5. <u>Traffic Bureau Report – February 2023</u>

Mr. Lopez provided a summary, noting (0) Fatalities, (25) Injury, and (21) Property Damage, with (4) DUI, (1) Bicycle, and (1) Pedestrian. There were (8) Traffic Enforcement Operations, yielding (92) Stops, and (88) Citations. The primary collision factors: Improper Turn (24), (18) Right-of-Way Violations, (16) Unsafe Speed, (13) Improper Driving, and (12) Traffic Signals and Signs. Reviewed the Year-to-Date numbers, and noted the High Collision intersections for February 2023 are Florence/Norwalk (6), Telegraph/Greenleaf (4), Florence/Orr and Day Road (3), Florence/Bloomfield (2), Florence/Roseton (2), and Florence/Pioneer (2).

Chairperson Vallejo indicated that she saw the Flock cameras on Danby, stating that a few residents were unaware that there were cameras on the street.

Commissioner Carter inquired about the crosswalk on Orr and Day Road by the CHP office. Mr. Lopez indicated that after the installation of Stop signs on Orr and Day Road staff is planning to remove the in-pavement lights from Orr and Day Road/Whiteland and install them at Orr and Day/Davenrich.
