PROJECT DESCRIPTION / FACTS

The Airport Board met on December 8, 2022, to review and approve the attached 10 Project Plan for the Salem Municipal Airport.

The plan was presented by Ian Wright of Lochner, the City's Airport Engineering firm and is the same firm we are working with on the T-Hangar construction project. During the Airport Board meeting there was much discussion concerning the merits of various projects and their timing.

In order to be eligible to receive future Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) funds that come through the Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT) specifically for airport improvements the City must have a CIP filed with MoDOT.

Approval of the CIP does not lock in these projects for each specified year, this is a plan that is re-evaluated each year based on fluctuating construction costs, airport needs, city's financial availability and federal funding.

Most of the grant funding for airport improvements requires a 10% match of local funds for the total amount of the project.

The plan has been preliminarily filed with MoDOT awaiting formal approval by the City's Board of Aldermen.

The Airport Board officially recommends approval of the attached 10 Year Plan.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION / FACTS

Spring Creek was placed on EPA's 303d list of impaired waters around 2004. This required a Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) study to be performed on the stream. The TMDL study was completed in 2010 and updated in 2022. The City has been working with the Missouri Department of Natural Resources (MDNR) continually during this time to develop a reasonable and affordable solution. The city has already completed phase 1A and B of upgrades to the wastewater treatment plant. In April of 2022 the City received the results of the updated TMCL study and the new limits were set and mandated by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as goals the City's sewer system <u>must</u> achieve. This is not optional, the City must meet these new goals as agreed to in a negotiation process that is ongoing or future federal level fines will be incurred. A Facility Plan for future upgrades was submitted to MDNR detailing a phased improvement plan that is dependent on ARPA funding and subsequent MDNR SRF grants and low interest loans.

Note - A TMDL is the calculation of the maximum amount of a pollutant allowed to enter a waterbody, in our case Spring Creek, so that the waterbody will meet and continue to meet water quality standards for that particular pollutant. A TMDL determines a pollutant reduction target and allocates load reductions necessary to the source(s) of the pollutant. These TMDL numbers are requirement per the federal Environmental Protection Agency.

The scope of work proposed to meet the new permit requirements is included in the Facility Plan submitted to MDNR with the ARPA application.

ARPA funds must be expended by 2026. (\$5,000,000)

A sewer bond is the most cost-effective approach to funding the remaining balance of work on the wastewater treatment plant for phase 2A and B. Bonds provide for a lower interest rate than traditional financing methods.

FISCAL IMPACTS

If the Sewer Bond passes and the City is successful in securing the additional \$2,750,000 in grant funding, the remaining \$1,880,000 which will be financed through the sale of the sewer bonds will have to be repaid from a sewer rate increase.

If the Sewer Bond does not pass and the City has to finance the total of \$4,630,000, this amount will have to be repaid from a sewer rate increase.

DEPARTMENT'S RECOMMENDED MOTION: NONE, this is a first reading of the ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE CALLING AN ELECTION ON A REVENUE BOND QUESTION IN THE CITY OF SALEM, MISSOURI.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF SALEM, MISSOURI, AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** The Board of Aldermen finds it necessary and hereby declares its intent to borrow \$4,630,000 for the purpose of extending and improving the City's sewerage system, including acquiring land and rights of way (the "**Project**") and to evidence such borrowing by the issuance of sewerage system revenue bonds (the "**Bonds**") of the City in the amount of \$4,630,000.
- **Section 2.** A bond election is hereby ordered to be held in the City of Salem, Missouri, concurrently with the general election on Tuesday, April 4, 2023, on the following question:

QUESTION

Shall the City of Salem, Missouri, issue its sewerage system revenue bonds in the amount of \$4,630,000 for the purpose of extending and improving the City's sewerage system, including acquiring land and rights of way, the cost of operation and maintenance of said sewerage system and the principal of and interest on said revenue bonds to be payable solely from the revenues derived by the City from the operation of its sewerage system, including all future improvements and extensions thereto?

The authorization of the Bonds will authorize the City to fix, establish, maintain and collect rates and charges for the services provided by the City through its sewerage system, including all extensions and improvements thereto hereafter constructed or acquired by the City, in addition to the other rates and charges for such services provided by law, as will produce income and revenues sufficient to provide funds to pay the costs of operation and maintenance of said sewerage system and the principal of and interest on the Bonds as they become due and to provide for the establishment of reasonable reserves therefor.

- **Section 3.** The form of Notice of Election showing said question, a copy of which is attached hereto as **Exhibit A** and made a part hereof, is hereby approved.
- **Section 4.** The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to notify the County Clerk of Dent County, Missouri, of the passage of this Ordinance no later than 5:00 P.M. on Tuesday, January 24, 2023, and to include in said notification all of the terms and provisions required by Chapter 115, RSMo, as amended.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION / FACTS

In an effort to adjust the City of Salem's budgetary functions and more accurately reflect a balance of revenue to expenditures, the City had engaged in a series of discussions and conversations over the past few months concerning the need to pull less funding from City Utility Funds to supplement the City's General Fund for each upcoming budget year.

In order to be less reliant on Utility Revenue which are generated through rates and fees for service to the City's residents, the City of Salem proposes a General Sales Tax increase of 1%.

