JUNE 13, 2013

1. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Pro Tem Trujillo called the meetings to order at 4:48 p.m.

3. Introduction and Discussion of City's Proposed FY 2013-14 Budget

Recommendation: That the City Council provide staff with direction regarding revenue and expenditure matters included in the FY 2013-14 Proposed Budget.

The City Manager opened the Budget Study Session by stating that the City's fiscal situation looked optimistic which was different from many other surrounding cities that did not take the prudent actions taken by this City Council last year. The City's economy is growing slowly, but steadily. He proceeded to outline the Council priorities and present the Proposed Budget.

Jose Gomez further explained the budget fundamentals.

Councilmember Rounds asked if the batting cages would remain closed. The City Manager stated that the Department of Community Services plans to issue an RFP for the operation of the batting cages.

Mayor Pro Tem Trujillo asked if the Supervisor positions in the Department of Community Services would be realigned so that they were all at the same salary level. The City Manager stated that the salaries would all be at the same salary level.

Councilmember Rounds asked why there was such a big increase in the Fiestas Patrias budget. The City Manager stated that the budget reflects a more accurate picture of actual labor. Councilmember Rounds added that it was refreshing to have a little surplus in the budget and thanked everyone who worked on the budget.

Mayor Pro Tem Trujillo stated that this is the first year that she has been on the Council that cuts did not have to be made. She thanked staff for their work on the budget.

Councilmember González stated that he was glad that the budget was balanced, but was sorry for the loss of employees. He also stated his concern over the \$9 million that the State still owes the City. Councilmember González requested the budgets for the various City Committees. The City Manager will provide this information to the Council. Councilmember González thanked everyone for their hard work on the budget.

Mayor Pro Tem Trujillo recessed the meetings at 5:46 p.m.

8. <u>National Pollutant Discharge Elimination Systems (NPDES) – Draft Ordinance No. 1045</u> <u>Amending Chapter 52: Storm Water Runoff</u>

Recommendation: That the City Council receive and file the draft of Ordinance No. 1045 amending Chapter 52: Storm Water Runoff of the Santa Fe Springs Municipal Code to expand the applicability of the existing Standard Urban Stormwater Mitigation Plan (SUSMP) requirements by Imposing Low Impact Development (LID) strategies on projects that require building permits and/or encroachment permits and direct staff to return with a final Ordinance No. 1045 in October 2013 for Council approval.

The City Attorney stated that it was necessary to present this item as a receive and file report due to the fact that the report must be initiated by June 2013 and adopted by October 2013.

Noe Negrete gave a presentation on the NPDES Storm Water Permit. Cities are no longer allowed to connect their drainage systems to storm drains that drain to ocean. Cities are now required to develop "percolating" systems. Santa Fe Springs is working with other cities to come up with a final ordinance. This will result in higher costs for developers as well as the City.

Councilmember González stated that this is another example of the State or Federal government giving cities mandates without any funding.

Councilmember González moved the approval of Item 8; Councilmember Rounds seconded the motion which passed unanimously.

9. Authorize the Disposal of Surplus Vehicles & Equipment by Way of Public Auction Recommendation: That the City Council authorize the disposal of four (4) surplus vehicles, one (1) walk behind roller, and (1) emergency generator and authorize the City Manager or his designee to proceed with the disposal of the vehicles & equipment at public auction. RESOLUTION NO. 9412

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE SPRINGS, CALIFORNIA, CALLING FOR THE HOLDING OF A GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 5, 2013, FOR THE ELECTION OF CERTAIN OFFICERS AS REQUIRED BY THE PROVISIONS OF THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA RELATING TO GENERAL LAW CITIES, AND FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE VOTERS A QUESTION RELATING TO THE AMOUNT OF THE OIL BARREL TAX.

WHEREAS, under the provisions of the laws relating to general law cities in the State of California, a General Municipal Election shall be held on Tuesday, November 5, 2013, for the election of Municipal Officers; and

WHEREAS, the City Council also desires to submit to the voters at the election a question relating to the amount of the oil barrel tax.

