13. Resolution No. 9116 – Public Hearing for City of Santa Fe Springs Lighting District No. 1 (FY 2008/2009)

B. <u>Resolution No. 9111 – Declaring Intention to Levy Annual Assessments Heritage Springs Assessment District No. 2001-01 (Hawkins Street and Palm Drive)</u>

Recommendation: That the City Council adopt Resolution No. 9111 declaring its intention to levy annual assessments and setting the public hearing for the Council meeting of July 10, 2008.

C. Resolution No. 9114 - Request for Parking Restriction on Greenstone Avenue

Recommendation: That the City Council adopt Resolution No. 9114, which would prohibit the parking of vehicles weighing over 6,000 pounds on the east side of Greenstone Avenue beginning at a point 1,135 feet north of the centerline of Sunshine Avenue to a point 1,308 feet north of the centerline of Sunshine Avenue and implement a tow-away zone for vehicles that violate the restriction.

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D. <u>Resolution No. 9115 - Request for Parking Restriction on Rosecrans Avenue and Stage Road</u>

Recommendation: That the City Council adopt Resolution No. 9115, which would prohibit the parking of vehicles weighing over 6,000 pounds on the south side of Rosecrans Avenue beginning at a point 200 feet west of the centerline of Iseli Road to a point 360 feet west of the centerline of Iseli Road and on the north side of Stage Road beginning at a point 170 feet west of the centerline of Iseli Road to a point 365 feet west of the centerline of Iseli Road and implement a tow-away zone for vehicles that violate the restriction.

E. <u>Resolution No. 9118 Authorizing Execution of TCIF Baseline Agreement for the Valley View Avenue Grade Separation Project</u>

Recommendation: That the City Council adopt Resolution No. 9118 authorizing the execution of a Project Baseline Agreement for the ACE: Gateway – Valley View Grade Separation Project.

F. <u>Traffic Signal - Florence Avenue at Roseton and Associated Florence Avenue Corridor Improvements</u>