General Sales Tax is the primary revenue stream for the City's General Fund which supports the main governmental operations of the City.

Shifting the revenue for General Fund to rely more heavily on Sales Tax with share the cost of services with those who live outside of the Salem City Limits and shop here, both county residents and tourists passing through, instead of burdening residents with additional utility costs.

Additional General Sales Tax revenue will also ensure continued levels of service to our residents who live in the City of Salem and to those who do not live in Salem but utilize city facilities such as the Old City Hall and other venues and services the General Funds supports.

WHEREAS, the City of Salem ("City") currently imposes a general sales tax at the rate of 1%; and,

WHEREAS, Section 94.510 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri authorizes the City to collect up to an additional 1% sales tax; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen of the City of Salem has determined that it is in the public interest to submit a ballot question to the voters of the City of Salem, Missouri at the general Municipal Election on April 4, 2023 the question of whether to impose a General Sales Tax of one percent (1%) pursuant to Section 94.510 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri for general municipal purposes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF SALEM, MISSOURI AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1.

There is hereby imposed, subject to approval of a ballot measure as set forth below by the qualified voters, a general sales tax as authorized by Section 94.510, RSMo.

Section 2.

An election is hereby ordered to be held in the City of Salem, Missouri on the public municipal election date of April 4, 2023, on the following question:

"SHALL THE CITY OF SALEM, MISSOURI, IMPOSE A CITY SALES TAX OF ONE PERCENT (1%)?"

Section 3.

The City Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to notify the County Clerk of Dent County, Missouri, of the passage of this Ordinance and to provide a certified copy of this Ordinance no later than 4:00 P.M. on Tuesday, January 24, 2023, and to include in said notification all of the terms and provisions required by Chapter 115 RSMo, as amended.

Section 4.

copy of this ordinance together with certified copy of election results and copy of the official ballot.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION / FACTS

The AHP program is a partial grant funded home rehabilitation program. The contracts are between the City, the homeowner and the contractor.

Participating homeowners are responsible for 20% of the total cost of rehabilitation work done and administration costs, to be paid to the City of Salem prior to work beginning (maximum of \$5,000 owner contribution). The remaining costs are covered by the grant funds, up to \$20,000. This gives a total of \$25,000 (with \$2,000 or 12% going to the City of Salem for administration costs) per home. Any costs above the \$25,000 are the responsibility of the homeowner.

After the homeowner approved the bid with Mendenhall Contracting, Inc, they then chose to negotiate some of the items on the bid. At a meeting where the Homeowners, Contractor and City Staff were present, the bid was negotiated to reduce the Roof costs, and eliminate the: Grading Right Side of Porch, House Numbers (homeowner will take care of this since it is required by city codes), Basement, and Basement Windows. These items show a single line strike through on the attached bid/scope of work which is Attachment A to the Contract.

It was determined to maintain the integrity of the original bidding process that approval of the contract with these changes was the best option.

PROCUREMENT

FISCAL IMPACTS

Economic Development Revenue line 703-47550 will receive \$13,760.00 from homeowner for their required contribution plus the additional work, prior to work beginning.

The contract will result in an expense to Economic Development, FHLB Grant Expenses 703-501-70550 in the amount of \$31,760.

Upon completion of rehab work on all 4 homes in Round #2, the City will be able to apply for reimbursement from FHLB in the amount of \$20,000. No home will be able to go above \$23,000 for total work performed without the homeowner covering the additional cost. REHABILITATION CONTRACT

For The

FHLB (Welcome Home) Housing Program

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this 10th day of January 2023, by and between Mendenhall Contracting, Inc, hereinafter called the "Contractor", and Benjamin and Sally Granowski, hereinafter called the "Owner" of property located at 708 N. Hickory St., Salem, MO, and the City of Salem hereinafter called the "City". In consideration of the mutual promises and agreements contained herein, the undersigned Contractor, Owner, and City agree as follows:

I. The Contractor shall comply with the following provisions:

(1) <u>Labor, Materials, and Work Write-up</u>:

Furnish all labor, materials, supervision and services necessary to do the work specified in the "Work Write-up" (Attachment A) and made a part hereof for the total sum of \$31,760.00.

(2) <u>Notice to Proceed and Date of Completion:</u>

Not begin the work to be performed until receipt of written Notice to Proceed, after which the Contractor shall complete said work within the number of days specified on the Notice to Proceed.

(3) Specifications, Codes and Regulations:

Comply with all appropriate specifications and codes referred to and with all regulations, ordinances, and laws of the City, the County, the State of Missouri, and the Federal Government, and permit reasonable inspection of all work by authorized inspectors, and perform the work diligently, in a workmanship manner, using the materials specified.