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE SPRINGS, CALIFORNIA, DOES RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Pursuant to the requirements of the laws of the State of California relating to general law cities, there is called and ordered to be held in the City of Santa Fe Springs, California, on Tuesday, November 5, 2013, a regular General Municipal Election for the purpose of electing three members of the City Council, each to hold office for a term of four years.

Section 2. That the City Council, pursuant to its right and authority, does order submitted to the voters at the General Municipal Election the following question:

Shall Ordinance No. 1044, which would increase the oil barrel tax	YES
charged to operators of oil wells in the City from \$.20 per barrel to an amount ranging from a minimum of \$.41 to a maximum of \$.52 per barrel, be adopted?	NO

<u>Section 3.</u> That the proposed complete text of the measure submitted to the voters is attached hereto as Exhibit "A".

<u>Section 4.</u> The form and content of the ballots to be used at this election will be as required by law.

<u>Section 5.</u> The Deputy City Clerk is authorized and directed to procure and furnish, through the County of Los Angeles Registrar/Recorder/County Clerk, all official ballots, notices, printed matter, supplies, equipment, and paraphernalia that may be necessary in order to properly and lawfully conduct the election.

Section 6. The polls for the election will be open at seven o'clock a.m. on the day of the election and will remain open continuously from that time until eight o'clock p.m. of the same day when the polls will be closed, pursuant to Election Code §10242, except as provided in §14401 of the Elections Code of the State of California.

<u>Section 7.</u> In all particulars not recited in this Resolution, the election will be held and conducted as provided by law for the holding of General Municipal Elections.

<u>Section 8.</u> Notice of time and place of holding the election is given by this Resolution, and the Deputy City Clerk is authorized and directed to give such further or additional notice of the election as may be required by law.

<u>Section 9.</u> The Deputy City Clerk is directed to certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution and will enter it in the book of original Resolutions.

ORDINANCE NO. 1044

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE SPRINGS, CALIFORNIA, INCREASING THE CITY'S OIL BARREL TAX

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE SPRINGS, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The second sentence of subsection (B) of Section 117.022 of the Santa Fe Springs City Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

"In addition thereto, payable quarterly within 30 days after the close of each calendar quarter, an amount shall be paid for each barrel of oil or petroleum products production from such well during said calendar quarter, which amount shall be calculated as described in subsection (C), below, and which amount shall be not less than \$.41 per barrel, and not more than \$.52 per barrel."

In all other respects, said subsection (B) shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.

SECTION 2. The following language is hereby added to Section 117.022 of the Santa Fe Springs City Code, as subsection (C):

"The amount paid per barrel as set forth is subsection (B), above, shall be calculated as follows by utilizing the average price paid for Buena Vista Hills crude oil (BV):

The average price for BV will be determined by calculating the average price paid for each quarter from the available posted prices for the field (for example Chevron http://crudemarketing.chevron.com/crude/north_american/california.aspx). If more than one poster is available then the average price for each poster will be determined first for the calendar quarter and then the average of multiple posters will be calculated to determine the final average price. There will be no API adjustment of pricing for BV used in such calculation.

The following table displays the tax rate to be paid for each barrel, based on the BV average price per barrel for the pertinent quarter:

If in any quarter there are no official posted prices for BV available throughout that entire quarter, then the methodology used to determine the monthly average price per barrel of oil for the purpose of utilizing the table displayed above to calculate the tax rate to be paid per barrel shall be to determine the average price of the Wilmington Oil Field (constrained to the Long Beach Unit and the West Wilmington Oil field under the Unit Operatorship of the City of Long Beach), with an adjustment to 32° API. The monthly averages in each quarter will be averaged to determine a single average rate for each calendar quarter.

In the event that neither the BV prices nor the Wilmington prices are available, the City and the operator of the Santa Fe Springs Unit shall meet and confer in good faith to choose an alternative price index."

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall be effective if approved by a majority vote of the electorate voting on the issue, at the General Municipal Election to be held on November 5, 2013, within the City of Santa Fe Springs. If so approved, the Deputy City Clerk shall certify to adoption of this Ordinance, which shall take effect on January 1, 2014.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> The Deputy City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this Ordinance, and shall cause the same to be posted in at least three (3) public places in the City, such posting to be completed not later than fifteen (15) days after passage hereof.

