The taking of any action prohibited by this Section, or the failure to take any action required by this Section, is an infraction, punishable by a fine as set forth in Section 36900 of the California Government Code, not to exceed \$500 for each day in which the violation occurs.

Notice Of Water Shortage Contingency Plan

In response to Governor Gavin Newsom's March 28 Executive Order the State Water Resources Control Board adopted an emergency water conservation regulation that will ensure more aggressive conservation by local water agencies across the state.

Accordingly, the SWRCB has called upon the City of Santa Fe Springs to also conserve its water usage.

EVERY DROP COUNTS

Mandatory Water Use Reductions and Restrictions

-  **NO** hose washing of walkways, driveways, or parking areas except as needed for sanitary or safety purposes
-  Water shall **NOT** be used to clean, fill or maintain levels in decorative fountains unless a recirculating system is used
-  Restaurants or other public places where food is served or offered for sale shall **NOT** serve drinking water to any customer unless expressly requested
-  All water leaks shall be promptly repaired
-  **NO** water runoff is allowed when irrigating with potable water
-  Use automatic shutoff nozzles to wash cars
-  **NO** irrigating allowed outdoors within the first 48 hours after any rainfall
-  Residential and commercial landscaped areas shall be watered **NO** more than 2 times a week, for **NO** more than 10 minutes per day
-  Residential and commercial landscaped areas shall **NOT** be watered between 8 a.m. and 8 p.m.
-  Properties located north of Lakeland Road shall be watered only on Mondays and Thursdays
-  Properties located south of Lakeland Road shall be watered only on Tuesdays and Fridays

WATER SAVING TIPS

Use a broom to clean outdoor areas
Saves 8-18 gallons per minute

Use mulch on soil surface
Saves 20-30 gallons per 1,000 sq. ft.

Set mower blade to 3" to encourage deeper roots
Saves 16-50 gallons a day

Install drip irrigation
Saves 15 gallons

Adjust sprinklers to water plants, not concrete
Saves 12-15 gallons

Water plants early in the morning
Saves 25 gallons

Plant drought resistant trees and plants
Saves 30-60 gallons per sq. ft.

Install a "smart" controller
Saves 25+ gallons a day