(4) <u>Insurance</u>:

A. The Contractor shall purchase and maintain such insurance as will protect him from claims set forth below which may arise out of or result from the Contractor's execution of the Work, whether such execution be by himself or by any Subcontractor or by anyone directly or indirectly employed by any of them, or by anyone for whose acts any of them may be liable:

- 1. Claims under workmen's compensation, disability benefit and other similar employee benefit acts;
- 2. Claims for damages because of bodily injury, occupational sickness or diseases, or death of his employees;

- 3. Claims for damages because of bodily injury, sickness or disease, or death of any person other than his employees;
- 4. Claims for damages insured by usual personal injury liability coverage which are sustained (1) by any person as a result of an offense directly or indirectly related to the employment of such person by the Contractor, or (2) by any other person; and
- 5. Claims for damages because of injury to or destruction of tangible property, including loss of use resulting therefrom;
- 6. Bodily injury insurance shall be in the amount of \$100,000.
- B. Certificates of Insurance shall be filed with the Administrator (City's Economic Development office) prior to commencement of the work. These Certificates shall contain a provision of coverages afforded under the policies will not be canceled unless at least fifteen (15) days prior Written Notice has been given to the Administrator.
- C. The Contractor shall procure and maintain, at his own expense, during the Contract Time, commercial liability insurance in the amount of \$150,000.
- D. The Contractor shall procure and maintain at his own expense, during the Contract Time, in accordance with the provisions of the laws of the state in which the work in performed, Workmen's Compensation insurance, including occupational disease provisions, for all of his employees at the site of the project and in case any work is sublet, the Contractor shall require such Subcontractor similarly to provide Workmen's Compensation insurance, including occupational disease provisions for all of the latter's employees unless such employees are covered by the protection afforded by the Contractor. In case any class of employees engaged in hazardous work under this Contract at the site of the project is not protected under Workmen's Compensation statute, the Contractor shall provide, and shall cause each Subcontractor to provide, adequate and suitable insurance for the protection of his employees not otherwise protected.

(5) Permits and Licenses:

Obtain and pay for all permits and licenses necessary for the completion and execution of the work and labor to be performed.

(6) Debris and Material Removal:

Keep the premises clean and orderly during the course of the work and remove all debris as it accumulates. Materials and equipment that have been removed and replaced as part of the work shall belong to the Contractor, unless the Owner

stipulates their intent to retain certain material or equipment. Any material or equipment retained by the Owner shall not be stored outside or in a manner that detracts from the neighborhood.

(7) <u>Assignments and Subcontracts</u>:

Not assign the contract or subcontract any portion of this contract without notification to the Project Administrator. The notification must be addressed to the Project Administrator, Economic Development, 400 N. Iron St., City of Salem, MO 65560. The General Contractor is responsible for all work carried out by any subcontractor.

(8) <u>Subcontracts to City Officials and Employees:</u>

Shall not subcontract any part of the work to be performed under this contract to any officer, or employee of the City of Salem, or their designees or agents, no member of the governing body of said city, and no other official of such locality who exercises any functions or responsibilities with respect to the City, giving rise to this contract during his or her tenure or for one year thereafter.

(9) <u>Guaranty</u>:

The Contractor shall guarantee all materials and equipment furnished and work performed for a period of one (1) year from the date of Final Completion. The Contractor warrants and guarantees for a period of one (1) year from the date of Final Completion of the system that the completed system is free from all defects due to faulty materials or workmanship and the Contractor shall promptly make such corrections as may be necessary by reason of such defects including the repairs of any damages to other parts of the system resulting from such defects. The Owner will give written notice to the Contractor (copy to Administrator) of observed defects with reasonable promptness. In the event that the Contractor should fail to make such repairs, adjustments, or other work that may be made necessary by such defects, within 30 days of written notice, the Owner may do so and charge the Contractor the cost thereby incurred.

(10) Correction of Work:

A. The Contractor shall promptly remove from the premises all Work rejected by the Administrator or Owner for failure to comply with the Contract Documents, whether incorporated in the construction or not, and the Contractor shall promptly replace and re-execute the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents and without expense to the Owner and shall bear the expense of making good all Work of other Contractors destroyed or damaged by such removal or replacement.

B. All removal and replacement Work shall be done at the Contractor's expense. If the Contractor does not take action to remove and repair such rejected Work within ten (10) days after receipt of Written Notice, the Owner may remove and repair such Work at the expense of the Contractor.

(11) <u>Suspension of Work, Termination and Delay</u>:

- A. The Owner may suspend the Work or any portion thereof for a period of not more than ninety days or such further time as agreed upon by the Contractor, by Written Notice to the Contractor, which notice shall fix the date on which Work shall be resumed. The Contractor will resume that Work on the date so fixed. The Contractor will be allowed an increase in the Contract Price or an extension of the Contract Time, or both, directly attributable to any suspension.
- If the Contractor is adjudged as bankrupt or insolvent, or if he makes a В. general assignment for the benefit of his creditors, or if a trustee or receiver is appointed for the Contractor or for any of his property, or if he files a petition to take advantage of any debtor's act, or to reorganize under the bankruptcy or applicable laws, or if he repeatedly fails to supply sufficient skilled workmen or suitable materials or equipment, or if he repeatedly fails to make prompt payments to Subcontractors or for labor, materials or equipment or if he disregards laws, ordinances, rules, regulations or orders of any public body having jurisdiction of the Work or if he disregards the authority of the Owner or City, or if the work does not pass inspection by the Project Inspector, or if he otherwise violates any provision of the Contract Documents, then the City may, without prejudice to any other right or remedy and after giving the Contractor and his surety a minimum of ten (10) days from delivery of a Written Notice, terminate the services of the Contractor and take possession of the Project and of all materials, and finish the Work by whatever method he may deem expedient. In such case the Contractor shall not be entitled to receive any further payment until the Work is finished. If the unpaid balance of the Contract Price exceeds the direct and indirect costs of completing the Project, including compensation for indirect costs of completing the project, including compensation for additional professional services, such excess shall be paid to the Contractor. If such costs exceed such unpaid balance, the Contractor will pay the difference to the Owner or City. Such costs incurred by the Owner or City will be determined by the Project Administrator and incorporated in a change order.
- C. Where the Contractor's services have been so terminated by the Owner or City, said termination shall not affect any right of the Owner or City against the Contractor then existing or which may thereafter accrue. Any retention or payment of moneys by the City due the Contractor will not release the Contractor from compliance with the Contract Documents, such as guarantees, workmanship, etc.

