#### SARTELL CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

Meeting Location: Sartell City Hall, Council Chambers

Meeting Date: April 10<sup>th</sup>, 2023

Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, a regular meeting of the Sartell City Council was held on April 10<sup>th</sup>, 2023, at Sartell City Hall. Mayor Ryan Fitzthum called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

#### **SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS**

#### **Everything Sartell Funding Request**

Everything Sartell and the Sartell Baseball Association (SBA) presented a recommendation for funding to the City Council for lights on two baseball fields at Pinecone Central Park. Everything Sartell approved a \$75,000 contribution to the project from the CVB Hotel Tax Dollar fund due to the lights creating additional playing hours, bringing more tournaments, and supporting tourism in Sartell. SBA's president, Mark Dingmann, was present to share details regarding the number of tournaments, teams, and overall tourists that SBA brings to Sartell each year and how the lights will allow this to increase year after year.

#### **Direction/Action**

A motion was made by Fitzthum and seconded by Meyer to approve the funding request as presented but increasing the amount to \$100,000 out of the CVB Hotel Tax Dollars fund and ensuring that the funds are only issued upon insurance of the project taking place and the remaining funding secured. Gruber presented the new "Projects & Performance" site on the City website, that allows "live" updates of City projects, as well as a visual of the fiscal performance of the City. This is to allow better engagement with residents, as well as regular updates. She also provided a specific update to the golf course project, sharing that Council authorized a Purchase Agreement with a private party during a Closed Session on March 13<sup>th</sup> and this will come before the Council on April 24<sup>th</sup>. Councilmember Meyer shared he would not be present April 24<sup>th</sup>, so the request to review the documents on May 8<sup>th</sup> was made and agreed upon.

#### <u>Solutions Behavioral Healthcare Revenue Bonds</u>

Voshell presented the proposed Solutions Behavioral Healthcare Revenue Bonds, using the City as conduit bonding.

#### SPECIAL MEETING IMMEDIATELY FOLLOWING REGULAR MEETING

Pursuant to due call and notice thereof, a special meeting was held on April 10<sup>th</sup>, 2023 at Sartell City Hall. The meeting commenced at 7:30 pm.

COUNCIL PRESENT: Mayor Ryan Fitzthum, Council Members Elness and Meyer, Councilmember

Lewandowski

COUNCIL ABSENT: Councilmember Smith

OTHERS PRESENT: City Administrator Anna Gruber, Finance Director Rob Voshell, Project

Supervisor Kari Theisen, Public Works Director John Kothenbeutel, Fire Chief Peter Kedrowski, City Engineer April Ryan, Deputy Police Chief Schriener.

#### **AGENDA**

A Motion was made by Councilmember Lewandowski and seconded by Councilmember Elness to adopt the agenda as presented. The motion carried unanimously.

#### **DEPARTMENT UPDATES**

Project Supervisor Theisen presented proposed rezone and/or ordinance changes near the Central MN Healthcare Hub for mutli-family uses. Council directed Theisen to draft ordinance uses in the B3 zoning to allow for multi-family with conditions of it being tied to medical-professional workforce needs, as well as mixed-use. Theisen also presented an R3 site plan for an apartment proposed on Roberts Road. The request was for the potential of a variance for height, due to the water tables. Council directed Theisen to allow the developer to apply for a variance for height up to 70 feet, only if the water tables do not allow for the garages to be underground.

City Administrator Gruber presented the draft version of the Master Park Plan and discussed with Council the concept of creating a Park Committee to assist Parks Supervisor Tony Krueger in implementation of the plan, as well as review of park amenities and requests from different groups throughout the community. Council directed Gruber to develop an application process for a Parks Committee.

Gruber presented an update on the status of the AIM properties and future closure, as well as permitting requirements for the landfill being purchased. Council directed Gruber to actively permit the landfill and to leave the uses broad in nature.

Gruber presented quotes from multiple environmental companies for the annual monitoring of the landfills within Sartell. Council directed Gruber to bring agreements to the regular Council from the low bidder (Braun Intertec) for all of the closed landfills and SEH Inc (City Engineer) for the active landfill being purchased from AIM. This will come to a future regular meeting for approval.

Deputy Chief Schriener provided an update on the Police Discovery Process, as well as the Police Chief process. Council reviewed the completed background check investigation summary and proposed employment contract with Brandon Silgjord. The employment contract will come before the City Council for approval on April 24<sup>th</sup>.

#### **ROUNDTABLES**

Mayor Fitzthum updated the Council on the potential growth of the Central MN Healthcare Hub.







**BACKGROUND**: The City has been working over the past year with the MPCA, our Municipal Advisors, Bond Counsel, and a couple of different financial institutions to work toward obtaining financial assurance for the landfill site we will be acquiring on 4<sup>th</sup> Ave S. State law allows us to use a few different methods for obtaining the assurance with the MPCA including letter of credit, bond, or funded trust agreement.

The letter of credit is the method staff is recommending because it is the most cost-effective option without us needing to make a significant change to our CIP.

We received quotes from two different financial institutions, US Bank and Deerwood Bank. Deerwood Bank quoted us the lowest fee if we agreed to create a deposit account and deposit \$1.5M by the beginning of July. Their current rates on their deposit account is competitive with the market and their rate on the letter of credit is the lowest.

#### TRUST AGREEMENT

Trust Agreement, the "Agreement," entered into on [date] by City of Sartell, a Minnesota Association, the "Grantor," and Deerwood Bank, incorporated in the State of Minnesota, the "Trustee."

The Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (Agency), an agency of the state of Minnesota, has established rules applicable to the Grantor, requiring that an owner or operator of a solid waste management facility shall provide assurance that funds will be available when needed for closure and/or postclosure care of, and/or contingency action for, the facility.

The Grantor has chosen a trust to provide the financial assurance for the facilities identified herein.

The Grantor, acting through its duly authorized officers, has selected the Trustee to be the trustee under this agreement, and the Trustee is willing to act as trustee.

The Grantor and the Trustee agree as follows:

Section 1. Definitions. As used in this Agreement:

- a. The term "Grantor" means the owner or operator who enters into this Agreement and any successors or assigns of the Grantor.
- b. The term "Trustee" means the Trustee who enters into this Agreement and any successor Trustee.
- c. The term "Beneficiary" means the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency and any successor agency.

Section 2. Identification of Facilities and Cost Estimates. This agreement pertains to the facilities and cost estimates, if any, identified on attached Schedule A [on Schedule A, for each facility list the identification number, name, address, and the current contingency action, closure, and/or postclosure cost estimates, or portions thereof, for which financial assurance is demonstrated by this Agreement].

Section 3. Establishment of Fund. The Grantor and the Trustee hereby establish a trust fund, the "Fund," for the benefit of the Agency. The Grantor and the Trustee intend that no third party have access to the Fund except as herein provided. The Fund is established initially as consisting of the property, which is acceptable to the Trustee, described in Schedule B attached hereto. This property and any other property subsequently transferred to the Trustee is referred to as the Fund, together with all earnings, and profits on earnings, less any payments or distributions made by the Trustee under this Agreement. The Fund shall be held by the Trustee, IN TRUST, as hereinafter provided. The Trustee shall not be responsible, nor shall it undertake any responsibility for the amount or adequacy of, nor any duty to collect from the Grantor, any payments necessary to discharge any liabilities of the Grantor established by the Agency.

Section 4. Payment for Contingency Action, Closure, and Postclosure Care. The Trustee shall make payments from the Fund as the Agency Commissioner shall specify, in writing, to provide for the payment of the costs of contingency action, closure, and/or postclosure care of the facilities covered by this Agreement. The Trustee shall reimburse the Grantor or other persons as specified by the Agency Commissioner from the Fund for contingency action, closure, and postclosure expenditures in amounts the Agency Commissioner shall specify in writing. In addition, the Trustee shall refund to the Grantor the amounts the Agency Commissioner specifies in writing. Upon refund, these funds shall no longer constitute part of the Fund as defined herein.

Section 5. Payments Comprising the Fund. Payments made to the Trustee for the Fund shall consist of cash or securities acceptable to the Trustee.

Section 6. Trustee Management. In investing, reinvesting, exchanging, selling, and managing the Fund, the Trustee shall discharge his or her duties with respect to the trust fund solely in the interest of the beneficiary and with the care, skill, prudence, and diligence under the circumstances then prevailing which persons of prudence, acting in a like capacity and familiar with such matters, would use in the conduct of an enterprise of a like character and with like aims; except that:

- a. securities or other obligations of the Grantor, or any other owner or operator of the facilities, or any of their affiliates as defined in the Investment Company Act of 1940, United States Code, title 15, section 80a-2(a), shall not be acquired or held, unless they are securities or other obligations of the federal or state government;
- b. the Trustee is authorized to invest the Fund in time or demand deposits of the Trustee, to the extent insured by an agency of the federal or state government; and
- c. the Trustee is authorized to hold cash awaiting investment or distribution uninvested for a reasonable time and without liability for the payment of interest thereon.

Section 7. Commingling and Investment. The Trustee is expressly authorized in its discretion:

- a. to transfer from time to time any or all of the assets of the Fund to any common, commingled, or collective trust fund created by the Trustee in which the Fund is eligible to participate, subject to all of the provisions thereof, to be commingled with the assets of others participating therein; and
- b. to purchase shares in any investment company registered under the Investment Company Act of 1940, United States Code, title 15, sections 80a-1 et seq. including one which may be created, managed, underwritten, or to which investment advice is rendered or the shares of which are sold by the Trustee. The Trustee may vote such shares in its discretion.

Section 8. Express Powers of Trustee. Without in any way limiting the powers and discretions conferred upon the Trustee by the other provisions of this Agreement or by law, the Trustee is expressly authorized and empowered:

- a. To sell, exchange, convey, transfer, or otherwise dispose of any property held by it, by public or private sale. No person dealing with the Trustee may be bound to see to the application of the purchase money or to inquire into the validity or expediency of a sale or other disposition.
- b. To make, execute, acknowledge, and deliver any and all documents of transfer and conveyance and any and all other instruments that may be necessary or appropriate to carry out the powers herein granted.
- c. To register any securities held in the Fund in its own name or in the name of a nominee and to hold any security in bearer form or in book entry, or to combine certificates representing the securities with certificates of the same issue held by the Trustee in other fiduciary capacities, or to deposit or arrange for the deposit of the securities in a qualified central depository even though, when so deposited, the securities may be merged and held in bulk in the name of the nominee of the depository with other securities deposited therein by another person, or to deposit or arrange for the deposit of any securities issued by the United States Government, or any agency or instrumentality thereof, with a federal reserve bank, but the books and records of the Trustee shall at all times show that all these securities are part of the Fund.
- d. To deposit any cash in the Fund in interest-bearing accounts maintained or savings certificates issued by the Trustee, in its separate corporate capacity, or in any other banking institution affiliated with the Trustee, to the extent insured by an agency of the federal or state government.

Section 9. Taxes and Expenses. All taxes of any kind that may be assessed or levied against or in respect of the Fund and all brokerage commissions incurred by the Fund shall be paid from the Fund. All other expenses incurred by the Trustee in connection with the administration of this Trust, including fees for legal services rendered to the Trustee, the compensation of the Trustee to the extent not paid directly by the Grantor, and all other proper charges and disbursements of the Trustee shall be paid from the Fund.