RESOLUTION NO. 9413

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE SPRINGS, CALIFORNIA, REQUESTING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES TO CONSOLIDATE A GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON NOVEMBER 5, 2013, WITH THE SCHOOL ELECTION TO BE HELD ON THE SAME DATE PURSUANT TO §10403 OF THE ELECTIONS CODE.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Santa Fe Springs, California, called a General Municipal Election to be held on November 5, 2013, for the purpose of the election of three members of the City Council for the full term of four years; and

WHEREAS, the City Council is submitting to the voters the question relating to the amount of the oil barrel tax; and

WHEREAS, it is desirable that the General Municipal Election be consolidated with the School Election to be held on the same date and that within the City, the precincts, polling places, and election officers of the two elections be the same, and that the Election Department of the County of Los Angeles canvass the returns of the General Municipal Election and that the election be held in all respects as if there were only one election;

<u>Section 2.</u> That a measure is to appear on the ballot as follows:

maximum of \$.52 per barrel, be adopted?	

<u>Section 3.</u> That the County Election Department is authorized to canvass the returns of the General Municipal Election. The election shall be held in all respects as if there were only one election, and only one form of ballot shall be used.

<u>Section 4.</u> That the Board of Supervisors is requested to issue instructions to the County Election Department to take any and all steps necessary for the holding of the consolidated election.

<u>Section 5.</u> That the City of Santa Fe Springs recognizes that additional costs will be incurred by the County by reason of this consolidation and agrees to reimburse the County for any costs.

<u>Section 6.</u> That the Deputy City Clerk is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this Resolution with the Board of Supervisors and the County Election Department of the County of Los Angeles.

Section 7. That the Deputy City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this resolution and enter it into the book of original resolutions.

RESOLUTION NO. 9414

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE SPRINGS, CALIFORNIA, ADOPTING REGULATIONS FOR CANDIDATES FOR ELECTIVE OFFICE PERTAINING TO CANDIDATES' STATEMENTS SUBMITTED TO THE VOTERS AT AN ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 5, 2013.

WHEREAS, §13307 of the Elections Code of the State of California provides that the governing body of any local agency adopt regulations pertaining to materials prepared by any candidate for a municipal election, including costs of the candidate's statement;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SANTA FE SPRINGS, CALIFORNIA, DOES HEREBY RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. GENERAL PROVISIONS. That pursuant to §13307 of the Elections Code of the State of California, each candidate for elective office to be voted for at an Election to be held in the City of Santa Fe Springs on November 5, 2013, may prepare a candidate's statement on an appropriate form provided by the Deputy City Clerk. The statement may include the name, age, and occupation of the candidate, and a brief description of no more than 200 words of the candidate's education and qualifications expressed by the candidate him/herself. The statement shall not include party affiliation of the candidate, nor membership or activity in partisan political organizations. The statement shall be filed in typewritten form to the office of the City Clerk at the time the candidate's nomination papers are filed. The statement may be withdrawn (in writing), but not changed, during the period for filing nomination papers and until 5:00 p.m. of the next working day after the close of the nomination period.

SECTION 2. FOREIGN LANGUAGE POLICY.

- a. Pursuant to the Federal Voting Rights Act, candidates' statements will be translated into all languages required by the County of Los Angeles. The County is required to translate candidate's statements in the following languages: Spanish.
- b. The County will mail separate sample ballots and candidates' statements in Spanish to only those voters who are on the County voter file as having requested a sample ballot in a particular language. The County will make the sample ballots and candidates' statements in the required language available at all polling places, on the County's website, and in the Election Official's Office.

<u>SECTION 3.</u> PAYMENT. The candidate shall not be required to pay for the cost of printing the candidate's statement or translating it.

<u>SECTION 4.</u> MISCELLANEOUS. The Deputy City Clerk shall comply with all recommendations and standards set forth by the California Secretary of State regarding occupational designations and other matters relating to elections.