- D. After ten (10) days from delivery of a Written Notice to the Contractor, the Owner may, without cause and without prejudice to any other right or remedy, elect to abandon the Project and terminate the Contract. In such case, the Contractor shall be paid for all Work executed and any expense sustained plus reasonable profit.
- If, through no act or fault of the Contractor, the Work is suspended for a E. period of more than ninety (90) days by the City or under an order of court or other public authority, or the City fails to act on any request for payment within thirty (30) days after it is submitted, or the City fails to pay the sum awarded by arbitrators within thirty (30) days of its approval and presentation, then the Contractor may, after ten (10) days from delivery of Written Notice to the Owner and City, terminate the Contract and recover from the City payment for all Work executed and expenses sustained. In addition and in lieu of terminating the Contract, if the City has failed to act on a request for payment or if the City has failed to make any payment as aforesaid, the Contractor may upon ten (10) days Written Notice to the Owner and City, stop the Work until he has been paid all amounts then due, in which event and upon resumption of the Work, Change Orders shall be issued for adjusting the Contract Price or extending the Contract Time or both to compensate for the costs and delays attributable to stoppage of the Work.
- F. If the performance of all or any portion of the Work is suspended, delayed, or interrupted as a result of a failure of the Owner or Administrator to act within the time specified in the Contract Documents, or if no time is specified, within a reasonable time, an adjustment in the Contract Price or an extension of the Contract Time, or both, shall be made by Change Order to compensate the Contractor for the costs and delays necessarily caused by the failure of the Owner or Administrator.

(12) <u>Payments to Contractor</u>:

- A. Request for funds will be submitted to the Administrator. The Contractor will submit to the Administrator an invoice for the work performed, in addition to lien waivers covering all supplies, labor, and/or subcontractors used during the project period. The City will only pay for completion of tasks.
- B. Upon completion and acceptance of the Work, the Project Inspector shall issue a certificate attached to the final payment request that the Work has been accepted by him under the conditions of the Contract Documents. The entire balance found to be due the Contractor, excluding the lead clearance retainage, and except such sums as may be lawfully retained by the City, shall be paid to the Contractor within thirty (30) days of completion and acceptance of the Work, if the Contractor has provided all required lien releases.

C. The Contractor hereby indemnifies and saves the Owner, the Owner's agents, the City, the City's agents, and Administrator, harmless from all claims growing out of the lawful demands of subcontractors, laborers, workmen, mechanics, material suppliers, and supplies incurred in the furtherance of the performance of the Work. The Contractor shall, at the Owner's, City's, or Administrator's request, furnish satisfactory evidence that all obligations of the nature designated above have been paid, discharged, or waived. If the Contractor fails to do so, the City may, after having notified the Contractor, either pay unpaid bills or withhold from the Contractor's unpaid compensation a sum of money deemed reasonably sufficient to pay all such lawful claims until satisfactory evidence is furnished that all liabilities have been fully discharged, whereupon payment to the Contractor shall be resumed, in accordance with the terms of the Contract Documents, but in no event shall the provisions of this sentence be construed to impose any obligations upon the Owner or City to either the Contractor, his surety, or any third party. In paying any unpaid bills of the Contractor, any payment so made by the City or Owner shall be considered as a payment made under the Contract Documents by the City or Owner to the Contractor, and the City or Owner shall not be liable to the Contractor for any such payments made in good faith.

(13) Owner's Rights

- A. Prior to Substantial Completion, the Owner, with the approval of the Contractor, may use any completed or substantially completed portions of the Work. Such use shall not constitute an acceptance of such portions of the Work.
- B. The Owner shall have the right to enter the premises for the purpose of doing work not covered by the Contract Documents. This provision shall not be construed as relieving the Contractor of the sole responsibility for the care and protection of the Work, or the restoration of any damaged Work except such as may be caused by the Owner, agents or employees of the Owner.

(14) <u>Acceptance of Final Payment as Release</u>:

The acceptance by the Contractor of final payment shall be and shall operate as a release to the Owner and City of all claims and all liability to the Contractor other than claims in stated amounts as may be specifically excepted by the Contractor for all things done or furnished in connection with this Work and others relating to or arising out of this Work. Any payment, however, final or otherwise, shall not release the Contractor or his sureties from any obligations under the Contract Documents.

