### **MINUTES**

#### 1. **CALL TO ORDER**

Chairperson Debbie Baker called the meeting to order at 9:01 a.m.

#### 2. **ROLL CALL**

#### 3. **ORAL COMMUNICATIONS**

#### 4. **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

A motion was made by Francis Carbajal and seconded by Laurie Rios to approve the minutes of March 29, 2022. The motion was carried unanimously.

#### 5. **COUNCIL LIAISON REPORT**

Mayor Annette Rodriguez informed the committee members that the Easter event was a huge success. The Mayor also reported that the City's PSOs will now be doing bike patrolling throughout the City. Lastly, Mayor Rodriguez encouraged the members to participate in the Aloha Festival and the Meet the Mayor's event.

#### 6. **PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT REPORT**

#### 7. **PLANNING DEPARTMENT DIRECTOR REPORT**

Mr. Velasco reported that on September 10, 2018, the Planning Commission approved a Tentative Parcel Map (TPM No. 78232) and four (4) Development Plan Approvals (DPA Case Nos. 930-933) to allow a consolidation of seven (7) parcels into five (5) parcels and for the construction of four (4) concrete tilt-up

industrial buildings, ranging from 58,463 sq. ft. to 121,124 sq. ft. Due to an extensive amount of oil wells that are located on the subject site, the property owner has spent the past four (4) years abandoning wells and prepping the site for future development. It should be noted that Parcel 4 has been sold to Omega OU2, LLC who intends to construct a 48,649 sq. ft. industrial building and use it for a water treatment facility.

To date, the applicant has not yet completed a detailed street improvement plan to confirm that the corner artwork on Telegraph Rd. and Santa Fe Springs Rd., known as “Dancing Gabrielenos”, will not be affected. However, the plans submitted with the original development entitlements calls for the artwork to remain in place. The committee raised the concern regarding the close proximity of the street improvement plan next to the art piece and asked Mr. Velasco to bring up those concerns with the Public Work Department.

Lastly, Mr. Velasco confirmed that two billboards are currently advertising the SFS Art Fest of 2022.

## 8. EXECUTIVE SECRETARY REPORT

Executive Secretary, Edmund Ramirez reported on the following:

### **a) Approval of Heritage Arts Fund (240 & 245) Financial Report – March 2022**

March 2022– Mr. Ramirez provided an overview of the Fiscal Year 2021/2022 financial report for the period of March 2022. Copies were distributed to members for their review. Balance: \$1.8 million.

A motion was made by Francis Carbajal and seconded by Gabriel Jimenez to approve the FY 2021/2022 financial report for the period ending on March 2022. The motion was carried unanimously.

## 9. PRESENTATION

### **a) 2022 SFS Art Fest Update**

Executive Secretary Ramirez and Art Consultant Sandra Hahn provided an update on the planning for the 2022 Art Fest event. The update and presentation included information regarding the various components of the event. They discussed the Artists, Preview and Showcase night, Marketing, Sponsorships, Entertainment timeline, Food / Beverage, and Artisan Vendors.

Ms. Hahn reported that a new DJ workshop will be part of the event. Ms. Hahn also notified the members that art submission deadlines were not extended this year. Ms. Hahn updated the HAAC on the marketing of the event.

Executive Secretary Ramirez expressed concerns regarding maximum capacity at the event and will be monitoring the issue. Additionally, a meeting has been scheduled with all staff working the event to inform them of their work assignments. He also reported that the Chair and Vice-Chair of the HAAC Committee will participate in judging the Art Pieces as well as two additional members from the HAAC.

Mr. Hayes thanked the staff who made the SFS Art Fest poster at Los Nietos Park. Additionally, the committee thanked the Chamber of Commerce for promoting the SFS Art Fest event.

#### 10. OLD BUSINESS

##### **a) Rexford Industrial Project Update**

Executive Secretary Ramirez reported that on April 7, 2022, Ms. Elwood informed him that the Rexford Industrial team has decided not to proceed with art at their development site and instead will pay the City the fee in-lieu of art installation. Rexford Industrial is in contact with the Planning Department to determine the amount to be paid associated with their project.

#### 11. NEW BUSINESS

##### **a) Review and Approve FY 2022-2023 Art Education Grant Guidelines**

Executive Secretary Ramirez provided the current FY 2022-2023 Art Education Grant Guidelines for the committee's review. He recommended the committee review the document and be ready to discuss it at the HAAC next meeting. The Art Education Grant Guidelines will need to be approved by the HAAC in preparation for the FY 2022-2023 Art Grant Program. If necessary, the revised guidelines will be sent to all Santa Fe Springs schools as they begin to complete their Art Education Grant applications and submit them by June 30, 2022.



**Introduction of Library Services Manager**

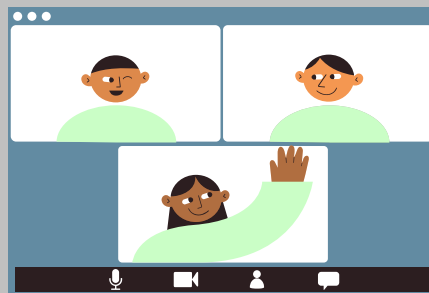