<u>SECTION 5.</u> ADDITIONAL MATERIALS. No candidate will be permitted to include additional materials in the sample ballot package.

<u>SECTION 6.</u> That the Deputy City Clerk shall provide each candidate or the candidate's representative a copy of this Resolution at the time nominating petitions are issued.

<u>SECTION 7.</u> That all previous resolutions establishing Council policy on payment for candidates' statements are repealed.

<u>SECTION 8.</u> That this Resolution shall apply at the next ensuing municipal election and at each municipal election after that time.

<u>SECTION 9.</u> That the Deputy City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution and enter it into the Book of Original Resolutions.

The arguments shall be filed with the Deputy City Clerk, signed, with the printed names and signatures of the authors submitting it, or if submitted on behalf of an organization, the name of the organization, and the printed name and signature of at least one of its principal officers who is the author of the argument. The arguments shall be accompanied by the form of Statement To Be Filed By Authors of Argument.

Section 2. That the City Council, directs the Deputy City Clerk to transmit a copy of the measure to the City Attorney. The City Attorney shall prepare an impartial analysis of the measure not exceeding 500 words showing the effect of the measure on the existing law and the operation of the measure. The impartial analysis shall be filed by the date set by the Deputy City Clerk for the filing of primary arguments.

<u>Section 3.</u> That the Deputy City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this resolution and enter it into the book of original resolutions.

The rebuttal arguments shall be filed with the Deputy City Clerk not more than 10 days after the final date for filing direct arguments. Rebuttal arguments shall be printed in the same manner as the direct arguments. Each rebuttal argument shall immediately follow the direct argument which it seeks to rebut.

SECTION 2. All previous resolutions providing for the filing of rebuttal arguments for city measures are repealed.

SECTION 3. The provisions of Section 1 shall apply only to the election to be held on November 5, 2013, and then be repealed.

SECTION 4. The Deputy City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution.

Transportation Services Agreement with Pupil Transportation Cooperative (PTC) -**Authorization to Renew Contract**

RECOMMENDATION

CONTRACT AGREEMENT FOR TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

CONTRACTOR

Pupil Transportation Cooperative

City of Santa Fe Springs

Hereby mutually agree to the following:

I. Service

(a) The Contractor shall provide transportation services to the City of Santa Fe Springs as needed, to perform extra curricular and athletic services transportation when the Contractor's vehicles and personnel are available for hire.

II. Vehicle & Driver Requirements

- (a) The Contractor shall comply with all the provisions of the California Vehicle Code and Rules and Regulations pertaining to pupil transportation established by the California Sate Department of Education and the California Highway Patrol.
- (b) Contractor's drivers <u>must</u> possess a valid California Driver's License (Class A or B), valid medical certificate, and a California Special Driver's Certificate for a school bus or SPAB (School Pupil Activity Bus) vehicle.
- (c) Prior to departure from the requisitioning site, the City of Santa Fe Springs has the right to perform a visual inspection of the vehicle and to inspect the driver's license and certificates for validity to insure proper compliance with all safety and driver regulations.

III. Insurance

Contractor shall obtain, as its sole cost and expense and keep in force throughout the term of the Agreement the following insurance coverage:

a. Minimum two million dollars (\$2,000,000.00) combined single limit public policy liability insurance for bodily injury and property damage with the City named as an additional insured. This coverage shall include business automobile liability insurance or an equivalent form with a limit of not less than \$1,000,000 each accident with the City named as additional insured. Such insurance shall include coverage for owned, leased, hired, and non-owned automobiles.

b. Workers' Compensation Insurance in the statutory amount required by the State of California with the City named as an additional insured.

Further, Contractor shall obtain any additional kinds and amounts of insurance which, in its own judgment, may be necessary for the proper protection of any of its officers', employees', agents, or authorized subcontractors' own actions during the performance of this Agreement. Said policy or policies shall be in a form to be reasonably approved by the City and shall name the City, the City Council, its officers, agents and employees as additional insured by an endorsement to the policy. Said endorsement shall provide that the City shall receive not less than thirty (30) days prior written notice of cancellation of any policies of insurance required hereunder.