Section 10. Annual Valuation. The Trustee shall annually, at least 30 days prior to the anniversary date of establishment of the Fund, furnish to the Grantor and to the Agency Commissioner a statement confirming the value of the Trust. Any securities in the fund shall be valued at market value as of no more than 60 days prior to the anniversary date of establishment of the Fund. The failure of the Grantor to object in writing to the Trustee within 90 days after the statement has been furnished to the Grantor and the Agency Commissioner shall constitute a conclusively binding assent by the Grantor, barring the Grantor from asserting any claim or liability against the Trustee with respect to matters disclosed in the statement.

Section 11. Advice of Counsel. The trustee may from time to time consult with counsel, with respect to any question arising as to the construction of this Agreement or any action to be taken hereunder. The Trustee shall be fully protected, to the extent permitted by law, in acting upon the advice of counsel.

Section 12. Trustee Compensation. The Trustee shall be entitled to reasonable compensation for its services as agreed upon in writing from time to time with the Grantor.

Section 13. Successor Trustee. The Trustee may resign or the Grantor may replace the Trustee, but the resignation or replacement shall not be effective until the Grantor has appointed a successor trustee and this successor accepts the appointment. The successor trustee shall have the same powers and duties as those conferred upon the Trustee hereunder. Upon the successor trustee's acceptance of the appointment, the Trustee shall assign, transfer, and pay over to the successor trustee the funds and properties then constituting the Fund. If for any reason the Grantor cannot or does not act in the event of the resignation of the Trustee, the Trustee may apply to a court of competent jurisdiction for the appointment of a successor trustee or for instructions. The successor trustee shall specify the date on which it assumes administration of the trust in a writing sent to the Grantor, the Agency Commissioner and the present Trustee by certified mail ten days before the change becomes effective. Any expenses incurred by the Trustee as a result of any of the acts contemplated by this Section shall be paid as provided in Section 9.

Section 14. Instructions to the Trustee. All orders, requests, and instructions by the Agency to the Trustee shall be in writing, signed by the Agency Commissioner; and the Trustee shall act and shall be fully protected in acting in accordance with the orders, requests, and instructions. The Trustee shall have the right to assume, in the absence of written notice to the contrary, that no event constituting a change or a termination of the authority of any person to act on behalf of the Grantor or the Agency hereunder has occurred. The Trustee shall have no duty to act in the absence of orders, requests, and instructions from the Agency Commissioner, except as provided herein.

Section 15. Notice of Nonpayment. The Trustee shall notify the Grantor and the Agency Commissioner by certified mail within ten days if no payment is received from the grantor by the end of the month. After the pay-in period is completed, the Trustee shall not be required to send a notice of nonpayment.

Section 16. Amendment of Agreement. This agreement may be amended by an instrument in writing executed by the Grantor, the Trustee, and the Agency Commissioner, or by the Trustee and the Agency Commissioner if the Grantor ceases to exist.

Section 17. Irrevocability and Termination. Subject to the right of the parties to amend this Agreement as provided in Section 13 and in Section 16, this Trust shall be irrevocable and shall continue until terminated at the written agreement of the Grantor, the Trustee, and the Agency Commissioner, or by the Trustee and the Agency Commissioner, if the Grantor ceases to exist. Upon termination of the Trust, all remaining trust property, less final trust administration expenses, shall be delivered to the Grantor or to any successors or assigns of the Grantor.

Section 18. Immunity and Indemnification. The Trustee shall not incur personal liability of any nature in connection with any act or omission, made in good faith, in the

administration of this Trust, or in carrying out any directions by the Agency Commissioner issued in accordance with this Agreement. The Trustee shall be indemnified and saved harmless by the Grantor or from the Trust Fund, or both, from and against any personal liability to which the Trustee may be subjected by reason of any act or conduct in its official capacity, including all expenses reasonably incurred in its defense in the event the Grantor fails to provide a defense.

Section 19. Choice of Law. This Agreement shall be administered, construed, and enforced according to the laws of the state of Minnesota.

Section 20. Interpretation. As used in this Agreement, words in the singular include the plural and words in the plural include the singular. The descriptive headings for each Section of this Agreement shall not affect the interpretation or the legal efficacy of this Agreement.

In Witness Whereof the parties have caused this Agreement to be executed by their respective officers duly authorized and their corporate seals to be hereunto affixed and attested as of the date first above written. The parties below certify that the wording of this Agreement is identical to the wording specified in Minnesota Rules, part 7035.2805, subpart 1, as such rules were constituted on the date of signing.

The proposed agreement to complete landfill permitting efforts and permit documents is an hourly contract estimated at \$74,950.

#### **OPPORTUNITY COST IF APPROVED:**

Updated landfill permitting documents are required by the MPCA prior to the City taking over and operating the landfill. Once permitted, the city can collect dumping fees for any material disposed of at the landfill. The city can be very selective on what materials they are willing to accept. The city can use the landfill for their own waste meeting the permit requirements, which will save the city money in not having to haul and dump somewhere else.

## Payments to Consultant for Services and Expenses Using the Hourly Basis Option

The Agreement for Professional Services is amended and supplemented to include the following agreement of the parties:

#### A. Hourly Basis Option

The Client and Consultant select the hourly basis for payment for services provided by Consultant. Consultant shall be compensated monthly. Monthly charges for services shall be based on Consultant's current billing rates for applicable employees plus charges for expenses and equipment.

Consultant will provide an estimate of the costs for services in this Agreement. It is agreed that after 90% of the estimated compensation has been earned and if it appears that completion of the services cannot be accomplished within the remaining 10% of the estimated compensation, Consultant will notify the Client and confer with representatives of the Client to determine the basis for completing the work.

Compensation to Consultant based on the rates is conditioned on completion of the work within the effective period of the rates. Should the time required to complete the work be extended beyond this period, the rates shall be appropriately adjusted.

#### B. Expenses

The following items involve expenditures made by Consultant employees or professional consultants on behalf of the Client. Their costs are not included in the hourly charges made for services but instead are reimbursable expenses required in addition to hourly charges for services and shall be paid for as described in this Agreement:

- 1. Transportation and travel expenses.
- 2. Long distance services, dedicated data and communication services, teleconferences, Project Web sites, and extranets.
- 3. Lodging and meal expense connected with the Project.
- 4. Fees paid, in the name of the Client, for securing approval of authorities having jurisdiction over the Project.
- 5. Plots, Reports, plan and specification reproduction expenses.
- 6. Postage, handling and delivery.
- Expense of overtime work requiring higher than regular rates, if authorized in advance by the Client.
- 8. Renderings, models, mock-ups, professional photography, and presentation materials requested by the Client.
- 9. All taxes levied on professional services and on reimbursable expenses.
- 10. Other special expenses required in connection with the Project.
- 11. The cost of special consultants or technical services as required. The cost of subconsultant services shall include actual expenditure plus 10% markup for the cost of administration and insurance.

The Client shall pay Consultant monthly for expenses.

#### C. Equipment Utilization

The utilization of specialized equipment, including automation equipment, is recognized as benefiting the Client. The Client, therefore, agrees to pay the cost for the use of such specialized equipment on the project. Consultant invoices to the Client will contain detailed information regarding the use of specialized equipment on the project and charges will be based on the standard rates for the equipment published by Consultant.

The Client shall pay Consultant monthly for equipment utilization.

Short Elliott Hendrickson Inc. (SEH®) is pleased to provide a proposal for 2023 Landfill Permitting Services to the City of Sartell (City) for the existing industrial solid waste disposal facility operating under Minnesota Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) permit SW-281 also known as the AIM Landfill. The solid waste permit expired on March 12, 2014; with the purchase of the facility by the City of Sartell, it is our understanding that the City of Sartell will have 90 days to prepare and submit Permitting Documents following the property transfer.

We understand the City is close to acquiring the facility. Services proposed include preparing submittals required for solid waste permitting under Minnesota Rules 7035 as well as completion of application forms and checklists provided by the MPCA.

The following tasks are proposed to meet regulatory requirements of the facility as part of the 2023 Landfill Permitting Services.

#### TASK 1 | PROJECT MANAGEMENT

Project management throughout the contract period will include the internal project coordination, staff assignments, and budget management. This task also involves coordination with the City and the MPCA to identify the specific issues to be addressed as part of re-permitting. Minnesota Rules 7001.0500 outlines the requirements for re-issuance of a permit with a direct reference to the specific conditions or need for additional information as established by the assigned regulatory staff. Specific elements of this task for project management/regulatory coordination include:

- Coordination and direction to the SEH project team throughout the project.
- Coordination with the City and MPCA for transmitting information and scheduling meetings.
- Review of existing documents, data, and regulations.
- Coordinate internal quality control reviews for assurance of document completeness.

In addition, any questions or concerns relating to project schedule, billings, etc., will also be addressed as part of project management. Throughout the re-permitting process, SEH staff will be available to the City to provide information on the project status and associated technical data.

#### TASK 2 | ELECTRONIC FILES/SITE SURVEY

Currently, SEH does not have any land survey data associated with the AIM Landfill. That includes original as-builts of the existing features or the original design documents completed by prior consultants. The last site survey was completed in 2012 as part of AIM Landfill operations. SEH recommends that prior design and survey data be requested for your records as the new landfill owner; files should be provided electronically and compatible with AutoCAD.

In addition, the Landfill Evaluation and Assessment Report (SEH, November 2022) recommended that a site survey also be completed to provide an updated landfill topography to document waste settling since 2012 and document existing engineered features on the site. Therefore, the 70-acres currently designated for solid waste activities and setbacks will be surveyed by SEH as part of Task 2 including site topography and landfill features.

Note: Costs associated with a property boundary survey are not included in the Task 2 services but can be provided upon request for an additional fee.

#### TASK 3 | PERMITTING APPROACH

The City has indicated that their future plans regarding the AIM Landfill have not been finalized including the type of waste to be accepted and anticipated waste flows. Knowing waste types and waste flows will determine the approach, regulatory requirements, and resulting content of the Permitting Documents.

We proposed as part of Task 3 to present the following information to the City regarding the landfill's future:

- SEH will review the past cost estimates for closure prepared by others and update as appropriate to
  allow assessment of closure costs under a 12-acre closure scenario. Based on updated unit costs,
  closure costs for a consolidated footprint of less acreage will also be estimated to allow the City to
  understand costs that will impact operations as well as financial assurance calculations.
- A summary of landfill design and operation requirements for maintaining the Industrial Solid Waste
  Landfill permit or converting the facility to a Demolition Landfill. The landfill designation will determine
  which regulatory requirements must be followed in reference to the design criteria (liner, leachate
  collection, and final cover) or they types of industrial solid waste that can be accepted.

The preferred approach for the Permitting Documents will be discussed with the City to determine the approach for the remaining permitting tasks.

