BACKGROUND

The Art Education Grant Program is facilitated by the HAAC in an advisory capacity. Funded by the Heritage Arts in Public Places program. The Heritage Arts Education Endowment Fund was established to support youth oriented arts programs and events with Art Education Grants. Schools in Santa Fe Springs have the opportunity to submit applications annually requesting funds to help support their art education programs.

As of June 17, 2022, the HAAC has received 15 grant applications for the FY 2022-2023 Art Education Grant Program totaling \$36,069.32. 
Annual Staff In-Service Training

Independence Day Event

The City of Santa Fe Springs is proud to present its Annual Independence Day Celebration and Fireworks Spectacular on Sunday, July 3, 2022 at Los Nietos Park, located at 11143 Charlesworth Road. The celebration features a horseshoe tournament, live music, food trucks, and family games. We are asking that everyone bring a lawn chair for seating. The "Easy Viewing Area," will be offered at Santa Fe Springs Athletic Fields located at 9720 Pioneer Blvd.

This viewing area will be available beginning at 8:00 p.m. and offers the same great view to the fireworks show as the main event site at Los Nietos Park. Barbeques, canopies, and umbrellas are not allowed in the firework viewing areas. For spectator convenience to and from Los Nietos Park and Santa Fe Springs Athletic Fields, a shuttle will be offered from the Town Center Hall Parking Lot, located at 11740 E. Telegraph Road, and the Betty Wilson Center located at 11641 Florence Ave. The grand finale will be an 18-minute Fireworks Spectacular that will begin at 9:00 p.m.

Registration for this event is not required. You will notice a perimeter fence installed around Los Nietos Park. This fence is for safety, as creating an area with controlled entries and exits provides with public safety officers to have better control of the event area. Additionally, there will be emergency exits clearly marked on fencing and emergency lanes painted on the grass. Staff will begin event setup on July 1, 2022.

Curbing Hunger Can Food Drive

The Family and Human Services Division will be hosting a can food drive June 13th through July 1, 2022 in an effort to restock Gus's food pantry to assist families in need. Donations are being accepted at all City facilities during operating hours for non-expired canned goods, non-perishable food items and unopened personal hygienic items. **No clothing will be accepted.**