(15) Changes in Work:

The Owner or Project Inspector may at any time, as the need arises, order changes within the scope of the Work without invalidating the Agreement. If such

changes increase or decrease the amount due under the Contract Documents, or in the time required for performance of the Work, an equitable adjustment shall be authorized by Change Order. The Contractor shall proceed with the performance of any changes in the Work so ordered by the Owner or Project Inspector. The Contractor shall comply with all orders issued by the Owner or Project Inspector in relation to carrying out the rehabilitation.

(16) Changes in Contract Price

The Contract Price may be changed only by a Change Order. The value of any Work covered by a Change Order or of any claim for increase or decrease in the Contract Price shall be determined by an agreed lump sum price only.

(17) <u>Time for Completion and Liquidated Damages</u>:

- A. The date of beginning and the time for completion of the Work are essential conditions of the Contract Documents and the Work embraced shall be commenced on a date specified in the Notice to Proceed.
- B. The Contractor will proceed with the Work at such rate of progress to insure full completion within the Contract Time. It is expressly understood and agreed, by and between the Contractor and the Owner, that the Contract Time for the completion of the Work described herein is a reasonable time, taking into consideration the average climatic and economic conditions and other factors prevailing in the locality of the Work.
- C. If the Contractor shall fail to complete the Work within the Contract Time or extension of time granted by the Owner, then the Contractor may be required to pay to the City the amount of \$100/day for liquidated damage for each calendar day that the Contractor shall be in default after the time stipulated in the Contract Documents.
- D. The Contractor shall not be charged with liquidated damages or any excess cost when the delay in completion of the Work is due to the following, and the Contractor has promptly given Written Notice of such delay to the Owner and Administrator.
 - 1. To any preference, priority or allocation order duly issued by the Owner.
 - 2. To unforeseeable causes beyond the control and without the fault or negligence of the Contractor, including but not restricted to, acts of God, or of the public enemy, acts of the Owner, acts of another Contractor in the performance of a contract with the Owner, fires, floods, epidemics, quarantine restrictions, strikes, freight embargoes, and adverse weather conditions; and

3. To any delays of Subcontractors occasioned by any of the causes specified in paragraphs 17 D.1. and 17 D.2. of this article.

(18) Equal Opportunity

During the performance of this contract, the Contractor agrees as follows:

- A. The Contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, religious affiliation, sex, handicap, or national origin. The Contractor will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment, without regard to their race, color, religion, religious affiliation, sex, age, handicap or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: Employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided by the Administrator setting forth the provisions of this non-discrimination clause.
- B. The Contractor will, in all solicitation or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, religious affiliation, sex, handicap, or national origin.
- C. The Contractor will cause the foregoing provisions to be inserted in all subcontracts for any work covered by this contract so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor, provided that the foregoing provisions shall not apply to contracts or subcontracts for standard commercial supplies or raw materials.
- D. The Contractor will comply with all provisions of Executive Order 11246, as amended by Executive Order 12086 and the regulations issued pursuant thereto, and of the rules, regulations and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor.
- E. The Contractor will furnish all information and reports required by Executive Order 11246, as amended by Executive Order 12086, and by the rules, regulations and orders of the Secretary of Labor, or pursuant thereto, and will permit access to his books, records, and accounts by the Owner and the Secretary of Labor for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with such rules, regulations and orders.
- F. In the event of the Contractors non-compliance with the non-compliance clause of this Agreement or with any of such rules, regulations or orders, this Agreement may be canceled, terminated, or suspended in whole or in part and the

Contractor may be declared ineligible for further Government contracts in accordance with procedures authorized in Executive Order 11246, as amended by Executive Order 12086, and such other sanctions may be imposed and remedies invoked as provided in Executive Order 11246, as amended by Executive Order 12086, or by rule, regulation, or order of the Secretary of Labor, or as otherwise provided by law.

G. The Contractor will include the provisions of paragraphs (a) through (g) in every subcontract unless exempted by rules, regulations or orders of the Secretary of Labor issued pursuant to Section 204 of Executive Order 11246, as amended by Executive Order 12086, so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor. The Contractor will take such action with respect to any subcontract as the Owner may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions including sanctions for non-compliance: Provided, however, that in the event the Contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subcontractor as a result of such direction by the Owner, the Contractor may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

Civil Rights Act of 1964

Under Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, no person shall, on the grounds of race, color, sex, religion, religious affiliation, handicap, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance.

Section 109 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974

No person in the United States shall on the ground of race, color, sex, religion, religious affiliation, handicap, or national origin be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity funded in whole or in part with funds made available under this title.

"Section 3" Compliance in the Provision of Training, Employment and Business Opportunities

A. The work to be performed under this contract is on a project assisted under a program providing direct Housing and Urban Development and is subject to the requirements of Section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, as amended, 12 U.S.C. 1701u. Section 3 requires that to the greatest extent feasible opportunities for training and employment be given lower income residents of the project area and contracts for work in connection with the project be awarded to business concerns which are located in, or owned in substantial part by persons residing in the area of the project.