#### TASK 4 | PERMIT APPLICATION/CHECKLISTS/FINAL PRINT

The MPCA Application Form entitled Permit Application for the Issuance, Reissuance, or Major Modification (revised May 16, 2022) will be completed along with required supporting documentation. Once completed, the Application Form will be forwarded to the Client for signatures associated with local acknowledgement as well as owner and operator. Darryl Heaps will certify the final version as Professional Engineer. Depending on the determinations of Task 3, the following MPCA checklists will also be completed as needed as part of the Permit Application Form:

- Solid Waste Facility Application Checklist (revised June 30, 2011)
- Industrial Solid Waste Landfill Application Checklist (revised June 30, 2011)
- Demolition Debris Land Disposal Facility Application Checklist (revised June 30, 2011)
- Hydrogeologic Evaluation Form for Demolition Landfills (March 2006)

Bound copies of the final Permitting Documents must be provided to the MPCA. A bound copy will also be provided to the City.

#### **TASK 5 | DESIGN REPORT**

Because the AIM Landfill is an existing landfill that dates back more than 30 years, historical documentation on permitting, construction, and water quality monitoring provide an important basis for current and future operations. In preparation of the Design Report, SEH will request copies of critical documents from the MPCA for prior design, construction, and monitoring to be used in conjunction with more recent documents provided by AIM to establish existing site conditions at the facility.

Minnesota Rules 7001 and 7035 outline line required information to be submitted with the Permit Application form for solid waste disposal facilities including a design report that addresses landfill siting criteria, type of wastes to be received, and existing/proposed design of the facility to meet regulatory requirements. In addition, open and active landfills are also required to obtain and follow an NPDES Industrial Stormwater Permit. Depending on the determinations of Task 3, a Design Report will be prepared as part of Task 5 to include the following information:

#### TASK 6 | OPERATIONS & MAINTENANCE PLAN

Minnesota Rules 7001 and 7035 outline line required information to be submitted with the Permit Application form for solid waste disposal facilities including an Operations & Maintenance Plan (O & M Plan) to establish the day-to-day operating criteria including waste acceptance, leachate management, groundwater monitoring, and additional plans to outline requirements for closure, post-closure, contingency action, and industrial waste management. In addition, to comply with the NPDES Industrial Stormwater Permit, a Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) will be developed as part of Task 6. Depending on the determinations of Task 3 and information presented in the Design Report, a site-specific O & M Plan will be prepared as part of Task 6 to include the following information:

#### 1. Landfill Operations

- a. Site Management and Administration
- b. Waste Handling
- c. Response to Site Conditions
- d. Field Forms/Schedule

#### 2. Leachate & Landfill Gas Management Plan

- a. Characterization
- b. Procedures and Responsibilities
- c. Contingencies

#### 3. Facility Monitoring Plan

- a. Existing Monitoring System
- b. Total Facility Requirements

#### 4. Facility Plans

- a. Closure Plan
- b. Post-Closure Plan
- c. Contingency/Emergency Response Plan
- d. Industrial Solid Waste Management Plan
- e. Industrial Stormwater SWPPP

#### TASK 7 | FINANCIAL ASSURANCE PLAN

A Financial Assurance Plan and cost estimates must be developed for the facility as defined in Minnesota Rules 7035.2685. Although previous cost estimates were prepared by prior consultants and reviewed as part of Task 3, costs estimates will be modified and updated based on the design and operating criteria established under Task 5 and 6. Cost estimates associated with the Closure, Post-Closure, and Contingency Action Plans will be evaluated in reference to the City's selected financial assurance mechanism. Anticipated waste flows and monitory factors will be compared against plan and updated as appropriate. The Financial Assurance Plan will include:

- Closure Cost Estimates
- Post-Closure Cost Estimates
- Contingency Action Cost Estimates
- Financial Assurance Payment Calculation

The MPCA payment estimating table will be used in conjunction with MPCA-assigned discount and inflation rates to calculate the updated monthly payment for the financial assurance fund.

#### TASK 8 | DRAWINGS

Minnesota Rules 7001 and 7035 outline line required information to be submitted with the Permit Application form for solid waste disposal facilities including permit design drawings. Plans, including the Permit Application, Design Report, and Drawings must be prepared by a registered engineer of Minnesota. As part of the Permitting Documents, SEH is not proposing any "new" design, but instead will prepare selected new drawings and reference previously approved design drawings to demonstrate compliance and operations in association with the original permitted design as issued in the 2009 solid waste permit to Verso Paper.

Depending on the determinations of Task 3 and information presented in the Design Report, Permit Drawings will be prepared as part of Task 8 to include the following information:

- 1. Title Sheet
- 2. Site Plan and Existing Conditions Map (based with Task 2 Survey)
- 3. Facility Monitoring Plan (updated with Task 2 Survey)
- 4. Groundwater Contour Map (based on most recently available water level data)
- 5. Top of Liner Base Grades (existing design drawings prepared by others)
- 6. Leachate Management Plan (existing design drawings prepared by others)
- 7. Final Cover Grades (developed/updated to provide capacity/life expectancy of landfill)
- 8. 10-Year Closure Plan (developed/updated as defined by the MPCA)
- 9. Phase Development Plan (developed/updated to provide capacity/life expectancy of landfill)
- 10. Details (new details based on new final cover; existing details prepared by others)

(Note: In the future, if new design is to be pursued for "new" landfill cell construction, the original design drawings compatible with AutoCAD would be the most cost-effective source of information to use for contiguous design drawings and calculations.)

#### TASK 9 | MEETINGS/CORRESPONDENCE

Initial meetings with MPCA will be important in establishing any information requested by MPCA staff. Therefore, as part of Project Management, SEH will prepare for and participate in a meeting between the City representatives and the assigned MPCA staff to establish permitting requirements. In addition, we have included up to two additional meetings with the City staff for interim reviews and discussions.

Following submittal of the Permitting Documents, the MPCA must review the application for completeness. SEH's experience with the MPCA suggests that the MPCA may request additional information or clarification of some issues. As necessary, SEH will prepare written responses to comments provided by the MPCA on the completeness of the application and an estimated dollar amount has been projected. Once technical completeness has been achieved, the MPCA will provide a draft of the solid waste permit prior to being placed on its 30-day public notice. SEH will review the draft permit, discuss in issues with the City, and provide written comments to the MPCA for consideration for the final permit.

#### TASK 10 | PFAS MONITORING COORDINATION

The City of Sartell has elected to participate in a third-party PFAS Study being coordinated through a Landfill Coalition of private and public landfills across the state. As part of that study, it is our understanding that the City has retained the services of Barr Engineering to coordinate sample collection and laboratory analysis for PFAS compounds and the development of a statewide report. The City has requested SEH to coordinate with Barr Engineering and existing sampling contractors for two facilities as follows:

- **SW-279: Sartell Municipal Landfill:** Braun Intertec is currently contracted to collect monitoring samples at the facility.
- **SW-281: AIM Industrial Landfill:** MVTL will be contracted directly with the City to collect monitoring samples at the facility as part of a prior SEH Agreement.

Coordination of the PFAS sampling will occur over the next 12 months with services summarized as follows:

- 1. SEH will complete online surveys developed by Barr Engineering to provide site-specific information for each facility.
- 2. Prior to the first PFAS sampling event at the Sartell Municipal Landfill, SEH will coordinate with Braun Intertec to prepare an addendum (just for the PFAS monitoring) to their Sampling and Analysis Plan and submit to the MPCA.
- 3. Prior to the first PFAS sampling event at AIM Landfill, SEH will prepare an addendum (just for the PFAS monitoring) to the Sampling and Analysis Plan and submit to the MPCA. We anticipate the first PFAS sampling event to be completed in the fall of 2023 given that the City hasn't closed on the property.
- 4. Coordinate with each contractor for the first and second PFAS sampling events to be completed between April 1, 2023, and May 31, 2024, during routine monitoring events.

It is our understanding that the sampling contractors will be transporting PFAS samples directly to Pace Laboratories, the contracted laboratory for Barr Engineering. Invoicing of both Barr Engineering services and laboratory services will be sent directly to the City under the Barr Engineering agreement.

#### PROJECT SCHEDULE

It is our understanding that submittal of the Permitting Documents must be completed within 90 days of property transfer from AIM to the City of Sartell. Therefore, the schedule to complete Tasks 1 through 9 is dependent on the final closure date which will be coordinated with the City.

Schedules associated with Task 10 are defined in the services described above.

#### **COST ESTIMATE**

The 2023 Landfill Permitting Services is proposed as an hourly fee estimated to be \$69,950, including expenses. An additional fee of \$5,000 has been established for PFAS Monitoring Coordination. The fee does not include sampling and analytical services by a laboratory.

**BACKGROUND**: The Personnel Committee has been actively negotiating with incoming Chief of Police Brandon Silgjord since March. On March 13<sup>th</sup>, the City Council approved a Conditional Offer conditional upon completion and acceptance of a comprehensive background check and psychological exam, both managed by the Personnel Committee.

On March 15<sup>th</sup>, the psychological exam report was provided and completely successfully. On March 31<sup>st</sup>, the background check investigation summary report was provided and completed successfully with no disqualifying factors. The conditional offer is now removed, and the Personnel Committee recommends approval of the attached Employment Contract, which specifies the terms approved in the Conditional Offer. The employment contract is the same template as the City Administrator's contract but edited to be specific to law enforcement and Brandon Silgjord's specific agreed upon employment terms.

Brandon Silgjord will join the City of Sartell as the next Chief of Police on June 5<sup>th</sup>, 2023. He is already actively participating in departmental and leadership meetings in a part-time capacity in advance of his official start date.

#### City of Sartell, Minnesota Employment Agreement

**THIS AGREEMENT ("Agreement")** made this day of \_\_\_\_, 2023, by and between the CITY OF SARTELL, a Minnesota municipal corporation ("**Employer**"), and BRANDON SILGJORD ("**Employee**"). The parties agree as follows:

1. **POSITION.** Subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement, Employer agrees to employ Employee as Chief of Police for the Sartell Police Department. Employee agrees to serve as Chief of Police in accordance with all Federal laws, Minnesota Statutes and Employer Ordinances as well as in accordance with all Police Department policies and Employer Personnel Policies. Employee shall serve in accordance with the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) Code of Ethics, as they may be amended, as a preface to the mission and commitment law enforcement agencies make to the public they serve. Employee further agrees to perform his job responsibilities and duties as Chief of Police in accordance with the job description for the Chief of Police for the Employer, and as may be hereafter amended, and such other legally permissible and proper duties and functions as the City Council of the Employer shall from time-to-time assign. Employee shall devote Employee's full time and best efforts to the business and affairs of Employer.

As the Chief of Police, Employee will act as department head for the Sartell Police Department. As Department Head, Employee will report directly to the City Administrator and the City Council of the Employer.

Employee understands that the Chief of Police is a nonexempt position, is not a part of any Union and is considered an "employee at will."

- 2. **PENSION PLAN.** Employer shall contribute to PERA as required by State law for Employee or an alternate pension plan, if selected by Employee, and as authorized by State law. Employer shall also contribute \$4,800 annually toward Employee's deferred compensation plan through MNDCP, prorated into semi-annual installments.
- 3. **SALARY.** Employer shall pay Employee a salary of Pay Grade 19, Step 8 salary per year from the 2023 Compensation Plan and Pay Scale, starting \_\_\_\_\_\_\_, 2023. Employer and Employee agree that an initial performance review will be conducted on Employee after six (6) months and annually thereafter. The Employer utilizes a compensation plan for all employees and will increase Employee's compensation annually pursuant to the pay schedule grade for Chief of Police dependent upon the results of the annual performance evaluation.
- 4. **SENIORITY.** For purposes of employment benefits such as sick leave, vacation leave, and the like, Employee will be credited with having completed 11 years of employment with the Employer upon his/her first day of employment. Employee will move to the following accrual rate upon one year of continuous employment with the Employer and a positive performance evaluation.
- 5. **SICK LEAVE.** Effective upon Employee's first day of employment, Employee shall accrue 96 Hours/year (8 hours per month or 3.7 hours per pay period). Employee shall be awarded 440 Hours of Sick Leave upon Employee's first day of employment. In addition, Employee shall accrue sick leave in accordance with the Employer's Personnel Policy and

item number four above.

