The City of Santa Fe Springs Welcomes René Bobadilla as City Manager

A fter an extensive search process, the Santa Fe Springs City Council proudly announced the selection of Mr. René Bobadilla as its new City Manager. This announcement is pending the approval of his employment agreement scheduled for July 18, 2023. When approved, Mr. Bobadilla will commence his service on July 19, 2023.

Mr. Bobadilla has served over 28 years in local government with nearly 12 years of service as a City Manager. He brings a wealth of experience and strong commitment to public service, making him an excellent fit for the City's chief executive role.

Mr. Bobadilla's extensive background in local government led him to oversee several City organizations where he has held the position of City Manager, most recently, the City of Montebello since July of 2019, Pico Rivera from 2014 to 2018, Huntington Park from 2012 to 2014, and El Monte from 2009 to 2012. As a City Manager, Mr. Bobadilla has been recognized and acknowledged for his ethical and moral decisions, ability to harness enthusiasm and talents of others, identify core issues, and exploit the necessary resources available to stretch funds and achieve management objectives within municipal environments.

One of his most notable achievements was restoring the City of Montebello's financial position from the verge of bankruptcy. Though his leadership, the City recovered and increased its General Fund Reserve by over \$30 million. His successes included rapid improvements to the City's infrastructure, attracting many new national retailers and numerous successful economic development projects, developed a state awarded homeless program, made substantial updates to City planning policies and processes, and made improvements in public engagement and communication.

Prior to his role as a City Manager, Mr. Bobadilla served in various executive roles, where he demonstrated the ability to strengthen core municipal services through improvements in the delivery of responsive services to customers. He served as the Director of Economic Development and



Sustainability for the City of Commerce and prior to serving as the City Manager of El Monte, he was the Director of Public Works, where he managed large capital projects.

Mr. Bobadilla is also a registered civil engineer. From 1994 to 2009 he worked in both private



and public capacities directly related to engineering and management. He continues to use his extensive engineering experience to improve public infrastructure, economic development and municipal operations. He holds a Master of Public Administration from Villanova University and a Bachelor of Science in Civil Engineering from California State Polytechnic University.

Mr. Bobadilla expressed his excitement about joining the City of Santa Fe Springs and his commitment to upholding the City's values of transparency, accountability, and community collaboration. He stated, "Santa Fe Springs is such a special place and I am so honored to be selected City Manager. I am excited to support such a dedicated City Council Team and lead the City staff as we implement the Council's vision and goals for the community. I commit to taking the time to listen to our local residents and build a strong relationship with the entire community."

The City of Santa Fe Springs looks forward to the positive impact Mr. Bobadilla will have on the City and its residents. His appointment marks an important milestone in the City's ongoing commitment to ensuring efficient, responsive and outstanding services.


The photo contest begins on September 1st and will end

Since photos may fall into more than one category, it is important to note that each photo may only be submitted to a single category, and only one submission per individual will be accepted. The top entry from each category will receive a monetary prize of \$125, a feature in a future "All Things Santa Fe Springs" guide, a mention on the City's social media channels, and be displayed at the City Library and the 2024 Santa Fe Springs Art Fest. To be featured on promotional materials, it is important that you take a high-resolution photograph. Family & Youth Intervention Program

The Family and Youth Intervention Team understands that parent involvement is the key to behavior change among behaviorally challenged adolescents. The Parent Project is a parent training program designed for parents experiencing behavioral challenges with their adolescent(s). Throughout the program, parents will be introduced to discussion topics which include reducing family conflict and arguing, improving school performance and attendance, identifying and intervening with alcohol and other drug abuse, interceding with negative peer associations (including inappropriate dating relationships up to and including gang involvement) and helping parents to set effective applicable limits.

Many parents attending the Parent Project have experienced difficulty in identifying appropriate limits and enforcing consequences consistently. Those who attend the Parent Project are more likely to see their child's attendance at school improve, and to require less school based disciplinary resources as parents find powerful interventions at home which help bring about positive change in their children.

The motto of the Parent Project is *"Parents are the answer... when they have the tools they need."* This program is presented three times per year.