- B. The parties to this contract will comply with the provisions of said Section 3 and the regulations issued pursuant thereto by the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development set forth in 24 CFR 135, and all applicable rules and orders of the Department issued thereunder prior to the execution of this contract. The parties to this contract certify and agree that they are under no contractual or other disability which would prevent them from complying with these requirements.
- C. The Contractor will send to each labor organizations or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, if any, a notice advising the said labor organization or workers' representative of his commitments under this Section 3 clause and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment or training.
- D. The Contractor will include this Section 3 clause in every subcontract for work in connection with the project and will, at the direction of the applicant for or recipient of Federal financial assistance, take appropriate action pursuant to the subcontract upon a finding that the subcontractor is in violation of regulations issued by the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development, 24 CFR Part 135. The Contractor will not subcontract with any subcontractor where it has notice or knowledge that the latter has been found in violation of regulations under 24 CFR Part 135 and will not let any subcontract unless the subcontractor has first provided it with a preliminary statement of ability to comply with the requirements of these regulations.
- E. Compliance with the provisions of Section 3, the regulations set forth in 24 CFR Part 135, and all applicable rules and orders of the Department issued hereunder prior to the execution of the contract, shall be a condition of the federal financial assistance provided to the project, binding upon the applicant or recipient for such assistance, its successors and assigns. Failure to fulfill these requirements shall subject the applicant or recipient, its contractors and subcontractors, its successors and assigns to those sanctions specified by the grant or loan agreement or contract through which federal assistance is provided, and to such sanctions as are specified by 24 CFR Part 135.

No member of the governing body of the locality and no other public official of such locality, who exercises any functions or responsibilities in connection with the planning and carrying out of this program, shall have any personal financial interest, direct or indirect, in this Contract; and the Contractor shall take appropriate steps to assure compliance.

The Contractor covenants that it presently has no interest and shall not acquire interest, direct or indirect, in the study area or any parcels therein or any other interest which would conflict in any manner or degree with the performance of services hereunder. The Contractor further covenants that in the performance of this Contract, no person having any such interest shall be employed.

(19) <u>Section 503 of Rehabilitation Act of 1973,</u> as amended, provides for nondiscrimination in contractor employment. All recipients of Federal funds must certify to the following in all contracts issued:

Affirmative Action for Handicapped Workers

- (a) The contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of physical or mental handicap in regard to any position for which the employee or applicant for employment is qualified. The contractor agrees to take affirmative action to employ, advance in employment and otherwise treat qualified handicapped individuals without discrimination based upon their physical or mental handicap in all employment practices such as the following: Employment upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment, advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation, and selection for training, including apprenticeship.

Section 3 requires that to the greatest extent feasible, opportunities for training and employment be given lower income residents of the project area and contracts for work in connection with the project be awarded to business concerns which are located in, or owned in substantial part by persons residing in, the area of the project.
 - B. The parties to this contract will comply with the provisions of said Section 3 and the regulations issued pursuant thereto by the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development and all applicable rules and orders of the Department issued thereunder prior to the execution of this contract. The parties to this contract certify and agree that they are under no contractual or other disability which would prevent them from complying with these requirements.
- (23) Special Conditions Pertaining To Hazards Safety Standards

Lead-Based Paint Hazards

The construction or rehabilitation of residential structures are subject to the HUD Lead-Based Paint regulations, 24 CFR Part 35. The contractor and subcontractor shall comply with the provisions for the elimination of lead-base paint hazards under sub-part B of said regulations. The Administrator will be responsible for the inspections and certifications required under Section 35.14 (f) thereof. The use of lead-based paint is expressly prohibited.

Lead Clearance

A. Contractor is responsible for all construction and clean-up costs needed to obtain lead clearance.

B. The City will pay costs of initial lead clearance lab fees. If the lead clearance test fails, it will be the Contractors responsibility to pay for all subsequent lab fees until clearance is received.

II. The Owner shall:

- (1) Be the only contact in negotiating items of this contract, unless agreed upon by all parties of the contract.
- (2) Permit the Contractor to use at no cost existing utilities such as light, heat, power, and water necessary to the carrying out and completion of work.

If defects are observed by the Owner during the one year guarantee period, the Owner must give written notice to the Contractor (copy to Administrator) of observed defects with reasonable promptness.
- (6) Abide by the terms of this contract and allow the rehabilitation to be carried out in accordance with city codes and federal regulations.

III. General Provisions:

- (1) This contract embodies all the representatives, rights, duties, and obligations of the parties, and any prior oral or written agreement not embodied herein shall not be binding upon or endure to the benefit of any of the parties.
- (2) The Contractor agrees to perform the Work required by this contract, and the Owner agrees that neither he/she nor the members of his/her family, tenants, agents, or employees will hinder the Contractor in his Work or the Project Inspector in carrying out project requirements and city codes and policies.
- (3) No member, officer, or employee of the Grantee, or its designees or agents, no member of the Governing Body of the locality in which the program is situated, and no other public official of such locality or localities who exercises any

functions or responsibilities with respect to the program during his tenure or for one year thereafter, shall have any interest, direct or indirect, in any contract or subcontract, or the proceeds thereof, for work to be performed in connection with the program assisted under the Agreement.

EXHIBIT A

EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT

This employment agreement entered into this 10th day of January 2023, is between the City of Salem, Missouri, a duly organized municipal corporation, hereinafter referred to as "City", and Sally Burbridge, hereinafter referred to as "Administrator".