- 6. **VACATIONS.** Effective upon Employee's first day of employment, Employee shall accrue 13.334 hours of vacation leave per month and be credited with 80 hours Starting Vacation Bank. In addition, Employee shall accrue vacation leave in accordance with the Employer's Personnel Policy and item number four above.
- 7. **HOLIDAYS.** Employer shall provide Employee the same holidays as enjoyed by other non-union employees, per the Personnel Policy.
- 8. **INSURANCE.** Employee shall, subject to the terms and conditions of any applicable benefits, plan documents, and applicable law, be entitled to receive all benefits of employment generally available to other department heads of Employer when and as Employee becomes eligible for them, including medical, dental, vision, life, and disability insurance, and PERA as required by state law or an alternate pension plan, if selected by Employee and authorized by state law.
- 9. **DUES AND SUBSCRIPTIONS.** Employer shall budget and pay the professional dues and subscriptions for Employee which are deemed reasonable and necessary for Employee's continued participation in national, regional, state and local associations necessary and desirable for Employee's continued professional participation, growth and advancement, per the annual approved budget as developed and approved by the Employee and Employer.
- 10. **PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT.** Employer shall budget and pay necessary and reasonable registration, travel and subsistence expenses of Employee for professional and official travel, meetings and occasions adequate to continue the professional development of Employee and to adequately-pursue necessary official and other committees thereof which Employee serves as a member. Employee shall use good judgment in his/her outside activities so he/she will not neglect his primary duties to the Employer. This includes annual attendance at the MN Chiefs of Police Conference and National IACP Conference.
- 11. **CIVIC CLUB MEMBERSHIP.** Employer recognizes the desirability of representation in and before local civic and other organizations. Employee is authorized to become a member of such civic clubs or organizations as deemed appropriate by Employee and Employer, and at Employer's expense, if approved by the City Council of Employer.
- 12. **GENERAL EXPENSES.** Employer shall provide reimbursement for Chief of Police's cell phone up to \$50 a month. Employer shall reimburse Employee reasonable miscellaneous job-related expenses which it is anticipated Employee will incur from time to time when provided appropriate documentation in accordance with the Employer's Personnel Policy.
- 13. **UNIFORM ALLOWANCE.** The Employer will provide the Employee with an annual uniform allowance of up to \$950. The uniform allowance may be used for the maintenance and replacement of uniforms and equipment used by the Employee in the course of his duties as Chief of Police, with the standard issue items being of first priority. The uniform allowance will be paid upon presentation of an invoice or receipt documenting the purchase of uniforms and/or equipment eligible for reimbursement. The first and initial uniform upon starting employment will be provided, at no cost, to the Employee by the

Employer.

- 14. **HOURS OF WORK.** The Chief of Police position is an "Exempt" position under the Fair Labor Standards Act. It is understood the position of Chief of Police requires attendance at evening meetings and occasionally at weekend meetings. It is understood by Employee that additional compensation and compensatory time shall not be allowed for such additional expenditures of time. It is further understood that Employee may absent himself/herself from the office to a reasonable extent in consideration of extraordinary time expenditures for evening and weekend meetings at other than normal working hours. However, Employee agrees to devote their full time, attention, and energy, which is reasonably necessary for the Chief of Police, to faithfully perform the duties of the position.
- 15. **CERTIFICATIONS AND LICENSES.** Employee shall maintain certification as a police officer in the State of Minnesota through the Peace Officer and Standards Training (P.O.S.T.) Board and shall maintain a valid Minnesota Driver's License throughout active employment with the Employer. Employee shall obtain, if not already obtained, certification as a Chief Law Enforcement Officer (CLEO), as required by Minnesota statute and the P.O.S.T. Board, for the Police Department of Employer. Employee shall act as the CLEO for the term of this Agreement.
- 16. **RESPONSE TIME.** Employee shall reside within a 30-minute response distance from the Sartell Police Department building and be provided a take-home squad for within this response time.
- 17. **GENERAL CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT.** Nothing in this Agreement shall prevent, limit, or otherwise interfere with the right of Employer to terminate the services of Employee at any time, for any reason, subject only to the provisions of this Agreement and statutory requirements. Furthermore, nothing in this Agreement shall prevent, limit or otherwise interfere with the right of Employee to resign at any time from his/her position with Employer, subject only to the provisions of this Agreement.
- 18. **TERMINATION BENEFITS**. In the event the Employee is terminated by the Employer during such time that Employee is willing and able to perform the duties of Chief of Police, then in that event, Employer agrees to pay Employee at the time of receipt of his/her last paycheck a lump sum cash payment equal to 6 months aggregate salary and to continue to provide and pay for the benefits set forth in this agreement for a period of 6 months following termination. However, in the event Employee is terminated for cause because of a failure to meet all conditions of this agreement as determined by the Employer Attorney, his/her willful neglect of duty, inefficiency or incompetence in office after reasonable written notice, malfeasance in office, gross misconduct, conviction of a felony, conviction of an illegal act involving personal gain to Employee, a violation of the IACP Code of Ethics, or a violation of the City of Sartell's Personnel Policy as determined by the Employer Attorney, then the Employer shall have no obligation to pay the termination benefits cited herein within.

If Employer at any time during the employment term reduces the salary or other financial benefits of Employee in a greater percentage than across-the-board reduction for all non-union employees, or if Employer refuses, following written notice, to comply with any other provisions of this Agreement benefiting Employee, then Employee may, at his/her option, be deemed to be "terminated" on the effective date of Employee's resignation and the Employee shall also be entitled to receive the termination benefits set forth above.

If Employee voluntarily resigns his/her position with Employer, Employee agrees to give the Employer thirty (30) days advance notice in order to separate in good standing. If Employee voluntarily resigns his/her position with Employer, there shall be no termination pay due to Employee.

19. **INTEGRATION.** This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the Employer and Employee, and supersedes all prior oral and written agreements, understandings, commitments, and practices between them, whether or not fully performed. No oral modifications, express or implied, may alter or vary the terms of this agreement. No amendments to this Agreement may be made except by a writing signed by both parties. Neither Employee nor Employer are authorized to alter or vary the terms of this Agreement except as provided in this Employment Agreement. Any representations contrary to this Agreement, express or implied, written or oral, are hereby disclaimed. Employee acknowledges receipt of the Employer's Personnel Policy Handbook and agrees to abide by the policies set forth in the Personnel Policy Handbook as it may be amended. #### VAL SMITH PARK FIELD LEASE AGREEMENT

This Agreement ("Agreement") is made effective \_\_May 1\_, 2023, by and between \_\_Sauk Rapids Baseball\_ Association ("Association") and City of Sartell ("City").

Now, therefore, Association and City agree as follows:

#### 1. Field Use.

Association will have secondary use of Val Smith Regional Park for recreational and travel baseball fields on scheduled dates starting June 1<sup>st</sup> and ending October 31<sup>st</sup> each year. Association agrees to provide a practice schedule to City on or before May 15<sup>th</sup> and City may use the fields during the lease term for other scheduled activities which do not conflict with Association's scheduled use, including leasing to other baseball associations, in City's sole discretion. The Sartell Baseball Association shall have primary first right of refusal to the baseball fields.

#### 2. Field Prep and Conditions.

City will mow, maintain, set up and stripe the fields for baseball use according to the schedule provided. The City will be responsible for all chemicals and spraying.

The City reserves the right to cancel play if weather conditions have made the Fields unplayable or will create damage to the Fields if played upon. City will coordinate any cancellations with Association prior to 3 pm.

#### 3. Responsibilities.

City will be responsible for field preparations and maintenance described above, as well as refuse collection. City will provide parking for Association. City will provide portable toilets.

Primary point of contact for this agreement, responsibilities, and maintenance is the City Park Supervisor.

#### 4. Lease Payment.

Association agrees to pay City the sum of \$350 for the season's use, payable on or before October 1<sup>st</sup>. There will be an annual cost of living increase to the lease payment, equivalent to the National cost of living increase.

#### 5. Insurance.

Association will maintain comprehensive commercial general liability insurance with a minimum liability limit of at least \$1,000,000 each occurrence, \$2,000,000 aggregate, and will provide City with a certificate of such insurance, naming City as additional insured.

#### 6. Indemnification.

Association agrees to hold harmless defend and indemnify City, and its employees, volunteers, and agents for injury to, death of, or damage to any Association's property or

third person or persons, arising from Association's performance or failure to perform its duties under this Agreement. City agrees to hold harmless defend and indemnify Association, and its employees, volunteers, and agents for injury to, death of, or damage to any City property or third person or persons, arising from the City's performance or failure to perform its duties under this Agreement.

7. Assignment.

Association may not assign this lease or sublease the property without first obtaining the prior, written consent of City.

8. **Term.** The term of this agreement is three years in length, from 2022 through 2024. A 90-day written notice is required for termination and must be due to cause.

8. Entire Agreement.

This is the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes and replaces any oral or written agreements which may have been given. This Agreement may not be amended or modified by either party except in a written document signed by both of the parties.

# CHAPTER 1:

Park System Overview + Summary



### Parks Introduction

### History of Sartell Park Development

The story of the Sartell Park System comes from years of volunteer groups fundraising and creating some of the most desirable facilities in the State of Minnesota. In addition to volunteer board and association led facilities, the large majority of Sartell's park system were created by residential developments (neighborhood parks) or longtime regional parks, such as Watab and Val Smith.

The Mississippi and Watab Rivers flow through the middle of the city and serve as primary sources of natural beauty. Sartell's Parks are also primary sources of attraction within the City and provide many active and passive recreational opportunities for youth, seniors, and families.

The City is continually challenged to keep pace with growing demands for park and recreational facilities. There is currently 11 acres of parkland per 1,000 residents, which meets the City goal of 10 acres of parkland per 1,000 residents.

Sartell has 29 active parks and a handful of natural greenways with approximately 70 miles of trails. The city's trail system connects with multiple community facilities as they are developed.

### **Park Naming**

Parks have historically been named from a variety of different sources – including the residential developer, natural features located in or near the park, or major funders/sponsorships to the park. This is evident throughout the City, from The Wilds Park in the Wilds Development to Watab Park near the Watab River, to Rotary or Lions Parks.

#### Notable Parks and Facilities Developments

Scheels Athletic Complex located in Pinecone Regional Park is an indoor multi-sport athletic complex fundraised and managed by the Sartell Youth Rec Board. Pinecone Central Park is an outdoor multi-sport athletic complex created by the Pinecone Central Park Association (now dissolved) and managed by the City. St. Cloud Orthopedics Field is the premier amateur baseball field in the Region.

### Department Structure

The Sartell Parks Department was created in 2022, when the City began management of Pinecone Central Park and the Pinecone Central Park Association dissolved.