IV. Hold Harmless & Indemnification

- (a) Pupil Transportation Cooperative agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the City of Santa Fe Springs, its trustees, employees and agents, from any and all claims, liabilities, or losses, including attorney fees, for injuries and/or damages resulting from the actions and/or omissions of Pupil Transportation Cooperative, its employees and agents.
- (b) The City of Santa Fe Springs agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless Pupil Transportation Cooperative, its employees and agents, individually and collectively, from and against any and all claims, liabilities, or losses, including attorney fees, for injuries and/or damages resulting from the acts and/or omissions of the City of Santa Fe Springs, its employees and agents.

V. Tariff Rates & Invoices

- (a) The Contractor shall provide the City of Santa Fe Springs with a current copy of its trip rates. Rate changes shall be mailed when available. Additional charges for cancellation, one-time charge, clean-up, etc. shall also be included.
- (b) The City of Santa Fe Springs will be responsible for payment to the Pupil Transportation Cooperative. Invoices should be submitted to the City of Santa Fe Springs in duplicate and must be itemized by trip location and date.

VI. Miscellaneous

(a) The City of Santa Fe Springs has the right to cancel any excursion without liability for breach of contract if the Contractor does not comply with the conditions as set forth in this agreement.

- (b) If cancellation of any excursion occurs less than twenty-four (24) hours before a scheduled trip, a three (3) hour minimum will be charged. If cancellation occurs after bus(es) has/have departed the terminal, or if cancellation occurs at trip departure, a three (3) hour minimum plus mileage will be charged.
- (c) The Contractor shall be considered an independent contractor for the purpose of this agreement and not an employee or agent of the City of Santa Fe Springs.
- (d) This Agreement may not be sold, transferred or assigned by either party, or by operation of law, to any other person or persons or business entity, without the other party's written permission. Any such sale, transfer or assignment, or attempted sale, transfer or assignment without written permission may be deemed by the other party to constitute a voluntary termination of this Agreement and this Agreement shall thereafter be deemed terminated and void.
- (e) In the event any legal proceedings is instituted to enforce any term or provision of this Agreement, the prevailing party in said legal proceedings shall be entitled to recover attorneys' fees and costs from the opposing party in an amount determined by the Court to be reasonable.
- (f) Either party may terminate this Agreement with or without cause upon service of a thirty day (30) written notice to the other party.

This Agreement shall commence on July 1, 2013, and extend through June 30, 2015.

Santa Fe Springs City Hall, South Section Heating, Ventilation and Air Conditioning System Upgrade – Award of Contract

RECOMMENDATION

BACKGROUND

Bids were opened on June 25, 2013 and a total of four (4) bids were received. The lowest responsive and responsible bidder for the project is A and Y Construction Company of Arcadia, California, in the amount of \$517,624.00. The following represents the bids received and the amount of each bid:

The bid submitted by A and Y Construction Company is 22.1% below the Engineer's Estimate of \$664,830.66. The Department of Public Works has reviewed the bids and determined the low bid submitted by A and Y Construction Company to be satisfactory.

To mitigate the potential disruption to ongoing city hall operations, the HVAC work within the South Section offices will take place during weekend days only, and at night. For purposes of this contract, night work is defined as work occurring between the hours of 7:00 PM and 5:00 AM. Work may also take place in the offices during Fridays that the City is closed to public business (every other Friday).

This Contract Agreement is made and entered into the above-stated project this $\underline{11}^{TH}$ day of \underline{July} $\underline{11, 2013}$, BY AND BETWEEN the City of Santa Fe Springs, as AGENCY, and \underline{A} $\underline{\&}$ \underline{Y} $\underline{Construction\ Company}$, as CONTRACTOR in the amount of $\underline{\$517,624.00}$.