WHEREAS the City has created by ordinance the position of City Administrator of the City of Salem, Missouri, and desires to employ Administrator in said position in accordance with the Code of Ordinances of the City of Salem and the terms and conditions as set forth herein, the City and Administrator hereby agree to the following:

1. **Employment**

The City hereby employs Administrator, and the Administrator hereby accepts such employment subject to and in accordance with the Code of Ordinances of the City of Salem, specifically referencing but not limited to Chapter 106 (Code of Ethics for Public Officials), Chapter 115 (City Officials), and Chapter 120 (Administration), and the terms and conditions as set forth herein in this employment agreement.

2. Duties

The Administrator shall perform the duties delegated to the City Administrator described within the City Ordinances. The Administrator shall oversee the operations of the City and have full authority and responsibility, subject to the directions and control of the Board of Aldermen, for assisting in the formulation of policies and for implementing such policies as established by the City, and all duties as referred within the City Administrator job description approved in the Code of Ordinances of the City of Salem. The Administrator shall accept no outside employment that will interfere with the performance of her duties as City Administrator. In this regard it is the City's intention that the Administrator devotes her full attention towards the fulfillment of the Administrator's obligations under this agreement.

3. <u>Term of Employment:</u>

The initial term of this agreement shall be for the period commencing on January 10, 2023, and shall expire on December 31st, 2027. In accordance with§ 115.540 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Salem, the person appointed to the position of City Administrator "shall serve for an indefinite period of time". Therefore, this employment agreement shall be renewed automatically on January 1st of each subsequent year unless cancelled as set forth herein or the Administrator is removed in accordance with§ 115.570 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Salem. Each subsequent renewal of this employment agreement shall be under the same terms and conditions as set forth herein and shall be for a term commencing on January 1st and expiring on December 31st of the same year.

Nothing in this agreement shall be construed to prevent, limit, or otherwise interfere with the right of the City to non-renew the employment of the Administrator at the expiration of the term, or to terminate the services of the Administrator at any time, with or without cause, or with the right of the Administrator to resign from her position as Administrator of the City at any time. Any termination of this agreement in accordance with § 115.570 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Salem will be effective immediately, unless otherwise agreed to by both the City and Administrator in writing and signed by both parties.

4. Termination and Severance Pay:

- a. In the event the City terminates this agreement on or before the expiration of the initial term of this agreement, or before the expiration of a subsequent renewal of this agreement, or fails to renew the employment of the Administrator at the expirations of the term, notwithstanding the Administrator's willingness to continue performing such services for the City, the City shall pay as severance pay a lump sum cash payment equal to the total of four (4) months' aggregate salary, accrued personal leave time, and all other benefits available to employees of the City of Salem upon termination, and shall for a period of four (4) months following such termination continue to underwrite the Administrator's health care plan to the same extent as prevailed immediately prior to such termination; provided, that should the Administrator be terminated for any violation of Chapter 106 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Salem, the commission of any crime involving moral turpitude, veracity, honesty or personal gain, or a felony offense, or engage in misconduct in the performance of her official duties, the City shall have no obligation to pay any such severance pay.
- b. Except as otherwise agreed by the parties, the Administrator shall give the City (30) days' written notice of any voluntary resignation from employment hereunder. In the event of such voluntary resignation and subject to paragraph "c' below, the provisions of paragraph 'a" above shall not apply and this contract shall expire on the effective date of such resignation.
- c. If at any time during the term of this agreement:
 - A majority of the Board of Aldermen votes to terminate Administrator at a duly authorized public meeting for any reason other than commission of any crime involving moral turpitude, veracity, honesty or personal gain, or a felony offense, or engage in misconduct in the performance of her official duties, when Administrator is ready, willing, and able to perform the duties of Administrator;
 - 2) The City reduces base salary, compensation, or other financial benefits applicable to Administrator, unless such reduction applies no greater percentage than the average reduction of all department heads of the City:
 - 3) The Administrator resigns following an offer to accept resignation, whether formal or informal, by an Alderman as representative of the majority of the Board of Aldermen at any time the Administrator is ready, willing, and able to perform the duties of City Administrator;
 - THEN, in such events, the Administrator may at her election deem her employment hereunder to have been terminated within the meaning of paragraph "a" of this section and, the City shall forthwith make payments and provide the benefits required under such paragraph "a".
 - d. In the event either party shall decide that they do not desire to renew this contract at the conclusion of its term, said party desirous of non-renewal shall give the other party 30 days' notice of said intent. Otherwise, both parties shall negotiate in good faith for renewal of this contract upon terms agreed upon by the parties hereto.

5. <u>Disability:</u>

If the Administrator becomes permanently disabled or is otherwise unable to perform her duties because of sickness, accident, injury, mental incapacity or health for a period of thirty (30) successive days beyond any accrued sick leave, or for twenty (20) business days over a thirty (30) day period after exhaustion of accrued sick leave, the City shall have the option to terminate this agreement, consistent with all applicable federal and state laws pertaining to required leave, disabilities and accommodations. Provided, in any such event the Administrator shall be compensated for any accrued and compensable sick leave, personal leave time, holidays, and other accrued benefits, but Administrator shall not be entitled to any severance pay or further compensation under section 4 of this agreement.