Seven full time employees make up the parks department staff team, as well as part time and seasonal employees. The full-time staff members include:

- ▶ Parks and Recreation Director
- Park Lead
- ▶ Park Maintenance (5)

## Intent of the Master Plan

The intent of this plan is to provide guidance for how to grow and maintain existing and future parks for the next 5-10 years for the Department by integrating community input and current services and infrastructure with best practices in park planning standards.

### How to Use the Plan

Sartell's Master Park Plan is organized into four chapters. The different chapters can be referenced individually to understand where the Sartell parks system is today, what recommendations there are for the future, and how those recommendations are prioritized to address to future needs.

- ▶ Chapter One introduces and provides context for the plan with a history of the system and the guiding principles for Sartell's parks.
- Chapter Two outlines the value of parks, national and local trends that impact current and future development and the use of parks systems, and a summary of community input.
- ▶ Chapter Three includes detailed information about the system's existing conditions, needs, recommendations, and supplemental or precedent projects. The chapter is organized into sections:
  - Parks and Facilities Plan
  - · Trails and Connectivity Plan
  - Marketing Plan
- Chapter Four provides implementation tools, including priorities to assist with future decision-making, general cost estimates, and potential funding sources.

Throughout the entire plan, yellow call out boxes are used to provide supplemental information.

The system plan is supplemented by three appendices.

- ▶ Appendix A: The first appendix includes 11x17 maps that inventory the system's facilities and parks.
- ▶ Appendix B: The second appendix includes the peer community comparison and the NRPA Metrics used to identify comparisons of Sartell's number and types of parks and recreation facilities to other similar communities.
- ▶ Appendix C: The third appendix contains all of the input received during the community engagement process, including a list of Key Findings.

It is important to recognize that the recommendations contained within this plan do not constitute all possible future actions. Instead, this Park Master Plan provides a framework to guide future decision-making. Given the 10-year time frame, it is anticipated that the Park Master Plan may need to change as the community responds to future trends, needs, and opportunities.


The following specific tasks and actions were undertaken:

- ▶ Engage the community members and obtain input and desires for the future of parks in Sartell.
- ▶ Develop a long-range guide for Sartell's parks and trails to include a list of priorities and goals for future decisions about park investments.
- Prioritize actions to ensure the parks system meets community needs now and in the future.
- Create Park Inventory maps identifying park characteristics and facilities.
- ▶ Provide guidance on operations and maintenance.

### **Guiding Principles**

The City's most recent Comprehensive Plan document was completed in 2016. It identifies goals, policies, and plans related to land use, the natural environment, transportation, parks and trails, and community facilities and infrastructure. Some of the major parks and trails goals from the 2016 Comprehensive Plan include:

- ▶ Goal #1: Value Passive Recreation Passive recreation generally enhances the open-space aspect of a park by providing a minimal intensity of development for "unstructured" recreation opportunities, such as walking, picnics, and exercise. Active recreation, on the other hand, involves more intensive development for ball fields or aquatic centers, and typically includes programmed activities. By focusing on passive recreation spaces, Sartell provides a unique opportunity to connect with nature, and its trail network provides connections to major amenities like a future downtown.
- ▶ Goal #2: Prioritize Existing Parks Sartell has spent much of the last decade creating new parks to respond to the citizen-approved ½-cent sales tax. While more park spaces are planned, ensure that existing parks are maintained so that they remain attractive assets. New parks increase the City's operating costs and responsibilities. As such, focus dollars toward enhancing existing parks before creating new ones.
- ▶ Goal #3: Ensure the Parks & Trails are Safe to promote expanded use of the parks and at all times of the day, maintaining park safety is a critical goal for Sartell.
- ▶ Goal #4: Expand the Park Connections & Trail Network Improving existing parks and ensuring that they are safe is the current priority for Sartell. However, this does not mean we should not think ahead about ways to improve connectivity of the trail network. Sartell's trail system is extensive, but there are a few missing links. An effective trail network is one that is connected and fully integrated into the City's neighborhoods and regionally.
- ▶ Goal #5: Recognize the Mississippi, Watab, Sauk, and other Rivers and Natural Areas as a Mahor Recreational, Economic, and Open Space Asset to the Community.





From the goals outlined in the 2016 Comprehensive Plan, Guiding Principles for the Parks Department have been developed. Guiding Principles are the statements that capture and define the character and values of the Sartell's Parks Department. They will be used by staff and elected officials to guide high level decision making in the parks system. These principles have been referenced when defining recommendations and priorities.



### **Community Identity**

Use a consistent design signature in the design of parks, trails, amenities, and facilities throughout Sartell to convey a community identity. The Community Identity should match the Sartell brand.



#### **Natural Areas Preservation**

Preserve land for future generations through the acquisition of high-quality natural areas for parks, open space, river access, and trail corridors. Acknowledge and protect the Mississippi, Watab, and Sauk Rivers as major recreational and economic assets to the community.



### **Access and Connectivity**

Maintain and develop a well-connected trail network throughout the community including sidewalks, on-road trails, and off-road greenway corridors. Ensure the appropriate trail support facilities, such as trailheads, signage, garbage's, and benches, are provided for high level experiences. Connect neighborhoods to destinations, such as schools, commercial areas, city facilities, river access points, and adjacent communities.



### **Service and Communication**

Parks staff provide helpful and responsive service to Sartell's residents and visitors. Information on parks, facilities, and programming is communicated effectively, easily accessible, and promoted to the community.



### **Quality over Quantity**

Focus on development of specific, prioritized high quality parks facilities in the community rather than build additional facilities of lower quality. Avoid duplication of facilities that may be provided by other agencies in the community. Take care of what we have before building new.



### Sustainability

Ensure sustainable maintenance and replacement of existing parkland facilities. When investing in new parks and facilities, ensure that appropriate planning considers long term maintenance and replacement needs.



### Fiscal Responsibility

Ensure that department budgeting reflects efficient and organized management of capital investments, maintenance, and operations spending, and staffing levels to provide necessary and desired parks services.

### **Local Context**

Sartell is a growing Minnesota community of just over 20,000 residents located at the center of the State of Minnesota and in the St. Cloud metro area. The City anticipates growth of its parks, recreation, and trails in line with its developing neighborhoods in order to serve its residents now and into the future.

Sartell experienced increased growth in the late 1990s which continued into the mid-2000s. While residential growth has slowed in retrospect to the 1990's and early 2000's, it is still growing considerably faster than most communities. Today, the City is growing at a steady pace, with an average of over 56.8 new residential units per year over the last five years and 5.2 commercial units per year over the last five years. The past five years have seen an increased interest in commercial development to match the increase in population.

Located in Stearns and Benton Counties, Sartell is one of the most desirable places to live in the region. Sartell is home to the Sartell-St. Stephen School District 748, which is ranked in the top 20 in the State of Minnesota.

The most common job groups, by number of people living in Sartell, MN, are Healthcare (19%), Office & Administrative (11%), Business Management Occupations (18%) and Sales (10%) & Related Occupations.

### **Demographics**

Sartell's continues to rapidly grow. Sartell has grown 98.9% since the 2000. Sartell is growing moderately quickly; it is growing faster than 88% of similarly sized cities since 2000, with projections of reaching nearly 25,000 residents by 2035. It is the 61st largest city in the State of Minnesota.

Sartell's population is made up of young families with 48% of the population being between the ages of 20-45 years old and the median age being 33 years old. Over 60% of the housing units are owner-occupied, with the average family size being 3.31 people. Future job growth over the next ten years is predicted to be 33.8%, which is higher than the US average of 33.5%.


The population of Sartell is expected to grow 21% between now and 2035, while the population of Stearns County is expected to grow approximately 5.76% as a whole. Most of the County's growth between now and 2035 will be in Sartell.



## CHAPTER 2:

Values, Trends, and Changing Needs



## Value of Parks & Recreation

When people talk about the places they love in their city or neighborhood, parks and trails are at the top of the list. The community survey completed by the City in 2022 confirmed this. They are sources of community identity and pride, and parks and recreation are also essential to the physical, economic, environmental, and social health of cities and their residents. Quality parks, along with schools and safety, are typically the top three criteria people consider when choosing a place to live.



### Health & Wellness

A healthy recreation and park system equals healthy residents. Simply put, people who engage

in regular physical activity are healthier and happier. When people have access to parks, trails, and recreation, they exercise more. In addition, increased exposure to natural areas has been linked to improved physical and psychological health.

Recreation programs contribute to community health. Recreation programs offered for all ages (families, youth, adults, and seniors) promote life-long learning and a supportive community atmosphere. In Sartell, the recreational programming is primarily managed by the ISD 748 or well-established sports associations.

Recreation and Parks encourage play. Parks are often cited as people's favorite places. They are the places people go to have fun, relax, and play. Whether it's a place to play a game of soccer, garden with neighbors, take a quiet walk through the woods or go on a vigorous run with the dog, a balanced park and recreation system has something for everyone.

### Property Values

Parks and open space increase property values. Numerous studies show



that proximity to parks, trails, and open spaces increases residential property values. Parks and open space can also positively affect commercial property and can be catalysts for redevelopment. In the *REALTORS and Sustainability* 2018 Report, 59% of REALTORS listed proximity to parks and outdoor recreation as one of the top neighborhood features their clients look for when buying a house. ### **Beauty**

Parks contribute to aesthetics. Parkways, tree-lined streets, gardens, lush, landscaped areas, views of rivers and lakes, stately woods, and public art are all things that make a city a beautiful place to live, work, play, and shop. They make essential contributions to a city's livability and vitality.

### Natural Value & Environmental Benefits

Parks and open space provide environmental benefits. Trees and vegetation found in parks, preserves, and open spaces improve air and water quality and provide wildlife habitat. These areas also play a role in managing stormwater runoff and protecting natural areas.



### **Cultural & Social Amenity**

Parks preserve natural and cultural heritage. Significant natural features, such as large stands of woodlands, rivers, creeks, and lakes, are preserved for today's residents as well as for future generations.

Parks have important social benefits. Parks are often the focal points of neighborhoods. As places for neighborhood activities, celebrations, and informal interaction they provide places for community members to come together.

The above language has been developed by HKGi as a result of their analysis of industry research for park system planning.

### Trends in Parks and Recreation

The following parks and recreation trends have been identified as potentially having an impact on the planning and use of parks facilities in Sartell.





### **More Transient**

In order to relocate for a job, better schools, or up-size or down-size, people are moving more often now than in past decades. In order to keep local residents informed of offerings, parks and recreation departments should provide ample information through multiple outlets: City website, social media, and mailed/print publications.

### Trail Use

In many communities, trails are the most requested facility. As the popularity of walking, running, biking, and dog-walking have continued to increase, people are looking for trails that are safe and provide high quality experiences, including loops, off-road paved surfaces, and natural corridors.

The following trends analysis has been developed by HKGi using industry research and tailored to fit the context of the City of Sartell.





### Aquatic Facilities & Recreation Centers

Many communities provide or are being asked to provide high quality indoor and outdoor aquatic facilities and community or recreation centers that include options for all ages: senior center, teen center, preschool, meeting rooms, event facilities, indoor pool, indoor children's play area, and fitness center.

