 5. Add the buttermilk and egg to the flour mixture and stir until a stiff dough form.
- 6. Place the dough on a floured flat surface.
- 7. Coat your hands in flour and shape the dough into a ball. The dough will be sticky.
- 8. Transfer the ball of dough to the prepared pan.
- 9. Use a sharp knife to cut an X into the top of the loaf.
- 10. Bake for 45 minutes, until a toothpick inserted into the center of the loaf comes out clean.
- 11. Cool on a wire rack for at least 10 minutes, then slice and serve. ENJOY!