WITNESSETH that AGENCY and CONTRACTOR have mutually agreed as follows:

ARTICLE I

The contract documents for the aforesaid project shall consist of the Notice Inviting Sealed Bids, Instructions to Bidders, Proposal, General Specifications, Standard Specifications, Special Provisions, Plans, and all referenced specifications, details, standard drawings, CDBG contract provisions and forms, and appendices; together with this Contract Agreement and all required bonds, insurance certificates, permits, notices, and affidavits; and also including any and all addenda or supplemental agreements clarifying, or extending the work contemplated as may be required to ensure its completion in an acceptable manner. All of the provisions of said contract documents are made a part hereof as though fully set forth herein.

ARTICLE II

For and in consideration of the payments and agreements to be made and performed by AGENCY, CONTRACTOR agrees to furnish all materials and perform all work required for the above-stated project, and to fulfill all other obligations as set forth in the aforesaid contract documents.

ARTICLE III

CONTRACTOR agrees to receive and accept the prices set forth in the Proposal as full compensation for furnishing all materials, performing all work, and fulfilling all obligations hereunder. Said compensation shall cover all expenses, losses, damages, and consequences arising out of the nature of the work during its progress or prior to its acceptance including those for well and faithfully completing the work and the whole thereof in the manner and time specified in the aforesaid contract documents; and also including those arising from actions of the elements, unforeseen difficulties or obstructions encountered in the prosecution of the work, suspension or discontinuance of the work, and all other unknowns or risks of any description connected with the work.

ARTICLE IV

AGENCY hereby promises and agrees to employ, and does hereby employ, CONTRACTOR to provide the materials, do the work and fulfill the obligations according to the terms and conditions herein contained and referred to, for the prices aforesaid, and hereby contracts to pay the same at the time, in the manner, and upon the conditions set forth in the contract documents. No work or portion of the work shall be paid for until it is approved for payment by the City Engineer. Payment made for completed portions of the work shall not constitute final acceptance of those portions or of the completed project.

ARTICLE V

CONTRACTOR acknowledges the provisions of the State Labor Code requiring every employer to be insured against liability for Worker's Compensation or to undertake self-insurance in accordance with the provisions of that code and certifies compliance with such provisions. Contractor further acknowledges the provisions of the State Labor Code requiring every employer to pay at least the minimum prevailing rate of per diem wages for each craft classification or type of workman needed to execute this contract as determined by the Director of Labor Relations of the State of California. The Contractor is required to pay the higher of either the State or Federal Wages.

ARTICLE VI

CONTRACTOR agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless AGENCY and all of its officers and agents from any claims, demand or causes of action, including related expenses, attorney's fees, and costs, based on, arising out of, or in any way related to the work undertaken by CONTRACTOR hereunder.

ARTICLE VII

CONTRACTOR affirms that the signatures, titles and seals set forth hereinafter in execution of this Contract Agreement represent all individuals, firm members, partners, joint venturers, and/or corporate officers having principal interest herein.



Approval of Parcel Map No. 72154

RECOMMENDATION

That the City Council take the following actions:

- Approve Parcel Map No. 72154; 1.
- Find that Parcel Map No. 72154 together with the provisions for its design 2. and improvement, is consistent with the City's General Plan; and
- Authorize the City Engineer and City Clerk to sign Parcel Map No. 72154. 3.

BACKGROUND

The subdivision is located on the east side of Shoemaker Avenue, south of the Union Pacific Railroad tracks and south of Firestone Boulevard, in the M-2, Heavy Manufacturing Zone. The County Assessor has assigned an address of 14912 and 14920 Shoemaker Avenue (APN of 7005-001-036) and 14928 and 14938 Shoemaker Avenue (APN of 7005-001-037).

Parcel Map No. 72154 subdivides the two existing lots, (APN 7005-001-036 and APN 7005-001-037), with a total combined area of ±33,600 square feet into four parcels. Parcel 1 would be 9,070 square feet; Parcel 2 would be 8,218 square feet; Parcel 3 would be 8,126 square feet; and Parcel 4 would be 8,126 square feet. After the subdivision, those two lots, each containing two buildings, will be "split" resulting in four parcels, each with a building. Subdividing two lots into four parcels would allow the newly created parcels, each with a building, to be sold separately.

The Planning Commission approved the tentative map at their meeting of May 13, 2013. A full-sized copy of this map is available in the office of the City Clerk.