### High Quality Athletic Facilities

Artificial turf fields are becoming more popular as a way to provide reliable and flexible multi-use athletic fields that require little maintenance compared to natural turf fields. Tournament complexes with multiple features and amenities, such as covered dugouts, concession stands, permanent restrooms, shaded viewing areas, and warm up spaces are also becoming more in demand.





### **Green Alternatives**

Changing weather patterns, increased flooding, larger rain events, and increased development have brought attention to smart stormwater design and best practices for protecting the environment. Implementation of rain gardens, prairie restoration areas, and native landscaping along shorelines have become popular ways to improve the local landscape.

### Special Facilities & Non-Traditional Activities

There is more interest today in unique and non-traditional recreational activities as people are constantly discovering and learning about new ways to recreate. These include disc golf, dog parks, splash pads, and pickleball, among others.



### Universal Design & Accessibility

There is a need for public services, such as parks and recreation facilities, to be designed to meet the needs of all citizens in terms of accessibility and usability.



### **Aging Actively**

People are living longer today than ever before, and many seniors have a desire to stay active as they grow older. Activities, such as pickleball, swimming, walking, and biking, are popular among seniors.



### **Disconnected From Nature**

Digital devices, such as mobile phones, tablets, and laptops, provide constant distractions from the outdoors. Parks and recreation need to stay relevant to ensure youth and adults engage with the outdoors.



### Place-Making & Destination Facilities

Destination parks and special facilities, such as event spaces, amphitheaters, bars/restaurants in parks, and unique facilities have been popular developments in recent years as communities try to attract visitors and provide memorable experiences for their residents. Placemaking is a multi-faceted approach to the planning, design and management of public spaces. Placemaking capitalizes on a local community's assets, inspiration, and potential, with the intention of creating public spaces that promote people's health, happiness, and well-being.





Residents are more concerned about safety in parks and open spaces. Desired features include lighting in parks and along trails, security cameras, and open spaces with long sight lines.



### **Changing Winters**

As winter temperatures have varied in recent years, many communities are finding it difficult to maintain outdoor ice rinks, ski trails, and sledding hills. Refrigerated ice rinks and snow making have been used to provide reliable outdoor winter recreation facilities. Other flexible outdoor winter activities, such as fat tire biking, have become popular.



### Increasing Demands on Time

Changes in employment patterns are altering patterns of parks and recreation use and are creating more demand at new times. Notable trends include a shorter workweek, flexible work hours, home offices, and two income households. For example, use of parks during day hours by mothers with toddlers has decreased, but park use at day's end by young family groups has increased.

## Summary of Community Input

### Community Engagement Process

The process for gathering community input included reaching out with social media, email blasts, postings in parks and community buildings, and attending local events. There were three phases of engagement during the system planning process.

#### Phase 1

Phase 1 engagement included general outreach to inform residents of the project and get general feedback on issues and opportunities. Activities included:

- ▶ August-November 2022: Online engagement
  - Survey Monkey Questionnaire
  - Social Media Sharing of Survey
  - Sharing of Survey in Resident Newsletter
- ▶ November 22: Survey Access at all Polling Places

#### Phase 2

Phase 2 engagement presented the inventory and analysis of the system and gathered feedback on the key findings. Activities included:

- ▶ October 6th, 2022: Internal & Staff Review of Results
- ▶ April 10<sup>th</sup>, 2023: Presentation of Results to Council
- ▶ May 2023: Adoption of Parks Master Plan

#### Phase 3

Phase 3 engagement focused on reviewing the draft master plan recommendations and gathering feedback on priorities, with the end goal of approving a Master Parks and Trails Plan that would guide the City in years to come.

### Online Survey Responses

This online survey conducted during Phase 1 of the engagement process asked about how residents use current park facilities and what improvements or new facilities they are interested in seeing in Sartell in the future. (Advertised on social media, website, and at City facilities).

The survey received 320 responses. Compared to the City's population of 19,532, this means approximately 1.6% of residents participated in the survey. Compared to other similar parks and recreation system plan surveys completed by *HKGi*, Sartell received average participation.

Other communities' online survey participation for reference:

- ▶ 1.4% -- Elk River Parks and Recreation System Plan (2014) online survey: 300+ participants of 23,447 residents
- ▶ 3.8% -- Chanhassen Parks and Recreation System Plan (2016) online survey: 935 participants of 24,432 residents
- ▶ 1.4% -- Maple Grove Parks and Recreation System Plan (2017) online survey: 924 participants of 66,401 residents
- ▶ 3.6% -- Otsego Parks and Recreation System Plan (2018) online survey: 570 participants of 16,019 residents.



### **Online Community Engagement Summary**

An engagement strategy was implemented to better understand how residents and visitors feel about Sartell's Park System, as well as what they would like to see in the future. 

### Parks and Facilities Plan

### **Existing Conditions**

Sartell's parks system is relatively young, with many of the parks constructed within the past 10-20 years. The system includes several high-quality neighborhood parks with traditional amenities and features, such as play equipment and picnic shelters. Regional parks include larger amenities, including multi-use fields, basketball courts, splash pads, wading pools, and parking lots.

Unique features in the park system include a popular splash pad at Watab Park, an off-leash dog park at Pinecone Central Park, a mountain bike trail at Sauk River Regional Park, and an amateur baseball field at St. Cloud Orthopedics Field.

As noted in the demographics section of this plan, the City is growing rapidly and in the process of increasing the amenities available in the City, while ensuring we maintain what we have.

### Parks & Facilities Needs Assessment

#### Community Input

The community wide survey conducted during the summer/fall of 2022 included the following input specifically related to parks and facilities:

92% of respondents indicated that they have visited a Sartell park in the past year; the most visited facility was Pinecone Central Park at 25% of respondents. The next most visited facility was Watab Park at 21%.

Generally, respondents rated the **quality and maintenance** of park facilities in Sartell as
"satisfactory" or "very good" – 38% and 46%
respectively, with an average rating of 4.6. They
rated the overall appearance (upkeep) as
"satisfactory" and "very good" as well – 41% and
38%, and an average of 4.5. The quality of the
parks, trails, and greenways specifically in
neighborhoods or parks the respondent
frequented most often was "satisfactory" at 41%,
or an average of 4.1. Overall, respondents felt
satisfactory about the parks meeting their needs –
47% or an average of 4.1.

70% of survey respondents listed "amenities" as the top priority for the City; with the next top 2 being: appearance and maintenance (51% of respondents) and safety (41%); the item that scored the lowest was "arts" at 19%.

When asked which amenities to park development survey respondents prefer, respondents indicated the following of the following level of support among multiple provided preferences:

Pool	54%
Pickleball	37%
Water Access/Docks	29%

In addition, between 20-27% responded with a desire for outdoor equipment rental, covered shelters, splash pads, ski trails, and ice skating/hockey rinks.

52% of respondents shared that their favorite part about the Sartell Parks System is the variety of types of parks, locations, and that there are multiple to choose from, with 32% sharing that what they liked best is all of the trails (referenced walking, biking, paved, and variety). 21% shared that they like best that the parks are clean, well kept, nice, and maintained.

When asked if they have contacted City staff about the parks system in the past 12 months and how their would rate their experience, 38% shared that it was average (neither satisfied or dissatisfied), with 25% sharing they were satisfied.

The fact that you're even having a survey shows you care a little, so that's cool! I would highly recommend a kids playground area somewhere within pinecone Central Park. Also, nice job getting a Mr. Twisty in there!

Not sure if this relates to the parks system or not, but it would be great if the community center had a pool.

We would love to see waterfront walking paths and a community event park of some kind along the east side river front (old paper mill site). Consider Stillwater or Duluth's Canal Park for inspiration. Thanks for listening.

Keep up the good work. Fill gaps in trail system. I like the trail systems rather than sidewalks as the grass boulevard separation from roads gives me more comfort especially with training my kids on bicycles.

I appreciate the work, attention, and continued efforts toward improvement, particularly the collaborative approach.

#### Park Development Standards

In order to ensure an appropriate amount of park land within new developments, the City's development ordinance regulates the provision of park land when new developments are planned. The City has authority to decide if land or cash, or a combination thereof, will be required from a developer. Recently, the City has preferred cash in lieu of land due to the number of already available parks and trails within the City meeting the Park Master Plan standard of ½ mile radii from every neighborhood core.

The formula for calculating the fee paid by developers for parks in lieu of land dedication must adhere to Statuary requirements. Minnesota Statutes 462.358.2b(C) states that when the City elects to receive a cash fee in lieu of land dedication, the fee is 5% of the total square feet of land x \$1.64 for commercial and industrial properties only. The fee for residential development is \$978 per unit within the development. This includes multi-family residential development, as well.

#### Park Service Areas & Park Access

It is a generally accepted standard that neighborhood park access should be provided within 1/2 mile (about a 10-minute walk) of every resident in a community. The Park Access Gaps and Coverage Map identifies 1/2-mile radii from every neighborhood park or similar facility in Sartell. Future park locations and future park service areas are also identified.

Providing access to park facilities, both regionally and within neighborhoods, is important to the viability of any community. Accessibility is a top priority of the City, as identified in the many maps and plans provide. The City continues to explore creative and unique ways to connect parks and amenities in ways that are safe and accessible, such as pedestrian islands and flasher systems. Trail connections and open space corridors also serve to provide recreational amenities and connections.

### **Recommendations for Parks** and Facilities





### Manage Growth and Development

Sartell is growing rapidly. Residential neighborhoods are quickly occupying space that was once vacant agricultural land. The City should regularly evaluate park dedication and park development standards in order to ensure its vision of parks and trails is realized and able to be maintained. Prioritize care of current parks before creation of new parks via capital improvement dedicated funds from the development cash in lieu fees received.





### Provide Access to Neighborhood

Establish park service districts to ensure that neighborhood parks are approximately located to provide ½ mile service area from most residents. Continue to build Neighborhood Parks as new developments are added, if needed to meet the ½ mile radii.





### Manage Park Assets

Utilize an asset management system to plan for maintenance and replacement costs for existing and proposed facilities. Create a plan for replacement schedules of park assets.

With the acquisition of the former Mill Site, utilize this property as an opportunity to engage and embrace the recreational use of the Mississippi River, a premier destination within the City. This property could include parks, trails, docks, canoe/kayak launch exit points, pavilions, and outdoor sport amenities called for in the community input survey.





### Partner with School District to Provide Turf Athletic Fields

Consider long term Joint Use Agreement with ISD 748 to ensure care and maintenance of top tier athletic fields available to associations for practices and games.





#### Undertake a Feasibility Study for Pinecone Central Park Improvements

- ▶ A Feasibility Study involves hiring an architect or building expert to study the existing Pinecone Central Park systems, identify a set of potential improvements for the expandable property, and determine potential costs and impacts to the park by making those improvements.
- ▶ Utilize results of the community input to determine desired amenities for the expansion of Pinecone Central Park.
- ▶ The goal of the study will be to understand the potential costs and impact to expanding the Pinecone Central Park at a future date. Other potential improvements may be identified during the study process.

### Planning with the Future in Mind

As new projects are planned, designed, and constructed, it is important to remember that Sartell is a growing community. While facilities that exist today were built for a population of 10,000-20,000, facilities built over the next 5-10 years should be designed while considering a future population of 20,000-30,000, but also recognize that those same facilities may need to be expanded or upgraded to meet even larger populations in the next decades. Future projects should incorporate phasing plans in order to plan for organized additions and improvements.