6. Salary:

The City shall pay to the Administrator as compensation for her services hereunder an annual base salary of **\$80,000.00** payable in installments at such intervals as other City employees are paid. During the initial term and any subsequent renewal term of this agreement, the Administrator shall receive an annual cost of living increase, which shall be an identical increase as the other city employees receive during each fiscal year. During any automatic subsequent renewal of this agreement, the Administrator's base salary shall be adjusted to account for any annual cost of living increase previously earned under this agreement.

7. Other Monetary Benefits:

- a. **Vehicle allowance.** The City shall provide the Administrator with a monthly vehicle allowance in the amount of **\$300.00** in lieu of a City vehicle for use for City business and to and from Administrator's residence, and Administrator shall be responsible for the maintenance and insurance thereof.
 - 1. The City Administrator shall maintain insurance coverage in an amount of not less than \$1,000,000 in coverage per occurrence and shall list the City of Salem as an additional insured on such policy with a copy of the Certificate of Insurance stating such current coverage, on file with the City Clerk's office.
 - 2. The City Administrator, by agreeing to provide full coverage insurance on her personal vehicle for City use, as stated above, agrees to indemnify the City of Salem for losses that the City Administrator may incur as the result of accident or property damage.
- b. **Deferred compensation.** The City has a deferred compensation program thru LAGERS available for participation by Administrator.
- c. **Health Insurance.** The City shall provide hospitalization, surgical, and comprehensive medical insurance for the Administrator, as provided to all City employees with the same deductibles and copays.
- d. **Merit Increases.** The Administrator may also be entitled to a merit increase in salary as determined by the Board of Aldermen pursuant to their review in December of each year.

8. Leave and other benefits:

a. Upon the commencement date of the contract term the Administrator shall have the paid vacation leave time currently accrued through employment with the City and shall be entitled to such other additional paid leave earned during her employment.

- b. Group insurance and all other benefits provided to other City employees shall be made available to the Administrator on like terms and conditions.
- c. In addition to any deferred compensation payment made pursuant to Section 8 b. of this agreement, the Administrator may elect to allocate any part of her total compensation to a retirement, deferred compensation, or similar program of her choice.

9. <u>Professional Development:</u>

- a. The City shall budget for and pay the professional dues and subscriptions incurred by the Administrator for her participation in such national, regional, state, and local associations or organizations as the Administrator deems necessary, subject to the approval of the Board of Aldermen.
- b. The City shall budget for and pay the travel and subsistence expenses incurred by the Administrator during her attendance at or participation in such meetings, conferences, or other functions as he deems necessary to adequately discharge official and ceremonial functions on behalf of the City.
- c. The City shall budget for and pay the travel and subsistence expenses incurred by the Administrator for short courses, seminars, and institutes which he deems necessary for her professional development and are in the best interests of the City, subject to the approval of the Board of Aldermen.

10. Other terms and conditions of employment:

- a. In addition to benefits specifically enumerated in this agreement, all policies and procedures of the City relating to personal leave time (1.54 hrs/wk), administrative time (1.54 hrs/wk) and sick leave (1.85 hrs/wk), retirement and pension system contributions (mandatory 4%), holidays (13) and other benefits and working conditions, as they now exist or may hereafter be amended, shall apply to the Administrator in the same way as to other employees of the City.
- b. The City, in consultation with the Administrator, may fix any such other terms and conditions of employment relating to performance of the Administrator as it deems appropriate for time; provided, that such terms and conditions are not inconsistent with or in conflict with the express provisions of this agreement, City policies and procedures or any other law or regulation. No such additional terms or conditions shall be effective unless first reduced to writing and furnished to the Administrator as mutually agreed by the Administrator and the City.

11. <u>Performance evaluation:</u>

The Board of Aldermen shall review and evaluate the performance of the Administrator annually in November of each year, based upon the performance goals established by the Board in consultation with the Administrator, and may evaluate such performance more frequently, if determined necessary by the Board of Aldermen or requested by the Administrator. The President of the Board of Aldermen and the Administrator shall meet prior to any findings to discuss the Administrator's self-evaluation of the prior year. The President of the Board of Aldermen shall furnish to the Administrator a written summary of the findings of the Board and shall afford the Administrator an adequate opportunity to discuss such findings and evaluations with the Board.

12. Bond:

The City shall bear the full cost of any fidelity or other bonds required of the Administrator.

13. **Special Provisions:**

The City of Salem shall bear the costs of providing a cell phone to the Administrator during the term of this contract.

14. General Provisions:

- a. The text herein shall constitute the entire agreement between the parties. Any modification of this agreement shall be in writing and signed by both parties.
- b. Other than those provisions relating to the Administrator's obligations to serve as the City Administrator, this agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the heirs and executors of the Administrator.
- c. Except as expressly provided herein, neither party shall assign rights or delegate duties arising from this agreement without first obtaining the express written consent of the other.
- d. This agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Missouri. If any provision or portion of this agreement shall be determined to be unconstitutional, invalid, unenforceable, or unlawful, that provision shall be severed from this agreement and the remainder of this agreement shall not be affected and shall remain in full force and effect.
- e. In implementing any provision of this section, the parties agree to abide by all applicable law.

To the above and foregoing terms and conditions, the parties execute this agreement on the day and date above written.