### Supplemental Information

The following pages contain information that may be useful as reference when planning specific parks and facilities projects.

### **Athletic Tournament Complexes**

As a wider array of athletics is joining the field from which young and old can participate (lacrosse, soccer, football, cricket, disc golf, etc.), athletic fields and facilities are increasingly being asked to be multi-functional, flexible, accessible, and able to provide support facilities to participants and spectators. Cities and School Districts have been hearing the call for a number of elements desired when building or improving athletic fields. These include:

- ▶ High end Turf
- ▶ Irrigation
- ▶ Field lighting
- ▶ Covered Dugouts
- ▶ Concessions
- Spectator seating
- ▶ Play Areas













### Splash Pads and Outdoor Aquatic Facilities

Splash pads are becoming increasingly popular facilities that offer inexpensive outdoor recreation for participants and agencies. Facilities are typically accessible without admission fees or supervision. In the upper Midwest, it is important to consider freeze-thaw impacts to water lines and structural pieces.

In addition, the community survey expressed a desire amongst Sartell respondents for access to a pool. In the St. Cloud Metropolitan Area, there is currently not an existing outdoor pool for recreational use. This is an amenity to consider in park planning efforts.

### Neighborhood Park Design Process

When redeveloping or designing a new neighborhood park, it is important and essential to inform and involve the neighbors of the park. Utilizing a neighborhood park meeting to gather neighbors and City Commission members, city staff, and park designers to discuss how parks should be improved are advised. Neighborhood meetings are a useful exercise to inform residents of the plans and gather input on how to design improvements.









### River-Oriented Public Space

River-Oriented public spaces are great ways to encourage local residents to celebrate the unique location of their city and entice tourism with events and attractions all year long. Riverwalk or trail systems are a popular occurrence among river cities such as those in Northfield, MN, Durango, CO, Portland, OR, and San Antonio, TX. If planned carefully, these trail systems can set the stage for many other successful public spaces along riverbanks such as seating, shopping, dining, and festivals. It can allow many opportunities for experiencing both sides of the river with scenic foot bridges and native plantings for wildlife sightings. The Riverwalk in Northfield MN is the sight of the city's iconic River Walk Market Fair featuring local artists, entertainment, and local shopping. Pedestrianlevel lighting and small plaza spaces with bench seating help to create "moments" where users can stop to enjoy the scenery. Multiple dinning experiences can also be found along Northfield's Riverwalk, including the Contented Cow and Froggy Bottoms River Pub, both boasting unique outdoor patio spaces and a beautiful river-side experience. While Northfield's historic downtown faces away from the Riverwalk, it is centrally located and easy to access along the path. In the city of Durango, CO the Animas River Trail run for several miles, using five scenic foot bridges to connect bikers and hikers to numerous city parks, unique shops, and local watering holes like the Animas River Beer Garden, all nestled within the city's unique arid mountain landscape. These towns are well known for celebrating the rivers that help to define their scenic settings, using unique river walks, paths, and pedestrian bridges to create connection to unique local destinations like outdoor dining and shopping with beautiful water views. The Mississippi River through Sartell, with the historic pedestrian bridge, is a prime example of a potential River-Oriented Public Space and should be prioritized.

### **Community Center Facility**

Community centers are a great way to provide many different amenities and benefits to the members of a community. The Sartell Community Center includes additional amenities to be considered in the park/recreation system as a whole, including rooms for rent, programming activities, gym space, a walking track, kids play zone, and gathering spaces for community events. Despite the many great amenities the community center provides, variable costs can begin to overwhelm the city with maintenance and other needs to keep a center up to date and enjoyable for users. A priority to focus on the maintenance of the community center facility should be considered in park/recreation facility management. Key items to consider:

- Use of gym facilities will likely mean an immediate need for maintenance and repair of gym floors.
- Programming is a draw to the Community Center and with the City managing operations, recreational programming is a great way to engage residents in a park and recreation model, as well as build revenues.
- ▶ The Sartell-St. Stephen School District and Community Education provide multiple recreational programming opportunities within the community that the City will want to be sensitive and efficient in not duplicating, yet working in collaboration to maximize dollars, staff, and offerings to residents.
- ▶ There is a strong desire for additional aquatic features within the community, as the survey suggests. The City currently owns vacant land for future expansion of the Community Center and this should be considered in any aquatic center planning efforts. Locating an aquatic facility near the existing Community Center facility will make sense from a management perspective, as well as logistically.





- ▶ Understanding the current space of the Community Center, use of the space, and continued growth and demands to the Community Center will be key in maintenance and expansion. There is high demand from sport associations, as well as recreational use for pickleball. This creates competition for court space, as well as high demand on facility upkeep. It may be considered to expand court space or limit the facility to residents only.
- ▶ When considering expansion plans, there are multiple community center models available throughout the State of Minnesota that could be toured and modeled upon. This includes Monticello, Maple Grove, Plymouth, Becker, and Elk River.
- ▶ Many of the statewide community centers are built off a model with the area YMCA and this could be a strong consideration for Sartell as expansion plans take place. YMCA's are well equipped to manage, operate, and facilitate a strong recreational system that creates additional amenities and efficiencies.

### Sartell Community Gardens

Available for rental to Sartell residents, 20' x 20' plots at either North Ridge or East Side Garden. Community Gardens are a great way to enjoy fresh foods and fragrant flowers even if you don't have a garden on your property.







### Trails and Connectivity Plan

### **Existing Conditions**

Paved trails for walking, running, and biking exist within most parks in Sartell. Loop trails are provided in varying contexts, such as short loops within individual parks and longer loops using a combination of trails along roads and through parks. Sidewalks and wide paved shoulders along collector roads supplement paved trails for walking and biking.

Two regional trail corridors are planned in Sartell: the Sauk River Regional Park trail system and the newly installed River Road (Linear Park) trail system. The future goal is for Linear Park to connect to the former Mill Site via the historic pedestrian bridge.

#### Maintenance and Operation of Trails

City trails will be plowed on a priority level basis. Trails that provide access to schools and that run along streets will be plowed after the streets. Trails that are located within the interior of parks will be plowed during the regular workday as time allows.

The trail plan is integral to both Sartell's park system as well as transportation providing access to scenic and recreational areas of the community and region. The trail plan attempts to strike a balance between recreation and transportation objectives of the City and subsequently provides a plan for a comprehensive multiple purpose trail system. In addressing both the recreational and transportation aspects of the trail system, the following elements were considered:

- ▶ Trails must be accessible to the users. Densely populated areas of the City should receive high priority when considering trail routes. Trail development in areas of greatest user demand achieves the best utilization of trail facilities and the highest return on the capital investment.
- ▶ To encourage trail use, trails must be planned to connect important trail user destinations. Popular recreational and commuter destinations include major residential neighborhoods, school sites, park sites, shopping areas, park and ride sites, centers of employment, and civic events and activities.

- The trail system is intended to promote recreational use as well as offer an alternative mode of transportation. To accomplish this objective, the Trail System Plan recommends multiple purpose trails and trail routes that divert from the adjacent to streets to take advantage of natural areas or unique vistas that may improve the recreational experience of the trail system users. Through the coordination of trails adjacent to and off of street corridors and implementation of a complete trail system plan, the City will meet the needs of both the commuter and recreational trail user.
- ▶ Trail user protection is another important concern when determining the route and type of trail. To provide the utmost protection to the trail user, trails separated from the street corridor by boulevard are preferred whenever possible.
- ▶ It is this plan's intention to provide routings which will not burden the City with high acquisition and construction costs. Trail rights-of-way will be acquired as part of the dedication process of a subdivision or included as streets are built or improved within the City right-of-way.
- Establishment of trails in conjunction with park development can expand the service area of neighborhood parks through improved access making trail planning integral to future neighborhood park development

# Trails and Connectivity Needs Assessment

#### Community Input

The community wide survey conducted during the summer/fall of 2022 included the following input specifically related to trails and connectivity:

42% of respondents indicated that feel the quality of the trails and greenways are satisfactory, with 29% stating they are "very good." The overall rating of the quality of the trails and greenways was 4.6 out of 6.0.

One of the top reasons respondents identified about what they like best regarding the Sartell Parks System is the trails. 32% respondents stated this was the best feature about the Sartell Park System. The Sartell Park System holds a combined 68+ miles of trails and growing.

15% of survey respondents listed "trails" as something they wish to improve about the Sartell Park System.

Accessibility was the #4 priority listed by survey respondents for the City to focus on.

Would like to see more trails lit up better. The trails on 19th Ave would be nice to have lights. See people on it frequently in the dark.

It would be nice to see the running trails better taken care of in the wintertime.

Extensive trails around town and easy access to parks.

The trails. Love the paved trails that connect the entire City.

Love the new mountain bike trails.

Paved trail system that connects them all and their tidiness.

I like the variety of activities available. Ball fields, playgrounds, biking and walking paths, dog park, even the new mountain bike trails!

# Recommendations for Trails and Connectivity



#### Identify Trail Loops in the Community

Trail loops are desired as they allow trail users to track distance and experience variation in scenery during a walk, run, or bike. They are shown on Figure 9. In the future, more trail loops should be added as trails are built. Considerations for trail loops include:

- ▶ Distance (1 mile, 5-mile, 10 mile)
- ▶ Access points parking, connection to parks or retail areas, schools, etc.
- ▶ Trail experience on-road vs. off-road, through natural areas
- ► Trail surface sidewalk, bituminous, or natural surface



## Provide a Trail Map for Winter Trail Maintenance

Identify priority trails and sidewalks that will be plowed in winter months, to ensure a complete network for safety and recreational purposes that residents can plan for and utilize.



## Identify Trail Connections to Mississippi River

Work with DNR and related agencies to continue to expand the trail network in and around the Mississippi River, especially with the acquisition of the Mill Site.







#### Establish a Plan for Trail Access and Wayfinding Signage

Create a template for park identity signs, wayfinding and directional signs that represent the character of Sartell and highlight the importance of parks and trails in the community.







# Prioritize Trail Gaps & Safety in Funding Applications

Continue to seek funding for identified trail gaps, as well as pedestrian islands and flasher systems that promote safety for trails and residents. Consider lighting along trails when constructing new trails.

## Trail Planning with Stearns County

The City of Sartell should continue working with Stearns County staff to develop safe pedestrian connections between Sartell and the Stearns County Mississippi River County Park north of Sartell, as well as along County Road 1 north of 12th Street North as Sartell continues to expand.

#### Community Identity and Branding- LIVE SARTELL

Community branding has become more of an industry in recent years as communities have struggled to keep and attract young people and families to reside in their communities. In 2022, the City embarked on a rebranding initiative to enhance the City logo and community branding.

In 2023, the City formally approved the new Sartell brand, as well as the "Live Sartell" theme. Within this brand initiative, a brand guide and required features were established that should be utilized and followed in all parks planning. In addition, the rebranding initiative developed "Live Sartell – it's not where you live, but how you live that matters" as a core theme for the parks, recreation, and community engagement features.

Other community identity and branding tools include gateway signage, streetscaping enhancements, and park signage.







# CHAPTER 4:

# **Implementation**



# How to Use this Chapter

The purpose of this chapter is to identify the projects and priorities for achieving the System Plan Recommendations. This chapter more specifically calls out projects, estimated timelines, and estimated costs that can be used to plan for budgeting and staffing needs. Funding options and sources are identified that will serve as a reference when looking at how to achieve projects. General parks and trails costs are listed for reference and a process is outlined for how to make decisions about potential projects.

### **Priority Actions**

The priorities for the future of the Sartell Parks System are pulled from the System Plan recommendations. The recommendations have been translated into actions, which are categorized as one of the following:

- City Projects / Actions are projects that the City will undertake directly. These could be funded by the City's general fund, park dedication fees, or referendum. City staff will manage these projects and they will typically be owned and operated by the City.
- Development-Related Projects include projects that will occur because of another project, sometimes directed by another agency.
- ▶ Partnerships are projects, joint use agreements, or programming that will be paid for, led, or operated by the City in coordination with another agency, organization, or entity.

#### City Projects / Actions (Ten-Year Capital Funding Implementation Plan)

The following projects have been identified to be incorporated into the City's CIP for future parks development. The table identifies the project, a cost range, and the priority level. The priority levels are described below:

- ▶ **Short term** projects are highest priority, and ideally would be completed before the long-term projects. They are accounted for in our Capital Improvement Planning via a variety of different funds.
- ▶ Long term projects are important projects, but due to high cost, non-immediate needs, or more planning that needs to be done, these won't be completed until after the short-term projects are complete. If opportunities arise that make the long-term projects more feasible in the short term, they will be completed earlier.
- ▶ Ongoing initiatives are projects that are ongoing and funded by general or operational funds. These projects may include general maintenance and replacement to existing facilities.



## **Funding Options**

While a parks system is an essential component of the quality of life in a community, ensuring sufficient funding can be challenging when compared to other city services such as water, sewer, and public safety. To achieve the vision set forth in the Master Parks & Trails Plan, additional investment will be needed. This investment will not only be needed to support system expansion, but for the replacement of existing system components. The following are potential options the City could explore to expand and diversify funding for parks and recreation:

- ▶ Increase Parks share of the general fund.
- Increase funding from the General Fund for maintenance work.
- Follow Maintenance and Replacement Fund to cover major capital repairs and replacements.
- Use of franchise fees to fund maintenance or specific programs.
- Explore a bond/tax referendum for a specific package of capital improvements.
- Utilize Regional Sales Tax dollars for regional initiatives that qualify.
- Continue to strategically pursue grants focused on those whose funding amounts are sufficient to outweigh administrative requirements.
- ▶ Continue to build and enhance partnerships with schools, athletic associations, nonprofits, and others.
- Explore collaboration funding opportunities in areas like public health, public art, programming, and sustainability.

## **Funding Sources**

Achieving the vision and goals for the parks system will take additional funding, not only for large capital investments, but also for park revitalization and maintenance, improvements to accessibility, etc. Significant investment is needed for Sartell to provide the type of parks and recreation system identified in this System Plan. Implementation of the priority actions, as well as routine system maintenance and reinvestment needs, will add to the investments needed over the next 10-20 years. Table 11 Funding Sources highlights the types of funding sources that may be appropriate for various types of actions. The table is followed by brief descriptions of each of the funding sources.

#### **General Funds**

General funds can and should be used to maintain and operate the parks system. General funds are the primary funding source for ongoing maintenance, operations, and amenities. Most grants also have a matching requirement, which is often fulfilled with general funds.

#### Park and Trail Dedication

Minnesota Statutes allow local governments to require dedication of land or cash in-lieu of land for parks and trails from new subdivisions. The dedication must be reasonable and rationally related to the recreation demand created by the development. Cities can also require dedication of right-of-way or easements for sidewalks or trails.

The City of Sartell has a park dedication fund that recognizes the impacts that increased residents and employees have on the parks system. It seeks to ensure that areas are preserved for future parks and trails. It establishes a cash in-lieu of land fees where the dedication of land is not feasible or practical or will not create a site usable for park purposes. Fees collected are deposited into the City's park and recreation development fund or its multipurpose trail fund and are used for the development of new or expanded facilities. The City has and will continue to update its park dedication ordinance from time to time to reflect changes to Minnesota Statutes

#### **Grants**

Grants are a way to make Sartell's dollars go further. The City should pursue opportunities when potential award outweighs the costs for applying or administrating. Below is a sample of grant opportunities that may be available, along with websites to visit for more information.

#### Minnesota DNR

The Minnesota DNR is one of the most comprehensive resources when it comes to state funding for park and trail programs. They offer a variety of grant programs and technical assistance. Current programs provide assistance

for cross country skiing trails, mountain biking trails, horseback riding trails, and recreational trails. Some programs also offer assistance for the development of parks or for trail amenities such as restrooms, lightning, benches, etc.

Each of the Minnesota DNR grant programs is unique. The DNR should be consulted before pursuing a grant to clarify funding availability and qualifications.

A portion of most trail or bikeway improvement projects funded through Minnesota DOT is from federal dollars. Examples of programs typically funding trail or sidewalk improvement projects include Safe Routes to School or the Transportation Alternatives Program managed by MNDOT District 3. Given the size of these grants the City should begin preparing in advance for future applications by identifying the type of improvement, the right-of-way needs, preliminary layout, and cost estimates.

#### Clean Water, Land and Legacy Amendment

On Nov. 4, 2008, Minnesota voters approved the Clean Water, Land and Legacy Amendment to the Minnesota State Constitution which increased the general sales and use tax rate by three-eighths of one percentage point (0.375%) to 6.875% and dedicated the additional proceeds for the Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund, the Outdoor Heritage Fund, Clean Water Fund, and Parks and Trails Fund.

Funding from the Legacy Amendment is administered by a variety of agencies such as the Department of Natural Resources, Pollution Control Agency, Department of Health, Historical Society, Minnesota State Arts Board and regional art councils. A number of new grant programs were created. Information about grant opportunities can be found on individual state department and organization websites.

#### Foundations & Non-Profits

There are foundations and non-profits that are interested in fulfilling their missions by supporting local projects. There are a number of online tools that can assist with the process of identifying additional foundations that may provide financial support for park, trail, and bikeway

improvements. The Minnesota Council of Foundations is a great starting point for identifying foundations. Another good starting point is to consider the businesses within Sartell and identifying those that have a foundation or charitable giving department. In addition to retailers and manufacturers, be sure to consider businesses such as energy providers and communications companies.

#### **Partnerships**

Public and private partnerships are valuable to community development of a parks system. These relationships can contribute to the development of parks, operation of athletic facilities, development and implementation of community programming and events, and natural resource management. Partnerships will continue to be important in Sartell for both facilities and programming. Organizations with partner funding can also aid with design, outreach, and maintenance. Partnerships and relationships with private businesses can also result in easements and agreements for trails across private land.

#### **Donations**

Private donations are another potential funding source. These may be financial donations from individuals or area corporations, or donations of labor from recreation clubs or use agreements. Programs such as "adopt-a-trail" or "adopt-a-park" by an organization, business, or individuals have been used in many communities to help with maintenance tasks and raise awareness.

#### State Aid Funds

State aid funds are available for pedestrian and bicycle improvements on state aid streets. This funding source is particularly useful at the time of street construction or reconstruction.

#### **Dedicated Tax Levy**

A city can hold a referendum for a dedicated tax levy with proceeds directed specifically for parks and recreation. This levy can be used for capital projects as well as operations and maintenance. The proceeds may be in place of general funds or be supplemented by general funds. The advantage of a dedicated tax levy is that parks and recreation receive a more stable source of funding.

and does not have to compete with other city priorities for funding on an annual basis. An example of this is the half-cent sales tax Sartell already collects, or the Food & beverage Tax that Sartell has brought for referendum in the past.

#### **Bonding**

General Obligation Bonds and Revenue Bonds provide another source of implementation funding for new public facilities, as well as repairs and/or upgrades to existing facilities.

#### General Park Bond Issue

Residents can decide to raise revenue through a permanent or temporary tax increase dedicated for specific purposes such as park, trail, and bikeway improvements and maintenance. These funds are usually provided through bonds approved as part of a voter referendum.

#### **Utility/Franchise Fees**

Franchise fees are included on the monthly bill that customers receive from a utility, such as natural gas, electricity, or cable. The fee can be a flat amount each month or a percentage of the monthly bill. A franchise fee is implemented with an ordinance, which must be approved by the City Council. Sartell already collects franchise fees and deposits them in the Park CIP Funds.

#### **School Districts**

Open communication between the City and the school districts are important for continued collaboration.

Communication should occur on at least an annual basis about planned projects and additional opportunities to jointly manage public facilities and provide programming. The City has a joint Park-City Committee that is well established and meets to review items such as this.

# General Capital, Operations, and Maintenance Costs

The following table is a tool the City can use to initially evaluate and budget for new improvements. Equally important to the initial capital costs for a project are ongoing operations and maintenance costs. Adequately budgeting operations and maintenance ensures that facilities fulfill life expectancy and that parks remain safe and welcoming. All costs are planning level costs in 2023 dollars and do not necessarily reflect additional costs, such as engineering, design, construction administration, and staff time. These costs were estimated based on contractor bids for public park and trail projects in the State of Minnesota.







#### Web Survey

The web survey was launched October 3rd and closed November 28th, 2022, with a total of 321 participants. 





## Q8 Please rate the quality of the parks, trails and greenways in your neighborhood or the park you visit most frequently.



## Q9 Please rate how the parks system is meeting the needs of residents in your age category.



#### Q10 Please rate the overall appearance (upkeep) of the parks system.



## Q11 What are the top 3 priorities the city should address in the next 3-5 years?




















#### **Sector Distribution**

Convexity helps to approximate the change in price that is not explained by Effective Duration. Effective Convexity assumes that cash flow does change due to a change in interest rates.

#### CPN: Coupon

Annual interest rate (in percent) earned for the bond in decimal format.

#### **EFF DUR: Effective Duration**

Duration is the approximate percentage change in price for a 100 basis point change in rates. Effective Duration takes into account both the discounting that occurs at different interest rates as well as changes in cash flows.

#### Glossary Cont.

#### MKT VAL: Market Value (in ooos)

Bond Par Value multiplied by current market price (as a percent of par) in thousands (000s) reported on Maturity and Sector Position Reports.

#### MKT YIELD: Yield to Maturity (annualized)

The theoretical internal rate of return that causes the present value, assuming neither options for bonds nor prepayments for mortgage backed securities, to equal the current market price of the bond. It can be defined as an estimate of the total return of a bond assuming it is held to maturity and that all coupon and principal income is reinvested at a rate equal to the yield to maturity. The yield to maturity takes into consideration the coupon income, interest-on-interest, and capital gains or losses due to the difference between the price paid when the bond was purchased, and par, the return of principal at maturity.

#### PAR: Par Value (in 000s)

The face value of a bond. The amount of principal expected to be received at maturity. In the case of preferred or equity securities, this may be the number of shares.

#### UNR GAIN/LOSS: Unrealized Gain / Loss (in 000s)

Total in thousands (000s) is based on the current market value without accrued interest (000s) and the total book value (000s) at the reporting period.

#### Asterisk (\*)

A \* after a bond identifier denotes that certain inputs required for advanced bond analytics may not be available.
